
SITE RULES

COMPETITION RULES

- 11th Edition Rules of Ultimate will be in effect.
- All games to 15, point-cap at 17.
- Half-time is 10 minutes.
- Each team has two timeouts per half.
- Regardless of how many timeouts a team has used before overtime, during overtime each team has one timeout.
- Overtime: A game is in overtime if tied at one point less than original game total (e.g. In a game to 15 goals, overtime occurs when the score reaches 14-14).
- Soft time cap goes on at end of round time on schedule. Add two points to higher score after first score after soft time cap. Game ends when first team reaches new game total, or when first team reaches 15 ahead by at least two points, whichever comes first.
- A hard time cap will be put into effect for all pool and placement games (5th-16th, Masters 3rd). The hard time cap will go on 35 minutes after the soft time cap for pool games and 20 minutes after the soft time cap for placement games. When the hard time cap goes on, finish the point in progress and the game is over. If it's tied, play one more point.
- Caps do not affect timeouts.

PLACEMENT GAME RULES (5-8TH AND 9-16TH ON SATURDAY AND ANY 3RD PLACE GAMES)

For games that could affect the strength wildcard:

- If a game will determine a strength wildcard, or leads to a game that might determine a strength wildcard, it must be played. If a team still chooses to forfeit such a game, that team's region/division will not be eligible for any nationals' wildcards the following year (size, strength, growth), unless given a specific exception by the National Division Director. Special case: In the first round of the 5-8 bracket, if there are exactly two teams in contention for a strength wildcard, those teams will play each other in that first round regardless of the originally scheduled match-ups.

For games that do not affect the strength wildcard:

- If neither team wants to play a scheduled game that leads to another round (i.e. semis for the 5th, 9th, 13th brackets): Those two teams finish tied for the placement of the lower portion of their bracket and the other game is now for two higher spots. (e.g. In a 9-12 semifinal game, the two forfeiting teams would be tied for 11th and the other semifinal would become the game for 9/10.)
- If neither team wants to play a scheduled game that does not lead to another round: Both teams will finish tied for the higher placement, since they went out at the same time.
- If only one team wants to play a scheduled game that leads to another round (e.g. semis for the 5th, 9th, 13th brackets): The forfeiting team will finish at the bottom of its respective bracket (i.e. 8th, 12th or 16th).
- If only one team wants to play a scheduled game that does not lead to another round: The game will be treated as a loss for the forfeiting team and a win for the other team, with final placement reflecting that outcome.

WFDF WORLDS (2008 WUGC) QUALIFICATION:

 If two non-US teams make it to the final in the Open Division, a 3rd place game will be necessary to determine the US champion and Worlds qualifying team. If necessary, the game to determine this team will take place on Sunday at the same time as the Open Division final, on an adjacent field.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Medical staff, including athletic trainers, will be on site at tournament central to treat injuries, handle emergencies, and provide some preventative care. The event will provide standard athletic tape, prewrap, ice, and some bandages. Other supplies, including special tape/bandages and anti-inflammatory drugs, you will need to bring yourself or you may be charged by the training staff for those supplies. If there is an injury on a field that needs medical attention, inform a field marshal and they will radio in to the trainers. If you have issues that need attention in the morning before play, please show up early to avoid long waits in line. The trainers will be at the fields by 7:30AM each day.

Directions to the local hospital can be found in the "Directions" (page 5) section of this program.

CONCUSSIONS

- Concussions are brain injuries that can occur as a result of a blow to the head.
- Symptoms may include headache, nausea, vision problems, confusion, balance problems.
- If you think you or one of your teammates might have a concussion, tell your coach and have the person see a medical professional. Medical staff are on hand at the event at Tournament Central.

