## Regionals Summary or How We Got Here

**NORTHEAST** - N.Y. fought their way to the top by beating UMass in the semis and then eking out a victory over the Rude Boys in the winners final. The Rudies went back and slaughtered the Boston Stranglers. The Boston Spinsters once again earned their spot by cruising through the women's division.

**MID-ATLANTIC** - Static Disc fought their way to the top utilizing their strong man to man D to stifle Mr. Ponce from N.C. and the Gang beat them with their zone to take the 2nd spot. Andromeda won the women's spot by beating UVA in the finals after losing to them in the prelims.

**CENTRAL** - Undoubtedly the hardest fought Region in the country, St. Louis won by beating Windy City 22-20 in the winners bracket. It was a game that was tied from 14's to 20's until St. Louis scored 2 in a row to win. Windy went on to beat the Horizontals in the loser's final. Current National Champ Fisheads beat out Windy City women for the right to defend their title.

**SOUTH** - Miami Refugees won the top spot with a squad of virtually unknown players. Gainesville joined their Floridian bro's for their second trip to the nationals. The Shakti Nuns are also making their 2nd straight trip to Nationals.

**WEST** - The Flying Circus crushed to win their second western title—their hardest game was against the Spinoffs. The Condors rebounded to take the 2nd spot going on an 18-8 surge to beat out the Spinoffs. The Condors won the women's title by handily beating Dark Star for their 1st nationals appearance.

# The History of the Nationals

**I**N THE beginning there was disc, and it was good and then some cad from New Jerky had to put boundaries upon it and these boundaries were called Ultimate. From that date (1968) disc would not be the same.

Columbia High School in Maplewood, New Jersey, was the site of the original Uity contest, devised by a group of semi-unconscious unknowns who have since mysteriously disappeared. Uity gradually developed a series of definitive rules that gave us the ultimate disc sport. For six years, Uity wandered through the realm of the unknown until some bright individual decided to hold the first National Uity Championship in 1973. Since most of the only decent Uity players all went to the same school, Rutgers, they proceeded to capture the first four championships.

During the time when all these national Uity championships were being held, no one outside the Eastern Seaboard played the game—or at least that's the way it seemed. Gradually, like a strain of the flu, the game spread itself across the country, first infecting areas of the Ohio Valley, then creeping its way into the Great Lakes region, and eventually reaching the West Coast. Of course, no one on the East Coast cared whether or not anyone played, since they all believed that if you won the Easterns, you won the Nationals.

In 1977, the Wham-O Corp decided to sponsor an East-West national title game during the week of the Rose Bowl Disc Championships. It was sort of a joke—everyone knew that Penn State was gonna slaughter the Condors.

The whos? Well, much to the chagrin of the Eastern establishment, it was Santa Barbara who slaughtered the Nittany Lions, 32-14. The world of Uity would never be the same, and boy! were those East Coast guys mad. They were so mad that they organized what many still believe to be one of the best Uity teams ever—the Cornell Red Buds. The Red-heads came out West to take the title back where they thought it belonged. They forgot to score in the last six minutes of the game, however, and once again the Condors lucked out and won the national championship.

After the 1978 season, the gods of Uity met to restructure the national championship process. It was decided that the country would be divided into five regions: West, Central, South, Mid-Atlantic, and Northeast. In 1979, the five finalists gathered in State College, Pennsylvania, to vie for the title. The Condors and Cornell were there, as were Gainesville, Florida, Michigan State, and Glassboro from New Jerky. After round-robin play, the Condors and Glassboro slogged their way through the rain and mud to the finals. That final game was hardly a display of quality Uity; it rained even harder and the puddles were even bigger. But the 'Boro, using a dump-pass offense and excellent Zone D managed to eke out a one-point victory over the Conteds, to become the first Ultimate Players Association National Uity Champs.

In 1980, they decided to move the site to a warm-weather area, so they held the championship in Atlanta, Georgia. Great idea. At the start of the first game, Santa Barbara v's the 'Boro, there were snow flurries coming down. The other finalists that year were Michigan State, Dallas, and the Boston Aerodisc. All tried to knock Glassboro off, with little success. The closest anyone came was in the finals, when Boston had the disc on the goal line with ten seconds left, needing one to tie, only to have one of their players drop the 'bee in the endzone as the clock expired and the 'Boro won again, 12-11.

The Powers That Be decided to move the next championships to a centralized area—Bob Austin, Texas. The fields in Austin were just slightly softer than your average playground blacktop, and quite a bit dustier. That year, Santa Barbara, Dallas, and Michigan State all made repeat performances with the newcomers, The Boston Hostages and The Knights of Nee out of Jerkyland. There was some great comp in the prelims, but after two days Santa Barbara and the Knee emerged as finalists. The Knights had a four-goal lead going into the second half, but the Condoramos stormed back and, as one idiot observer noted, "Scored in spite of themselves," and won the title 15-13. The 1981 championship also included for the first time a women's division—Boston Ladies Uity, Dark Star, Michigan State, Glassboro, and Wild and Ready (Atlanta). In the championship game with a grand total of 25 spectators, Boston Ladies Uity beat Dark Star 7-6 to take the title.

