#### Greetings Grand Masters,

Minnesota Ultimate and USA Ultimate are excited to welcome you to the National Sports Center in Blaine, MN, September 1-3 for the 2012 USA Ultimate Grand Masters Championship. The weekend promises to be one to remember with great Ultimate played on fabulous fields and, of course, legendary social events that only Minnesota hospitality and Surly Brewery know how to host!

The National Sports Center (NSC), the world's largest amateur sports and meeting facility, will host this year's Championship. The NSC has a strong history of hosting major national and international Ultimate events. The highlight was in 1998, when the best players in the world visited the NSC for the World Flying Disc Federation World Championships. The NSC is also an active site of the MN High School Ultimate League State Championship Tournament (with over 60 competing teams), three local week-night Twin Cities Ultimate Leagues (45+ teams) and has hosted the USA Ultimate Youth Club Championships each summer since 2005.

### **COMPETITION RULES**

- USA Ultimate Official Rules, 11th Edition will be in effect.
- All game to 15, point-cap at 17, except Pool B/C games to 13/15.
- Halftime is 5 minutes.
- Each team has two time outs per half.
- Regardless of how many time outs a team has used before overtime, during overtime each team has one time out.
- Overtime: A game is in overtime if tied at one point less than original game total (e.g. in a
  game to 15 goals, overtime occurs when the score reaches 14-14).
- Soft time-caps will not be used.
- Hard time-cap goes on at end of round time on schedule. Game is over at the end of the point in progress, unless tied. If tied, play one more point.
- The cap does not affect time outs



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### **SPIRIT AWARDS**

Ultimate has traditionally relied upon the spirit of sportsmanship, which places the responsibility for fair play on the player. Highly competitive play is encouraged, but never at the expense of mutual respect among competitors, adherence to the agreed upon rules of the game, or the basic joy of play. — 11th Edition USA Ultimate Rules of Ultimate.

#### INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

Teams will each be asked to nominate a player from their own team who they feel displays the highest level of Spirit. The definition of Spirit is up to each team, but should include elements of sportsmanship, leadership, perseverance, fire, etc. Choose the person whose attitude you wish other people on your team would emulate and who other players off your team admire. Individual Spirit winners will receive a medal and prize disc (courtesy of DISCRAFT). Thanks to Discraft for their support of Ultimate and Spirit of the Game!

#### TEAM AWARDS

Following every game, each team will be asked to rate its opponent on a scale of 1-5, with 5 being the highest level of sportsmanship. These ratings will be averaged and the team in each division with the highest rating will be awarded the Team Spirit Award after their division's finals.

#### **USA ULTIMATE SPIRIT RATINGS GUIDELINES**

The ratings are ordered from 5 (indicating the highest level of spirit) through 1 (the lowest level of spirit):

5: Highest level of respect shown throughout the game towards opponents, officials, and spectators. For the level of play, showed excellent knowledge of the rules and abided by them throughout the game. Any conflicts were resolved amicably and without incident. Opposing team's conduct added to our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team unfailingly played fairly and with an excellent attitude.

4: Respect shown throughout the game towards opponents, officials, and spectators. For the level of play, showed above average knowledge of the rules and abided by them throughout the game. Any conflicts were resolved favorably and without incident. Opposing team's conduct did not detract from our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team played fairly and with a good attitude.

3: Generally exhibited respect towards opponents, officials, and spectators. For the level of play, showed adequate knowledge of the rules and abided by them during the game. Any conflicts were resolved plainly and without incident. Opposing team's conduct generally did not detract from our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team generally played fairly and with a decent attitude.

2: Exhibited a lack of respect towards opponents, officials, and/or spectators. For the level of play, showed a lack of knowledge of, or disregard for the rules at points during the game. Any conflicts were resolved heatedly or led to contentious incidents. Opposing team's conduct detracted somewhat from our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team played unfairly and/ or with a poor attitude.

