

Competition Rules

- All games to 15, win by two, cap at 17. Finals also to 15/17.
- · Half-time is 10 minutes.
- Each team has two timeouts per half.
- Regardless of how many timeouts a team has used before overtime, during overtime each team has one timeout.
- Overtime: A game is in overtime if tied at one point less than original game total, and the winning score will exceed said game total. (e.g. In a game to 15 goals, overtime occurs when the score reaches 14-14 and the minimum winning score is determined to be 16.)
- Time-cap goes on at end of round time on schedule. Add two points to higher score after first score after time-cap. Play to that new point total (no more win by two), or to 15 (win by two), whichever comes first.
- Hard-cap will be put into effect for all pool and placement games (5th-16th).
 The hard-cap will go on 35 minutes after the time-cap for pool games and 20 minutes after the time-cap for placement games. When the hard-cap goes on, finish the point in progress and the game is over. If it's tied, play one more point.
- · Caps do not affect timeouts

Placement Game Rules (5-8 and 9-16 on Saturday)

For games that could affect the strength wildcard;

- If a game will determine a strength wildcard, or leads to a game that might determine a strength wildcard, it must be played. If a team still chooses to forfeit such a game, that team's region/division will not be eligible for any nationals' wildcards the following year (size, strength, growth), unless given a specific exception by the National Division Director.
- Special case: In the first round of the 5-8 bracket, if there are exactly two teams
 in contention for a strength wildcard, those teams will play each other in that
 first round regardless of the originally scheduled match-ups.

For games that do not affect the strength wildcard:

- If neither team wants to play a scheduled game that leads to another round (i.e. semis for the 5th, 9th, 13th brackets): Those two teams finish tied for the placement of the lower portion of their bracket and the other game is now for two higher spots. (e.g. In a 9-12 semifinal game, the two forfeiting teams would be tied for 11th and the other semifinal would become the game for 9/10.)
- If neither team wants to play a scheduled game that does not lead to another round: Both teams will finish tied for the higher placement, since they went out at the same time.
- If only one team wants to play a scheduled game that leads to another round (e.g. semis for the 5th, 9th, 13th brackets): The forfeiting team will finish at the bottom of its respective bracket (i.e. 8th, 12th or 16th).
- If only one team wants to play a scheduled game that does not lead to another round: The game will be treated as a loss for the forfeiting team and a win for the other team, with final placement reflecting that outcome.



Rima Viliamas-Boncha

May 7, 1979 - Oct. 5, 2006

For those of us fortunate enough to have known Rima Viliamas-Boncha, we can tell you with great certainty that she was a living example of what being part of the ultimate community is about. She was the type of friend, teammate and advocate we all hope to be. Through Ultimate, we become more than competitors, we become family. It is in light of this sense of unity that we pay tribute to her this fall.

As a player, Rima had her hand in many aspects of the game – captaining college and club teams, coordinating series tournaments, running Cleveland summer league, organizing women's clinics and playing competitively at the club level. She had all the throws, and as her competitors know, that included a threatening huck, low-release break and unstoppable high-release backhand. As an advocate of Ultimate, Rima could often be found smiling and playing somewhere across the country, be it with teams in Austin, Hawaii, Mars, Poultry Days, Gender Blender, New Years Fest and more.

Beyond her contributions to Ultimate, what made Rima so special was the way she touched our lives. She was always there with a smile, whether it was a game, party or hanging out with friends. Her positive attitude made her uber fun to be around and the type of friend who showed us how to live life to the fullest.

In June, at age 27, Rima was diagnosed with an aggressive form of cancer. On July 7, she lived her dream of marrying Jeremiah Boncha in front of family and friends in Cleveland. Although she lost the fight to cancer after just four short months, we will continue to celebrate her life and will always remember her on and off the field.

On Oct. 1, 2006, two Ultimate Frisbee players from the Gendors, Will Wiersma and Doug Baker, were tragically killed in a solo vehicle accident on the way home from Regionals in Scottsdale, Ariz. where (to their great delight) they had just qualified for the UPA Club Championships.



Douglas Cameron Baker

Nov. 25, 1980 - Oct. 1, 2006

Douglas Cameron Baker was born on Nov. 25, 1980 and was raised in Hoffman Estates, Ill. He is survived by his parents John and Marilyn, his sisters Jennifer and Melissa (Jamie) Howard, and his girlfriend of 6 years, Linda Strubbe. Doug received his B.S. in mathematics from the California Institute of Technology in 2002, and was a Ph.D. candidate in Mathematics - Functional Analysis at the University of California at Santa Barbara. He planned to become a professor of Mathematics. While in high school,

Doug participated in the state level mathematics competitions. During these competitions, the students would play Ultimate. Thus began his passion for the game.

