

SITE RULES

- **Dogs:** Dogs must be leashed. No dogs at finals stadium!
- No Glass.
- Beer will be available for purchase at Uihlein Soccer Park. Outside alcohol may not be brought
 into the facility.
- No Tobacco Products.
- **Field Access:** Spectators and equipment must stay at least three yards away from sidelines and behind any spectator/equipment lines or barriers! Where there are buffer lines, respect them. Where there are not buffer lines, stay back at least three yards.
- Trash and Recycling: Place recyclables in the recycling receptacles, and place trash in the trash.
- Guests and Spectators: You and your team are responsible for the people on your sidelines and
 making sure they abide by these site rules.

COMPETITION RULES

- 2022-2023 Official Rules of Ultimate will be in effect.
 - Changes from previous versions can be reviewed at usaultimate.org/rules
- All games to 15.
- Halftime cap goes on exactly halfway to hard cap (52:30 after the beginning of the game). If
 neither team has reached seven or more points, one point is added to the highest score after the
 completion of the point. Halftime will be taken once a team reaches the new halftime score.
- Halftime is five minutes.
 - Halftime for semifinals and finals is 10 minutes.
- Soft time cap goes on after 90 minutes (15 minutes before the hard cap). Add one point to the
 higher score after the point during which the cap goes off is completed. Game ends when the
 first team reaches the new game total or when the first team reaches 15, whichever comes first.
 - Soft cap for Semifinals and Finals will be at 1 hr 45 min.
- Hard time cap goes on at the end of round time listed in the schedule (1 hr, 45 min). Finish the point in progress and the game is over unless tied. If tied, play one more point.
 - Hard caps will not be used for the semifinals and finals.
- Each team has two timeouts per half.
- Caps do not affect timeouts.



NOISEMAKER GUIDELINES

The following guidelines for noisemakers will be applied at USA Ultimate events. They are designed to strike a balance between limiting artificial noise that adversely impacts the competition or the on-site experience of participants with allowing for noise that helps create an enthusiastic, fun and supportive environment. Players, teams and spectators are expected to abide by these guidelines while on site at the event.

- Powered noisemakers are not allowed at the event site. This includes, but is not limited to, air horns, sirens and electronic bullhorns.
- Novelty noisemakers are NOT permitted, except under the following conditions:
 - Must remain outside of the equipment lines.
 - May only be used between a goal being scored and the offense signaling readiness for the next point.
 - May not be used during timeouts taken during active play.
 - Novelty noisemakers include, but are not limited to, whistles, vuvuzelas, squeeze horns and musical instruments.
- Music-playing devices with external speakers are permitted under the following conditions:
 - Must remain outside of equipment lines, except during warm-ups and half-time.
 - Must remain at a reasonable volume considering other event participants and attendees.
 - May not be used to play music with offensive lyrics or themes.
- No noisemaker of any kind is permitted that may present a safety hazard.
- Any noisemaker permitted above may be disallowed if the volume or content of the
 noise is deemed to be offensive or disruptive to the enjoyment of the event, or the
 noisemaker is used in an un-spirited manner such as to taunt, intimidate or give a
 team an undue competitive advantage, as determined by event staff.

Event staff and observers will inform teams and individuals of these guidelines as needed. Repercussions for violation of these guidelines may include confiscation of the noisemaker, removal of the individual from the event site and/or in-game sanctions associated with the Misconduct System.

