UPA College Championships Final on CSTV – Your Cooperation is needed!

For the first time, the UPA and CSTV will televise the finals of the 2007 UPA College Ultimate Championships within two weeks of crowning the champions! Mark your calendar now to watch the 2007 UPA College Ultimate Championships on College Sports Television! Final 1 will air nationally on CSTV June 9, 4 – 6 pm EDT, and Final 2 Sunday June 10, 7:00 – 9:00pm EDT. Each program will air a minimum of five additional times during primetime, so check cstv.com for additional broadcast schedules. Programs will be aired “live to tape” with limited editing and lots of excitement from both on the field and in the stands.

Broadcasts will also air on CSTV.com no later than July 1, 2007.

The UPA thanks VC Ultimate and Discraft for their sponsorship of the broadcasts.

The UPA asks your cooperation when approached by members of the camera crew for interviews. Please be respectful and do your best to talk about your passion for Ultimate and your participation. Teams qualifying for the finals should be prepared to participate in interviews immediately following the conclusion of their semifinal game.

Camera people will be respectful of your space and will do their best to stay out of the way while they film. However, accidents can happen. If you or your team come across any issues during competition, please contact a member of the tournament staff – not a camera person – who will follow up with the production crew.

Dogs must be leashed!

No Alcohol! – This goes for both the main field site and the finals stadium. The main fields are on the Ohio State University campus where alcohol is prohibited. University employees and event staff will be checking to make sure people are not drinking. There will also be lots of moms, dads, and kids watching the action. Please abide by these rules. The stadium is at a high school where, of course, alcohol is prohibited. If you are caught with alcohol at either of the field site(s) you will be asked to leave the site and risk disqualification for your team, as well as potential ramifications outside of the event for breaking the field regulations. Thank you!

No tent stakes! – Per university facility regulations, do not drive stakes into the ground. This includes stakes for shade tents. Shade tents are fine to use at the fields, but teams are responsible for making sure they are anchored down sufficiently by some method other than staking. If you have questions about whether something is OK, please contact the tournament director.

Field boundaries! – In Ultimate, a lot of action can occur outside of the perimeter lines of the field. Where boundary lines are established around playing fields, all equipment and spectators must remain outside of those lines. Where boundary lines are not established, spectators and equipment should be at least 3 meters away from the perimeter lines of the playing field. Spectators should remain aware of the action on the field and be prepared to move themselves and any equipment, in case game play takes players outside of the perimeter lines.