1: Exhibited a major lack of respect towards opponents, officials, and/or spectators. For the level of play, exhibited no knowledge of the rules or blatantly disregarded them during the game. Conflicts were resolved acrimoniously or led directly to contentious incidents. Opposing team's conduct made the game basically unenjoyable. The opposing team played unfairly and their attitude was abysmal.



### IO THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT SPIRIT OF THE GAME™

1. THE GOLDEN RULE: TREAT OTHERS AS YOU WOULD WANT TO BE TREATED. Spirited games result from mutual respect among opponents. Assume the best of your opponent. Give him or her the benefit of a doubt. You would want the same for yourself. But if you are thick-skinned, do not assume that your opponent is. Maybe you should think of this rule as, "treat others as you would have them treat your mother."

2. CONTROL: SOTG TAKES REAL EFFORT. SOTG is not just some abstract principle that everyone adopts and then games run smoothly without effort. Close calls are made in tight games. Hard fouls are committed. SOTG is about how you handle yourself under pressure: how you contain your emotionality, tame your temper, and modulate your voice. If you initiate or contribute to the unraveling of spirit, the concept falls apart quickly. If you act to mend things (or at least not exacerbate the situation) by following (1) above, the game heals itself.

#### 3. HECKLING AND TAUNTING ARE DIFFERENT.

Ultimate has a long tradition of good-natured heckling. Heckles are friendly barbs, typically from non-playing spectators. Heckling can be fun, but taunting is unspirited and wrong. Harassing remarks after an opponent's foul call or close play are NOT heckling: they are abusive taunts which create unpleasant playing conditions and often escalate to acrimonious disputes.

4. SOTG IS COMPATIBLE WITH CHAMPIONSHIP PLAY. It is a fallacy to argue that the stakes are so important that some aspect of SOTG can be cast aside. Time and again, great teams and star players have shown that you can bring all your competitive and athletic zeal to a game without sacrificing fair play or respect for your opponent.

5. DON'T "GIVE AS YOU GOT." There is no "eye for an eye." If you are wronged, you have no right to wrong someone in return. In the extreme case where you were severely mistreated, you may bring the issue up with a captain, tournament director, or even lodge a complaint with the governing body. If you retaliate in kind, however, a complaint may be filed against you. We recall point (1): treat others as you would have them treat you, not as they have treated you. In the end, you are responsible for you. 6. BREATHE. After a hard foul, close call, or disputed play, take a step back, pause, and take a deep breath. In the heat of competition, emotions run high. By giving yourself just a bit of time and space, you will gain enough perspective to compose yourself and concentrate on the facts involved in the dispute (was she in or out; did you hit his hand or the disc; did that pick affect the play). Your restraint will induce a more restrained response from your opponent. Conflagration averted, you may resume business as usual.

7. WHEN YOU DO THE RIGHT THING, PEOPLE NOTICE. When you turn the other cheek, you know you've done the right thing. You may not hear praise, there may be no standing ovation, but people do notice. Eventually, their respect for you and their appreciation of the game will grow.


8. BE GENEROUS WITH PRAISE. Compliment an opponent on her good catch. Remark to a teammate that you admire their honesty in calling themselves out of bounds. Look players in the eye and congratulate them when you shake their hands after a game. These small acts boost spirit greatly, a large payoff for little time and effort.

9. IMPRESSIONS LINGER. Not only does the realization that your actions will be remembered for a long time serve to curb poor behavior, it can also inspire better conduct. Many old-timers enjoy the experience of meeting an elite player who remembers their first rendezvous on the field and recalls the event in detail. A good first encounter with an impressionable young player can have considerable long term positive impact.

 HAVE FUN. All other things being equal, games are far more fun without the antipathy. Go hard. Play fair. Have fun.

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
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

### HEALTH AND SAFETY

Medical staff (trainer and EMT) will be available throughout the event at Tournament Central. Please seek advice and assistance regarding prevention and treatment of injuries or illness. Directions to the local hospital can be found in the "Directions" section of this program.

