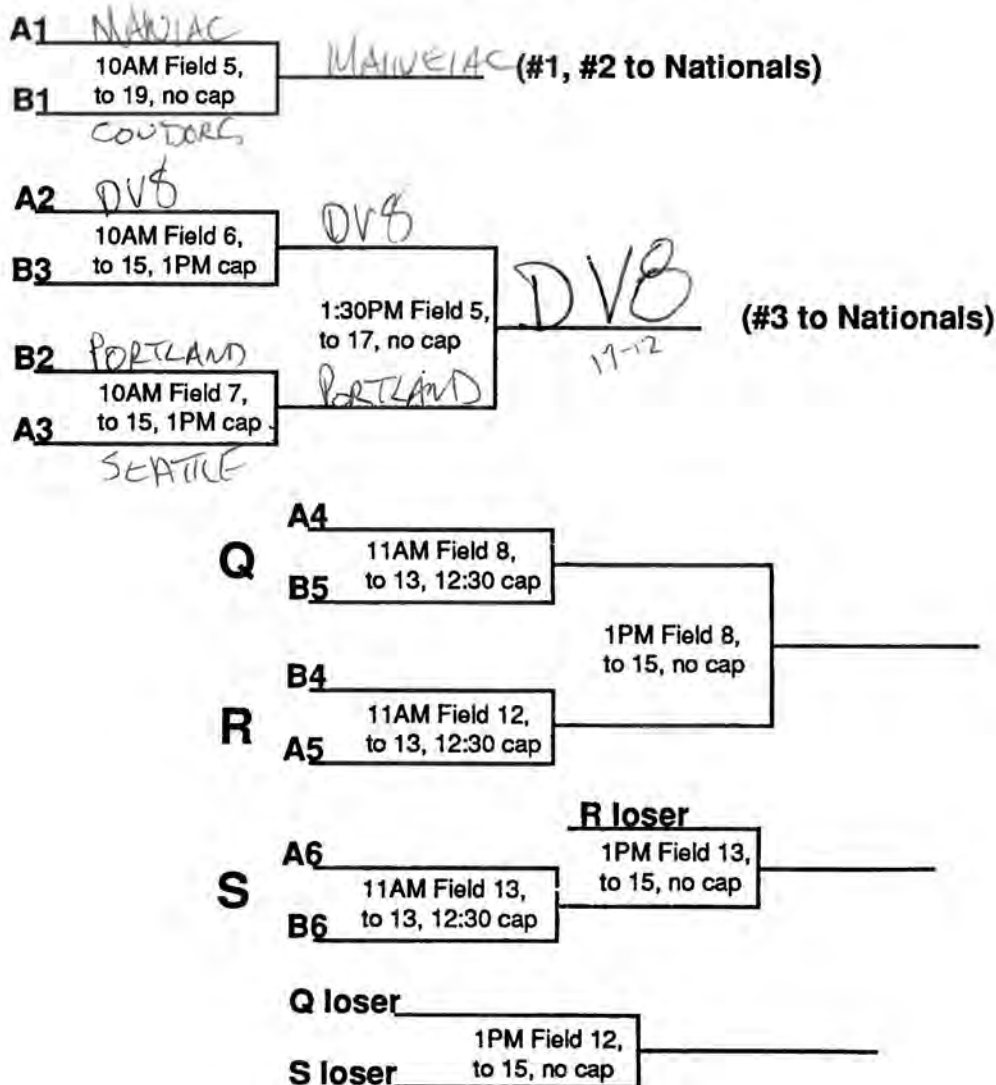

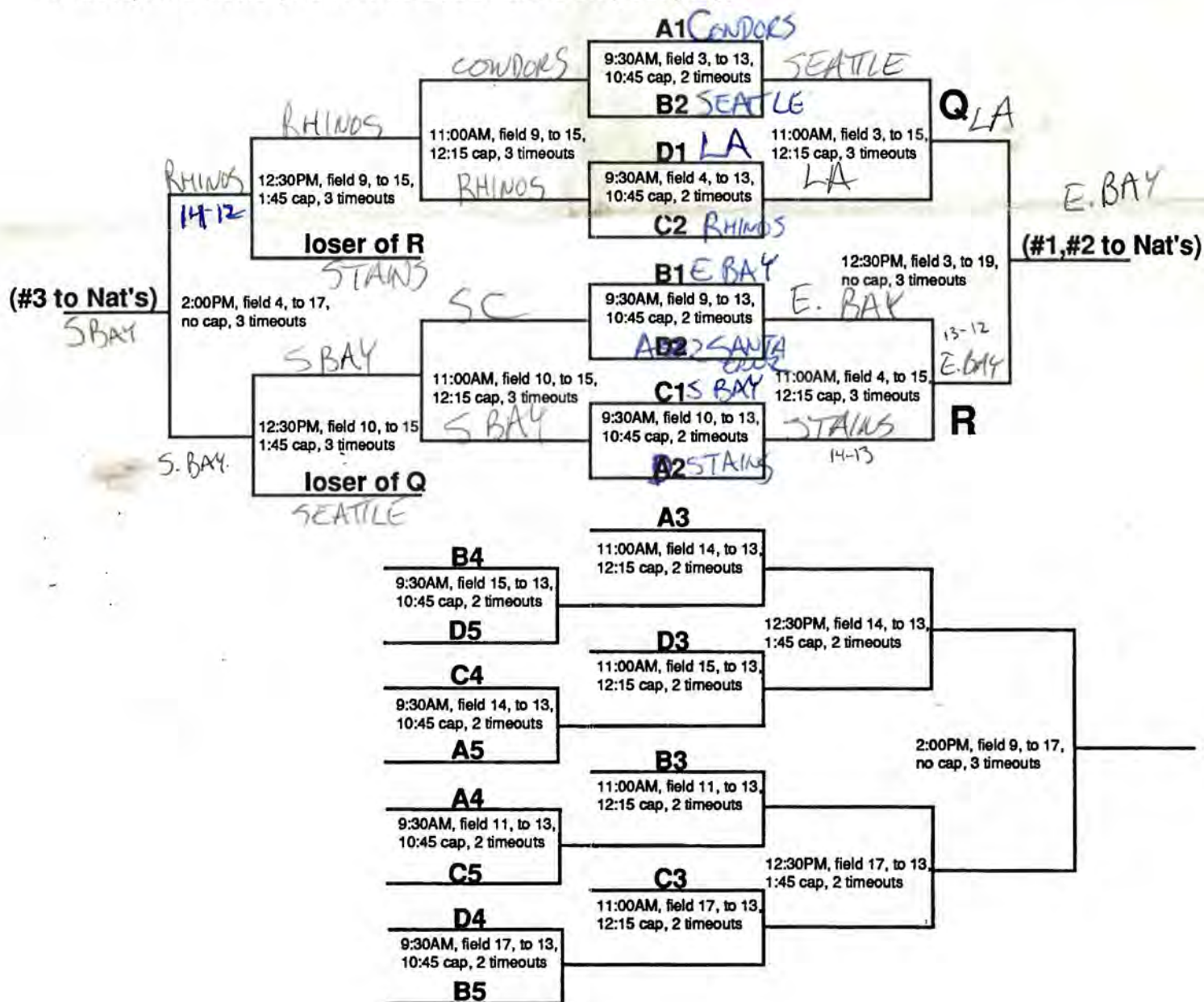

Ultimate Frisbee

The game of Ultimate Frisbee was invented in the late 1960's by students at Columbia High School in New Jersey. From its simple beginnings Ultimate spread quickly across the United States and to many European countries. The official governing body of the game, the Ultimate Players Association, now supports over 300 teams and sponsors two major tournament series each year, one for college teams and one for unrestricted "open" teams. Western Regionals is the tournament which qualifies western teams for the Open National Championships. The teams competing at Stanford this weekend include 4 of the best men's Ultimate teams in the world and the defending women's national champions.

Description of the Game

Ultimate is a non-contact sport, featuring two 7-person teams, each trying to score goals by catching the "disc" in their opponent's endzone. The frisbee can only be advanced by completing passes to teammates, as once a player catches the disc, he or she must come to a stop and establish a pivot foot. The new thrower then attempts to make another pass before the defender covering him or her counts to 10. Turnovers occur whenever the count reaches 10 or whenever a pass falls to the ground, goes out-of-bounds, or is intercepted. After a score (worth one point), the scoring team then "pulls" the disc to the other team at the far endzone, and the game continues.

