Accommodation

There are three places to sleep during the tournament, if sleep you must. The camp site and the hotel are situated on the Papendal compound, the youth hostel is in Arnhem (see the maps elsewhere in this book). Breakfast will be at the place you stay, lunch will be all together in the canteen near the camp site. You can find additional information about your sleeping place below.

Campers

You can choose your own spot and pitch your tent at the camp site within the limits of the red/white tape. The fence behind the camp site will be open during the day so anyone can enter the camp site. Somebody will guard the camp site during the day, but we advise you not to leave anything valuable in your tent. The organization will not be responsible for theft!

Cars are not allowed on the camp site, sorry.

Some people sleep at night, some people party: these two don't match. Please be so kind as to respect other people's need for rest and shut up after midnight!




Hotel guests

People staying in the hotel can use the Papendal swimming pool between 7 and 9 a.m. (not on Monday, Saturday only till 8). Could you keep your rooms neat, please? Don't forget to return your room key when you leave! Breakfast will be in the self-service restaurant of the hotel.

Youth hostel

The youth hostel is located in the northwest part of Arnhem, near the "Open Lucht (open-air) Museum" and "Burger's Zoo & Bush". As with the hotel: don't forget to return your room key when you leave.



Meals

Breakfast 6.45-9.00 hours

Breakfast will be served near the place you sleep. For campers, breakfast will be in the canteen near the camp site; hotel guests can get breakfast in the self-service restaurant of the hotel and people staying in the youth hostel will have breakfast there.

Lunch 12.00-14.00 hours

Yes, an unlimited supply of mind-altering drugs (caffeine for the deadheads, tea for the wimps) is available! For everyone lunch will be in the canteen near the camp site. We will not supply any eating aids, so please bring your own plate, cup, knife, fork, spoon, chopsticks and bib if you want to eat properly. You can wash your dishes in the canteen.

Dinner 18.00 and 19.00 hours

Dinner is also a group event and for everybody will be in the self-service restaurant of the hotel. There is not enough room for everybody at the same time, so please control your animal urges and spread yourselves out. Teams who played in round 3 will eat at 18.00, teams who played in round 4 will eat at 19.00. We'll stop serving dinner at 19.30. If you're not in by then you'll go hungry.

On Friday, September 3, dinner will be at Casa del Loro. Don't forget your ID-card! Dinner will not be provided on Saturday, September 4.

Tzatziki

Apart from Ultimate the members of the organizing committee have another common love: Garlic. This ancient herb has a thousand golden properties, which we want to share with you. During the tournament we will do the work for you and supply you with vast quantities of tzatziki, one of our favourite ways to use Garlic. For those of you who become hopelessly addicted we include the recipe which you can try yourself at home

5 liter yoghurt or "kwark"
5 cucumbers
20 Garlic cloves
some olive oil
some vinegar
salt, pepper
oregano, thyme

Put the yoghurt or "kwark" in a sheet, hang this for about a night, so the water from the yoghurt can leak out. Rasp the cucumber and squeeze it. Add (squeezed) garlic, oil, vinegar, pepper, salt, oregano and thyme. It is best to put this mixture in a quiet cool spot for a couple of hours before you start eating this delicious tzatziki.

Drinks

Drinks

Water is available in the dressing rooms at the fields. Other, more tasty, liquids are available at three different bars, which are open from 8.30 a.m. till 0.45 a.m.. One bar is in the main building, called "dug out" (ground water?), one in the swimming pool (has a bit chlorine taste) and the best one at the camp site. Drinks are sold at Papendal prices.

General remarks

ID-card

Your players kit includes a blank ID-card. Please fill in your name and make sure you bring it with you when you want to get dinner and when you go to the party. Without your ID you will not be fed and not be entertained.

Note

Please do not leave valuable items unattended in your tent. Although the tournament crew will be present constantly at the camp site, things may get stolen. The EUGC organization cannot be held responsible for loss of possessions.

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Sound coffee

There is something special about the coffee we serve you at this tournament and that is not the fact that it is free. The coffee carries the "Max Havelaar" trademark. Max Havelaar, the main character of a book by Multatuli (1860), was a Dutch government official who lived in Indonesia when it was a Dutch colony and fought the unfair way the Dutch treated the Indonesians.

The Max Havelaar trademark guarantees that the farmers who grow and pick the coffee receive a fair price for their produce. The coffee is **bought directly** from the farmers (bypassing the middlemen), at a **guaranteed price** (determined by UNCTAD), which is a **higher price** than the price on the world market (the present world market price for coffee is at its lowest point in 15 years). The farmers receive 60% of the **money in advance** so that they have an income between harvests. Finally, the farmers get **contracts for more than one year**.