In 1982, the format was enlarged to a ten-team field, two teams per region; the Rude Boys and 'Stooges (Northeast), 'Boro and The Gang (Mid-Atlantic), Chicago and St. Louis (Central), Dallas and Chained Lightning, At-

lanta (Southern), and The Flying Circus and Portland (Western) were the ten men's teams that once again met in Bob Austin, Texas. This year, to add some extra fun, it rained so hard and so long that the tourney was almost canceled. There was virtually three to four inches of standing water on each field, but at least it wasn't dusty. Through it all, the Rudies swept through each game easily as no team had the power to score on them. Hell, they had practiced twice a day during the early fall—no wonder they were good. In the finals, they rolled over upstart St. Louis to take the title.

In the women's division, the Airwaves, Dark Star, Fisheads, University of Virginia, and Zulu (Massachusetts) contested each other. Zulu had been the most surprising team of the tournament, expected to finish only third in their region. But they ended up beating out the MSU Fisheads for the title.

Last year's championship was finally held in a fun city—New Orleans. Windy City and St. Louis (Central), Santa Barbara and the Spinoffs (Western), Dallas and the Fat Women, Florida (Southern), The Rudies and Kaboom, New York (Northeast), and The Gang and Static Disc, Washington D.C. (Mid-Atlantic) were the fun teams that played in the fun city. There was some not-so-much-fun in the prelim game as most of the play was real intense, but in the end Windy City did what they do best and beat everyone, including the San Diego Spinoffs in the finals to capture the 1983 title, 20-16. In the women's division, there was a bit more parity as the Fisheads, Spinsters, Dark Star, Andromeda and UFDA all had good games. In the end, the Fisheads avenged last year's loss by overcoming a three-goal deficit to win the title 12-11 over the Spinsters.

So, in the beginning, there was disc and even still it remains, for those who play the game of Uity: there is an overpowering feeling that this is indeed the ultimate game. But then again, what is it that we know? Not much. But at least we are having some fun. Play on!

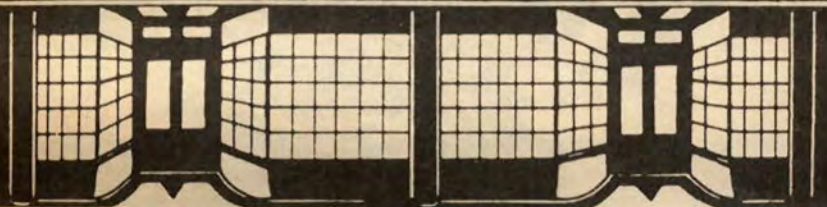

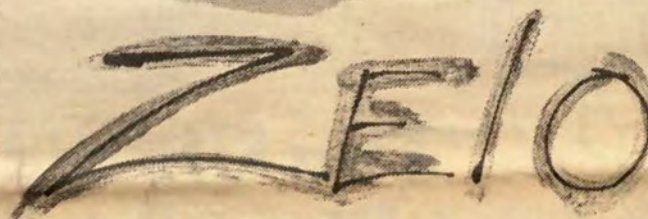

## Static Disc . . . Your Tax Dollars at Work

Pursuant to Executive Order #10,11,Turn, Static Disc has been issued a discretionary grant for defense development. In accordance with section 165 (g) of the Order and all the rights therein, the group has been exempted from getting burned to the corner. The restrictions of section 165(g), and 80(e) of the Act and the sanctions resulting from the application of the Code of Federal Regulations notwithstanding, promulgation of party lines will commence forthwith. Static Disc acts in favor of escalating defense spending, while remaining in control of social services. The group will embark on a Defense Demonstration Project with all interested challengers invited to run their own program. There are no exemptions. Hence, precedent THC of the Toxic Substance Control Act allows Static Disc to avert malfunctions at the endzone in cases of unreported fast-break flights. ## Santa Barbara Women's Condors

Bridesmaids over the last three years, the victory in 1984 Western Regionals over Eugene Dark Star was a long time coming. The western region's strong showing in past nationals has been small consolation to the frustrated women Condors. The exposure and respect long sought can now be realized. It wasn't an easy road.

1981 brought the unveiling of the woman competition at the national level. However, long before that Michele Pizoli and Sandy Ross, Linn Estes and Cindy Baregy were honing their skills against the men. Due to lack of experience the Synergy team was too strong and they prevailed over S.B. and the western regional finals.

1982 was a breakthrough year for the Condors. They beat Eugene Dark Star for the first time and rolled them in the prelims at regionals.
