Paul Eriksson is the treasurer of the European Flying Disk Federation (EFDF), and a player on Stockholm Ultimate in the open division. He first picked up a disk in the 1970s and hasn't put it down since. Disquito talked with him about the EFDF, the EUCC and Ultimate in Europe.

What is the EFDF?

EFDF stands for the European Flying Disk Federation. "It started out in the 1970s to organize the individual disk events -- distance, freestyle, golf -- but now it's pretty much for Ultimate," says Paul. EFDF's primary responsibility is to help plan European Ultimate championships, such as the EUCC. It also serves as a resource for European national federations that are looking for outside help, as they develop Ultimate in their countries.

Paul would like to see the EFDF concentrate more on development in the future, but right now it just doesn't have the resources. Currently, the EFDF consists of President Thomas Griesbaum and Paul, neither of whom are paid for their work.

EUCC and EUC tournaments schedule

The EUCC was last held in 1994. Why the seven-year wait? "A whole bunch of worlds got in the way," says Paul.

The first EUCC took place in 1992 in Rotenburg, Germany. Until then, the EFDF had organized European championships for national teams (EUC) every second year. Club championships were to be held in the years between, and after a European national team championship in the Netherlands in 1993, the second EUCC took place in Eching, Germany. However, more and more teams and players started to attend World championships as well. Since the world wide organization WFDF (World Flying Disk Federation) also hosted club and national team events every year, many players spent two full weeks at these international tournaments, not counting other events.

It turned out that this was too much for many players and already the 1995 national team championships in Fontenay le Comte, France, suffered slightly with some teams missing. In 1996, EFDF found a potential host for the

were well-prepared and announced long in advance, they had strong competition from the World Ultimate Club Championships which had taken place just a few weeks earlier in Canada, and attendance was quite low. With another expensive World championship in 1998 in the USA it was impossible to find a host for a EUCC. In the meantime, various players suggested changing the cycle of world events to 4 years instead of 2 years. This would reduce the number of tournaments at world level and leave room for regional or continental level championships. Now, with the agreement of the WFDF, a rotating four-year schedule has been adopted.

2001 - EUCC, Prague

2002 - World Clubs (WUCC), Hawaii

2003 - EUGC, ?

2004 - WUGC, ?

EFDF is looking for bids for the 2003 EUC, and hopes to make a decision by the end of the year. As you enjoy Prague and the EUCC this year, think about how cool it would be to host the EUC in your country in 2003.

Indoors and Juniors

Juniors in Europe will continue to have tournaments for national teams every other year, at the EUC or EUCC. "Taking in consideration that WFDF will have a worlds juniors' competition on the even years, juniors in Europe will have something every year," says Paul.

European Indoor championships were last played in 1997. Paul thinks they could be played annually or every other year, but there hasn't been much interest to organize it recently.

Rules!

Do you want referees in Ultimate? Do you mind waiting five minutes between points? On these and other subjects, European and North American Ultimate players don't always agree. Rather than depend on the WFDF or follow the lead of the North American Frisbee organizations, the EFDF sets its own standards for European championship tournaments. It also helps represent Europe in the world Ultimate community. The recent rule

EUCC only very late. Due to the late announcement, too few teams showed interest to attend and the EUCC had to be cancelled.

The 1997 national team championships

changes to maintain the pace in games are a good example of EFDF action to help maintain the high quality of European Ultimate.

Development of Ultimate in Europe

Can you imagine an EUCC in the future with all of Europe represented? Paul has been working towards that goal in Latvia, with the Swedish Ultimate Federation.

"We found some contacts in Latvia through the YMCA," says Paul, "did a little recon in 1995, and eventually found a key contact in the Latvian School Sport Federation." With these references, the Swedish Ultimate Federation applied to the EU for a grant to send Ultimate instructors to Latvia. They received 5000 Euros to promote a cultural exchange between the two countries. Three instructors went and taught lots of Ultimate. "They've got a Latvian Frisbee Federation going now. They're not officially recognized yet, but they're getting there. It's growing like hell." Maybe a future EUCC will be in Latvia! Paul finds spreading Ultimate personally rewarding. "I'm forty-one," says Paul, "I really want to put more effort and time into spreading the sport, instead of focusing on my own play."