The Spirit of the Game

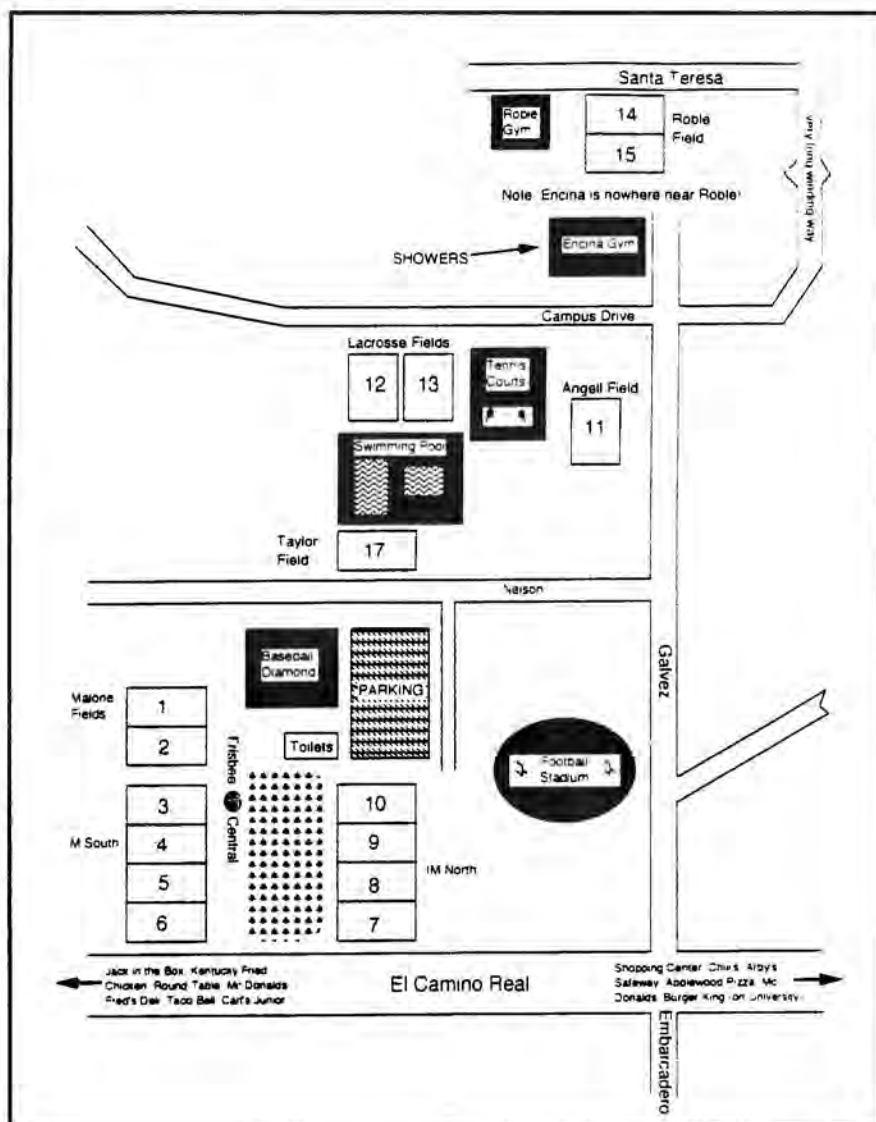
Amazingly, there are no referees in Ultimate, thus placing the responsibility for fair play on the players themselves. Highly competitive play is encouraged, but never at the expense of the bond of mutual respect between players, adherence to the agreed upon rules of the game, or the basic joy of play. Protection of these vital elements serves to eliminate adverse conduct from the Ultimate field. Such actions as taunting of opposing players, dangerous aggression, intentional fouling, or other "win-at-all-costs" behavior are contrary to the spirit of the game and must be avoided by all players. It is assumed that no Ultimate player will intentionally violate the rules; thus there are no harsh penalties for inadvertent infractions, but rather a method for resuming play in a manner which simulates what would most likely have occurred had there been no infraction. As a result, when a player on the field calls a foul or rule violation, there is usually a quick discussion of what happened, the players reposition themselves where they were when the call was made, and the game continues.

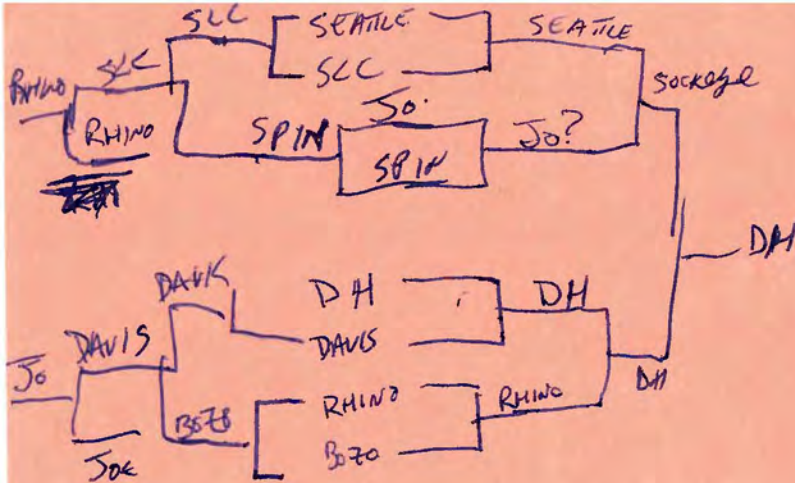
Map of Fields :
