## **COMPETITION RULES**

• 2022-2023 Official Rules of Ultimate will be in effect.

Changes from previous versions can be reviewed at usaultimate.org/rules

- All games to 15.
- Halftime cap goes on exactly halfway to hard cap (52:30 after the beginning of the game). If neither team has reached seven or more points, one point is added to the highest score after the completion of the point. Halftime will be taken once a team reaches the new halftime score.
- Halftime is seven minutes.
  - Halftime length does not include the time between pulls.
- Soft time cap goes on after 90 minutes (15 minutes before the hard cap). Add one point

to the higher score after the point during which the cap goes off is completed. Game ends when the first team reaches the new game total or when the first team reaches 15, whichever comes first.

- Soft cap for Semifinals and Finals will be at 1 hr 45 min.
- Hard time cap goes on at the end of the round time listed in the schedule (1 hr, 45 min). Finish the point in progress and the game is over unless tied. If tied, play one more point.
  - Hard caps will not be used for the semifinals and finals.
- Each team has two timeouts per half.
- Caps do not affect timeouts.

## SITE RULES

Inclement Weather Policy: If lightning or thunder is present any and all games should be suspended for 30 minutes from the last sighting and everyone should seek shelter. The staff member or official on duty has the right to cancel a game due to dangerous conditions.

#### General Parks

- Driving and Parking Observe parking restrictions and handicap/staff spots. Do not avoid traffic bumps, no through traffic in parking lots, 11 MPH speed limit.
- No Tobacco
- No Glass
- Dogs must be leashed
- No Firearms or weapons
- Restrooms Use them...not the fields, bushes or trees.
- No Abusive Language
- Spectators and Equipment must stay behind designated lines. Where there are not buffer lines, stay back from the sideline at least 5 yards



## **ULTIMATE IN 10 SIMPLE RULES**

**1. THE FIELD:** A rectangular shape with end zones at each end. A regulation field is 70 yards long by 40 yards wide, with end zones 20 yards deep.

**2. INITIATE PLAY**: Each point begins with both teams lining up on the front of opposing end zone lines. The defense throws ("pulls") the disc to the offense. A regulation game has seven players per team.

**3. SCORING:** Each time the offense completes a pass in the defense's end zone, the offense scores a point. Play is initiated after each score.

**4. MOVEMENT OF THE DISC:** The disc may be advanced in any direction by completing a pass to a teammate. Players may not run with the disc. The person with the disc ("thrower") has ten seconds to throw the disc. The defender guarding the thrower ("marker") counts out the stall count.

**5. CHANGE OF POSSESSION:** When a pass is not completed (e.g., out of bounds, drop, block, interception), the defense immediately takes possession of the disc and becomes the offense.

**6. SUBSTITUTIONS:** Players not in the game may replace players in the game after a score or during an injury timeout.

**7. NON-CONTACT:** No physical contact is allowed between players. Players must attempt to avoid physical contact during play. Picks and screens are also prohibited.

**8. FOULS:** When a player initiates contact that affects the play, a foul occurs. When a foul causes a player to lose possession, the play resumes as if the possession was retained. If the player that the foul was called against disagrees with the foul call, the play is redone.

**9. SELF-OFFICIATING:** Players are responsible for their own foul and line calls. Players resolve their own disputes.

**10. SPIRIT OF THE GAME:** The foundation of the rules of ultimate is Spirit of the Game, which places the responsibility for fair play on the players. Competitive play is encouraged, but never at the expense of respect between players, adherence to the rules, and the basic joy of play.

## **GLOSSARY OF ULTIMATE TERMS**

BREAKMARK - a throw made to other side of the field from what is being forced by the marker

**BRICK MARK** – the spot where play may be initiated when a pull lands out of bounds, typically 15 or 20 yards from the front of the offense's end zone and in the center of the field (yardage varies based on individual tournament rules); players have the option of making this call or taking the disc on the sideline closest to where it lands

 $\ensuremath{\textbf{CALLAHAN}}\xspace - a$  defensive score, occurs when a defender catches the disc in the end zone he or she is attacking

**CUP** – the wall of defenders that surround the thrower in a zone defense; the wall typically consists of 3 players, but variations with 2 or 4 defenders are also common