If you want to promote Ultimate and are up for a challenge, Paul suggests working to get Ultimate recognized as an official sport in your country. "I know it's super-hard and varies a lot by country, but you can help you access grants and better fields," he says. However, even in liberal Sweden it took ten years for Ultimate to gain official status. So it's an uphill battle, but Paul says "it can really help you."

Speaking of getting involved, there will be a player's meeting on Thursday night. "There's potential for making things happen here," says Paul. He added, "we are really hoping someone from the women's division will step up and take a position within the EFDF."

Do you know, where do you live?

As we know, most of you are accommodated in Strahov University Colleges. So we thought it will be a good idea to inform you about this location and, more importantly, with adjacent Strahov Stadium. The Strahov stadium (originally named Strahov Sletiste) was built in cooperation of the Czech government and Czech Hawking (something like Scouts in United States) organization in year 1925, in less than one and a quarter year.



Full capacity of auditorium was 133 thousands viewers and the exercising ground could be filled with 14 400 gymnasts all of them in distance of 1,8 m from each other (it is the biggest exercising ground in the world).

To the stadium was also connected adjacent areas with dressing rooms, marshalling grounds for gymnasts and 250 members of Hawking chivalry with horses, areas for the organizers, lunchrooms, medical care etc.

The first Hawking meeting was the eight Meeting of all Hawkings in 1926. From this time the all meeting were taking place here. In days of communistic totality the Hawking organization was cancelled and the government started to conduct their own copy of Hawking meetings called the Spartakiada. Because of this the government made a decision to rebuild and reconstruct this stadium. The Spartakiades were taking place on this new Strahov Stadium from 1955 to 1985 under the slogan "For peace and socialism".

The reconstruction was mainly focused on the auditoriums. Their capacity increased and into the eastern part of the stadium were placed gyms, swimming pool and other facilities. In 1955 were present 40 000 gymnasts on Strahov (but in the semi-finals for the Strahov finals participated 1 100 000 gymnasts from the whole Czech republic). In 1994 the Hawking organization could return once again to their domain in their XII. Meeting of all Hawkings.

The Stadium now has the area of (310,5 x 202,5) m². The asphalt area in front of the main gate (the area between the colleges) is the marshalling ground mentioned above. The university colleges (belonging to Czech Technical University in Prague) were built to serve in the days of Spartakiades as changing rooms. The corridors can content two passing by marching gymnasts two by two and the rooms are really a fitting place for school tables... Simply the students are becoming very close during the schooldays and in the corridors the parties take place.

When and why you decided to conduct this tournament?



This decision was made in the same time, when someone thought about conducting it in Czech republic, because it is one of the only ways to spread frisbee in our country and one of the ways how to get into the medias.



How many teams will come and how many teams should came at the begging?

In the begging we thought about 85 teams, but now 55 teams have made it. 27 open, 8 women teams, 16 mixes and 4 junior teams.



Were there any problems with the 85 teams were not coming and "only" 55 teams came?

Som small problems occurred, like the fields, which must have been cancelled, the capacity of lodging and some other small problems, but it could be alot worse.



How many fields will be there than?

We have narrowed the number to 15 fields in two areas, and one of them will be a little wider, That's Strahov (6 fields) and 9 fields on Slavia stadium.



How will the transportation be solved and how much time will it take?

Well, we tried to scheudle it in some way that the transports won't be neccessary during the day, when the tournaments take place. But, we were not completely successfull, but the moves between the two playing areas should be minimal. Special buses will be sent and will be working as direct line through the whole day. The way should take at about 30 minutes.



Czech guys are well know for their ability to make good parties, but you had some problems with this, is it true?

Well, i wouldn't call it a problem. But, it was like this: The person responsible for all the parties went to USA for work so someone else had to take this job, but even thought it was hard for him in the begging, I think he made it. So I personally think that the players will have a good time, or so I hope.



Whould you like to tell something to the players as your final message?

Of course. I would like to tell them to play with Spirit, because that is the most important thing in this game.

women's division

England's Bliss beat Finland's Atletico in yesterday's game of the day at Slavia Fields.