### CONCUSSIONS

- · Concussions are brain injuries that can occur as a result of a blow to the head.
- Symptoms may include headache, nausea, vision problems, confusion and balance problems.
- If you think you or one of your teammates might have a concussion, tell your coach and have the person see a medical professional. Medical staff is on hand at the event at Tournament Central.

### HEAT, NUTRITION AND HYDRATION

- Heat-related illness occurs when body cooling by evaporation is limited. Sweating depletes the body's salt and moisture, which leads to dehydration. If a player recognizes any signs or symptoms of heat-related illness, he or she should treat the problem immediately.
- Signs and symptoms of heat illness can include a change in a level of consciousness, abdominal cramps, nausea/vomiting, fatigue/tingling, chills, inability to spit, dry mucous membranes, decreased output and change in color of urine.
- Prevention and treatment of heat illness:
  - Avoid alcohol, caffeine, and carbonated beverages.
  - Medications such as antihistamines, decongestants, certain asthma medications, and diuretics can increase risk for heat illness. Avoid them if possible.
  - Avoid certain nutritional supplements (such as caffeine and ephedrine) that can dehydrate the body and/or increase metabolism and heat production.
  - Know your body Be honest! Are you fit enough to perform under current conditions?
  - Drink and eat Eat and drink (water AND sports drinks) "optimally" before, during, and after play. Potassium is important (good sources include: sports drinks, yogurt, grapefruit juice, bananas, and oranges). Sodium is also important (good sources include: sports drinks, vegetable juices, pretzels, nuts, cheese and crackers). After play, carbohydrates are important: foods such as potatoes, honey, cereal, white bread, corn chips, sports drinks, jelly beans, rice cakes, bagels crackers, gummy candies).
- Don't drink too much. Over-hydrating can be dangerous if it leads to a fluid and electrolyte imbalance.
- Monitor your urine Clear/copious = hydrated. Dark = Need water/electrolytes.
- Be sensitive to prior illness If you've been sick, your body may be more susceptible to dehydration.
- Rest and cool down after play Find shade, wet the skin, get in front of a fan or breeze.

### SIDELINE SAFETY

- Players and spectators should make every effort to keep objects, including but not limited to bags, strollers, chairs, coolers and tents, at least 3 yards from the sideline.
- If a player feels that an object on the sideline is not safe, he or she should inform

Event Staff and should refrain from playing until satisfied that safe conditions have been established.

 USA Ultimate and Event Staff reserve the right to move or remove objects or spectators on or near the playing field if those conditions are, in the opinion of USA Ultimate or Event Staff, unsafe for players, staff, or spectators.

### LIGHTNING GUIDELINES

- Event staff will communicate with players and spectators via PA system and field marshals equipped with radios that there is a lightning danger, play will be stopped, and everyone should seek shelter.
- Safe shelter for players and spectators at the field site includes any fully-enclosed building or vehicle with a hard-top and closed windows.
- Event staff will use the Flash-to Bang method to determine when to send people to shelter. By the time the Flash-to-Bang count has reached 30 seconds, all individuals should be in a safe shelter location.
- If you can't get to a safe shelter, try to avoid being the tallest object in an open field or
  on open water. Avoid other tall objects, metal objects, and water. Assume a crouch position with only the balls of your feet touching the ground, your arms wrapped around
  your knees, and your head lowered. Minimize contact with the ground. Do not lie flat.
- Avoid using telephone land lines. Cell phones are safe provided the person has followed other safety guidelines.
- Event staff will indicate to players when play is going to resume. Team captains should meet at Tournament Central to receive instructions for resuming play and any schedule modifications.