ULTIMATE IN 10 SIMPLE RULES

- **1. THE FIELD:** A rectangular shape with end zones at each end. A regulation field is 70 yards long by 40 yards wide, with end zones 20 yards deep.
- **2. STARTING PLAY:** Each point begins with both teams lining up on the front of opposite end zone lines. The defense throws ("pulls") the disc to the offense. A regulation game has seven players per team.
- **3. SCORING:** Each time the offense catches a pass in the defense's end zone, the offense scores a point. The teams switch direction after every goal, and the next point begins with a new pull by the team that just scored.
- **4. MOVEMENT OF THE DISC:** The disc may be advanced in any direction by completing a pass to a teammate. Players may not run with the disc. The person with the disc ("thrower") has ten seconds to throw the disc. The defender guarding the thrower ("marker") counts out the stall count.
- **5. CHANGE OF POSSESSION:** When a pass is not completed (e.g. out of bounds, drop, block, interception), the defense immediately takes possession of the disc and becomes the offense.
- **6. SUBSTITUTIONS:** Players not in the game may replace players in the game after a score and during an injury timeout.
- **7. NON-CONTACT:** Players must attempt to avoid physical contact during play. Picks and screens are also prohibited.
- **8. FOULS:** When a player initiates contact that affects the play, a foul occurs. When a foul causes a player to lose possession, the play resumes as if the possession was retained. If the player that the foul was called against disagrees with the foul call, the play is redone.
- **9. SELF-OFFICIATING:** Players are responsible for their own foul and line calls. Players resolve their own disputes.
- **10. SPIRIT OF THE GAME:** The foundation of the rules in ultimate is Spirit of the Game, which places the responsibility for fair play on the player. Competitive play is encouraged, but never at the expense of respect between players, adherence to the rules, and the basic joy of play.



ULTIMATE GLOSSARY

 ${f BREAKMARK}-{f a}$ throw made to other side of the field from what is being forced by the marker

BRICK MARK — the spot where play may be initiated when a pull lands out of bounds, typically 15 or 20 yards from the front of the offense's end zone and in the center of the field (yardage varies based on individual tournament rules); players have the option of making this call or taking the disc on the sideline closest to where it lands

CALLAHAN — a defensive score, occurs when a defender catches the disc in the end zone he or she is attacking

CUP – the wall of defenders that surround the thrower in a zone defense; the wall typically consists of 3 players, but variations with 2 or 4 defenders are also common

FLICK – forehand, thrown outside, away from the handler's body

FORCE — side of the field to which throws should be contained; the marker will attempt to take away throws to one part of the field and is said to be "forcing" throws to go up in a certain direction

 ${f GREATEST}-{f a}$ jump, throw, catch combination that occurs when the disc is out-of-bounds, but a player jumps from in-bounds, catches the disc and successfully throws it back in-bounds to a teammate

 ${f HAMMER}$ — an overhead throw that starts above the shoulders where the disc turns over in the air and lands upside-down

HUCK – a long throw

 ${f POACH}$ — a defensive decision to leave a designated one-on-one matchup, usually temporarily, to clog a cutting lane or help defend a player other than the original

PULL — the "kick-off" of each point in which the defensive team throws the disc from their own end zone down the field toward the offensive team

STALL – the 10-second count for which a player is allowed to maintain possession of the disc; the opposing, defensive player must count the 10-seconds aloud; a "stall" occurs if the disc is held for more than the 10-second count

STRIP – occurs when a disc is knocked out of a player's hands after they have stopped rotation and achieved possession

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Medical staff, including athletic trainers, will be on site at Tournament Central to treat injuries, handle emergencies and provide some preventative care. The event will provide standard athletic tape, pre-wrap, ice and some bandages. Other supplies, including special tape or bandages and anti-inflammatory drugs, must be provided by teams or may be charged by the training staff.

If there is an injury on a field that needs medical attention, inform a field marshal, and they will radio to the trainers.

If you have medical issues that require attention in the morning before play, please show up early to avoid long lines. The trainers will be at the fields approximately 90 minutes prior to game time each day.

COVID-19 EVENT PROTOCOLS - 2022 USA ULTIMATE COLLEGE NATIONALS

See https://usaultimate.org/covid-19/ for more detailed information.

USA Ultimate requires that sanctioned events and activities follow all COVID-19 related federal, state, local, and facility health and safety standards. There is no longer a USA Ultimate requirement for participants or other attendees to provide proof of vaccination status or a negative test result prior to the event. Participants are not required to wear masks during play or in conjunction with participation in an event, unless they are determined to be close contacts and meet certain CDC-recommended conditions for being allowed to continue at the event.

USA Ultimate recognizes that, at this point, individuals have the resources and tools to mitigate their own risks, and state and local authorities have the information and perspective to impose additional community-wide or activity-specific requirements as needed. USA Ultimate encourages the use of vaccinations, boosters, and testing to limit risks to individuals and groups.