The teams were ranked one and two in the women's division coming into the tournament, and the lopsided result surprised both teams and the crowd.

But the game was closer on the field than on the scoreboard, as both teams traded turnovers. Bliss's zone and Atletico's drops proved the biggest factors in the game.

The game: 1st half

A small but noticeable cross breeze blew as the teams warmed up. England kicked things off by pulling to Finland and immediately slapping on a zone. This strategy proved effective, forcing Atletico to hurry their throws and bobble their catches. The disk was turned over three times in quick succession, but then Bliss scored.

This proved to be the pattern for the first half of the game. Bliss's good pulls and loose-but-effective zone consistently forced turnovers before Atletico had a chance to move the disk very far from its end zone. While Bliss also had trouble with turnovers, they were able to capitalize and score more frequently.

By the third point, Finland had begun to adjust its throws to the English zone, but continued to have problems with drops.

With Bliss up 5-0, it started to rain. After trading turnovers, Finland's Anu Raasakka bobbled but then caught the score to put Atletico on the board.

The next point was the longest in the game, with the disk trading possession nine times due to unforced errors. An Atletico time out helped calm things down, but Finland couldn't follow through and Bliss scored to lead 6-1.

The previous long point seemed to galvanize the English, who forced a turn and marched down the field smoothly and efficiently to score.

Two points later, Bliss handler Claire Parker brought the game to half with a breakforce high-release backhand for the score.

2nd half

The light wind and rain stopped and there were fewer turnovers in the rest of the game, but Bliss remained in control. England's Maria Cahill opened the second half with an immediate huck to Heather Killian for a quick score. For several points, both teams traded turnovers, but Bliss's edge on defense and longer throws continued to put them ahead. With Bliss up 15-1, Atletico fought back with consecutive solid cuts and long throws despite hard Bliss defense. Finland's Kaisa Ronnqvist's thirty-meter huck to Anne Valta was called back, but a few throws later the Atletico scored to big cheers from the crowd.

Bliss answered by flowing down the field, making the throws and catches look easy in arguably their best offensive point of the game. Two points later Bliss finished with a catch by Killian again in the end-zone.

Wet disk, new players

Turnovers plagued both teams at the beginning of the game. "They were claiming a wet disk," joked Terry Whitehead of her teammates

on Bliss.

But first-day tourney jitters might also have contributed to the turnovers, as both Bliss and Atletico have some fresh faces on their rosters.

"We actually have a lot of new people on Bliss this year, and a core of people who have played, but it seems to be working out ok," said Whitehead. Bliss has six new players, but Atletico has even more. "Our roster has changed a lot. We have maybe six experienced players," said Marja-Riitta Niemi of Atletico.

Niemi praised the Bliss zone defense, but added, "our throws were getting through the box, but we just weren't catching them. Maybe we were too eager to pass the disk before really catching it." She noted that her team, "ran pretty good - and they're good runners too."

Bliss Captain Tara Jewell said Bliss had "played Atletico a few times, and had hard games with them. So they wanted to come out strong against them." She added, "Great crowd!" in reference to some of the athletic supporters in the stands.

The cheap seats speak

Sabine of the co-ed division Saxy Divers felt the game was closer than the score showed. "You couldn't see [the difference] on the field," she said, "Atletico dropped a few more disks." But Christoph from the co-ed team Saxy Divers gushed that Bliss was "safe with every throw, great cuts, very effective." He even admitted, "They pulled much better than me!"

Disquito: So, how many players are in your team, and do you have any other teams, for example, a women's team?

Lasse: Well, we've got 19 players on the team. We do not have a women's team here, because couldn't make it, but we have got a great women's team.

D: In the player's handbook you told us that you are one of the oldest team, together since 1975. And there's another team from Sweden that started in 1974. So, does that mean you started together?

L: Well, I wasn't playing back there, because I started playing a bit later, in 1979, so actually I really don't know how it was in the seventies.

D: You said you started in 1979. That means you are now playing for more than 20 years. You must be one of the best in Sweden by now?