HEAT, NUTRITION AND HYDRATION

- Heat-related illness occurs where body cooling by evaporation is limited. Sweating depletes the body's
 salt and moisture, which leads to dehydration. If a player recognizes any signs or symptoms of heatrelated illness, he or she should treat the problem immediately.
- Signs and Symptoms of Heat Illness can include change in level of consciousness, abdominal cramps, nausea/vomiting, fatigue/tingling, chills, inability to spit, dry mucous membranes, decreased urine output and change in color.
- Prevention and Treatment of Heat Illness
 - Avoid alcohol, caffeine, and carbonated beverages.
 - Medications such as antihistamines, decongestants, certain asthma medications, and diuretics can increase risk for heat illness. Avoid them if possible.
 - Avoid certain nutritional supplements (such as caffeine and ephedrine) that can dehydrate the body and/or increase metabolism and heat production.
 - Know your body Be honest! Are you fit enough to perform under current conditions?
 - Drink and eat Eat and drink (water AND sports drinks) "optimally" before, during, and after play. Potassium is important (good sources include: sports drinks, yogurt, grapefruit juice, bananas, oranges). Sodium is also important (good sources include: sports drinks, vegetable juices, pretzels, nuts, cheese and crackers). After play, carbohydrates are important: foods such as potatoes, honey, cereal, white bread, corn chips, sports drinks, jelly beans, rice cakes, bagels crackers, gummy candies).
 - Don't drink too much. Over-hydrating can be dangerous if it leads to a fluid and electrolyte imbalance.
 - Monitor your urine Clear/copious = hydrated. Dark = Need water/electrolytes.
 - Be sensitive to prior illness If you've been sick, your body may be more susceptible to dehydration.
 - Rest and cool down after play Find shade, wet the skin, get in front of a fan or breeze.

SIDELINE SAFETY

- Players and spectators should make every effort to keep objects, including but not limited to bags, strollers, chairs, coolers and tents, as far away from the playing field as possible. If there are restraining lines around your field, keep all objects behind the lines.
- If a player feels that an object on the sideline is not safe, s/he should inform Event Staff and should refrain from playing until s/he is satisfied that safe conditions have been established.
- The UPA and Event Staff reserve the right to move or remove objects or spectators from on or near the
 playing field if those conditions are, in the opinion of the UPA or Event Staff, unsafe for players, staff,
 or spectators.

LIGHTNING GUIDELINES

- Event staff will communicate with players and spectators via PA system and field marshals equipped with radios that there is a lightning danger, play will be stopped, and everyone should seek shelter.
- Safe Shelter for players and spectators at the polo grounds include any enclosed building or fully
 enclosed vehicle with a hard top and closed windows.
- Event staff will use the Flash-to Bang method to determine when to send people to shelter. By the time the Flash-to-Bang count has reached 30 seconds, all individuals should be in a safe shelter location.
- If you can't get to a safe shelter, try to avoid being the tallest object in an open field or on open water. Avoid other tall objects, metal objects, and water. Assume a crouch position with only the balls of your feet touching the ground, your arms wrapped around your knees, and your head lowered. Minimize contact with the ground. Do not lie flat.
- Avoid using telephone land lines. Cell phones are safe provided the person has followed other safety guidelines.
- Event staff will indicate to players when play is going to resume. Team captains should meet at Tournament Central to receive instructions for resuming play and any schedule modifications.

BE A PART OF THE VC GREEN PROGRAM

The VC Green Program's first large-scale initiative has created the opportunity to recycle cans and bottles at the 2007 UPA Club Championships – not an easy logistical task, but with the full support of the UPA, we've been able to actualize this idea.

We hope that you'll support this year's VC Green Program initiative by recycling responsibly at the 2007 UPA Club Championships.

Dispose of cans and bottles in the receptacles provided. Please don't throw waste into the recycling bins that have been set up. One piece of garbage can ruin an entire container of recyclable goods.

Together, we can all help make this a greener event.

SPIRIT AWARDS

Ultimate has traditionally relied upon a spirit of sportsmanship which places the responsibility for fair play on the player himself. Highly competitive play is encouraged, but never at the expense of the bond of mutual respect between players, adherence to the agreed-upon rules of the game, or the basic joy of play. – UPA 11th Edition Rules of Ultimate

TEAM AWARDS

Following every game, each team will be asked to rate its opponent using the following UPA Spirit Ratings Guidelines, approved by the UPA Board of Directors in July, 2007. These ratings will be averaged and the team in each division with the highest average rating will be awarded the Team Spirit Award after their division's finals.

