Special welcome to the players and teams that have qualified through Sectionals and Regionals for the hard-earned right to participate in the final stage of the 2002 UPA Club Championship Series. There are a lot of players out there who work towards this tournament throughout the year and over their Ultimate careers. Many don't make it. So make the most of this opportunity to play hard and have fun with the rest of the players and teams who are as excited to be here as you.

Once again, a lot of hard work has gone into making this event happen. Butch Brown is our man on the scene in Sarasota. From lining the fields to finding a party site, you've got Butch to thank for most everything that's been set up for your enjoyment this weekend. We also have a strong staff of tournament volunteers. With Trigger Hippy "retired" and KWA out at Regionals, there will be new champions crowned in the Mixed and Masters Divisions this year. Will that someone new be a team that's been knocking on the door recently, or a team of rising stars out of the blue?

In the Women's Division, defending champ Lady Godiva has won a record 8 UPA Championships, and 6 of the last 7. Can reigning World Champ Riot loose the stranglehold the women from Boston have on the title? Will another top team step up when the opportunity arises? Or will Godiva make it 7 of the last 8?

The reigning UPA and World Champ Santa Barbara Condors has to be the favorite in the Open Division. Many of this team's players were teammates on UCSB's Black Tide, where they won 3 straight college titles in the late 90's. Can these guys follow that up with a 3-peat at the club level? Will DoG, a team that has lost only to Santa Barbara at this tournament the last 2 years, rise up to reclaim the tournament they dominated from 1994-99? Furious George, another perennial semi-finalist has only one goal in mind, and the absence of

"'Jerry Springer lives [in Sarasota]." This was intriguing: We are hip. Nobody parties like Pee-wee Herman. We could totally dominate the Amish shuffleboard circuit. And the whole Jerry Springer/redneck association would make a team called Boss Hogo feel right at home. So our goal was set: we would qualify for nationals, and do it with style and class, and show the world that Boss Hogg isn't just a corrupt small-town county commissioner any more. Twenty-six perfectly honed, perfectly trained ultimate playing machines, we represent the culmination of all human evolution. We are smart. We are handsome. We bake 30 minute brownies in 6 minutes flat. We are selected according to only the most stringent requirements. (You must write at least two (2) polite, but firm, strongly worded letters to the team leadership, indicating that you think you are a really, really good ultimate player.)
We have already carved a swath through 15/16 of the

northeast. Now we descend on Sarasota. We are intimidating to men. We are desirable to women. We are Boss Hogg.

CHAIN LIGHTNING'S RIDE

Listen my children and you shall hear Of the lightning rod we all revere, On the twenty-fourth of October, in Two Ought Two; Hardly a man not even our Stu Can remember that famous day and year.

They said to our friends, "If Chain does march On O or D in Sarasota to-night, Hang an eye magnet aloft in the shade tent arch Of the Polo Field tower as a signal light,-One if on O, and two if on D; And I on the opposite sideline will be. Ready to run and spread the alarm Through every Sarasota village and farm, For the Atlanta folk to be up and to arm."

Then they said "Goode-night!" and with muffled roar Silently mowed other teams to the floor. Chain lightning rose over Tampa Bay, Where swinging wide at her moorings lay The Crawford, Atlanta's man-of-war; A phantom Shippey, with each Ultimate star Holding the disc like a prison bar, And a slate blue team, that was magnified By its own reflection in the tide.

DEATH or GLORY

Death or Glory (DoG) is the top men's ultimate team from Boston. DoG's style of play is characterized by an array of innovative defenses, complemented by a wideopen and opportunistic offense. Using this run-and-gun style, DoG won an unprecedented six consecutive UPA National Championships from 1994-1999. In international play, DoG captured the World Championships in 1996 and 2000 and the World Ultimate Club Championship in 1999 in Scotland.

DoG's roots can be traced back to the great Boston teams of the early 80's. The Boston team Rude Boys won the UPA National Championship in 1982, and the first ever World Championships in Gotenberg, Sweden, the following summer. Boston teams have remained a perennial national contender ever since.

ELECTRIC PIG

In two swift strides he covered the area from door to their war chest, ripping the lid off its hinges in one smooth movement. As he threw each crew member a gun, the navigator spoke up. "We've been trying to figure out how to get Anderson out there and backin one piece, but we haven't been able to come up with a plan." "Stark, once in a while you have to go on guts and talent. Thinking and planning only takes you so far - now is the time for action. Trust in yourself and each other. Anderson will conentrate on that fuel line and the rest of us will cover him. We'll all survive, this ship will take off and when we're done we'll celebrate with these good people and have a few drinks. Let's do this!" His crew snapped up as one, inspired, and jumped into the airlock, he hefted his massive rifle and turned back to the fugitives, his eyes on fire with the anticipation of the coming contest. "You folks stay here, we'll take care of this and have you safely on your way home." One of the women stepped up and placed her delicate hand on his arm, almost unable to look into those intense eyes. "We are grateful for your help, Mr. Bravo." "Call me Johnny, miss." He winked at her and swept his arm around towards his crew. "On this team we are all equals and expect no more than to be treated fairly. Now excuse me, we have a little imperial ass to kick." He turned and strode into the airlock. As the door closed, the woman stared, seemingly through the door, and said throatily to herself, "Wow, this baby wants a rocket ride!"

DIKE

Throughout the 90's there was a growing rivalry between Black & Gold (Pittsburgh) and Havoc (NJ). It was not a rivalry of animosity, rather one of symmetry, camaraderie and spirited competition. There were members of both teams looking to progress to the next level, but invariably each team fell short of these aspirations. At Regionals '99, 4th-seeded Black & Gold knocked 5th-seeded Havoc out of the tourney with a 15-14 win. But having spent most of their energy in the win, B&G went on to lose their next game to then up-and-coming WUFF Warriors. Some players on Havoc and Black & Gold sought change.

This change came in the form of the combined team of No Mas (Northern Mid-Atlantic Stars). This squad played on a trial basis at Terminus and proved compatible on and off the field, and decided to stay together for the 2000 season. In essence, the top half of each team. combined forming a highly talented albeit geographically impaired team. No Mas was, in effect, a tournamentonly team. The team had some limited successes, but as expected with a non-practicing team, could not achieve its full potential. The team placed 5th at Regionals, losing a 3 fi hour struggle against Philly Rage,

One year later, the team demographic shifted to about 70% NJ-area players with a smaller group from the burgh. After the spring of 2001, the growing NJ portion of the team was clamoring for more practices. It was clear that the team was evolving into something more. To this effect, the team was renamed Pike and began its climb. The team performed consistently through the fall, capped off by a solid Regionals performance, finishing 4th, losing to Electric Pig in semis and WUFF Warriors in the backdoor game-to-go.

Not content, Pike continued to push forward. Returning the vast majority of the team from 2001, Pike also added some excellent talent from NJ and Philly. With an increased dedication and commitment, Pike trained hard through the spring, summer, and fall of 2002. Their diligence paid dividends, as they avenged their previous year's loss to WUFF in the game-to-go. For an over-whelming majority of Pike's players, this trip to Sarasota represents their first Nationals experience.