FLICK - forehand, thrown outside, away from the handler's body

FORCE — side of the field to which throws should be contained; the marker will attempt to take away throws to one part of the field and is said to be "forcing" throws to go up in a certain direction

**GREATEST** — a jump, throw, catch combination that occurs when the disc is out-of-bounds, but a player jumps from in-bounds, catches the disc and successfully throws it back in-bounds to a teammate

 $\label{eq:HAMMER-anderson} \textbf{HAMMER} - \textbf{an overhead throw that starts above the shoulders where the disc turns over in the air and lands upside-down$ 

HUCK – a long throw

**POACH** – a defensive decision to leave a designated one-on-one matchup, usually temporarily, to clog a cutting lane or help defend a player other than the original

**PULL** – the "kick-off" of each point in which the defensive team throws the disc from their own end zone down the field toward the offensive team

**STALL** – the 10-second count for which a player is allowed to maintain possession of the disc; the opposing, defensive player must count the 10-seconds aloud; a "stall" occurs if the disc is held for more than the 10-second count

 $\label{eq:strip} \textbf{STRIP} - \textbf{occurs when a disc is knocked out of a player's hands after they have stopped rotation and achieved possession$ 



## FAQS

#### Q: Why are teams circling up with one another after the game?

A: That is called a spirit circle. An idea borrowed from international competitions in the ultimate world, the spirit circle will include comments from both teams to communicate positive play, constructive criticism and general conversation. Teams might exchange a small gift or partake in a cheer to show respect to one another and build relationships. It is not required but heavily encouraged.

#### Q: Where is my team playing? What field am I on? Where can I watch a team play?

A: All questions regarding site information can be answered by someone at the USA Ultimate Information Tent. You can also look for someone with a USA Ultimate badge/ lanyard who will promptly find a way for your question to get answered.

#### Q: How close to the field can I watch the game?

A: Spectators and equipment must stay at least five yards away from the sidelines. Where there are buffer lines, respect them. Where there are not buffer lines, stay back at least five yards for your safety as well as for players.

#### Q: I lost my water bottle/jersey/hat/etc. Where can I find them?

A: Lost and found items will be located at the USA Ultimate Information Tent. If your item is not there, check back at another time.

#### Q: Can I drink alcohol on site?

A: Yes, but you are not allowed to bring your own. Alcohol can be bought at the field with what is offered by the site.

#### Q: Who are the people in orange or green on the field who look like referees?

A: Those are observers! While USA Ultimate has one of the most unique and defining characteristics in its reliance upon players to officiate the game, observers are allowed to resolve disputes should the players request it. Unlike other referees, umpires or judges, observers are not allowed to make active foul and violation calls of a subjective nature. Observers may only make active calls related to conduct issues or objective rules like time violations and boundary decisions.

#### Q: What happens if there's lightning?

A: Event staff will communicate via a PA system and field marshals if there is lightning danger. All play will be stopped. Event staff will indicate to players when play will resume and captains should meet at Tournament Central when it is safe to receive instruction on resuming play and any schedule modifications.

#### Q: I want to get involved! Can I help out at the events?

A: Yes! USA Ultimate heavily relies on its incredible volunteers to make every event yearround work smoothly. Find a volunteer or USA Ultimate staff member and they will connect you with a local contact. Otherwise, visit usaultimate.org/about/volunteer/.

NORTH CAROLINA 15, BROWN 10 2022 College Championships May 30, 2022 - Milwaukee, WI

North Carolina won its third title in four years, pulling off the back-to-back championship run. Darkside, led by head coach David Allison and assistant coaches Matt Gouchoe-Hanas and JD Hastings, won all four games in

pool play, including wins over California, Vermont, Wisconsin and Ohio State. After a firstround bye, it was back to action for Callahan nominee Liam Searles-Bohs and Darkside as the defending champions took down 2021 College Championships runner-up Georgia. After another win in the semifinals against No. 2 ranked Colorado, Darkside faced off against No. 1 ranked Brown, led by Callahan winner John Randolph. With efficient offense and stifling defense, Darkside took over the college world for the second year in a row.