### **COMPETITION RULES**

- USA Ultimate Official Rules of Ultimate (11th Edition) will be in effect.
- All games will be played to 15, with a point-cap at 17
- Half-time is 10 minutes.
- · Each team has two timeouts per half.
- Regardless of how many timeouts a team has used before overtime, during overtime each team has one timeout.
- Overtime: A game is in overtime if tied at one point less than original game total (e.g. In a game to 15 goals, overtime occurs when the score reaches 14-14).
- Hard time-cap goes on at end of round time on schedule. Game is over at the end of the point in progress, unless tied. If tied, play one more point.
- Soft time-cap goes on 20 minutes before the hard cap. Add two points to higher score after first score after soft time-cap. Game ends when first team reaches new game total, or when first team reaches 15 or more ahead by at least two points, whichever comes first.
- Caps do not affect timeouts.

### 2013 USA ULTIMATE TRIPLE CROWN TOUR



The USA Ultimate Triple Crown Tour is the new name and new structure for the USA Ultimate club season, including the summer Regular Season and the fall Championship Series for the Men's, Mixed, and Women's divisions. Teams in this structure qualify into one of four "Flights" based on their finish in the previous year's Championship Series. Qualification for the 2012 Club Championships means all teams at Nationals have earned their way into one of the two top

Flights (Pro or Elite) for 2013. At the 2012 Club Championships, quarterfinalists will earn one of 8 spots in the 2013 Pro Flight. Semifinalists will earn a bid to the 2013 U.S. Open Championships. The bottom 8 teams at Nationals will be placed into the Elite Flight for the 2013 Triple Crown Tour. 

### HEALTH AND SAFETY

Medical staff, including athletic trainers, will be on site at Tournament Central to treat injuries, handle emergencies, and provide some preventative care. The event will provide standard athletic tape, pre-wrap, ice and some bandages. Other supplies, including special tape/bandages and anti-inflammatory drugs, must be provided by teams or may be charged by the training staff. If there is an injury on a field that needs medical attention, inform a field marshal and he/she will radio to the trainers. If you have medical issues that require attention in the morning before play, please show up early to avoid long lines. The trainers will be at the fields by 7:30 a.m. each day. Directions to the local hospital can be found in the "Directions" section of this program.

#### CONCUSSIONS

- Concussions are brain injuries that can occur as a result of a blow to the head.
- Symptoms may include headache, nausea, vision problems, confusion, and balance problems.
- If you think you or one of your teammates might have a concussion, tell your coach and have the athlete see a medical professional. Medical staff members are on hand at Tournament Central.

#### HEAT, NUTRITION AND HYDRATION

- Heat-related illness occurs when body cooling by evaporation is limited. Sweating depletes the body's salt and moisture, which leads to dehydration. If a player recognizes any signs or symptoms of heat-related illness, he or she should treat the problem immediately.
- Signs and symptoms of heat illness can include changes in level of consciousness, abdominal cramps, nausea/vomiting, fatigue/tingling, chills, inability to spit, dry mucous membranes, decreased output and change in color of urine.
  - Prevention and treatment of heat illness
    - Avoid alcohol, caffeine, and carbonated beverages.
    - Medications such as antihistamines, decongestants, certain asthma medications, and diuretics can increase risk for heat illness. Avoid them if possible.
    - Avoid certain nutritional supplements (such as caffeine and ephedrine) that can dehydrate the body and/or increase metabolism and heat production.
    - Know your body Be honest! Are you fit enough to perform under current conditions?
    - Eat and drink (water AND sports drinks) optimally before, during and after play. Potassium is important (good sources include: sports drinks, yogurt, grapefruit juice, bananas and oranges). Sodium is also important (good sources include: sports drinks, vegetable juices, pretzels, nuts, cheese and crackers). After play, carbohydrates are important: foods such as potatoes, honey, cereal, white bread, corn chips, sports drinks, jelly beans, rice cakes, bagels, crackers and gummy candies).
    - Don't drink too much: Over-hydrating can be dangerous if it leads to a fluid and electrolyte imbalance.
    - Monitor your urine: Clear/copious = hydrated. Dark = Need water/electrolytes.



