**Welcome to Bucks County Horse Park, site of the 1996 Mid-Atlantic
Ultimate Championships!**

Please Obey Park Rules:

- * No glass bottles or bottle caps. Beer and other alcohol are permitted, but must be in cans or cups.
- * Dogs are allowed, but must be on a leash at all times. If horses are nearby, please let them pass and keep dogs away.
- * Drive slowly on park roads - no more than 10 mph.
- * Announcer stand is off limits. It is for tournament personnel only.
- * Park vehicles in designated areas. No driving on the fields.

Note: There is no running water here! Take water jugs with you Saturday and refill for Sunday.

Tournament Tent: site of captains meeting, bagels, water, fruit. PADA is selling shirts, discs and beer.

Where To Get.....

Food: Vending truck on site.

Revere Deli is on Rte. 611, about 1/2 mile north of park.

Stuff: Closest shopping center with supermarket, cash machine & McDonald's is on Rte. 611 approx. 7.5 miles south of park in Plumsteadville.

Tournament Clarifications:

- * 20 yard brick
- * Two time-outs per half, except in open division games #17, #18, & #23 where there are two time-outs per half and one floater.
- * Timecap airhorn will serve as reminder, but round times vary so captains are responsible for capping games; either captain can execute a time cap.
- * Rules: Standard UPA ninth edition with amendments and clarifications
- * Tournament Rules Group will be established at captain's meeting
- * UPA yellow/red card tournament procedures will be followed
- * Tiebreakers are decided as follows: head to head, point differential among tied teams, overall point differential, rochambeau