NORTH CAROLINA 15, GEORGIA 11 2021 College Championships Dec. 20, 2021 – Norco, CA

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the 2021 College Championships would take place in December. In the first College Championship since 2019, it was North Carolina who went chalk as the No. 1 ranked team in the tournament. After sweeping through California-San Diego, Texas, Wisconsin and Michigan in pool play, Darkside would dispatch Colorado after

a first-round bye. It was Alexander Davis and Matthew McKnight doing the damage in the semifinals against an Azeez Adeyemi-led Brown. A surprise championship appearance from Georgia was not enough to turn the tide as Darkside would take home the trophy as the best college team in the country for 2021.



BROWN 14, NORTH CAROLINA 8 2019 College Championships May 27, 2019 – Round Rock, TX

In Texas, Brown would make its first appearance in the College National Championship since a Brownian Motion title in 2005. Led by coaches Samuel Lehman and James Smart, Brown would steam through pool play, picking up wins

against Iowa State, North Carolina State, Texas and Michigan. Led by Callahan-nominee Mac Hecht, Brown would defeat Ohio State in quarterfinals and Colorado in semifinals. Ranked No. 2 in the country, Brown had no issue in the finals as the Providence-based team would claim the 2019 College Championship title for the first time in 14 years.





NORTH CAROLINA 14, PITTSBURGH 10 2018 College Championships May 28, 2018 – Milwaukee, WI

North Carolina entered the 2018 College Championships as the No. 2 seed in the tournament. After three straight pool play wins, North Carolina would drop its final pool play game to William & Mary, the No. 14 seed. However, the loss didn't hold Darkside back in bracket competition. Led by future Callahan winner Matt

Gouchoe-Hanas and a talented cutter lineup, Darkside would take down Washington in the quarterfinals. Following a Universe Point win against Oregon in the semifinals, North Carolina would win its second title in school history by defeating No. 9 seeded Pittsburgh in the finals.



CARLETON COLLEGE 15, UNC-WILMINGTON 11 2017 College Championships May 29, 2017 – Cincinnati, OH

Carleton College entered the tournament as the No. 6 seed in the tournament, making it the second lowest seed to win the College Championships since its own win in 2012 (No. 12 seed). After beating Auburn, Oregon State and Colorado in pool play, the future champions would lose by five to a strong

North Carolina. Entering the bracket, wins over Michigan and Minnesota gave Carleton College momentum before beating No. 1 seeded Massachusetts in semifinals on Universe Point. In the final, it was No. 11 seeded UNC-Wilmington, led by star player Jack Williams but it was Carleton College with Joe White, Henry Fisher and crew who would claim the 2017 College Championships throne for CUT.



MINNESOTA 15, HARVARD 12 2016 College Championships May 30, 2016 – Raleigh, NC

The eventual champion Minnesota would have a rough start in 2016. As the No. 4 seed overall and No. 1 seed in its pool, Minnesota won against Utah and Carleton College but would drop games to No. 5 seed Pittsburgh and No. 16 seed Auburn. Led by head coach Tallis Boyd and David Eddy, Grey Duck would

bounce back in a big way to start the bracket play, defeating No. 1 seed Massachusetts by four in the prequarterfinal match-up. Minnesota would roll on past Colorado and Pittsburgh in the quarterfinals and semifinals, respectively. It was surprise finalist No. 10 seed Harvard with John Stubbs who'd be waiting in the final but Grey Duck, led by cutters Ben Jagt and Ryan Osgar, would push Grey Duck to its first title in school history.



NORTH CAROLINA 15, OREGON 6 2015 College Championships May 25, 2015 – Milwaukee, WI

North Carolina would begin its recent dynasty run in 2015 in Milwaukee, Wis. with its first title in school history. Coached by Michael Denardis and Dennis Tarasi, Darkside would go 3-1 in pool play, defeating Florida State, Illinois and Maryland

but dropping its final game to Oregon. With a first-round bye in pool play, Darkside would go on a dream run, finishing its final three games of the tournament with a +20-point differential. With wins against Colorado and Central Florida in bracket play, it would be a finals match-up with Oregon, the lowest seeded team to ever make a College Championships final, seeded at No. 15. Oregon's Ego, led by coach Jay Janin and cutter Dylan Freechild, had a dream run until the finals. It would be Callahan winner Jonathan Nethercutt and Ben Snell who would help Darkside paint the college world Carolina blue in 2015.



COLORADO 15, NORTH CAROLINA 10 2014 College Championships May 26, 2014 – Mason, OH

Following three runner-up finishes in 2005, 2007 and 2009, Colorado would claim its second title in school history since 2004. Led by Callahan winner, Jimmy Mickle, Mamabird would drop one game in the tournament to California-San Diego.