L: I would rather say one of the most experienced, but not one of the best, because now we have much faster and younger players. And that means we are insisting more on using your head, especially when it comes to the semifinals or finals. You have to use your head, more, and your muscles, less.

So that's why we have a lot of players, so during the game we can relax both our heads and our legs. Today we even have five people who aren't playing at all. And when it gets hotter it's good to have some players relaxing and ready to go into play anytime someone is tired.

D: And do you have any problems with recruiting new players onto your team back in Sweden?

L: Not at all. Well maybe in some other areas, they can have some slight problems, but in our area it's not a problem at all. We have three Frisbee clubs in the town we came from, and one outside the city limits. And now our juniors are growing up, and we have two junior teams in our club, and three of their players are even on our national team. So, we don't experience any problems with a lack of new players.

D: So I see that you have a good base for your Frisbee club, but how do you recruit the new players?

L: We recruit them in schools. We even had something like Frisbee school for a week or

two, something like a camp, where we played Frisbee golf and then we went to take a bath, and we also had some competitions where the kids could win Frisbees and ice-cream. That's how we recruit new players into the junior's team. And then we also have school championships in our area.

D: Okay, so I understand you have really no problems with this.

L: Yes, but as I said, it is not a problem in our area. Our team is now the strongest one [in Sweden] and we have a lot of really strong players, and our goal is to win the world's team championship in Hawaii 2002.

D: Well, that's going to be hard, right?

L: Actually, I think we can do it. We beat one American team in Scotland, the Santa Barbara Condors, and they are the American champions. And we beat them!

So that showed us that it is more in the mental part of the game. So this is just a part of our big goal. Well, we also know that if some stronger team comes, and we eventually lose, we will have to stay focused.

But, I think... I hope! we will win a gold medal here.

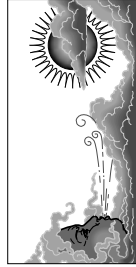

"Intense!" was the word for the game between Germany's Feldrenner and Denmark's Ragnarok yesterday afternoon. Hard-running D spiced with hucks and layouts made for exciting play as the teams met for the first time in two years. "Either team could have won," said Jens Meyer of Feldrunner.

1st half: first offense, then D

Patchy sun and little to no wind greeted the players as they stepped onto field #4 at Slavia. Feldrenner jumped to an early lead of 2-0, and after trading points twice, stood ahead at 4-2.

"We were a little too lazy in the beginning, so we had to psyche up," later said Erik Hammer (#5), Captain of Ragnarok, of this early part of the game. And psych up they did! With lots of short horizontal throws to set up the occasional long throw, Ragnarok scored again and again. They clustered their players near the disk and left plenty of room for surprisingly effective deep cuts.

Soon Ragnarok was up 8-5, and Feldrenner had only scored once in the last seven points. Ragnarok needed only one point to take the half, but it wasn't to happen. Feldrenner started their rally by receiving the pull and scoring with only two throws. They scored again after a too-hasty Ragnarok huck.

With Feldrenner now only a point behind Ragnarok, the tone of the game became noticeably more intense. The defense of both teams forced more and more turnovers as their offenses became jumpier. Feldrenner finally took the point with Jens Meyer (#8) throwing a wicked bender to a laying-out Ben Thielhorn (#3) in the end-zone. The Germans were amped from this last play, and on the next point played extremely intense D that



quickly resulted in a turnover. With more energy than they could handle, Ragnarok nearly turned it over themselves, and called a time out to calm down. Then they worked it up the field despite more amazing Danish D and scored to take the lead and the half. Feldrenner 9, Ragnarok 8. Watching the game were some players from the Russian open team Ju-piter. Said Gavin Rouch about the first half, "Ridiculous amounts of energy!"

2nd half: D continues

The second half started with the same defensive energy that finished the first half. Layout D's and handblocks frustrated both teams' offense, who began to look deep in desperation. One point featured four sketchy hucks, two from each team, with none completed.

However, between long D-dominated points were quick efficient ones, in which the offense never gave the defense a chance to get set.

Though Ragnarok stayed within two points, Feldrunner eventually went up 16-13 to game point. It seemed over for Ragnarok, but then they quickly scored.

