COMPETITION RULES

- 2024-2025 Official Rules of Ultimate will be in effect.
 - Changes from previous versions can be reviewed at usultimate.org/rules.
- All games to 15.
- **Halftime cap** goes on exactly halfway to hard cap (52:30 after the beginning of the game). If neither team has reached seven or more points, one point is added to the highest score after the completion of the point. Halftime will be taken once a team reaches the new halftime score.
- Halftime is seven minutes.
 - Halftime length does not include the time between pulls.
- **Soft time cap** goes on after 90 minutes (15 minutes before the hard cap). Add one point to the higher score after the point during which the cap goes off is completed. Game ends when the first team reaches the new game total or when the first team reaches 15, whichever comes first.
 - Soft cap for Semifinals and Finals will be at 1 hr 45 min
- Hard time cap goes on at the end of the round time listed in the schedule (1 hr, 45 min). Finish the point in progress and the game is over unless tied. If tied, play one more point.
 - Hard caps will not be used for the semifinals and finals.
- Each team has two timeouts per half.
- Caps do not affect timeouts.

SITE RULES

Inclement Weather Policy: If lightning or thunder is present any and all games should be suspended for 30 minutes from the last sighting and everyone should seek shelter. The staff member or official on duty has the right to cancel a game due to dangerous conditions.

- Pets are allowed, must be on a leash and owners are responsible for cleaning up after pets.
- No Glass.
- No Tobacco.
- No Alcohol.
- No Drugs & Cannabis Products.
- No Firearms/weapons (including knives).
- No Explosives.
- No motorized vehicles (including drones).
- Field Access: Spectators and equipment must stay at least three yards away from sidelines and behind any spectator/equipment lines or barriers! Where there are buffer lines, respect them. Where there are not buffer lines, stay back at least three yards.
- Trash and Recycling: Place recyclables in the recycling receptacles, and place trash in the trash.
- Guests and Spectators: You and your team are responsible for the people on your sidelines and making sure they abide by these site rules.

ULTIMATE IN 10 SIMPLE RULES

1. THE FIELD: A rectangular shape with end zones at each end. A regulation field is 70 yards long by 40 yards wide, with end zones 20 yards deep.

2. INITIATE PLAY: Each point begins with both teams lining up on the front of opposing end zone lines. The defense throws (“pulls”) the disc to the offense. A regulation game has seven players per team.

3. SCORING: Each time the offense completes a pass in the defense’s end zone, the offense scores a point. Play is initiated after each score

4. MOVEMENT OF THE DISC: The disc may be advanced in any direction by completing a pass to a teammate. Players may not run with the disc. The person with the disc (“thrower”) has ten seconds to throw the disc. The defender guarding the thrower (“marker”) counts out the stall count.

5. CHANGE OF POSSESSION: When a pass is not completed (e.g., out of bounds, drop, block, interception), the defense immediately takes possession of the disc and becomes the offense.

6. SUBSTITUTIONS: Players not in the game may replace players in the game after a score or during an injury timeout.

7. NON-CONTACT: No physical contact is allowed between players. Players must attempt to avoid physical contact during play. Picks and screens are also prohibited.

8. FOULS: When a player initiates contact that affects the play, a foul occurs. When a foul causes a player to lose possession, the play resumes as if the possession was retained. If the player that the foul was called against disagrees with the foul call, the play is redone.

9. SELF-OFFICIATING: Players are responsible for their own foul and line calls. Players resolve their own disputes.

10. SPIRIT OF THE GAME: The foundation of the rules of ultimate is Spirit of the Game, which places the responsibility for fair play on the players. Competitive play is encouraged, but never at the expense of respect between players, adherence to the rules, and the basic joy of play.

GLOSSARY OF ULTIMATE TERMS

BREAKMARK – a throw made to other side of the field from what is being forced by the marker

BRICK MARK – the spot where play may be initiated when a pull lands out of bounds, typically 15 or 20 yards from the front of the offense’s end zone and in the center of the field (yardage varies based on individual tournament rules); players have the option of making this call or taking the disc on the sideline closest to where it lands

CALLAHAN – a defensive score, occurs when a defender catches the disc in the end zone he or she is attacking

CUP – the wall of defenders that surround the thrower in a zone defense; the wall typically consists of 3 players, but variations with 2 or 4 defenders are also common

