

From the National College Director

Welcome to the 2000 UPA College Championships. Whether you are a player, spectator, visitor, or staff, I am sure you will have a fabulous three days. The teams that you will see here have worked amazingly hard to qualify to play in this prestigious tournament. The 2000 tournament is the largest UPA College Championships ever. Sixteen teams in both the Open and Women's divisions will be competing to go home with the first place prize.

A warm "thank you" to the city of Boise, Kienan Slate, Jim Dumont, Patty Sebby, and all of the other volunteers that have worked so hard to make this tournament happen. Sponsors, thank you for your donations. Without you none of this would be possible. The teams, the UPA, and I appreciate your generosity.

In the Open Division, North Carolina State University has returned to defend their 1999 championship. Their quest will not be an easy one as highly favored Brown University looks for its first ever title. Fortunat Mueller and Justin Safdie will be looking to complete the "reverse trifecta" by coming away with the college crown. If the University of Colorado has anything to say about it, this will be their year. Stocked with experience, the MamaBird will look to go all the way to the finals.

The 2000 field is as deep as ever. Perennial powerhouse Carleton College will be looking to take their "height" into the finals by putting the disc up in the air to Alex Nord and Thomas Sebby. It certainly can't hurt that the tournament is in Sebby's back yard. Stanford University, UC Santa Barbara, the University of North Carolina, and Michigan will also try and build on their previous trips to Nationals and could surprise any team if they are not prepared.

In the Women's Division, we will be looking for a new champion. The field seems noticeably absent with Stanford and British Columbia both failing to advance from their Regional tournament. The University of North Carolina at Wilmington rides a number one ranking into the tournament and is the early favorite.

This does not mean that the outcome is guaranteed. The field is strong, with eight or nine teams having a legitimate shot at the title. Carleton College, Brown University, and the University of Georgia will call on veteran experience to carry them through the weekend. Carleton seniors Paige Anderson, Anna Nelson, and Mimi Frusha have been to the finals twice already in their college careers. You can bet they want to return.

The University of California at Davis, a relatively new team, arrives under the leadership of two Cornell alums and previous national qualifiers. Melanie Carr and Kari Deleeuw were at Nationals in 1998 and bring the leadership presence that their team will need to be successful. Davis is peaking at just the right time and should be in top form for the tournament.

The New England region sends two very strong qualifiers in Tufts and Brown. Look for Johanna Neumann from Tufts to lead her team in their first trp to Nationals in six years. Neumann is a favorite for the Callahan Award, given to the college division MVP. Brown is stocked with talent and can go as far down their roster as any other team. Coach Lori Parham will be working very hard to improve on last year's finish.

Georgia, although without their star player Melanie Byrd, has developed to be a very solid team. Katherine Kidd and super coach Will Deaver will be striving for the finals. Keep your eyes peeled. The weekend will be full of excitement. With twelve games going on at any given time, there will be plenty to watch!

As this is my last tournament as the National College Director, I would like to thank everyone for four great years. I have really enjoyed participating in the growth of the UPA College Division and seeing the changes in our sport.

Thank you to all of the volunteers. You do superb work and I couldn't do my job without you! You have put many hours into planning this tournament and everyone of you has contributed to its success. Take a moment to pat yourself on the back.

Spectators and visitors, enjoy the weekend. There will be lots of excitement. You will see the finest college Ultimate played by thirty-two of the top teams in North America. Take advantage of this opportunity and have a great time.

These young players are hot, full of spirit, and will be in college soon. The juniors and their parents deserve a little more UPA attention than they've received in the past, so I made the tough choice to attend Junior nationals instead of College this year. I know the College Championship is in excellent hands with Kate and Patty in charge. The growth in the UPA's 8 championship divisions is so exciting - it makes for tough choices, yet is a sign of our sport's up-and-coming success at all levels.



2000 Callahan Award and College Nationals

Charles Kerr, Callahan Award Coordinator

This year's college National Tournament in Boise, ID includes many of the top contenders for the Callahan Award for college most valuable player. The winner of the Callahan Award is announced the Saturday night before the finals at Nationals, but as this tournament guide went to press, candidates for the award had already been selected. This year's award has 50 candidates in for the open division and 25 for the women's.

Many of the top teams that have qualified for Nationals also have the top players.

Open

If this year's award for the Callahan Award in the Open division (as the men's division is called in ultimate's hyper-PC terminology) has a favorite candidate, it would probably be **Justin Safdie** (#22) of *Brown University*. Justin in teammate of Fortunat Mueller (#8), last year's run away winner of the Callahan Award and in addition to both playing on the Brown University team, both also play the Boston club team *Death Or Glory* - the 1999 National Club Champions. Justin is an all around offensive and defensive standout, but his excellence as a deep receiver makes him Mueller's favorite target.

The University of Colorado may have the country's deepest, most athletic roster, giving them plenty of potential candidates for the Callahan. This year Colorado selected **Nate Miller**. Miller's tremendous quickness and fearless intensity make him one of college ultimate's premiere defensive players.

Stanford ultimate has the distinction of having the most Callahan winners since the award's inception, and this year's nomination for the men is **Scott Johnson** (#00). At 6'3, Scott's height combined with excellent hops and near perfect timing makes him a feared deep threat. And his good-natured spirit makes him an ideal Callahan candidate.

Tim Murray (#4) is both the captain and heart of MagnUM the University of Michigan's ultimate team. Rail thin, Magnum's offense revolves around Tim's first rate throwing ability.

Last year's champions, NC State, enters the tournament as the number nine seed, but includes **Chris Hinkle** (#17), arguably college ultimate's best offensive player. A fiery competitor, Hinkle's short cuts are virtually uncoverable and State's offense revolves around his pinpoint passing.

Other candidates at Nationals that will be playing in the open division include: Matt Bruss of the University of Wisconsin, Seth Mann of Tufts University and Mike Shiel of Notre Dame.

Women's Division

Of the 25 women nominated for the Callahan, almost half are here at College Nationals. And aside from **Angela** Lin (Georgia Tech) and Camille Yu (Stanford) all the major candidates are here, giving spectators an opportunity to survey the field firsthand.

Unlike the men's division, this year's race has no clear cut favorite, but leading candidates include:

Kari DeLeeuw plays for *Pleiades*, the number two seeded team from UC Davis. She was nominated last year for the Callahan as well and this is her 5th year playing ultimate after running cross country and track (along with basketball) in high school.

Tufts University's candidate is super star player Johanna Neumann (#13). Johanna was also nominated for the award last year and she, along with Whitney Kakas (#15) of Brown University, are generally considered to be the two best women players from the Northeast.

For the last several years **Sarah Hagen** has been the heart of the University of Minnesota women's team, *Tacky Lawn Ornaments*. Sarah is expected to finish in the top 5 of this year's Callahan voting.

Terri Murphy (#23) plays for the up and coming team Kali from the University of Colorado. Teri is starting her third year of playing ultimate after playing volleyball and basketball.

In addition to UC Davis, a number of strong teams and candidates hail from the West Coast, including **Corrine Ginsberg** of UC San Diego and **Robin Loek Birdsong** of the University of Oregon. Last year, Robin's teammate on the *Star Bellied Sneetches*, Jody Dozono, won the Callahan Award before finishing her master's degree at Oregon. In '97 and '98 the Stanford University's women's team had back to back Callahan Award winners, so having consecutive winners from the same team isn't without precedent.

Other candidate's in the women's division include **Katherine Kidd** from the University of Georgia, **Jessi Witt** of Smith College, **Lindsay Thompson**, Swathmore College and **Jenny Dale** of Rice University.


