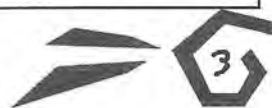

TO THE FIELDS:

The fields are about 15 minutes south of the hotels off of I-65. So, take I-65 south to exit 234 (Shelby Airport). Go left on County Rd. 12 at the end of the exit ramp. When this road ends (about 1.5 miles), turn right onto County Rd. 22. Go 1/4 mile and turn left on Shelby Academy Dr. The gas station on County Rd. 12 just off the exit ramp is the closest to the fields.

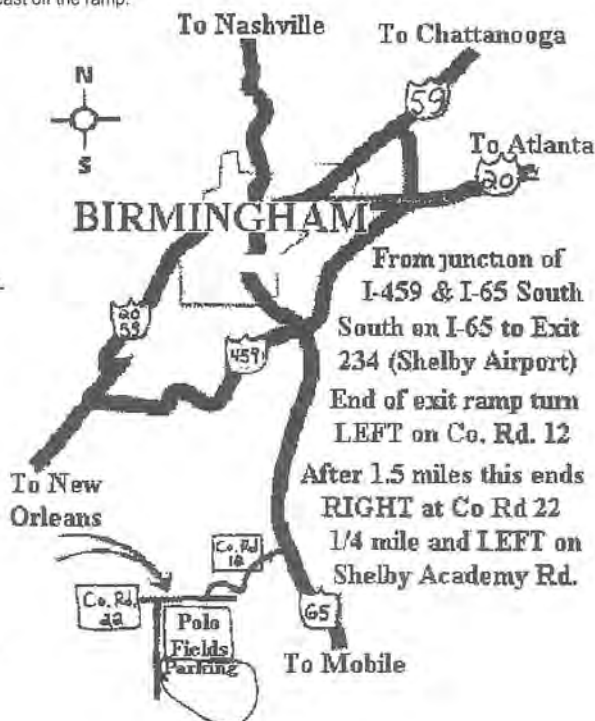

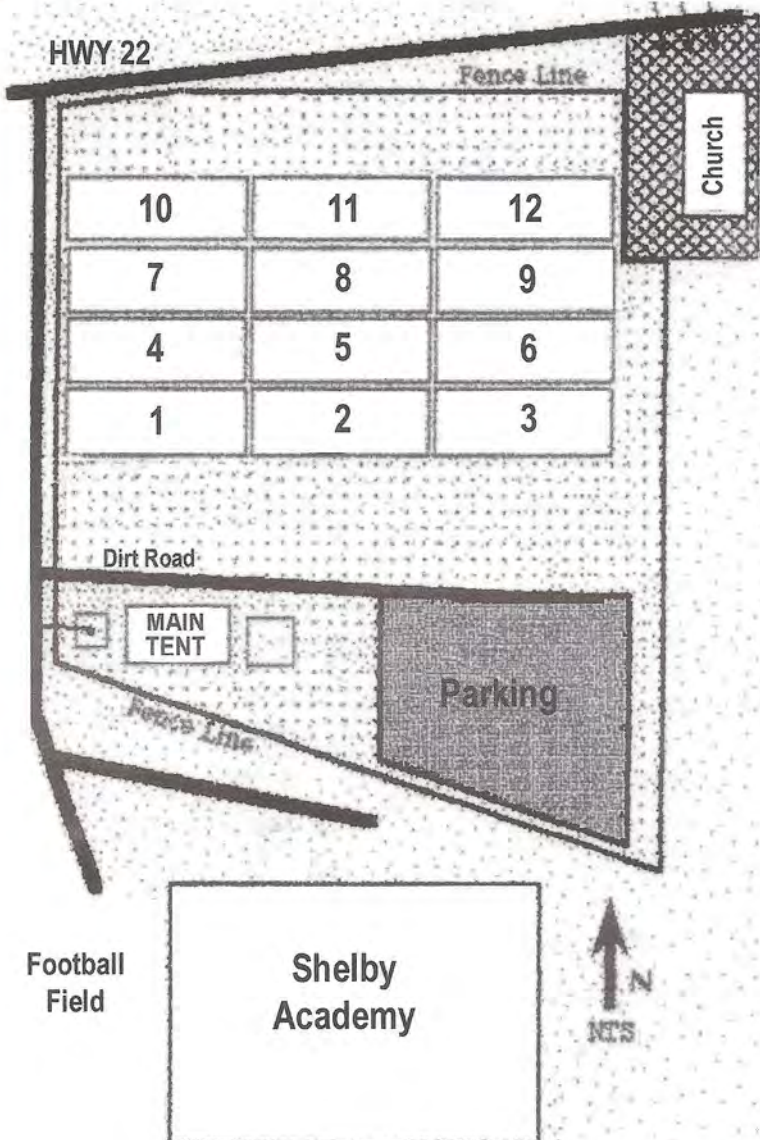

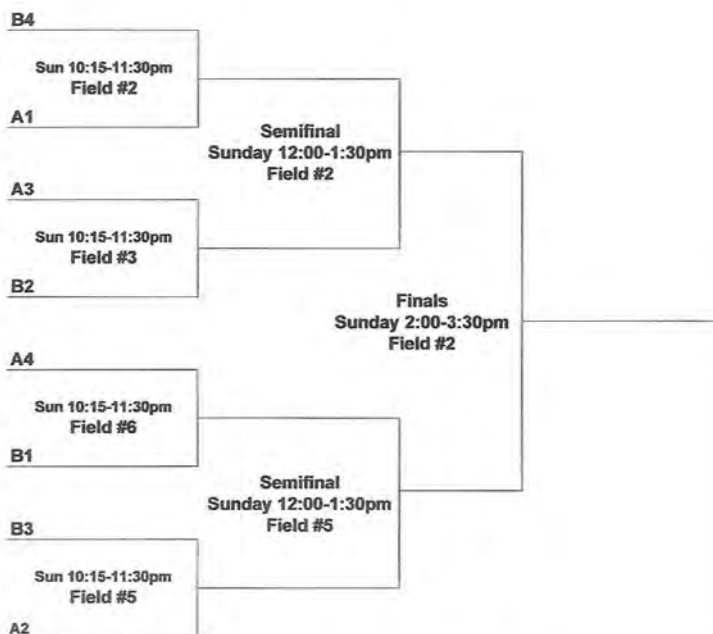

Team History: The origins of Chapel Hill's first junior women's team were long in the making. The original idea to start a girl's team began in the fall of 2001, when the large number of girls coming to the CHUF practices seemed to demonstrate the interest to start a new team. There were not enough girls to field a team as a solitary school, so the girls from East Chapel Hill High were invited. This group of ten from Chapel Hill High and five from East started practicing together in November 2001. At this point, a bid was placed for nationals last spring, and the team got in. That's when the name, Durga, was chosen. She is a goddess with eight arms and has a spinning disc as one of her weapons. Around then, two girls from Cardinal Gibbons joined the team for nationals. Durga arrived in Atlanta never having seen or played another junior girls team or having played together as a team. There, the first game was won and the weekend ended with a fourth-place finish.
