

ULTIMATE

Ultimate Frisbee originated in 1968, at Columbia High School in Maplewood N.J. The first intercollegiate match was in 1972 between Rutgers and Princeton with the former winning. In 1977 the first East/West Championships were held in L.A. where Santa Barbara defeated Penn. State. 1978 saw Santa Barbara retain the Championship title with their win over Cornell at Santa Barbara. the 1979 National Championships were held in Philadelphia. There an up-start Glassboro State team overcame Santa Barbara to bring the title to the East Coast.

Ultimate is a sport played by two teams of seven. With the throw-off or "pull" the game begins. The receiving team may elect to catch the disc and start play or may choose to let it drop and begin play from that point. The disc is advanced from player to player down the field. The thrower may not run with the disc but the receiver may move to catch it. All players are potential throwers and receivers. A point is scored when one player passes the disc across the goal line to another player.

Contact is discouraged and allowed only when incidental. Fouls are called by the players. No referees are used on the field. However observers may be used at the discretion of the team captains. Their role is arbitary when they are asked to make a call. However to date this role has been minimal.

Games will be played to either a set number of points or by a set time (until this year time has been the norm).

The field is 70 yds. long by 40 yds. wide with 25 yds. end zones.


the Allanta Frisbee Club

Now nearly four years old, the Atlanta
Frisbee Club was started by several Emory
U. students. Its primary activity has been
Ultimate Frisbee. However there is significant interest in such events as Golf, SelfCaught Flight, Distance, Double Disc Court
and of course Freestyle. The A.F.C. shelters
both Ultimate teams, The Doctors of Disc and
The Peaches. In this year's Regional
Tournament in New Orleans the Doctors finished
Fourth of eight teams while the Peaches tied
for Fifth. In 1979 Atlanta Ultimate the only
Atlanta team to go to the regionals in
Gainesville, Fla., finished second to Orlando.

In the past the A.F.C. has hosted the 1978
National Disc Open at G. Tech, the 1979 North
American Series Tournament at Piedmont Park,
the 1980 N.A.S. Tournament (with the Athens
Disc Golf Club) in Athens and the 1980 SubSectional Tournaments at Georgia Tech. It
is a great privilege to be hosting the 1980
National Championships, the first to be
held in the fall and in the South.
