Ultimate gains a nationals division specifically for mixed-gender play...

How many team sports allow men and women to compete together at the highest level of athleticism? Basketball? Nope. Height's too impotant. Football or Rugby? No way- brawn wins. Soccer, Handball, Lacrosse or Field Hockey? Perhaps top level coed could work there. But is it? Do the majority of players in those sports around the world play gendered or coed?

So what is it about Ultimate? What makes our sport better suited for coed play than any other team field or court spot? Is it the way we use space? The lack of goal or basket? Or does it have to do with the tool we use - dependent on science for much more controlled flight than any ball. Maybe something about Spirit of the Game is the key, or the body controll that's required for non-contact play.

Who knows, but top coed teams from around North America are here to show the world how it works. And work it does, for the thousands of league and pickup players who have enjoyed coed Ultimate for years.

This year's addition of a coed championship division is an exciting development for the Sport of Ultimate and for the UPA. Mixed gender play gains an outlet to evolve towards similar strategic and competitive levels as in Open & Women's games. And the new division allows cities with too few men or women players to form a top gendered team to participate at the national level, helping to grow the sport and to spread experience to more players.

Ultimate allows mixed gender play as well or better than any other team field sport due to our rules, including non-contact and Spirit of the Game. Highly athletic play among a wide range of player speeds and heights is facilitated by the nature of field movement in Ultimate as well as by the technical aspects of throwing the disc. But most players simply say, it is fun! Perhaps for this reason, coed Ultimate has exploded at the grass-roots level, with leagues in some cities reaching over 100 teams.

Just as Ultimate is gaining recognition as a sport, Coed is gaining recognition as a division. If you look at all the branches of Ultimate, from the grass roots to the elite, from the masters to the juniors, and all the variations of gender ratios, the sport is huge and only getting huger. By joining together in our passion for whatever type of Ultimate we play, this point can only become more and more apparent, both to the fledgling institutions that support Ultimate and to the outside world of media and sponsorship.

Coed Ultimate creates a venue for men and women to compete as equally values teammates in sport, as in life. But coed players have a way to go before reaching the strategic and competitive levels attained in the Open and Women's divisions- may our current and future UPA coed players start us off in that direction with Ultimate spirit, fun and grace, both on and off the field.

Many, Many thanks to the sectional and regional coordinators and all the team leaders who helped make this fledging coed division a success, as well as the original UPA coed committee that officially formed over two years ago to establish and foundation for this year's explosion of interest in coed.

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

Red Tide

Red tide was formed in 1988 by several University of Maine and Orono graduates. The teams initial focus was on having fun and hosting the Clambake. The Clambake has turned into the nationally renowned tournament that most attendees consider the single best party in Ultimate, bar none. The Clambake and associated activities have helped raise over \$30,000 for Maine Special Olympics since 1993.

While Red Tide has kept its initial focus (fun and Clambake) in tact, beginning in 1992 experienced club players began moving to Portland. Maine and providing some structure to the existing talent base. In the fall of 1992. Red Tide won its first games at Open Regionals going 2-2 on Saturday. In 1996. Red Tide gualified to play Sunday at Open Regionals and was knocked out in the game-to-go to the game to go by a NY team. The following year Red Tide added more talent but realized the same result, this time to Snapple(a/k/a/roQ and Dark Horse). In 1998, Red Tide again added more talent and finally cleared the game-to-go hurdle and beat a very good Dark Horse team to earn the right to play in its first Nationals, Significant 1998 tounament results have included: Eastern Champion, No border champions, Tune Up runner-up in the A-pool (to sub-zero), Clambake runner-up (to Dark Horse), and third at Regionals (after ceeding the 2nd spot to NY).


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

After any on-field dispute has lasted 30 seconds, an Observer will step in and ask the players to conclude the discussion immediately. The Observer will take steps to mediate and facilitate a rapid resolution to the disagreement, including making a ruling on the play if (and only if) requested to do so by either of the players involved in the dispute.

2:

Time between goals. 90 seconds after a goal is scored, an Observer will raise one hand and announce loudly "90 seconds". The Observer will make similar announcements every 15 seconds thereafter until the disc is pulled. The purpose here is not to enforce any time limit, but to provide feedback and a gentle incentive to keep the game moving.

Proposed Pull Rule Changes

If the pull "lands and stays in-bounds" or "is caught in bounds" you play it from that point.

If the disc initially lands in-bounds, then goes out-of bounds, the receiving team gains possession at the point on the playing field proper nearest to where the disc first went out of bounds.

If the disc lands out of bounds you can:

1. Put the disc into play at the point on the playing field proper nearest to where the disc first went out of bounds.

2. Request a re-throw.

3. Call Middle/Brick and Signal (raise hand above head), then the receiving team may choose to put the disc into play halfway between the two sidelines either at the point on the playing field proper closest to where the disc went out-of-bounds or at a point 20 yards upfield from the goal line which they are defending.

The receiving team can call re-throw, if the defense is off-sides at the time of the pull.