Max Havelaar coffee is bought from farmer cooperatives in Central and South America and Africa and is available in almost every supermarket in the Netherlands. Since its introduction in the Netherlands in 1988, Max Havelaar coffee has captured a market share of ca. 2.5% (3 million kgs per year).

In the near future, Max Havelaar cacao will be introduced in the Netherlands. Tea and rice may follow later.

Outside the Netherlands, Max Havelaar coffee is sold in Belgium and Switzerland and will soon be sold in Germany (where it will be called Transfer). Great Britain, Austria and France are the next countries where Max Havelaar coffee will be introduced.

For this coffee,
only beans were used
and not the workers abused.



No time to waste

At this tournament we want to minimize our impact on the environment. We will therefore do our best to avoid producing waste. For this reason, we have decided not to use disposable cups and plates for the breakfasts, lunches and coffee which will be served at the camp site canteen. Instead, we asked you to bring your own cup, plate and cutlery. If you forgot to bring a plate, cup or cutlery, you can **borrow** them for a f 10 deposit during the tournament. **If you return the utensils at the end of the tournament, you will get your money back.**

For the same reason, beer and other drinks will only be sold in **bottles** (beer out of a plastic cup doesn't taste good anyway), for which a f 1 deposit will be charged.

You, too, can help minimize the impact of the tournament. Please be so kind as to clean up after yourself and help keep the fields, camp site, party site, etc. tidy. Thank you!

Tournament set-up

Rules


WFDF rules will be the official rules of the tournament, with the exception of the tournament disc; this will be a 175 g. Discraft Ultrastar.

In the open division a game lasts until one team reaches a score of 21 goals with a lead of at least 2 goals, or until a team scores 25 goals. Halftime occurs the first time either team reaches 11 goals.

In the women's, the juniors' and the masters' divisions games last till 19 goals with a lead of at least 2 goals, or until a team scores 22 goals. Halftime at 10 goals. During games each team has three time outs per half.

A two-hour time cap will apply to all games, except for the finals. After the time cap signal, play shall continue until the next point is scored. Then two points are added to the highest score. The team reaching that score first will be declared the winner.


A complete edition of the rules will be available at the fields and at the tournament's bus.

What to do on a free evening?

monday august 30, thursday september 2

There you are: you've just arrived at Papendal, played only one day, your legs are not yet completely acidified and already you're faced with an evening without any scheduled events. What to do now? This is the time to discover the nightlife of Arnhem. Take your car or the bus (time table on page 20.) and read on this page about Arnhem and where to find the best café's and disco's in town.

Arnhem

Arnhem, with about 130,000 inhabitants, is the largest city near Papendal. Many people know Arnhem from the movie "A Bridge Too Far", about the Second World War, and nowadays many monuments honour that period. The 5,100 ha of public parks, the monumental buildings, the museums, orchestra's and above all the numerous café's, coffee shops and restaurants make Arnhem a pleasant place to visit.

history

Airborne: a word which means a lot in the recent history of Arnhem and Oosterbeek. The Airborneplein in Arnhem and the Airborne museum, Airborne monument and Airborne cemetery in Oosterbeek remind us of the battle for Arnhem in September 1944. In that historic battle, British and Polish paratroopers were dropped far behind the German lines to capture the bridge over the river Rhine at Arnhem. Because Allied Forces coming from Belgium were slowed down, the airborne divisions had to fight without reinforcements for nine days before it was concluded that this bridge "was one too far." As a result, the northern part of the Netherlands was not liberated until the spring of 1945 and had to survive the most difficult winter of that war.

Reminders of earlier military activities can be found in fortifications such as the Sabelspoort, dating from 1440. Other interesting, old buildings are the concert hall Muis Sacrum, the Eusebius Church, and the medieval Duivelshuis.

parks

The 19th century Sonsbeek Park, with its idyllic ponds and gently rolling landscape, is just one of the many beautiful parks in and around Arnhem. An international art centre is located in Sonsbeek Park. The castle at Zijpendaal and Rosendaal Park with "De bedriegertjes" (the little deceivers) are also well worth a visit.

museums

Openlucht (open-air) museum:

"Come see how life really was in the good old days!" This museum shows small holdings, mills, houses and barns from all parts of the country that have long since disappeared. Traditional clothing, household goods, toys and tools are actually used in this museum. You can even see traditional craftsmen working, such as a baker who bakes his delicious bread in a wood-fired stove, a paper maker, ladies making lace and much more.