The next point had the most controversial call of the game, as a hospital throw by Feldrenner slowly floated down over Ragnarok Thor Miller (#8) and Feldrenners Mohammed Boujataoui (#20) and Teemu Lempinen (#19). As they went up in a group, Ragnarok Niels Bach (#9) out-jumped them from the side, D'ed the disk, and then landed on the other three. The contested foul was returned to the thrower.

After a couple more turnovers that point, Ragnarok scored to bring them within one point of Feldrenner, 15-16.

The final point featured defensive bids on throw after throw, and even a tandem bid where offensive and defensive players laid out toward the disk right next to each other. It seemed like Ragnarok might come back to tie it, but Feldrenner held on to win, 15-17.



Comments from the teams

"We came back and went ahead, and then they did the same," said Captain Erik Hammer (#5) of Ragnarok. He said he enjoyed the game, but added with a laugh, "Not that we lost it!"

"Most intense game we've had so far," said Jens Meyer of Feldrenner, "We came well-prepared because we had lost to Fenris, the old Copenhagen team, two years ago at St. Andrews, and they have many of the same players. They're just as tough now as they were then."

Notable: Ragnarok Henrik Thomesen's (#1) one-handed catch of a difficult hammer in the end-zone; Feldrenner Mohammed Boujataoui (#20) who seemed to touch the disk every third throw; and Ragnarok Thor Moller (#8), who has apparently limitless defensive energy.

Juniors Games Summary

After a few days we bring you, exclusively!, the results that our staff team has been compiling from the junior division. There have been ten juniors games and in which 5 302 passes were made. 672 resulted in a turnover and 278 resulted in a score. The most passes in one game were made in the game between Sweden versus UK - 727. In the same game there was also the greatest number of turnovers - 102. The least passes in a game was 428, played between France and UK. In the game between Finland and UK both teams only lost their disks 45 times (combined total). If we play with these numbers a little, we can say that almost every nineteenth pass was caught in the opponent's end zone. On the other hand, every eighth pass meant a turnover, which happened between two and three times more often than any team scored a point.

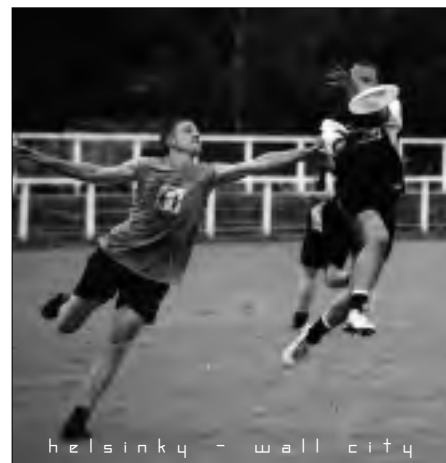

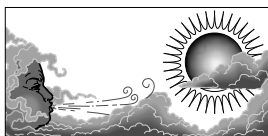

D: And how did you come up with the name of your club - the Frisbeer club?

I.B.: Well, it just sounds good. And we love the beer, so we thought of this name. And the sponsor I talked about earlier is a company that brews beer, so it came one with another. It's something like advertisement. They give us the beer, and we play with this name.

D: And that reminded me, how do you like our Czech beer?

I.B.: I cannot really tell you, because I don't like beer. But I'm pretty sure the others already tried and I think they are more than satisfied.

Women - Games Summary

an exact total of inexact data

We bring some next results and data of the women's division. There have been 32 games in which 11080 passes were made. 1804 resulted in a turnover and 758 resulted in a point. The most passes in one game were made in the Milder Norden - Espoo match. In the same game there was also the greatest number of turnovers - 93. The least passes during a game were between the Red Lights - Russki teams, they managed to finish with 134 passes. When Milder Norden played Russki, the teams lost their discs only 19 times. If we play a game with these numbers, we can say that every 14-15 pass was caught in the opponent's end zone. Each 6th pass turned into a turnover. Before one team scored, there was a turnover 2-3 times. Compared to juniors, the women need less passes (-5) to score. On the other side, they lose the disc one pass beforehand.

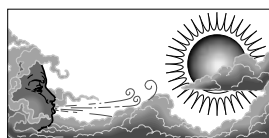

Disquito: How do you like this championship, the games, and the organization of the tournament?