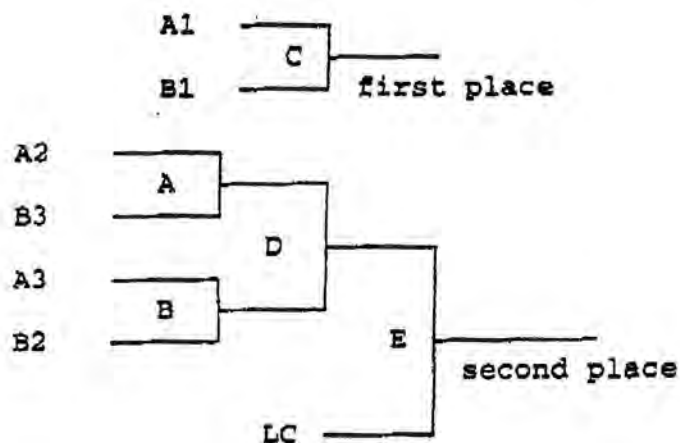

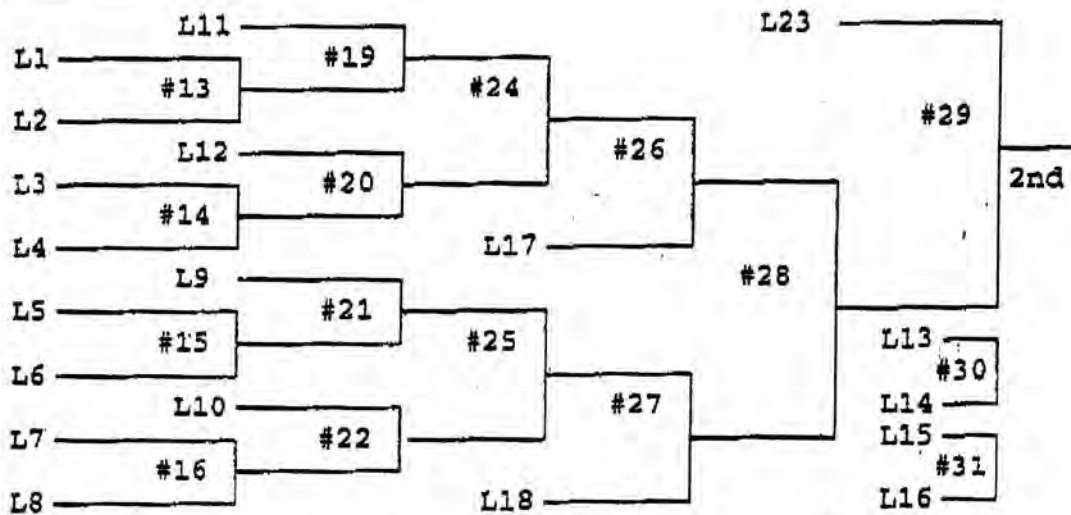
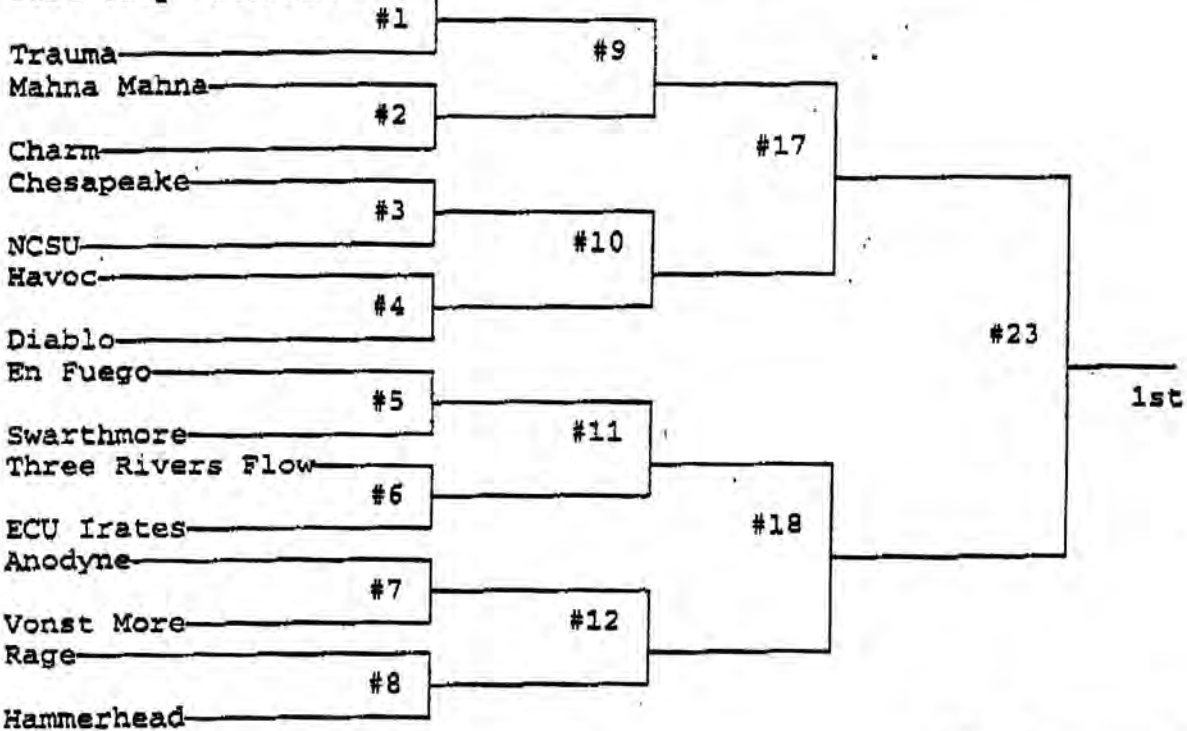
SUNDAY'S WOMEN'S DIVISION ELIMINATION BRACKET

