NORTHERN CALIFORNIA COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

(Sectionals)

For over a decade, the Northern California Colleges have competed in the sport of Ultimate. Prior to 1984, the league was mixed with open and local club teams. 1984 marked the first year of "college only" competition and the National Collegiate Series. In order to qualify fo Nationals, a college team must advance from Sectionals, and then place in the top two at Western Regionals. Only six collegiate men's teams and just two collegiate women's teams from the West have ever made the coveted trip to the Nationals. Three NCCUL Teams (Stanford, LPC, and UC Davis) have brought home the prestigious National Champion trophy for College Ultimate. While UC Santa Barbara's recent success at Nationals is phenomenal, the Northern California Collegiate Ultimate League has been the most powerful and balanced league in the nation.

This year's favored men's team has to be UC Santa Cruz, defending Western Regional Champions, which played well all season. LPC is the defending league champion, but will have to play very well just to compete with the likes of UC Davis, Stanford, and Berkeley. In the women's division, UC Davis will have to perform excellently in order to hold off Santa Cruz, Berkeley, and Stanford. Good luck to all the teams!

HOW IS ULTIMATE PLAYED?

Ultimate Frisbee is a team sport with seven players from each team in the game. Substitutes are needed because of the strenuous running required by the players. It is played on a 40 X 120-yard field with 25-yard end zones. Similar to football, the disc is thrown from player to player until it is caught in the end zone for a score (one point). Players, after catching a disc, must come to a stop and have ten seconds in which to pass the disc to a teammate. Any incompleted pass (e.g. drops, interceptions, bad passes, etc.) results in an immediate turnover, where the defensive team becomes the offensive team and begins passing the disc toward its end zone. After a score is caught, the defensive team travels to the opposite end zone to receive the next throw-off and begins the next try for point. Occasionally, the game stops because of violations - fouls (notice there are no referees - players call their own fouls), time-outs, injury time-outs, and at the end of a score caught. 