Athletes, organizers, coaches, staff and spectators are expected to NOT participate if they feel unwell, are symptomatic, or have been in close contact with someone that may be sick or may have tested positive for COVID-19 in the prior five days. Any event attendee who tests positive for COVID-19 prior to the event may not attend unless they have completed CDC and local health department requirements for isolation and return to activity. Any event attendee, including players, coaches, observers, volunteers, vendors and media partners, who tests positive during an event must report those results to the event organizer and follow CDC and local health department requirements for contact tracing and isolation.

Individuals and/or teams that do not comply with these or other event rules are subject to removal from the event and additional disciplinary action.



CONCUSSIONS

EDUCATION

- USA Ultimate recommends the CDC "Heads Up Safety" program, a free one-hour online training.
- USA Ultimate's participant waiver includes important information from the CDC regarding concussion safety.

COACHING REQUIREMENTS

 Coaches at USA Ultimate events are required to have completed a concussion awareness and safety recognition program (like the CDC program above or other local or staterecommended course).

REMOVAL & RETURN TO PLAY

- All guidelines identified by the CDC must be strictly followed in the event of a suspected concussion.
 - 1. Remove the athlete from play.
 - 2. Ensure the athlete is evaluated by a healthcare professional trained in concussion diagnosis and management. Do not try to judge the seriousness of the injury yourself.
- 3. If the athlete is a minor, inform the athlete's parents or guardians about the known or possible concussion and give them the fact sheet on concussions.
 - State of California Law for Under 18
 - IF removed from play for suspected concussion, no same day return to play.
 - IF determined NOT to have a concussion, must have a written doctor's note to present to the tournament staff in order to be allowed to return to play.
 - IF determined to HAVE a concussion, would not be allowed to return to play during the tournament and must complete graded return to play protocol before competing in the future.
- 4. Allow the athlete to return to play only with written permission from a licensed healthcare professional trained in concussion diagnosis and management (see below).

DOCTOR'S NOTE REQUIREMENT

 If, during a USA Ultimate event, an athlete receives care at a hospital, medical clinic or doctor's office, or is referred to a hospital or doctor by event medical staff, the athlete is barred from further competition in that event until they provide a doctor's note, on letterhead or prescription pad, to event medical and competition staff stating that the athlete is authorized to return to competition.

ATHLETE PROTECTION

- USA Ultimate takes the protection of event participants seriously. In accordance with SafeSport and the USA Ultimate Conduct Policy, all USA Ultimate employees, volunteers, athletes, members, coaches and chaperones are prohibited from engaging in the following conduct with athletes at any time (a more thorough description is available at www.usaultimate.org/protection):
 - Bullying
 - Hazing
 - Harassment, including Sexual Harassment
 - Emotional Misconduct
 - Physical Misconduct
 - Sexual Misconduct, including Child Sexual Abuse
- With the passage of the recent federal legislation to protect amateur and minor athletes, all SafeSport trained individuals (including coaches, team support, USA Ultimate staff) are now mandatory reporters.

HEAT, NUTRITION AND HYDRATION

- Heat-related illnesses occur when the body's ability to cool itself by evaporation is limited. Sweating
 depletes the body's salt and moisture, which leads to dehydration. If a player recognizes any signs or
 symptoms of a heat-related illness, he or she should treat the problem immediately.
- Signs and symptoms of a heat illness can include changes in level of consciousness, abdominal cramps, nausea/vomiting, fatigue/tingling, chills, inability to spit, dry mucous membranes, decreased output and change in color of urine.