- Be sensitive to prior illness: If you've been sick, your body may be more susceptible to dehydration.
- Rest and cool down after play. Find shade, wet the skin, get in front of a fan or breeze.

#### SIDELINE SAFETY

- Spectators and equipment must stay at least 3 yards away from the sidelines. Where there are buffer lines, respect them. Chairs, coolers, strollers, you, etc., must be at least three yards from the sidelines.
- If a player believes that an object on the sideline is not safe, he or she should inform Event Staff and refrain from playing until he or she is satisfied that safe conditions have been established.
- USA Ultimate and Event Staff reserve the right to move or remove objects or spectators from on or near the playing field if those conditions are, in the opinion of USA Ultimate or Event Staff, unsafe for players, staff or spectators.

#### LIGHTNING GUIDELINES

- Event staff will communicate with players and spectators via PA system, and through field marshals equipped with radios, if there is a lightning danger. Play then will be stopped, and everyone should seek shelter.
- Safe shelter for players and spectators at the field site includes any fully enclosed building or vehicle with a hard top and closed windows.
- Event staff will use the "flash-to-bang" method to determine when to send people to shelter. By the time the flash-to-bang count has reached 30 seconds, all individuals should be in a safe shelter location.
- If you can't get to a safe shelter, try to avoid being the tallest object in an open field or on open water. Avoid other tall objects, metal objects and water. Assume a crouched position with only the balls of your feet touching the ground, your arms wrapped around your knees, and your head lowered. Minimize contact with the ground. Do not lie flat.
- Avoid using telephone land lines. Cell phones are safe, provided the person has followed other safety guidelines.
- Event staff will indicate to players when play is going to resume. Team captains should meet at Tournament Central to receive instructions for resuming play and any schedule modifications.

### SPORTS MASSAGE THERAPY

The Florida State Massage Therapy Association Sports Massage Therapy Team will be available next to the medical tent near the pavilion. These professional Licensed Massage Therapists will be working on a \$1/minute pay-as-you-go system. They will provide Pre- and Post-Sports Massage Therapy from 8:00 a.m. through the end of games each day.



### **SPIRIT AWARDS**

#### TEAM AWARDS

Following every game, each team will be asked to rate its opponent on a scale of 1-5, with 5 being the highest level of sportsmanship. These ratings will be averaged and the team in each division with the highest rating will be awarded the Team Spirit Award after their division's finals.

#### USA ULTIMATE SPIRIT RATINGS GUIDELINES

The ratings are ordered from 5 (indicating the highest level of spirit) through 1 (the lowest level of spirit):

**5:** Highest level of respect shown throughout the game towards opponents, officials, and spectators. For the level of play, showed excellent knowledge of the rules and abided by them throughout the game. Any conflicts were resolved amicably and without incident. Opposing team's conduct added to our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team unfailingly played fairly and with an excellent attitude.

**4:** Respect shown throughout the game towards opponents, officials, and spectators. For the level of play, showed above average knowledge of the rules and abided by them throughout the game. Any conflicts were resolved favorably and without incident. Opposing team's conduct did not detract from our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team played fairly and with a good attitude.

**3:** Generally exhibited respect towards opponents, officials, and spectators. For the level of play, showed adequate knowledge of the rules and abided by them during the game. Any conflicts were resolved plainly and without incident. Opposing team's conduct generally did not detract from our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team generally played fairly and with a decent attitude.

2: Exhibited a lack of respect towards opponents, officials, and/or spectators. For the level of play, showed a lack of knowledge of, or disregard for the rules at points during the game. Any conflicts were resolved heatedly or led to contentious incidents. Opposing team's conduct detracted somewhat from our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team played unfairly and/ or with a poor attitude.

1: Exhibited a major lack of respect towards opponents, officials, and/or spectators. For the level of play, exhibited no knowledge of the rules or blatantly disregarded them during the game. Conflicts were resolved acrimoniously or led directly to contentious incidents. Opposing team's conduct made the game basically unenjoyable. The opposing team played unfairly and their attitude was abysmal.

#### INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

Teams are asked to nominate a player from their own team who displays the highest level of spirit. The definition of spirit is up to each team, but should include elements of respect, sportsmanship, leadership, perseverance, intensity, etc. Teams are asked to choose the player whose attitude should be emulated by teammates and admired by opponents. Individual spirit winners will receive a medal, prize disc (courtesy of DISCRAFT).

**PETER FARRICKER SPIRIT OF THE GAME AWARD** – The spirit award in the Open Division is named for Peter Farricker, a player who embodied Spirit of the Game to those who played with or against him. This award is given to a player in the Open Division of the USA Ultimate Championship Series deemed to have exhibited personal responsibility, integrity and fairness combined with a high standard of playing ability. Each qualifying Open team nominates one player from its roster who best represents the Spirit of the Game. At the Open Championship, each nominee is honored with a disc and a pin or set of Mardi Gras beads. The goal is that those wearing the Mardi Gras beads will be connected to Pete, each other and the Spirit of the Game, and become role models for their teammates and opponents. A selection committee watches the Open semifinal round and selects one of the four semifinal nominees as the winner. The award will be presented after the Open Finals. Previous winners include Moses Rifkin, Andy Crews, Damien Scott, Jeff Eastham-Anderson, Allan Cowan, Chase Sparling-Beckley, Josh McCarthy, Robbie Cahill, Bart Watson, and Matt Rebholz.

**KATHY PUFAHL SPIRIT OF THE GAME AWARD** – The Women's Division spirit award builds upon the foundations of SOTG that are reflected in the Farricker Spirit Award: ability, fairness and integrity. The Kathy Pufahl Spirit Award also recognizes those individuals who give back to our sport and is presented to the player deemed to have exhibited personal responsibility, integrity and selfless contribution to Ultimate, combined with a high standard of playing ability. Each qualifying Women's team nominates one player from its roster as the person who best represents the Spirit of the Game and has contributed in a substantial way to their Ultimate community. At the Club Championships, each of the 16 nominees is honored with a memento reflective of Kathy's love of horticulture. A vote of the qualifying teams will determine the recipient of the Pufahl Award, which will be presented during half-time of the Women's Finals. Previous winners include Vida Towne, Kati Halmos, Kristine Gill, Deanna Ball, Allison Boyd, Jody Dozono, Michelle Ng, and Gwen Ambler.

**MARTY BAKKO SPIRIT OF THE GAME AWARD** – In 2010, USA Ultimate added a new individual spirit award in the Masters Division to recognize one player in that division who stands out for their commitment and love of the game. The Masters Division spirit award honors players that embody the best attributes of Ultimate. Like Marty Bakko, these individuals: have an infectious sense of humor; possess a long-term passion for the sport of Ultimate; display a commitment to fair play, integrity and respect for their opponent; are shrewd, tactical innovators on the field; show an intense, competitive Spirit; and are leaders who inspire others to act. Each qualifying Masters team nominates one player from its roster as the person who best represents the Spirit of the Game and the qualities listed above. At the Club Championships, a vote of the qualifying teams will determine the recipient of the Marty Bakko Award, which will be presented during half-time of the Masters Finals. Previous winners include Blayne Ferguson and Russ Adams.

Johnny Bravo was founded in 1996 by Dan Ackerstein, Wes Williams and Dan "Jello" Revelle. (Note- Johnny Bravo was not named after the popular animated television series which first aired in 1997.) The team was founded on vengeance by castoffs from the top Boulderarea team, Secret Squirrel. Johnny Bravo quickly overtook their rivals and began their reign as the top elite team in Colorado, qualifying for Nationals in 1997. Bravo split into two teams (Bravo and Gun Club) in 1998 and failed to qualify for Nationals after falling to the Santa Barbara Condors in the final and Los Guapos from San Diego in the backdoor game. Bravo and Gun Club reunited in 1999 and took the name of the old Boulder team, Secret Squirrel. After a disappointing 15th place finish at nationals in 1999, the team reclaimed their Johnny Bravo identify in 2000. Bravo has qualified for Nationals every

year since 2000, a feat matched by Seattle Sockeye and surpassed only by Raleigh's Ring of Fire (1997). Bravo broke into the quarterfinals in 2001 and has remained a lop tier team ever since. In the past few years, Bravo made three semifinals appearances and a finals appearance in 2007.