FLICK – forehand, thrown outside, away from the handler’s body

FORCE – side of the field to which throws should be contained; the marker will attempt to take away throws to one part of the field and is said to be “forcing” throws to go up in a certain direction

GREATEST – a jump, throw, catch combination that occurs when the disc is out-of-bounds, but a player jumps from in-bounds, catches the disc and successfully throws it back in-bounds to a teammate

HAMMER – an overhead throw that starts above the shoulders where the disc turns over in the air and lands upside-down

HUCK – a long throw

POACH – a defensive decision to leave a designated one-on-one matchup, usually temporarily, to clog a cutting lane or help defend a player other than the original

PULL – the “kick-off” of each point in which the defensive team throws the disc from their own end zone down the field toward the offensive team

STALL – the 10-second count for which a player is allowed to maintain possession of the disc; the opposing, defensive player must count the 10-seconds aloud; a “stall” occurs if the disc is held for more than the 10-second count

STRIP – occurs when a disc is knocked out of a player’s hands after they have stopped rotation and achieved possession

Brown reclaims the crown for the first time since 2019. With the fourth title in school history, it moves Brownian Motion to T-3rd in men's division titles. Led by coaches James Smart, Jonathan Stout, Nate Taylor, Brown struggled in pool play, dropping to No. 1 seed and back-to-back-to-back champs North Carolina and a Universe point loss to Oregon State. Wins over Texas and Alabama-Huntsville put them in the bracket where they beat No. 20 seed Michigan. A win over No. 2 seed Georgia in quarters and a victory over No. 4 seed Colorado landed them into the final against No. 5 seed Cal Poly-SLO. A strong performance by Callahan finalist and captain Jacques Nissen (two goals, six assists) and four goals from Cal Nightingale was too much as Brown etched its name in history for the fourth time in Madison.

North Carolina etches its name in history as the third men's team to three-peat, appearing in their fifth straight final. Darkside moves into second place all-time for total titles with 5. Darkside, led by coaches David Allison, Matt Gouchoe-Hanas, Ben Snell, and JD Hastings, dropped one pool play game and faced off against a strong Brown team in the quarterfinals. Callahan nominee Andrew Li and a strong all-around squad passed No. 3 ranked Vermont in the semis before defeating No. 2 ranked Massachusetts, who appeared in their first final since 1986. Ultimately, one of the most dominant runs in college history continues as North Carolina will attempt the first ever four straight championships in 2024.

North Carolina won its third title in four years, pulling off the back-to-back championship run. After a first-round bye, it was back to action for Callahan nominee Liam Searles-Bohs and Darkside as the defending champions took down 2021 College Championships runner-up Georgia. After another win in the semifinals against No. 2 ranked Colorado, Darkside faced off against No. 1 ranked Brown, led by Callahan winner John Randolph. With efficient offense and stifling defense, Darkside took over the college world for the second year in a row.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the 2021 College Championships would take place in December. In the first College Championship since 2019, it was North Carolina who went chalk as the No. 1 ranked team in the tournament. After sweeping through UC-San Diego, Texas, Wisconsin and

Michigan in pool play, Darkside would dispatch Colorado after a first-round bye. It was Alexander Davis and Matthew McKnight doing the damage in the semifinals against an Azeez Adeyemi-led Brown. A surprise championship appearance from Georgia was not enough to turn the tide as Darkside would take home the trophy as the best college team in the country for 2021.

In Texas, Brown would make its first appearance in the College National Championship since a Brownian Motion title in 2005. Led by coaches Samuel Lehman and James Smart, Brown would steam through pool play, picking up

wins against Iowa State, North Carolina State, Texas and Michigan. Led by Callahan-nominee Mac Hecht, Brown would defeat Ohio State in quarterfinals and Colorado in semifinals. Ranked No. 2 in the country, Brown had no issue in the finals as the Providence-based team would claim the 2019 College Championship title for the first time in 14 years.



NORTH CAROLINA 14, PITTSBURGH 10
 2018 College Championships
 May 28, 2018 – Milwaukee, WI

North Carolina entered the 2018 College Championships as the No. 2 seed in the tournament. After three straight pool play wins, North Carolina would drop its final pool play game to William & Mary, the No. 14 seed. However, the loss didn't hold Darkside back in bracket competition. Led by future Callahan winner Matt Gouchoe-Hanas and

a talented cutter lineup, Darkside would take down Washington in the quarterfinals. Following a Universe Point win against Oregon in the semifinals, North Carolina would win its second title in school history by defeating No. 9 seeded Pittsburgh in the finals.