PREVENTION AND TREATMENT OF HEAT ILLNESS

- Avoid alcohol, caffeine and carbonated beverages.
- Medications such as antihistamines, decongestants, certain asthma medications and diuretics can increase the risk for heat illness. Avoid them if possible.
- Avoid certain nutritional supplements (such as caffeine and ephedrine) that can dehydrate the body and/or increase metabolism and heat production.
- Know your body be honest! Are you fit enough to perform under current conditions?
- Eat and drink (water AND sports drinks) optimally before, during and after play. Potassium is important; good sources include sports drinks, yogurt, grapefruit juice, bananas and oranges. Sodium is also important; good sources include sports drinks, vegetable juices, pretzels, nuts, cheese and crackers. After play, carbohydrates are important: foods such as potatoes, honey, cereal, white bread, corn chips, sports drinks, jelly beans, rice cakes, bagels, crackers and gummy candies.
- Don't drink too much. Over-hydrating can be dangerous if it leads to a fluid and electrolyte imbalance.
- Monitor your urine. Clear/copious = hydrated. Dark = Need water/electrolytes.
- Be sensitive to any prior illness. If you've been sick, your body may be more susceptible to dehydration.
- Rest and cool down after play. Find shade, wet the skin or get in front of a fan or breeze.



HEAT SAFETY GUIDELINES

• Event and medical staff will be monitoring the Wet Bulb Globe Temperature and making competition and scheduling decisions based on established safety thresholds. Conditions will be monitored before each round with the goal of determining any competition adjustments prior to the round. These may include additional and/or extended hydration and rest breaks. Monitoring will continue during rounds, especially near Heat Precaution thresholds, and some adjustments may be implemented during the round if necessary. Heat Precaution Levels may also be accelerated if medical staff observe a trend of heat related illness that calls for earlier adjustments.

SIDELINE SAFETY

- Spectators and equipment must stay at least five yards away from the sidelines. Where there
 are buffer lines, respect them. Chairs, coolers, strollers, people and other objects must be at
 least three yards from the sidelines.
- If a player believes that an object on the sideline is not safe, he or she should inform event staff and refrain from playing until he or she is satisfied that safe conditions have been established.
- USA Ultimate and event staff reserve the right to move or remove objects or spectators from
 on or near the playing field if those conditions are, in the opinion of USA Ultimate or event
 staff, unsafe for players, staff or spectators.

LIGHTNING GUIDELINES

- Event staff will communicate with players and spectators via a PA system and through field marshals equipped with radios if there is a lightning danger. Play will then be stopped, and everyone should seek shelter in the vehicles in which they arrived.
- Safe shelter for players and spectators at the field site includes any fully enclosed building or vehicle with a hard top and closed windows.
- Event staff will be monitoring radar and listening for thunder. If lightning is occurring
 within 10 miles or thunder is audible, play will be suspended and all individuals should
 get in a safe shelter location.
- If you can't get to a safe shelter, try to avoid being the tallest object in an open field or on
 open water. Avoid other tall objects, metal objects and water. Assume a crouched position
 with only the balls of your feet touching the ground, your arms wrapped around your knees,
 and your head lowered. Minimize contact with the ground. Do not lie flat.
- Avoid using telephone land lines. Cell phones are safe, provided the person has followed other safety guidelines.
- Event staff will indicate to players when play is going to resume. Team captains should meet at Tournament Central to receive instructions for resuming play and any schedule modifications.

SPIRIT CIRCLES

Spirit circles are an idea borrowed from international competitions throughout the ultimate world.

Upon the conclusion of a game, teams can use spirit circles as an opportunity to highlight, discuss or address any spirit-related issues.

- If agreed upon, the spirit captains of the opposing teams should arrange a space for the conversation to occur between the teams.
- Spirit captains should be prepared to speak about their team's experience during the game.
 - Prior to engaging in a spirit circle, each spirit captain should quickly check in with their team and/or complete spirit scoring so as to inform the discussion in the circle.
 - Discussion and feedback should be honest and candid, but not overly critical, and consistent with the scores submitted.
- Spirit captains should refrain from calling out individuals for negative actions
 which may be better discussed with that player or their spirit captain as a separate
 follow up.

Spirit circles can bring teams together and put the game in perspective. It's all about respect for each other and the experience of bringing out the best in each other through competition. Spirit circles are unique to ultimate and help teams build relationships and see opponents for who they really are: part of the same community that loves ultimate. Please note that this is not required and is not meant to replace other post-game traditions you may have (e.g., cheers, games, photos, gifts or trading gear).