With pool play wins against Harvard, Eastern Michigan and Wisconsin as well as bracket wins against Michigan and Oregon, Mamabird would roll past all competition to face off against a strong No. 6 seed in North Carolina. It was all Mamabird as the No. 1 seed would not lose and claimed the throne in 2014.



PITTSBURGH 15, CENTRAL FLORIDA 8 2013 College Championships May 27, 2013 – Madison, WI

Pittsburgh would be just the fifth team in history to go back-toback in the men's division with its performance in 2013. Ranked No. 4 overall, Pittsburgh would go 3-1 in pool play with wins over UNC-Wilmington, Texas and Illinois but dropping a game to

Arizona. With a first-round bye, Pittsburgh would take down No. 3 ranked North Carolina in quarterfinals and No. 1 ranked Oregon in semifinals to face Central Florida in the final. The team from Pennsylvania was not to be denied by No. 6 ranked Central Florida as the champions rolled by seven to claim its second title in school history.





PITTSBURGH 15, WISCONSIN 10 2012 College Championships May 27, 2012 – Boulder, CO

Despite being the only top seed in pool play to drop a game, Pittsburgh would appear in and win its first title game in school history. With pool play wins against California-Davis, Luther and Texas, Pittsburgh would lose to No. 15 seed Michigan. The champions would not miss a beat, thrashing Minnesota in quarterfinals. With a tight win against Carleton College in semifinals, Pittsburgh would complete the run, taking down No. 4 seed Wisconsin in the final. The two teams had met twice already in the season and Pittsburgh would win the last match-up to complete a strong season and take home the championship trophy.

NORTH CAROLINA 12, COLORADO 11 2022 College Championships May 30, 2022 - Milwaukee, WI

North Carolina became the fifth team in women's history to go back-to-back with the title defense in 2022. Pleiades went chalk in Milwaukee, winning all games

as the No. 1 seed in the tournament. Wins over Stanford, Florida State, Georgia and Northeastern in pool play gave Callahan winner Dawn Culton-led UNC a first-round bye. After advancing swiftly past British Columbia and California-Santa Barbara, the team from Chapel Hill would play in the second-ever Universe Point final, winning the championship on heroics from Anne Worth and Alexandra Barnett. The college world was Carolina blue for the second year in a row.



NORTH CAROLINA 15, WASHINGTON 6 2021 College Championships Dec. 20, 2021 – Norco, CA

North Carolina had never appeared in a College Championships final but that changed in 2021. Pleiades would run the table, starting with four straight wins in pool play over Ohio, Western Washington, California-Davis and

Georgia. Led by coaches Jessica Jones and David Allison, Pleiades would take down defending champion UC-San Diego in quarterfinals. Semifinals was a convincing win over UC-Santa Barbara and the finals was more of the same as Pleiades would win its first title in school history over Washington, thanks to the play of Dawn Culton, Alexandra Barnett and Bridget Mizener.



CALIFORNIA-SAN DIEGO 12, DARTMOUTH 11 2019 College Championships May 27, 2019 – Round Rock, TX

California-San Diego's Psycho would shock the college world in 2019 as Dena Elimelech would help lead the team to its first title since 2002. Led by coaches Alisha Stoun and Carlo Mosca, Psycho would take down Western Washington,

Northwestern and Georgia in pool play while dropping to Tufts. It was a close win in quarterfinals against Carleton College and a big win over Ohio State in the semifinals. After a prequarters loss in 2018, UCSD would face a back-to-back defending champion in Dartmouth, equipped with Callahan winner Jack Verzuh. Psycho would win the first Universe point final in women's history to rule the college world in 2019.



DARTMOUTH 15, COLORADO 9 2018 College Championships May 28, 2018 – Milwaukee, WI

In 2018, Dartmouth would become just the fourth team in women's history to go back-to-back. Princess Layout, led by Caitlyn Lee and Claire Trop, did not let any team score double digits while in Milwaukee for College Championships. Pool play wins over Tufts, California-Santa Barbara, Colorado and West

Chester gave Dartmouth more confidence. A win in quarterfinals over British Columbia and a win in semifinals over Stanford made for a pool play rematch with Colorado. Despite Colorado's dream run as the lowest seeded team to make a women's final (No. 12), it was Eugune Yum's Princess Layout with college dominance for the school's second title.



