

Welcome to the Tourney



- Time-cap goes on at end of round time on schedule. Add two points to higher score after first score after time-cap.
 Play to that total. No more win by two.



The time-cap does not affect timeouts.

Directions & Maps

TO THE SKAGIT RIVER PARK:

Gilkey Road East Burlington, WA

The Skagit River Park in Burlington will be the main site for the UPA College Ultimate Championships. Series play for Friday, May 28th and Saturday, May 29th will occur at this site.

Skagit River Park is in Burlington, WA, about one hour north of Seattle. From I-5, take Exit 229 (George Hopper Road) and head east (if you are coming from the north, turn left, from the south, turn right). At Burlington Blvd, turn left. At the Pease Road stoplight (near Shari's), turn right. Cross the railroad tracks; the road turns sharply left onto S Anacortes Street. Continue on Anacortes for 1/2 a mile to Gilkey Road, and turn right. Follow this road for about 1/4 mile. The fields and the parking lot are on the right.



TO THE UNITED GENERAL HOSPITAL: 2000 Hospital Dr, Sedro-Woolley, WA

From the parking lot, go straight out onto S. Skagit Street, Go one mile and turn right on SR-20 (immediately after railroad). Continue on SR-20 for approximately two miles. The hospital is on the left.

TO MARYSVILLE-PILCHUCK STADIUM: 5611 108th Street NE Marysville, WA

Finals will be played at Marysville-Pilchuck High School. The high school is approximately 30 minutes south of the Best Western Cottontree Inn.

From the hotel, head south on I-5 for about 25 miles. Take exit 202 (116th St NE), and turn left onto 116th Street. Turn right onto Smokey Point Blvd/State Ave. Turn left onto 100th Street, then take an immediate left onto Shoultes Road. Turn right onto 108th Street. The school will be on your left with the stadium at the northeast corner.


From Marysville-Pilchuck High School (about 8


TO THE SEATAC AIRPORT:

Head south on I-5 for about 73 miles. Take exit 154B and head west on Route 518 to the Sea-Tac Airport Exit.




