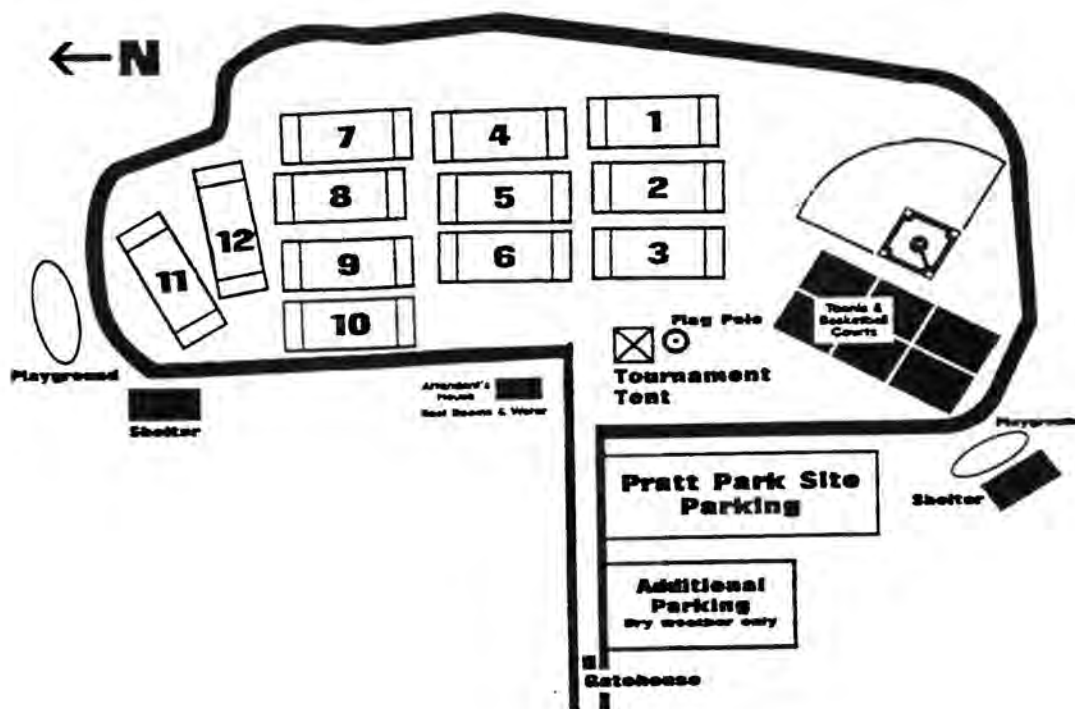

Directions from Pratt Park to Old Mill Park (OMP) site: at Gatehouse, turn LEFT ONTO RIVER. Then turn RIGHT ONTO ROUTE 3. Cross bridge and, at light, TURN RIGHT ONTO SOPHIA. At end of Sophia PROCEED TO THE LEFT, then turn RIGHT ONTO CAROLINE. Entrance to Old Mill Park is about ½ mile down Caroline on the RIGHT.

Directions from Old Mill Park site back to Pratt Park: turn LEFT ONTO CAROLINE. Turn LEFT ONTO ROUTE 3 (WILLIAMS STREET). Turn LEFT ONTO RIVER. Turn RIGHT INTO PRATT PARK.

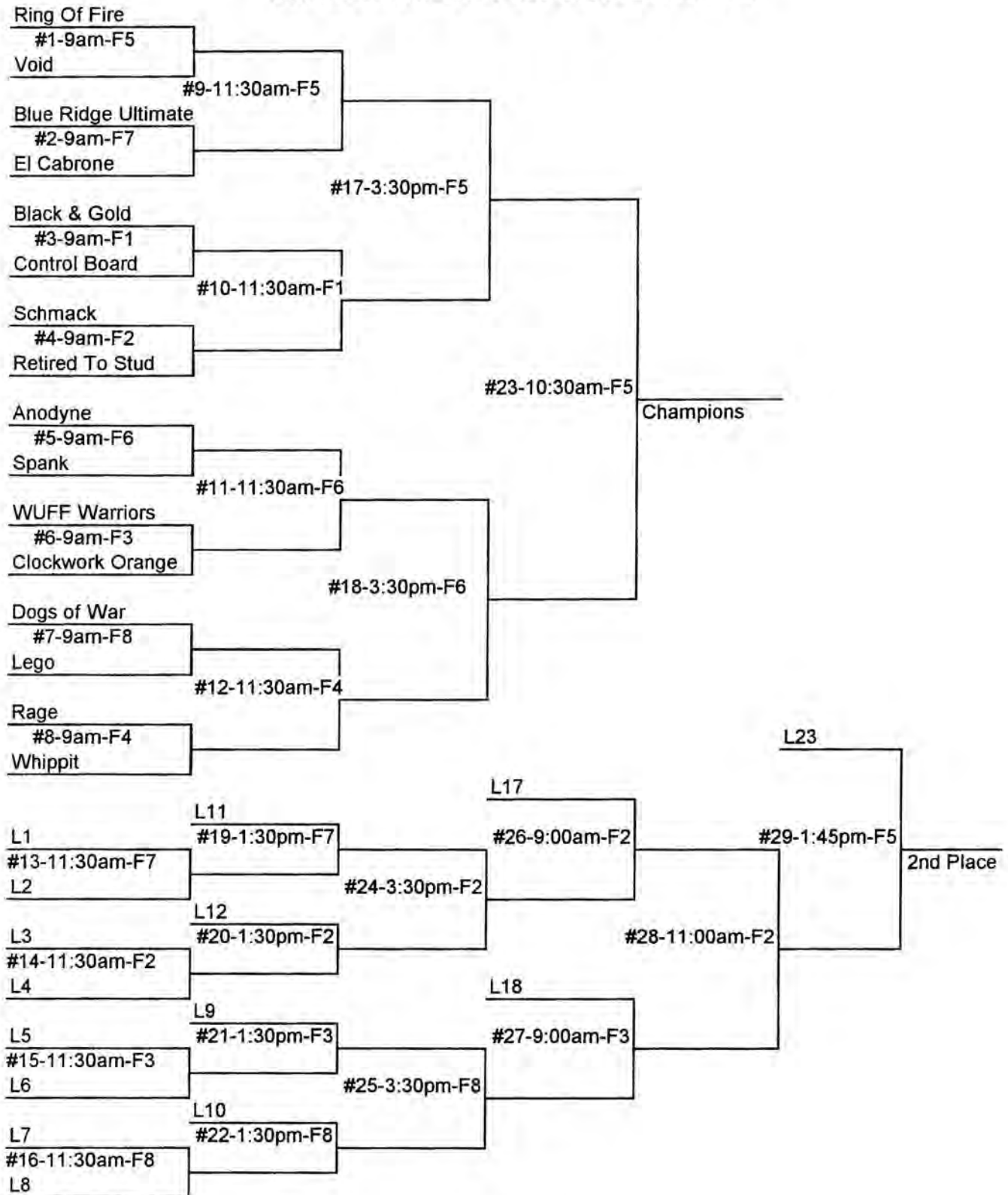
