
To those of you who have never seen Ultimate played, each of the players here this weekend has gone through untold hours of practice and are guite prepared to go on to the Nationals in Austin, Texas on the same basis. When you watch the games, remember there aren't even two-figure salaries in this game. We are all here to have fun. To the competitors, the Santa Barbara Condors look forward to your playing in the 1981 Western **Regional Championships. Play** as hard as possible, have as much fun as possible, and make your opponents in each and every game work their asses off against you.

Enjoy yourself, play hard, play fair and nobody hurt.

History

Ultimate Frisbee was created in 1968 at Columbia High School in Maplewood N.J. For several years the sport was only played in Maplewood usually in the evenings by a group of friends. Many of these players graduated and went onto college in the north east, and established their own teams at their respective schools. 1975 saw the first Ultimate championships (The Easterns) in which the top eight teams participated with Rutgers University emerging as champions. It was becoming evident that the sport had great potential for growth. 1977 saw the first National Championships with the Eastern Champs Penn State pitted against the Santa Barbara Condors. Santa Barbara was victorious and went on to win again in 1978 against Cornell


University. By 1979 250 teams were known across the U.S. and through a regional gualifying sysytem, five met in Pennsylvania to vie for the crown. This time the title went back to New Jersey in the hands of Glassboro State College who repeated as the top team in 1980. Today over 600 competitive teams are listed with the Ultimate Players Association but this is only a surface indication of all the Ultimated Frisbee activity as many colleges and high schools have adopted Ultimate Frisbee into their physical education and intramural programs.

Women's Ultimate

Finally....a women's Division at the Nationals. We've waited patiently for the past four years for Women's Ultimate to evolve to a point which warrants a division of its own. We've waited on the sidelines of the men's practices to sub in against another woman in the classic "6 and 1" team format. We've waited at the designated practice field for more women to show up for women's practice (3 on 3 ultimate is only fun for a little while!), finally giving up hopes of having a real women's team after a month of that.

Intermittently, during our waiting, there have been women's pick up games, usually at men's tournaments, serving to keep the ideal alive. We knew some day Women's Ultimate would come into its own. And now it has.

The U.S. is divided into five competitive regions. For the first time, this year, each region will host a Women's Division along side the already established Men's Division. The winning women's team from each region will travel to Austin, Texas to the National Ultimate Frisbee Championships, along with the winning men's team,




to compete for the National Championship title.


The decision to add a Women's Division to the National Championships came in late August. In just two short Women months. Ultimate players have organized nationally, boasting an average of seven teams in each region. During the past four years, women players have been working out and plaving Ultimate on men's teams at practice sessions. A few women have even played with their men's teams in national level competitions. These women have emerged as the organizers and leaders of the more than 30 teams now in existence. The level and quality of play is expanding by leaps and bounds atop the wave of enthusiasm and motivation which has swept across the regions. We are genuinely excited!

So... our patience has paid off. We won't be imaged standing on the sidelines of men's practices or waiting in a sparce little group on an empty practice field. We'll be seen practicing and enjoying Ultimate as much as any team ever has.