UPA SPIRIT RATINGS GUIDELINES

The ratings are ordered from 5 (indicating the highest level of spirit) thru 1 (the lowest level of spirit):

- 5: Highest level of respect shown throughout game towards opponents, officials, and spectators. For the level of play, showed excellent knowledge of the rules and abided by them throughout the game. Any conflicts were resolved amicably and without incident. Opposing team's conduct added to our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team unfailingly played fairly and with an excellent attitude.
- 4: Respect shown throughout the game towards opponents, officials, and spectators. For the level of play, showed above average knowledge of the rules and abided by them throughout the game. Any conflicts were resolved favorably and without incident. Opposing team's conduct did not detract from our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team played fairly and with a good attitude.
- 3: Generally exhibited respect towards opponents, officials, and spectators. For the level of play, showed adequate knowledge of the rules and abided by them during the game. Any conflicts were resolved plainly and without incident. Opposing team's conduct generally did not detract from our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team generally played fairly and with a decent attitude.
- 2: Exhibited a lack of respect towards opponents, officials, and/or spectators. For the level of play, showed a lack of knowledge of or disregard for the rules at points during the game. Any conflicts were resolved heatedly or led to contentious incidents. Opposing team's conduct detracted somewhat from our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team played unfairly and/or with a poor attitude.
- 1: Exhibited a major lack of respect towards opponents, officials, and/or spectators. For the level of play, exhibited no knowledge of the rules or blatantly disregarded them during the game. Conflicts were resolved acrimoniously or led directly to contentious incidents. Opposing team's conduct made the game basically unenjoyable. The opposing team played unfairly and their attitude was abysmal.



INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

Teams will be each be asked to nominate a player from their own team who they feel displays the highest level of spirit. The definition of spirit is up to each team, but could include elements of sportsmanship, leadership, perseverance, fire, etc. Choose the person whose attitude you wish other people on your team would emulate and who other players off your team admire.

Individual spirit winners will receive a medal and prize disc (courtesy of DISCRAFT). Thanks to Discraft for their support of Ultimate and Spirit of the Game!




Peter Farricker Spirit of the Game Award - The spirit award in the Open Division is called the Farricker Spirit Award, named for Peter Farricker, a player who embodied Spirit of the Game to those who knew him and those who played with or against him. This award is given to a player in the Open Division of the UPA's Championship Series adjudged to have exhibited personal responsibility, integrity, and fairness combined with a high standard of playing ability. Each qualifying Open team nominates one player from their own team as the person who best represents the spirit of the game. At the Open Championship, each nominee is honored with a disc and pin or set of Mardi Gras beads. Our hope is that the people wearing the Mardi Gras

beads will be connected to Pete, each other and the Spirit of the Game, and become role models for their teammates and opponents. A selection committee watches the open semis and selects one of the 4 semifinal nominees as the winner. The award will be presented after the Open Finals. Previous winners include Moses Rifkin, Andy Crews, Damien Scott, Jeff Eastham-Anderson, and Allan Cowan.



Kathy Pufahl Spirit of the Game Award - The introduction of the Kathy Pufahl Cande Spirit of the Game Award will build upon the foundations of SOTG that are reflected in the Farricker Spirit Award; Ability, Fairness, and Integrity. The Kathy Pufahl Cande Spirit Award will build upon that foundation by also recognizing those individuals who give back to our sport. The Kathy Pufahl Spirit Award is given to the player(s) adjudged to have exhibited personal responsibility, integrity, and selfless contribution to Ultimate, combined with a high standard of playing ability. Each qualifying Women's team nominates one player from their team as the person who best represents the spirit of the game and has contributed in a substantial way to their ultimate

community. At the Club Championships, each of the 16 nominees is honored with a memento reflective of Kathy's love of horticulture. A vote of the qualifying teams will determine the recipient of the Pufahl Award, which will be presented after the Women's Finals. Previous winners include Vida Town, Kati Halmos, and Kristine Gill.

2008 WFDF WORLD ULTIMATE CHAMPIONSHIPS QUALIFICATION

The 2007 UPA Club Championships is the event that will qualify one US team from each division (Masters, Mixed, Open and Women's) for the 2008 World Flying Disc Federation (WFDF) World Ultimate and Guts Championships (WUGC), to be held August 2-9, 2008 in Vancouver, Canada. The top finishing US-based team at the 2007 UPA Club Championships will qualify to represent the United States at the 2008 WUGC. In the Open Division, where there are two non-US teams in the field, a 3rd place game will be held to determine the US qualifier, if the two non-US teams make the final. The 3rd place game, if needed, will be held on Sunday, October 28th, at the same time as the Open Division final.