Burger's Bush zoo, safari & desert

Burger's Bush was the first European zoo where wild animals could be seen outside their cages. In the open 45 ha. safari park, many African animals and birds can be seen roaming around. Even more impressive is the enormous indoor tropical rainforest with hundreds of kinds of animals, from butterflies to crocodiles, moving around freely. Recently a hall has been opened showing deserts in different seasons.

Kröller Muller

The forested areas around Arnhem include the National Park "De Hoge Veluwe", inside which the Kröller Muller museum lies. The museum's collection includes many of Van Gogh's most famous paintings, as well as Impressionist paintings and an excellent sculpture garden.

To travel by bus you need a "strippenkaart". This is a ticket containing 2, 3, 10, 15 or 45 sections which are stamped by the busdriver. A one-way trip from Arnhem to Papendal or vv. costs 3 sections. More people can use the same "strippenkaart". At the railway station you can buy 15- and 45-section-"strippenkaarten". In the bus you can buy 2-, 3- and 10-section "strippenkaarten", but these are relatively more expensive.

The Dutch are a little bit stand-offish. It will require some effort.




An interview with Dan Weiss

trainer and coach of the Dutch open team.

Who are you?

"I'm 37 and have been playing Ultimate for 16 years in America and this is my first official coaching experience."

How did you start out playing Ultimate?

"I started out tossing a frisbee disc inbetween classes in college (Cornell University, Ithaca, New York). Somebody told me that I threw pretty well and that I should try out for the frisbee team. At that time I had never heard of Ultimate, I found out about the sport and fell in love."

Why did you come to the Netherlands?

"I was invited by Arjen Witte, from Red Lights, to coach the national team for the month of August, in preparation for the European Championships and I like Amsterdam."

How do you experience Ultimate in Europe and especially in the Netherlands?

"There are two basic differences: 1) skill level and athleticism and 2) intensity of play. Generally Americans have been playing longer and in the States it attracts people who have been playing other sports, so their skills are a little better. Besides this, Americans are willing to sacrifice a little bit more in order to win. Some people may say that 'The Spirit of the Game' is more alive in Europe, but I feel that we in America still play with 'Spirit', but also with more drive, desire and heart."

What do you think about passive observers?

"I think at the higher levels the time for passive observers is definitely here. It makes the game go better and when you have a championship kind of game and people have been preparing so long, playing in the 'Spirit' while fighting for a championship is asking too much of a human being. We're kind of cutting our own throats by not adapting to the changing nature of the competitiveness of Ultimate. Some people are less objective than others, they should not be allowed to gain an unfair advantage. Passive observers will help with that. My experience in the States with people who do not play in the 'Spirit' is that observers are necessary and eventually in Europe you will need them as well."

Since a lot of people are attracted to the sport because of the fact that there are no referees, do you think that, eventually, there will be two kinds of Ultimate, one with and one without observers?

"I was also attracted by that and it is still an important part of the game, there will always be a place for it. In the States we do not have observers in pool play and games go pretty well, but when you get to the semi's and the finals there's more at stake and people are less willing to be 'spirited' and objective. Sometimes people really abuse the 'Spirit' and the rules. Eventually there may be active observers, when money gets involved."

Do you have a message for frisbee players in Europe?

"It's great to see European teams come to America. It's good for the international flavour of the sport and the more European players see American frisbee, the more they will learn. It has been shown that teams which have been exposed to American frisbee have benefitted from it. They can take their knowledge back to Europe and hopefully the other teams can benefit from it, too, and the level of European frisbee will improve."

Papendal

During this tournament, you will be staying at the National Sports Center Papendal. Papendal is the home base of the NSF - the National Sports Foundation - which co-ordinates and looks after all Dutch sport interests. The NOC - the Dutch Olympic Committee-, the Dutch Sport and Health Institute and the Edese Golf Club are also located at Papendal.

The National Sports Center was established several decades ago. The name, "Papendal", has got a much longer history. Papendal used to be a farm with surrounding lands near the sports center and "pape" is often used in names of roads in Arnhem region. There are several stories about the origin of this word, such as a children's cemetery in pre-history. Most likely it has something to do with Catholic clergymen; in the past it was common to use "paap" (from "pope") instead of priest. Another story tells us that in the Middle Ages some Flemish sailors, home from travels to far and distant lands, brought a present for their priest. It was a bird and they called it "pape-gaai" (parrot). Whatever the origin of the name, Papendal is a great place to play Ultimate and Guts!

Official?

The European Championships will be held literally in the backyard of the Dutch Olympic Committee and the Dutch Sport Federation. The NFB - the Dutch Flying Disc Association - hopes this tournament will demonstrate that frisbee sports, such as Ultimate, are full-fledged sports and that they will be officially recognized. We hope that everyone will help achieve this goal by demonstrating our wonderful sport in a professional manner.