### 10 THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT SPIRIT OF THE GAME™

#### 1. THE GOLDEN RULE: TREAT OTHERS AS YOU WOULD WANT TO BE

**TREATED.** Spirited games result from mutual respect among opponents. Assume the best of your opponent. Give him or her the benefit of a doubt. You would want the same for yourself. But if you are thick-skinned, do not assume that your opponent is. Maybe you should think of this rule as, "treat others as you would have them treat your mother."

**2. CONTROL: SOTG TAKES REAL EFFORT.** SOTG is not just some abstract principle that everyone adopts and then games run smoothly without effort. Close calls are made in tight games. Hard fouls are committed. SOTG is about how you handle yourself under pressure: how you contain your emotionality, tame your temper, and modulate your voice. If you initiate or contribute to the unraveling of spirit, the concept falls apart quickly. If you act to mend things (or at least not exacerbate the situation) by following (1) above, the game heals itself.

#### 3. HECKLING AND TAUNTING ARE DIFFERENT.

Ultimate has a long tradition of good-natured heckling. Heckles are friendly barbs, typically from non-playing spectators. Heckling can be fun, but taunting is unspirited and wrong. Harassing remarks after an opponent's foul call or close play are NOT heckling: they are abusive taunts which create unpleasant playing conditions and often escalate to acrimonious disputes.

4. SOTG IS COMPATIBLE WITH CHAMPIONSHIP PLAY. It is a fallacy to argue that the stakes are so important that some aspect of SOTG can be cast aside. Time and again, great teams and star players have shown that you can bring all your competitive and athletic zeal to a game without sacrificing fair play or respect for your opponent.

**5. DON'T "GIVE AS YOU GOT."** There is no "eye for an eye." If you are wronged, you have no right to wrong someone in return. In the extreme case where you were severely mistreated, you may bring the issue up with a captain, tournament director, or even lodge a complaint with the governing body. If you retaliate in kind, however, a complaint may be filed against you. We recall point (1): treat others as you would have them treat you, not as they have treated you. In the end, you are responsible for you.

**6. BREATHE**. After a hard foul, close call, or disputed play, take a step back, pause, and take a deep breath. In the heat of competition, emotions run high. By giving yourself just a bit of time and space, you will gain enough perspective to compose yourself and concentrate on the facts involved in the dispute (was she in or out; did you hit his hand or the disc; did that pick affect the play). Your restraint will induce a more restrained response from your opponent. Conflagration averted, you may resume business as usual.

**7. WHEN YOU DO THE RIGHT THING, PEOPLE NOTICE.** When you turn the other cheek, you know you've done the right thing. You may not hear praise, there may be no standing ovation, but people do notice. Eventually, their respect for you and their appreciation of the game will grow.

8. BE GENEROUS WITH PRAISE. Compliment an opponent on her good catch. Remark to a teammate that you admire their honesty in calling themselves out of bounds. Look players in the eye and congratulate them when you shake their hands after a game. These small acts boost spirit greatly, a large payoff for little time and effort.

**9. IMPRESSIONS LINGER.** Not only does the realization that your actions will be remembered for a long time serve to curb poor behavior, it can also inspire better conduct. Many old-timers enjoy the experience of meeting an elite player who remembers their first rendezvous on the field and recalls the event in detail. A good first encounter with an impressionable young player can have considerable long term positive impact.

**10. HAVE FUN.** All other things being equal, games are far more fun without the antipathy. Go hard. Play fair. Have fun.