NORTH CAROLINA 15, STANFORD 10
2023 College Championships
May 29, 2023 – Mason, OH

Four titles in a row. A historic run continues for the Seven Sisters as the No. 4 Seed swept the competition in Madison. It was a strong pool play showing for North Carolina who defeated Oregon, UC-Santa Barbara, SUNY-Binghamton and UC-Santa Cruz with a +29 point differential. Led by coaches Jessica Jones, Mary Rippe, Liam Searles-Bohs and Walker Matthews, Pleiades saw a late surge from No. 3 Carleton College but fended it off on Universe in quarters. In semis, familiar foe No. 7 seed Colorado had a 13-9 lead but Pleiades, captained by Theresa Yu, Erica Birdsong and Dhara Buebe, scored five unanswered to move to the finals vs No. 6 seed Stanford. It was a fourth straight coronation as 2022 Callahan winner Dawn Culton put on a clinic, leading both teams in goals (six) and assists (four). North Carolina wins it all for the fourth straight year, cementing the Seven Sisters' legacy as the most dominant run in college ultimate history. A fifth straight will be on the line in 2025.



NORTH CAROLINA 15, COLORADO 8
2023 College Championships
May 29, 2023 – Mason, OH

A second perfect season means Pleiades becomes the second women's program to three-peat in history. North Carolina won every game played by at least three and completed their run to the top once again. The No. 1 ranked team, lead by coaches Anne Worth, Elisabeth Parker, Jessica Jones and Marry Rippe, took down Washington, UCLA, SUNY-Binghamton and Colorado State in pool play. Callahan nominee Alex Barnett helped Pleiades defeat No. 7 ranked Stanford in the quarterfinals and No. 4 ranked Vermont in the semifinals. A rematch of the 2022 final saw a similar finish as one of the most dominant runs of all time continues. North Carolina wins their 3rd title (tied third all-time) and has a chance to win a fourth straight title in 2024; an unaccomplished task in college ultimate history.



NORTH CAROLINA 12, COLORADO 11
2022 College Championships
May 30, 2022 - Milwaukee, WI

North Carolina became the fifth team in women's history to go back-to-back with the title defense in 2022. Pleiades went chalk in Milwaukee, winning all games as the No. 1 seed in the tournament. Wins over Stanford, Florida State, Georgia and Northeastern in pool play gave Callahan winner Dawn Culton-led UNC a first-round bye. After advancing swiftly past British Columbia and UC-Santa Barbara, the team from Chapel Hill would play in the second-ever Universe Point final, winning the championship on heroics from Anne Worth and Alexandra Barnett. The college world was Carolina blue for the second year in a row.



NORTH CAROLINA 15, WASHINGTON 6
 2021 College Championships
 Dec. 20, 2021 – Norco, CA

North Carolina had never appeared in a College Championships final but that changed in 2021. Pleiades would run the table, starting with four straight wins in pool play over Ohio, Western Washington, UC-Davis and Georgia. Led by coaches Jessica Jones and David

Allison, Pleiades would take down defending champion UC-San Diego in quarterfinals. Semifinals was a convincing win over UC-Santa Barbara and the finals was more of the same as Pleiades would win its first title in school history over Washington, thanks to the play of Dawn Culton, Alexandra Barnett and Bridget Mizener.



UC-SAN DIEGO 12, DARTMOUTH 11
 2019 College Championships
 May 27, 2019 – Round Rock, TX

UC-San Diego's Psycho would shock the college world in 2019 as Dena Elimelech would help lead the team to its first title since 2002. Led by coaches Alisha Stoun and Carlo Mosca, Psycho would take down Western Washington,

Northwestern and Georgia in pool play while dropping to Tufts. It was a close win in quarterfinals against Carleton College and a big win over Ohio State in the semifinals. After a prequarters loss in 2018, UCSD would face a back-to-back defending champion in Dartmouth, equipped with Callahan winner Jack Verzuh. Psycho would win the first Universe point final in women's history to rule the college world in 2019.



