


Thanks, and good luck to all teams this weekend. So quit reading this and lace up your cleats. It's Regionals! Let's play some Ultimate!

Open Division UPA STANDARD DOUBLE ELIMINATION FORMAT



All Saturday are to 15/17 with exception of games 9,10,11, and 12, which are played to 17/19, and games 17 and 18, which are played to 19/21. The final, game 23, is played to 21/23. All other Sunday games are to 17/19. Teams playing to 15 and 17 receive two time outs per half. Games to 19 and 21 include 3 time outs per half. In point capped games, each team has a total of one TO once entering into overtime. The time cap goes on 15 minutes before the start of the next round on Saturday and 30 minutes before the start of the next round on Sunday.

- Philly Peppers (Philadelphia, PA) After a strong fall season, Philly comes into Regionals ranked #1. Winning the region would prove that the Peppers have being using their Miracle-Gro.
- Lucy (Washington, DC) They found somebody older, but did they find somebody better?
- Cape Fearless (Wilmington, NC) Going where other womens teams fear to tread, many of these women have been to both college and club Nationals. What's next? Masters Divison beware!
