

Enough about the grand scheme! The College Division is something special because it is comprised of a select group of individuals.




Ultimate in 10 Simple Rules

1. **The Field** – A rectangular shape with endzones at each end. A regulation field is 70 yards by 40 yards, with endzones 25 yards deep.
2. **Initiate Play** – Each point begins with both teams lining up on the front of their respective endzone lines. The defense throws (called a “pull”) the disc to the offense. A regulation game has seven players per team.
3. **Scoring** – Each time the offense completes a pass in the defense’s endzone, the offense scores a point. Play is initiated after each score.
4. **Movement of the Disc** – The disc may be advanced in any direction by completing a pass to a teammate. Players may not run with the disc. The person with the disc (thrower) has ten seconds to throw the disc. The defender guarding the thrower (marker) counts out the stall count.
5. **Change of Possession** – When a pass is not completed (e.g. goes out of bounds, is dropped, blocked or intercepted) the defense immediately takes possession of the disc and becomes the offense.
6. **Substitutions** – Players not in the game may replace players in the game after a score or during an injury time-out.
7. **Non-contact** – No physical contact is allowed between players. Picks and screens are also prohibited. A foul occurs when contact is made.
8. **Fouls** – When a player initiates contact on another player, a foul occurs. When a foul disrupts possession the play resumes as if the possession was retained. If the player committing the foul disagrees with the foul, the play is redone.
9. **Self-Refereeing** – Players are responsible for their own foul and line calls. Players resolve their own disputes.
10. **Spirit of the Game** – Ultimate stresses sportsmanship and fair play. Competitive play is encouraged, but never at the expense of respect between players, adherence to the rules, and the basic joy of play.

HOW TO GET PLACES

Directions from the Ridpath Hotel to the Polo Grounds

Take I-90 Westbound to the Airport (highway 2) exit. Stay in the right lane, proceed west on highway 2 approximately 1 mile until you see the signs for the Polo Grounds. Turn Right at the Polo Grounds sign and follow the dirt road to the venue site.

Directions from the Polo Grounds to Sacred Heart Medical Center

From the Polo Grounds go down Highway 2, go to I-90, go east on I-90 to the division street exit. take a right at the bottom of the exit, turn right at the next stop sign. curve around to your left at the top of the hill, turn left at the light. follow the signs to the emergency room.

Directions from the Ridpath Hotel to University High School

Go to I-90 Eastbound (towards Coeur d'Alene). Take the Argonne exit. Go right (south). Argonne will become Dishman-Mica at Sprague Avenue. Continue on Dishman-Mica to 8th Avenue then turn left. Continue on 8th to South Walnut Rd. then turn right. Go to East 9th Avenue turn left.



Led by captains Danielle Schwartz ('02) and Pauline Lauterbach ('02), Disco has attended the Stanford Invitational, College Easterns, Ultimaxx, and Yale Cup tournaments to prepare for the College Series.

College Sectionals marked the beginning of the official College Series. Disco Inferno emerged as Southern New England Sectional champions against U Mass Amherst, Wesleyan, Yale, and Brown B.

As reigning Northeast Regional champions, Disco blasted through their pre-quarter and quarterfinal games on Saturday against Amherst and Wellesley, meeting rival Tufts E-Wo in the semifinals. After exchanging points early in the 1st half, Disco picked up steam and dominated to win 15-7. It was an intense battle for the Regional championship, marked by incredible offense and defense from both Disco and MIT. Disco eventually lost the highly spirited and competitive game, 10-15. Disco then rallied back with a decisive win over Yale, 15-4, to secure a 2nd place Regional bid to Nationals.

With an impressive arsenal of effective defenses and offensive plays, strong play against other teams in the region, and an inspirational coach that has truly cemented the team together, Disco Inferno is ready to make another run against the best teams in the country at College Nationals in late May.

2002 Callahan Award

Each year the Callahan Award is presented to the most valuable players in both the men's and women's division of college ultimate. Every college or university with an ultimate team can submit one candidate for the award and this year over 80 players from the men's division and 40 from the women's division were nominated.

Who wins the award is based on a vote of the player's peers with every college player being eligible to vote. Players could vote up until the Monday before the UPA Championship. The winners are announced Saturday evening before the finals.

Last year's winner in the men's division, Alex Nord, not only put in a dominating performance at the Championship tournament (he would undoubtedly have been the tournament MVP if there was such an award), but led his team, Carleton College, to its first ever college championship.