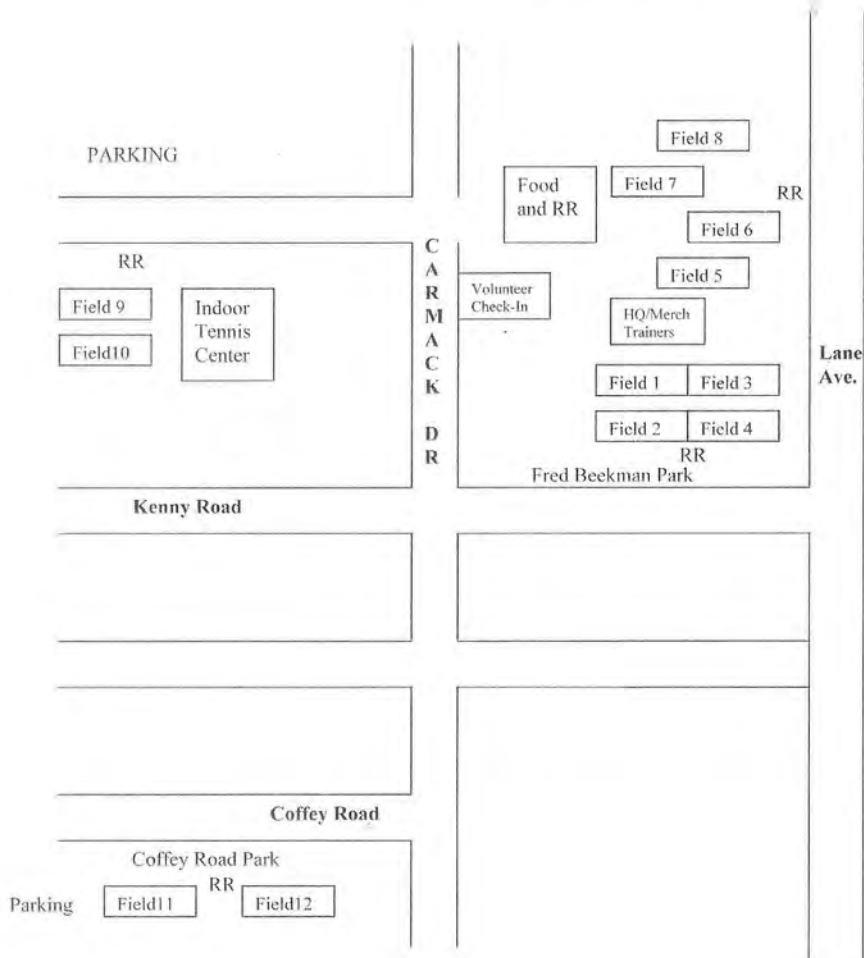

- 11th Edition Rules of Ultimate will be in effect. Observers will be used in all games, along with the Team Misconduct Foul system.
- All games to 15, point-cap at 17.
- Half-time is 5 minutes.
- Each team has two timeouts per half.
- Regardless of how many timeouts a team has used before overtime, during overtime each team has one timeout.
- Overtime: A game is in overtime if tied at one point less than original game total (e.g. In a game to 15 goals, overtime occurs when the score reaches 14-14).
- Soft time-cap goes on at end of round time on schedule. Add two points to higher score after first score after soft time-cap. Game ends when first team reaches new game total, or when first team reaches 15 ahead by at least two points, whichever comes first.
- Hard time-cap goes on 15 minutes after the soft time-cap. Game is over at the end of the point in progress, unless tied. If tied, play one more point.
- Caps do not affect timeouts.

Ultimate has traditionally relied upon a spirit of sportsmanship which places the responsibility for fair play on the player himself. Highly competitive play is encouraged, but never at the expense of the bond of mutual respect between players, adherence to the agreed-upon rules of the game, or the basic joy of play.

- UPA 11th Edition Rules of Ultimate

Team Awards - Following every game, each team will be asked to rate its opponent on a scale of 1-5, with 5 being the rating for the highest level of sportsmanship. These ratings will be averaged and the team in each division with the highest rating will be awarded the Team Spirit Award after their division's finals. The winning teams will each receive \$200 VC bucks, courtesy of VC Ultimate.

Individual Awards - Teams will each be asked to nominate a player from their own team who they feel displays the highest level of spirit. The definition of spirit is up to each team, but should include elements of sportsmanship, leadership, perseverance, fire, etc. Choose the person whose attitude you wish other people on your team would emulate and who other players off your team admire. Individual spirit winners will receive a medal, a Discraft SuperColor™ Spirit of the Game disc, and a 2004-5 College Championships DVD. Thanks to Discraft and CSTV for their support of Ultimate and Spirit of the Game.

Atlantic All-Star Showcase Game

The UPA is excited about creating a new opportunity to showcase the sport and entertain players and fans in conjunction with the College Championships. On Saturday evening, the UPA will host a showcase game between all-star club teams consisting of former college players from throughout the country.

The two all-star teams will be Mixed and consist of 12 players each (6 men and 6 women). One team will represent the East and the other the West. Each team represents 4 college regions (East – Atlantic Coast, Great Lakes, Metro East, New England; West – Central, Northwest, South, Southwest). Players for these teams were selected based on where they played in the College Series while in college, and on factors such as level of playing ability, position, and sportsmanship.

The Mixed format is 4/3 with the teams required to alternate the 4-person gender each point. The game will be to 15, point cap 17, soft time cap 1 hour 30 minutes, and will be observed and played under the 11th Edition Rules with time limits and line calls made by observers.