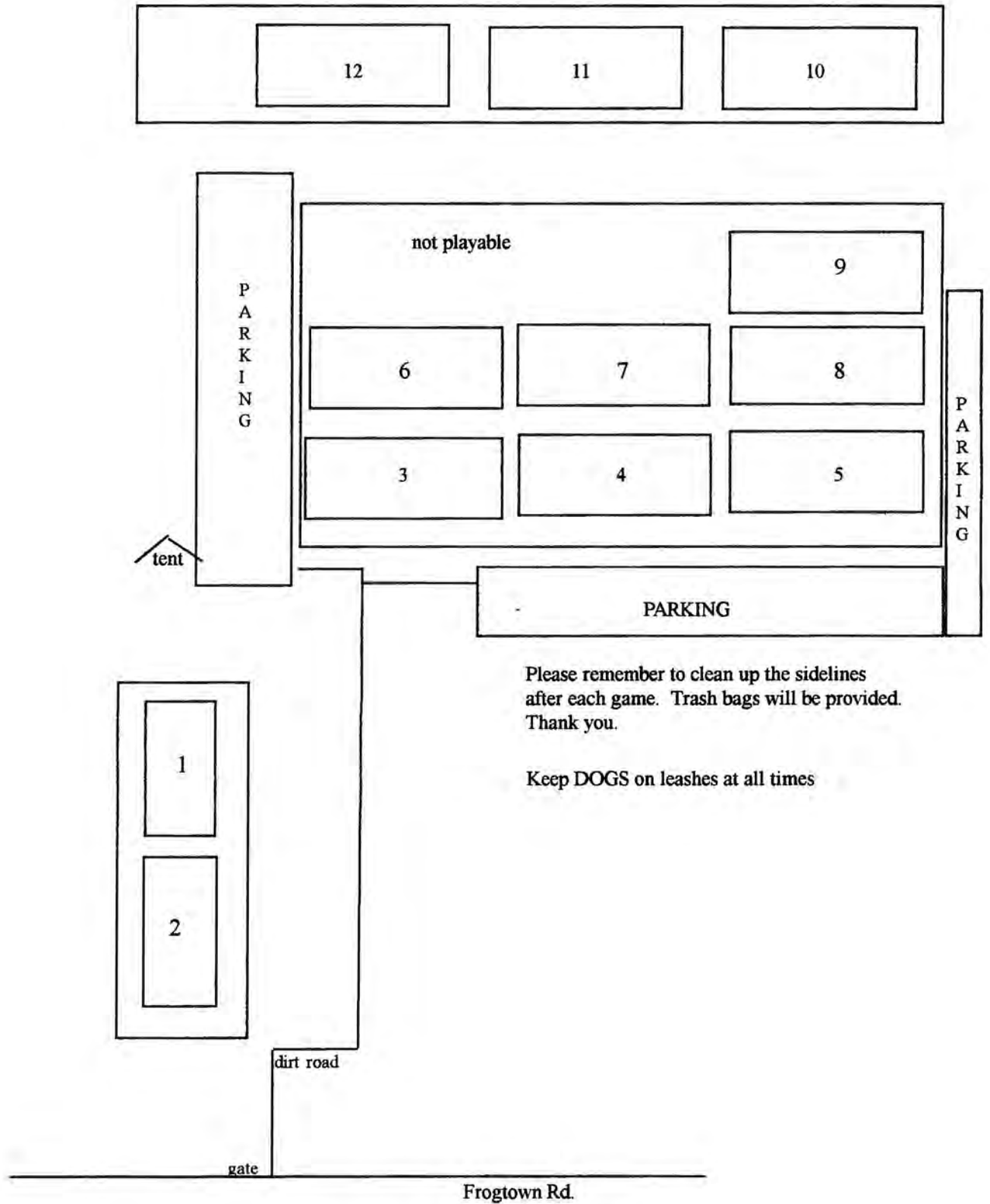

Preface taken from the Ninth Edition Rules of Ultimate.

The purpose of the rules of Ultimate is to provide a guideline which describes the way the game is played. It is assumed that no Ultimate player will intentionally violate the rules; thus there are no harsh penalties for inadvertent infractions, but rather a method for resuming play in a manner which simulates what would most likely have occurred had there been no infraction.

In Ultimate, an intentional foul would be considered cheating and a gross offense against the spirit of sportsmanship. Often a player is in a position where it is clearly to his/her advantage to foul or commit some violation, but that player is morally bound to abide by the rules. The integrity of Ultimate depends on each player's responsibility to uphold the spirit of the game, and this responsibility should not be taken lightly.

The Philadelphia Area Disc Alliance (PADA) is proud to sponsor and host the 1996 Fall Mid-Atlantic Regional Ultimate Championships. PADA, which began in 1985 with only a handful of people, has grown to over 600 members. The primary goal of our organization is to foster the sport of ultimate at different levels of competition.