Thomas: The organization of this tournament has been pretty good. The organizers have been doing many things all by themselves without help from someone outside of the championship. They seem they are very experienced.

The games, as far as I can tell, have been very close and very intense and I think that every team here, even if they have lost many games, is very glad to be here.

D: Yesterday, there was a forum with the players and the EFDF. What news can you tell us? What were the topics?

T.G.: One of the most-asked questions was about the mixed division in general. A few ideas were raised about how each nation could support or help develop the mixed division in their country.

Another topic was that the EFDF, as an organization, consists of only two people. And we are interested in finding one or two more people who would like to work with EFDF.

Also, we are looking for someone who would invest time and energy into the development and support of the women's division. So if there is someone who would like to help us with this, we would like to hear from him or her.

We also spoke about the future tournaments. We're looking for someone who will hold the next international indoor club championships this coming winter. And in 2003, we will have the European National Championship. So far only two countries (France and Finland) have sent us bids to host the championship.

D: Elsewhere in tomorrow's issue will a letter from French players who were threatened by a group of people here who were complaining about the color of their skin. Can EFDF do something to prevent these racist acts on the future tournaments?

T.G.: I think this is a problem that can happen in many places in the world. And I would say it could happen in every country you are traveling to. It's very hard to do something about this and EFDF can't do really anything about this. Maybe each local organizer could do something against it. It would be best that a police come to protect the players, but this is also unrealistic because this are not the Olympic Games where we can have ten thousand policemen helping us. I mean this is a big event, but not big enough. You know, this is the first time I hear, that a player from Europe was attacked or threatened because

of racism.

What we could do, as EFDF, is to ask future organizers if there is a potential of racism in the city where the tournament takes place. As I've said, and everybody agrees with this, this can happen in every country. And you've got the hot spots of this problem in every country, so it would be good to know this, before traveling there, that there is a potential of this problem.

D: For the last question, I would like to know, what will EFDF do about games, which are very often interrupted because of fouls, because these games lose spectators' interest very quickly?

T.G.: Well, there is really nothing that would keep players from calling a foul. But we're using a rule that comes from WFDF that tries to limit the time for which the game can be interrupted and as far as I've been told, it was in use here too. So the scorekeeper should in this case start to measure the time and if the problem is not solved in 30 seconds he should tell the players to return the disc and continue the game.

But I would have another comment on this, because when you are sitting really far from the field, you usually can't hear the player talk and you therefore do not know what kind of foul was called. So we would like to create a rule that creates some standard hand signals to help us explain what kind of foul was called. But there is nothing specific created yet, so maybe next year.

Their hard defense, combined with the wet conditions, made it tough for Liquidisc to keep possession. Layout D's like Kalie Norling's (#8), and Liquidisc unforced drops took their toll.

Then, when the Swedes got the disc, their well-organized offense pierced the Finnish defense at its weakest point time and time again. For example, Martin Filipovski (#18) used hammers the way most of us use a fore-hand, and threatened the entire field whenever he held the disc.

With the score 10-6, Liquidisc changed tactics and threw a loose zone. It seemed like the Swedes had easily adjusted, but then an impatient throw gave the disc to the Finns. Liquidisc couldn't convert, however, and so lost the opportunity to rally. Three turnovers later Skogshyddans FK scored.

Liquidisc had some nice plays, like Sami Holopainen's (#45) tipped-disc D early in the

game, and Juhana Oivio's (#49) break force throw to set up a score near the end.

But these plays were too far and few between to keep the the team in the game.

The last point ended quietly, when Skogshyddans FK scored quickly after Liquidisc turned the disk over immediately after the pull. Both teams showed excellent spirit throughout the game.

Skogshyddans FK's win puts them in the final today with Clapham Ultimate. The British team's testosterone-driven style will certainly challenge the cool intensity of the Swedes. We'll have to see which will deliver their team the title.