Health and Safety

Medical staff (trainer and EMT) will be available through the event at Tournament Central. Please seek advice and assistance regarding prevention and treatment of injuries or illness.

Directions to the local hospital can be found in the “Directions” section of this program.

Heat, Nutrition and Hydration

- Heat-related illness occurs where body cooling by evaporation is limited. Sweating depletes the body’s salt and moisture, which leads to dehydration. If a player recognizes any signs or symptoms of heat-related illness, he or she should treat the problem immediately.
- Signs and Symptoms of Heat Illness can include change in level of consciousness, abdominal cramps, nausea/vomiting, fatigue/tingling, chills, inability to spit, dry mucous membranes, decreased urine output and change in color.
- Prevention and Treatment of Heat Illness
 - o Avoid alcohol, caffeine, and carbonated beverages.
 - o Medications such as antihistamines, decongestants, certain asthma medications, and diuretics can increase risk for heat illness. Avoid them if possible.
 - o Avoid certain nutritional supplements (such as caffeine and ephedrine) that can dehydrate the body and/or increase metabolism and heat production.
 - o Know your body – Be honest! Are you fit enough to perform under current conditions?
 - o Drink and eat – Eat and drink (water AND sports drinks) “optimally” before, during, and after play. Potassium is important (good sources include: sports drinks, yogurt, grapefruit juice, bananas, and oranges). Sodium is also important (good sources include: sports drinks, vegetable juices, pretzels, nuts, cheese and crackers). After play, carbohydrates are important: foods such as potatoes, honey, cereal, white bread, corn chips, sports drinks, jelly beans, rice cakes, bagels, crackers, gummy candies).
 - o Don’t drink too much – Over-hydrating can be dangerous if it leads to a fluid and electrolyte imbalance.
 - o Monitor your urine – Clear/copious = hydrated. Dark = Need water/electrolytes.
 - o Be sensitive to prior illness – If you’ve been sick, your body may be more susceptible to dehydration.
 - o Rest and cool down after play – Find shade, wet the skin, get in front of a fan or breeze.

Health and Safety

Sideline Safety

- Players and spectators should make every effort to keep objects, including but not limited to bags, strollers, chairs, coolers and tents, as far away from the playing field as possible.
- If a player feels that an object on the sideline is not safe, s/he should inform Event Staff and should refrain from playing until s/he is satisfied that safe conditions have been established.
- The UPA and Event Staff reserve the right to move or remove objects or spectators from on or near the playing field if those conditions are, in the opinion of the UPA or Event Staff, unsafe for players, staff, or spectators.

Lightning Guidelines

- Event staff will communicate with players and spectators via PA system and field marshals equipped with radios that there is a lightning danger, play will be stopped, and everyone should seek shelter.
- Safe Shelter for players and spectators at the field sites includes any fully enclosed building or vehicle with a hard top and closed windows.
- Event staff will use the Flash-to Bang method to determine when to send people to shelter. By the time the Flash-to-Bang count has reached 30 seconds, all individuals should be in a safe shelter location.
- If you can't get to a safe shelter, try to avoid being the tallest object in an open field or on open water. Avoid other tall objects, metal objects, and water. Assume a crouch position with only the balls of your feet touching the ground, your arms wrapped around your knees, and your head lowered. Minimize contact with the ground. Do not lie flat.
- Avoid using telephone land lines. Cell phones are safe provided the person has followed other safety guidelines.
- Event staff will indicate to players when play is going to resume. Team captains should meet at Tournament Central to receive instructions for resuming play and any schedule modifications.