DARTMOUTH 15, TEXAS 9 2017 College Championships May 29, 2017 – Cincinnati, OH

Dartmouth dominance began in 2017 as Princess Layout would take over the college world. Led by Callahan winner Angela Zhu, Dartmouth would finish second in pool play dropping to a strong No. 11 seed in Oregon. With big wins over Delaware, Notre Dame and Florida in pool play, Princess

Layout would advance with a win over Michigan. It was a No. 1 versus No. 2 match-up in quarterfinals against Stanford's Superfly but Dartmouth was not to be stopped. After dispatching British Columbia in the semifinals, Dartmouth, coached by Eugene Yum and Laura Bitterman, would face off against Texas in the final. Neither team had made a final in school history but it was Dartmouth would claim its first title over Texas' Melee.





STANFORD 12, WHITMAN 10 2016 College Championships May 30, 2016 – Raleigh, NC

As the only team to ever three-peat in college ultimate history, Stanford returned to the top of the college world since its three championships from 2005-2007. Following a disappointing runner-up in 2015, Stanford wasted no time with pool play wins over Michigan, Washington, Ohio State

and Southern California. Led by coaches Robin Davis, Stephanie Lim and Jenny Wang, Superfly would win easily against Colorado in quarterfinals. In a semifinal classic, Stanford exercised the demon, picking up a 15-13 win over defending champion Oregon. With a finals match-up against Whitman, No. 3 ranked Stanford, led by Courtney Gregg and Caitlin Go, would claim the eighth Superfly title, the most by any team in college history.



OREGON 13, STANFORD 11 2015 College Championships May 25, 2015 – Milwaukee, WI

Oregon's dynasty was rolling in 2015 as Fugue appeared in its fourth consecutive final. Led by Bethany Kaylor, Jesse Shofner and Olivia Bartruff, Fugue would defeat Notre Dame, Victoria, Florida State and Central Florida handily

in pool play. A quarterfinal thrashing of Dartmouth and a convincing win over British Columbia in the semifinals, Rogue would face a strong Stanford Superfly, led by Michela Meister and Stephanie Lim, in the finals. A tight win in Milwaukee would once again throne Oregon's Fugue as the champions of the college world with two titles in three years.



OHIO STATE 15, OREGON 11 2014 College Championships May 26, 2014 – Mason, OH

It was all Ohio State in 2014 as Fever would run the table to take home its first title in school history. Led by coaches Nick Hamilton, Brent Reeb and DeAnna Ball, teams could do little to stop Ohio State as the champions

would pick up pool play wins against Michigan, Kansas, Victoria and Virginia. With dominating play from Callahan winner Cassie Swafford and crew, Ohio State strolled past Carleton College and Washington in quarterfinals and semifinals. It would be defending champion Oregon in the finals but Fever didn't skip a beat. In its first title appearance in school history, Ohio State would win it all in 2014.



OREGON 15, CARLETON COLLEGE 8 2013 College Championships May 27, 2013 – Madison, WI

Oregon was unstoppable in 2013 as the squad didn't allow anyone in the tournament to score more than 11 points in all match-ups. With pool play wins over Wisconsin, Northeastern, Stanford and Minnesota, Oregon would advance to bracket play with a first

round bye. A thrashing of British Columbia in the quarterfinals and the closest score in semifinals with an 15-11 win over Iowa, No. 2 ranked Carleton College could do little to stop Oregon as the team would claim the second title in school history, following its runner-up finish in 2012. The 2013 Oregon squad would lose only one game the entire year.



WASHINGTON 15, OREGON 7 2012 College Championships May 27, 2012 – Boulder, CO

Despite finishing second in pool play, Washington would claim

its first title in school history after runner-up finishes in 2005 and 2009. With pool play wins against Delaware, Humboldt State and UCLA, Washington would drop a game to No. 7 seed Iowa. The first two games of bracket play were big wins against British Columbia and Texas. A boost of semifinal momentum with a Universe Point win against Tufts made Washington unstoppable in the final. Despite facing No. 1 seeded Oregon, Washington took home the title for the first time with a convincing win in Boulder, the only time a No. 1 seed has lost in the finals.