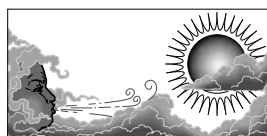

The Game:

1:0 - The offense was started by Clapham and they carried disk into the half of the field almost without any major problems, from where they, a bit hungry for their first score, really failed with their first pass - the long overhead into the zone. After this unsuccessful pass the Swedish team tried to score, but they managed to make the same mistake as British team. After three more turnovers the Swedish team made it to the lead.

1:1 - The first act that made the audience and one of the sprinting players from Clapham fry. The sixty meters long bomb into the Skogshyddans end-zone, where it was perfectly caught by the winner of short running race - the British player.

2:1 - During this point started the first "discussions" in the game, but even though the Skogshyddans have easily scored another point.

2:2 - Clapham repeated its move from the first point of the game with slight difference. This time the long pass was caught by British player.

2:3 - After the attacking Sweden team lost the disc the Clapham got in front of their offensive zone and they send a very unsuccessful hammer. 4:3 - Maybe the first throw of Sweden, which ended out of the field. Clapham therefore got their twenty meters for free, when they started from the brick position. They almost used this advancement, if it wasn't for an excellent defensive action in front of the Swedish defensive zone and their following perfect attack

4:4 - Swedish throw fell again outside the line and Clapham used the brick position for their advancement.

5:4 - Air-race for a Swedish payer, who read his pass very clearly and caught another point.

6:4 - For the first time the difference was more than one point. Skogshyddans by a very aggressive defense made Clapham do a mistake in their own third of the field. After the first timeout and by very cautious offense the Swedish team they got another point when they caught the disc in the air

6:5 - Another beautiful point caught by Clapham after some 25m overhead.

6:6 - This was a point you will not see on Czech fields very often: a sprint of a Swedish player with very unlucky ending - after a beautiful air action he dropped the disc in the zone. On the other side of the field there was a small and victorious air Battle of Britain, when even through a very tough defense the Clephem player managed to catch a disc in the air and he fell a few centimeters from the out zone.

6:7 - British break was made by one defense jump and a beautiful point on two passes. Ultimate is such an easy game after all.

7:7 - No mistakes and no comment.

7:8 - Clapham repeated the situation when they scored 6:7.

9:8 - After three turnovers and a very strange argument from the British team the Sweden managed to get in the lead. Once again.

10:8 - The game became fragmented, and it seemed that both teams wanted their mini-victory before the halftime begins. In the end the Skogshyddans were luckier.

11:8 - In the second halftime the British team was a little bit unlucky, when they lost a disc in front of their zone and they therefore helped the enemy to get a three point advancement.

12:8 - I believe that this was the point that made the resolution of how the game will end - it was full of turnovers, long discussions, but also one beautiful defensive jump of Swedish team. It was also visible that both teams are tired, because some unnecessary mistakes were made.

13:8 - Another mistake by Clapham in their own third of the field and got Skohydans a safe distance from them, which lowered the attention of all spectators.

13:9 - British team tried to risk and change the flow of the game by some long passes into the zone, but this time they were successful.

14:9 - Mistake on both sides, even though the Scandinavian team managed to get their point. From the auditorium it was quite sure that Clapham was dissolving - their players started to argue with each other.

15:10 - A loss on Swedish team and a beautiful one handed catch on the other side.

17:11 - Some excitement was brought by defense jump of Swedish team, even though Skogshyddans lost the disc.

18:12 - This point was the last interesting one in the game. British team lost their attack by a mistake in strategy, because they kept passing the disc to well defended players. point after Skogshyddans made other unnecessary mistake.

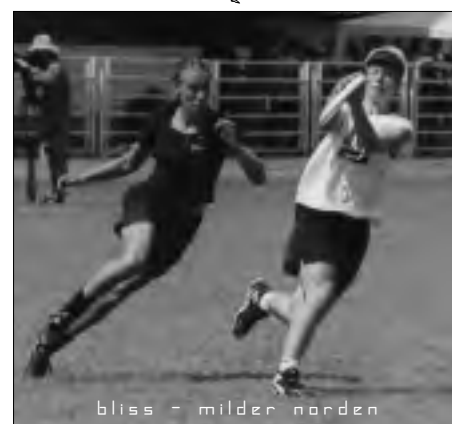
19:12 - Last point of the game.