In Memoriam



As a Ph.D. student, Doug breezed through his examinations. He frequently received very high evaluation scores from students in his math classes at UCSB. His students and colleagues commented on Doug's patience, availability, willingness to help, and his in-depth preparation for the courses he taught. Doug participated in a weekly game of Bridge and enjoyed a good battle of Settlers of Cataan or Magic. Those who had the good fortune to play with Doug would agree that he was very passionate, driven, stayed true to his principles, and exemplified the word 'teammate'. "Doug was a man of great integrity, He was the most committed and dedicated teammate that I have ever had. Doug never just 'showed up' - he always played with purpose, passion, and desire," said Sam Corbett (SB Gendor and LA Monster Teammate). "He would make fun of himself as much as he would make fun of others. He would never hold mistakes against you. He would never judge and always welcomed criticism. He was selfless and generous. His blunt honestly reflected a sincere, genuine individual who would do anything to support his friends and family," said Neda Bagheri (SB Gendor Teammate). A note from Doug to the Gendor's captain just a few days before sectionals read. "I can't tell you how fortunate I feel that the core gave me a chance to play with this team. I've enjoyed playing this season far more than any other club season." This would have been Doug's first trip to the UPA Club Championships.



William Jae Wiersma

Sept. 8, 1983 - Oct. 1, 2006

William Jae Wiersma was born in Chung Joo, South Korea on Sept. 8, 1983 and grew up in Grand Rapids, Mich. He is survived by his younger sister, Natalie, and his parents Tom and Laura. He graduated magna cum laude in three years from Westmont College (Santa Barbara, Calif.) with a Political Science major / International Affairs emphasis. He then studied for a year at Oxford University (Oxford, UK) with a focus on Business, Philosophy and Economics. He intended to earn his MBA at a top-10 business school after he got his first job. He was hired and started that job at

Commission Junction in Santa Barbara on Sept. 25, 2006.

Will was a joyful and committed Christian. He was a kind and good-hearted guv who genuinely cared about his friends and his community. He was exceptionally sharp and motivated, and strove to make this world a better place by putting his words into actions. He got involved. Will was also an avid poker player and deeply passionate about Ultimate. He was a budding superstar, with feet and a flick as fast as lightning. Yet Will was extremely humble, and constantly strived to improve upon himself to contribute to the betterment of the team. A recent e-mail from Will to his team read, "Great playing with ya'll this weekend. We know we can compete with anyone, but we haven't really achieved anything yet. I keep asking myself - what can I do to help this team achieve something? I like this quote by Rafael Nadal: 'Stay humble: stay hungry'." Will's view of 'team' is exemplified in a speech he wrote to his graduating college class, "We should never forget that there are others running the race...and that we are not alone. It is comforting to realize that there are others who are willing to support and help us along the way ... " Will's vibrant view of life has touched those around him, as did his quirky smile and the laughter that would reach his eyes. His motto was one he lived up to: "Live each day as if it is your last." This would have been Will's first trip to the UPA Club Championships.

Heat, Nutrition and Hydration

- Heat-related illness occurs where body cooling by evaporation is limited. Sweating depletes the body's salt and moisture, which leads to dehydration. If a player recognizes any signs or symptoms of heat-related illness, he or she should treat the problem immediately.
- Signs and Symptoms of Heat Illness can include change in level of consciousness, abdominal cramps, nausea/vomiting, fatigue/tingling, chills, inability to spit, dry mucous membranes, decreased urine output and change in color.
- Prevention and Treatment of Heat Illness
 - Avoid alcohol, caffeine, and carbonated beverages.
 - Medications such as antihistamines, decongestants, certain asthma medications, and diuretics can increase risk for heat illness. Avoid them if possible.
 - Avoid certain nutritional supplements (such as caffeine and ephedrine) that can dehydrate the body and/or increase metabolism and heat production.
 - Know your body Be honest! Are you fit enough to perform under current conditions?
 - Drink and eat Eat and drink (water AND sports drinks) "optimally" before, during, and after play. Potassium is important (good sources include: sports drinks, yogurt, grapefruit juice, bananas, oranges). Sodium is also important (good sources include: sports drinks, vegetable juices, pretzels, nuts, cheese and crackers). After play, carbohydrates are important: foods such as potatoes, honey, cereal, white bread, corn chips, sports drinks, jelly beans, rice cakes, bagels crackers, gummy candies).
 - Don't drink too much Over-hydrating can be dangerous if it leads to a fluid and electrolyte imbalance.
 - Monitor your urine Clear/copious = hydrated. Dark = Need water/ electrolytes.
 - Be sensitive to prior illness If you've been sick, your body may be more susceptible to debydration.
 - Rest and cool down after play Find shade, wet the skin, get in front of a fan or breeze.