DARTMOUTH 15, COLORADO 9
 2018 College Championships
 May 28, 2018 – Milwaukee, WI

In 2018, Dartmouth would become just the fourth team in women's history to go back-to-back. Princess Layout, led by Caitlyn Lee and Claire Trop, did not let any team score double digits while in Milwaukee for College Championships. Pool play wins over Tufts, UC-Santa Barbara, Colorado and West Chester

gave Dartmouth more confidence. A win in quarterfinals over British Columbia and a win in semifinals over Stanford made for a pool play rematch with Colorado. Despite Colorado's dream run as the lowest seeded team to make a women's final (No. 12), it was Eugene Yum's Princess Layout with college dominance for the school's second title.

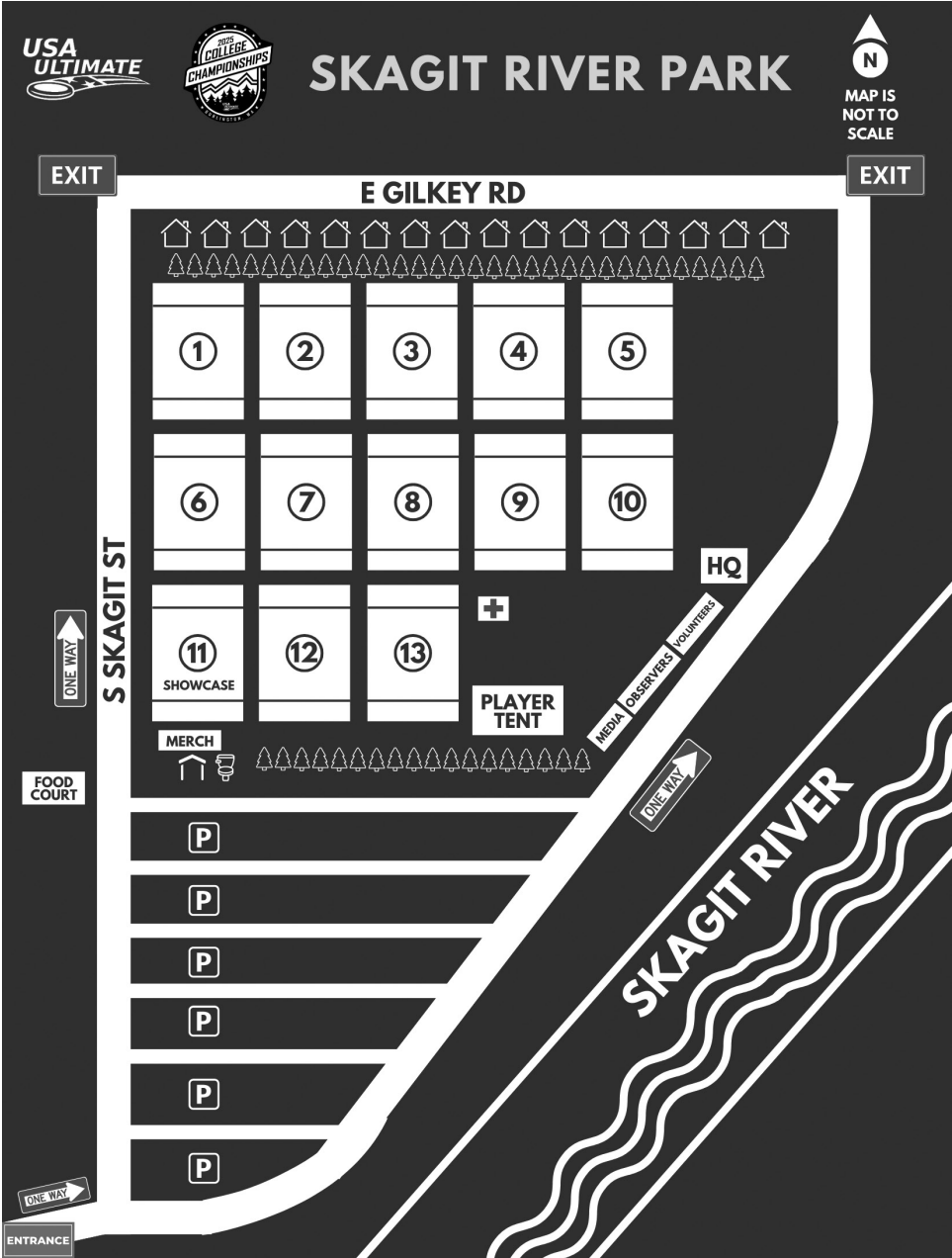
Lia Yamamoto Schwartz - Tufts EWO - Senior