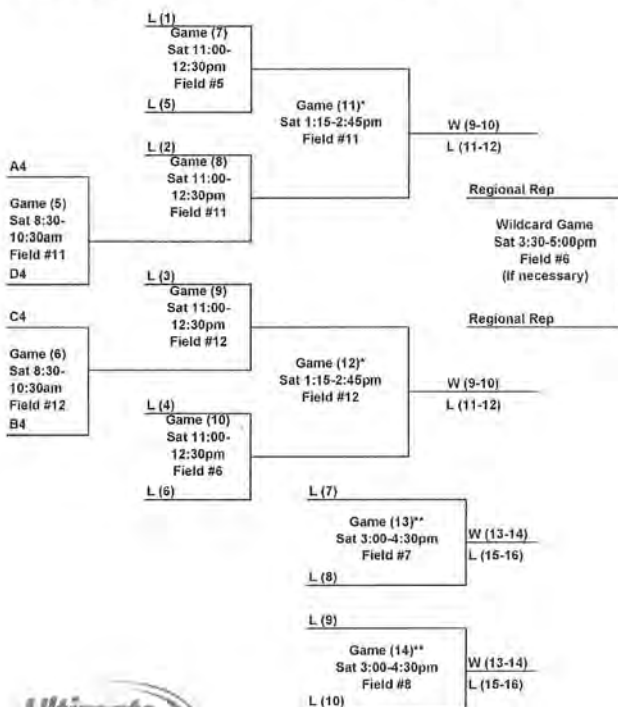
Concussions

- Concussions are brain injuries that can occur as a result of a blow to the head.
- Symptoms may include headache, nausea, vision problems, confusion, balance problems.
- If you think you or one of your teammates might have a concussion, tell your coach and have the person see a medical professional. Medical staff is on hand at the event at Tournament Central.

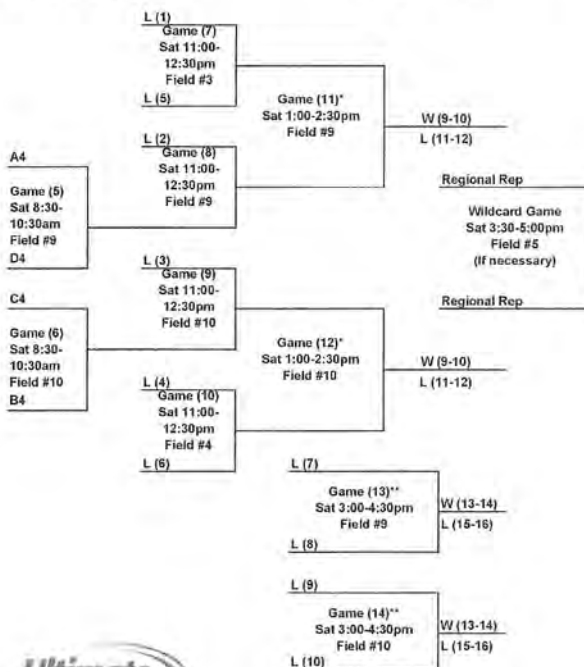

Consolation Brackets Saturday, May 26, 2007



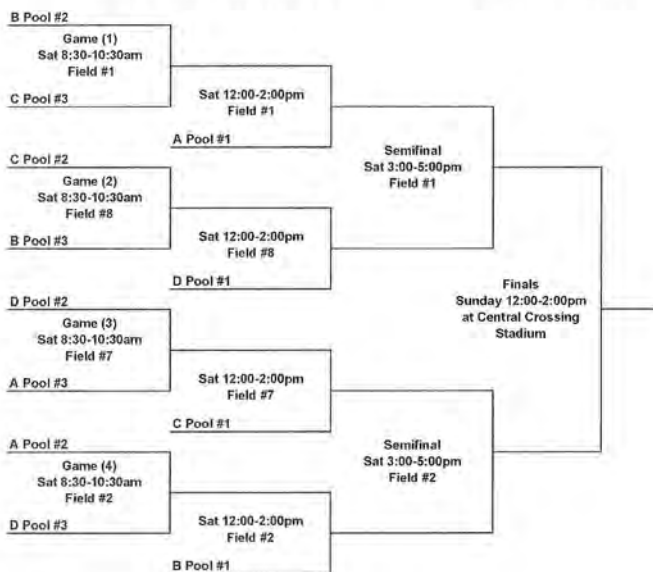