Sideline Safety

- Players and spectators should make every effort to keep objects, including but not limited to bags, strollers, chairs, coolers and tents, as far away from the playing field as possible. If there are restraining lines around your field, keep all objects behind the lines.
- If a player feels that an object on the sideline is not safe, s/he should inform
 Event Staff and should refrain from playing until s/he is satisfied that safe conditions have been established.

Health and Safety The

The UPA and Event Staff reserve the right to move or remove objects or spectators from on or near the playing field if those conditions are, in the opinion of the UPA or Event Staff, unsafe for players, staff, or spectators.

Lightning Guidelines

- Event staff will communicate with players and spectators via PA system and field marshals equipped with radios that there is a lightning danger, play will be stopped, and everyone should seek shelter.
- Safe Shelter for players and spectators at the polo grounds include any enclosed building or fully enclosed vehicle with a hard top and closed windows.
- Event staff will use the Flash-to Bang method to determine when to send people to shelter. By the time the Flash-to-Bang count has reached 30 seconds, all individuals should be in a safe shelter location.
- If you can't get to a safe shelter, try to avoid being the tallest object in an open field or on open water. Avoid other tall objects, metal objects, and water. Assume a crouch position with only the balls of your feet touching the ground, your arms wrapped around your knees, and your head lowered. Minimize contact with the ground. Do not lie flat.
- Avoid using telephone land lines. Cell phones are safe provided the person has followed other safety guidelines.
- Event staff will indicate to players when play is going to resume. Team captains should meet at Tournament Central to receive instructions for resuming play and any schedule modifications.

Ultimate has traditionally relied upon a spirit of sportsmanship which places the responsibility for fair play on the player himself. Highly competitive play is encouraged, but never at the expense of the bond of mutual respect between players, adherence to the agreedupon rules of the game, or the basic joy of play.

- UPA 10th Edition Rules of Ultimate

Team Awards - Following every game, each team will be asked to rate its opponent on a scale of 1-5, with 5 being the rating for the highest level of sportsmanship. These ratings will be averaged and the team in each division with the highest rating will be awarded the Team Spirit Award after their division's finals.

Individual Awards - Teams will be each be asked to nominate a player from their own team who they feel displays the highest level of spirit. The definition of spirit is up to each team, but should include elements of sportsmanship, leadership, perseverance, fire, etc. Choose the person whose attitude you wish other people on your team would emulate and who other players off your team admire. Individual spirit winners will receive a medal, Discraft SuperColor Spirit of the Game disc, and a Five Ultimate fuzzy hat. Thanks to Discraft and Five Ultimate for their support of Spirit of the Game.


Peter Farricker Spirit of the Game Award - The spirit award in the Open Division is called the Farricker Spirit Award, named for Peter Farricker, a player who embodied Spirit of the Game to those who knew him and those who played with or against him. This award is given to a player in the Open Division of the UPA's Championship Series adjudged to have exhibited personal responsibility, integrity, and fairness combined with a high standard of playing ability. Each qualifying Open team nominates one player from their own team as the person who best represents the spirit of the game. At the Open Championship, each nominee is honored with a disc, pin or set of Mardi Gras beads. Our hope is that the people wearing the Mardi Gras beads will be connected to Pete, each other and the Spirit of the Game, and become role models for their teammates and opponents. A selection committee watches the open semis and selects one of the 4 semifinal nominees as the winner. The award will be presented after the Open Finals. Previous winners include Moses Rifkin, Andy Crews, Damien Scott, and Jeff Eastham-Anderson.

Kathy Pufahl Spirit of the Game Award - The introduction of the Kathy Pufahl Cande Spirit of the Game Award will build upon the foundations of SOTG that are reflected in the Farricker Spirit Award; Ability, Fairness, and Integrity. The Kathy Pufahl Cande Spirit Award will build upon that foundation by also recognizing those individuals who give back to our sport. The Kathy Pufahl Spirit Award is given to the player(s) adjudged to have exhibited personal responsibility, integrity, and selfless contribution to Ultimate, combined with a high standard of playing ability. Each qualifying Women's team nominates one player from their team as the person who best represents the spirit of the game and has contributed in a substantial way to their ultimate community. At the Club Championships, each of the 16 nominees is honored with a disc and a memento reflective of Kathy's love of horticulture. A vote of the qualifying teams will determine the recipient of the Pufahl Award, which will be presented after the Women's Finals. Previous winners include Vida Town and Kati Halmos.

Chain Lightning






