WELCOME

Welcome to the 2008 UPA Club Championships! Whether you're a player, spectator, or volunteer, and whether you're here for the first time or the twentieth, we hope that you'll enjoy all the great aspects of the event you've come to expect, in addition to some new elements we think you'll like.

The tournament of course centers on the competition, which is the culmination of a two-month, 10,000+ player, 600+ team event. 2007 champions will be returning in all four divisions. In the Masters and Women's divisions, the returning champs (DoG and Fury respectively) will be coming off a summer in which they also won world championships as Team USA. Open and Mixed champions (Sockeye and Shazam) also medaled at the WUGC, and all four teams will be facing the doubly difficult task of not only repeating as UPA champs, but also trying to peak for two championships in the same year. There are plenty of teams in the field capable of knocking off any other team at the tournament. So as usual, expect an exciting four days of the best Ultimate in the world.

For those of you with family and friends at home, the UPA and UltiVillage are partnering to bring fans live video streaming of each division's championship game. Round by round highlight clips will also be available for each division throughout the event. So make sure you let those less fortunate souls who can't make it down to Sarasota know they can still be part of the event by watching it online.

Another exciting aspect of this year's event is the Alumni Reunion taking place over the weekend. Former players, organizers, and legends of the game will be reuniting in Sarasota, inducting individuals into the Hall of Fame, and mixing with the current crowd of players and fans. Keep your eyes and ears open for people and teams you may have heard or read about. See the Weekend Schedule page and page 48 of this program for more details about activities related to the reunion.

While at the event, please be sure to check out VC Ultimate's official tournament merchandise at the main pavilion, and take a look to see what other companies on site have to offer you or your team. As usual, trainers will be on site to help with preventative and injury care. Be sure to show up well before warm-ups to make sure you have time to get taped up. There will also be massage therapy students at the medical tent during portions of the event to take care of those sore muscles and help you relax. Check out pages 12-13 for more details.

Speaking of relaxing...if you've been to the tournament before, you'll note one change this year is the relocation of the beer garden. It will be located next to the grandstands at the opposite end of the finals field from the pavilion. We hope that this will reduce some congestion around tournament central and also enable folks in the beer garden to more easily watch games while enjoying a cold one. Please remember that you must have proof you are 21 to enter the beer garden and that you may not leave the beer garden area with your drink. Reusable "green" cups are required to get the free beer. Please respect these rules and the beer garden staff so that everyone can enjoy this aspect of the tournament.

Last but not least, please be respectful in whatever you do, on and off the field. Do your part to reduce trash by using the appropriate recycling and trash containers. Be respectful of the places you stay so that they can be used in the future. Be respectful of the tournament staff who is working hard to make this a great event for you. And most of all be respectful of each other on the field, because winning or losing while gaining the respect of your opponent is really what this is all about.

SITE RULES

HALF-TIME AND POST-GAME - AWARD CEREMONIES. During half-time, awards will be presented to the Spirit Award teams and Spirit Award individuals (one from each team). Following each division's final, awards will be presented to 1st and 2nd place teams in that division. Following the Open Division finals, the Farricker Award will be presented. Following the Women's Division finals, the Pufahl Award will be presented.

COMPETITION RULES

- UPA Official Rules of Ultimate (11th Edition) will be in effect.
- All games to 15, point-cap at 17.
- Half-time is 10 minutes.
- Each team has two timeouts per half.
- Regardless of how many timeouts a team has used before overtime, during overtime each team has one timeout.
- Overtime: A game is in overtime if tied at one point less than original game total (e.g. In a game to 15 goals, overtime occurs when the score reaches 14-14).
- Soft time cap goes on at end of round time on schedule. Add two points to higher score after first score after soft time cap. Game ends when first team reaches new game total, or when first team reaches 15 ahead by at least two points, whichever comes first.
- A hard time cap will be put into effect for all pool and placement games (5th-16th, Masters 3rd). The hard time cap will go on 35 minutes after the soft time cap for pool games and 20 minutes after the soft time cap for placement games. When the hard time cap goes on, finish the point in progress and the game is over. If it's tied, play one more point.
- Caps do not affect timeouts.

PLACEMENT GAME RULES (5-8th and 9-16th on Saturday and any 3rd place games)

For games that could affect the strength wildcard:

 If a game will determine a strength wildcard, or leads to a game that might determine a strength wildcard, it must be played. If a team still chooses to forfeit such a game, that team's region/division will not be eligible for

- any nationals' wildcards the following year (size, strength, growth), unless given a specific exception by the National Division Director.
- Special case: In the first round of the 5-8 bracket, if there are exactly two teams in contention for a strength wildcard, those teams will play each other in that first round regardless of the originally scheduled match-ups.

For games that do not affect the strength wildcard:

- If **neither** team wants to play a scheduled game that leads to another round (i.e. semis for the 5th, 9th, 13th brackets): Those two teams finish tied for the placement of the lower portion of their bracket and the other game is now for two higher spots. (e.g. In a 9-12 semifinal game, the two forfeiting teams would be tied for 11th and the other semifinal would become the game for 9/10.)
- If neither team wants to play a scheduled game that does not lead to another round: Both teams will finish tied for the higher placement, since they went out at the same time.
- If only **one** team wants to play a scheduled game that leads to another round (e.g. semis for the 5th, 9th, 13th brackets): The forfeiting team will finish at the bottom of its respective bracket (i.e. 8th, 12th or 16th).
- If only **one** team wants to play a scheduled game that does not lead to another round: The game will be treated as a loss for the forfeiting team and a win for the other team, with final placement reflecting that outcome.

VC ULTIMATE GREEN PROGRAM

The UPA and VC Ultimate are once again partnering to make the 2008 Club Championships a green event. Clearly marked recycling containers are located throughout the facility. Please be sure to put recyclables and trash in the appropriate bins. Once again, in order to reduce waste, Beer Garden patrons will be required to use their commemorative 2008 UPA Club Championships green stadium cups. Cups are provided to players in their player packs. Extra cups will be available for purchase through VC. The nominal fee will go towards supporting green initiatives at the event. Please make an effort to help reduce waste by following these simple steps.





HEALTH AND SAFETY

Medical staff, including athletic trainers, will be on site at tournament central to treat injuries, handle emergencies, and provide some preventative care. The event will provide standard athletic tape, pre-wrap, ice, and some bandages. Other supplies, including special tape/bandages and anti-inflammatory drugs, you will need to bring yourself or you may be charged by the training staff for those supplies. If there is an injury on a field that needs medical attention, inform a field marshal and they will radio in to the trainers. If you have issues that need attention in the morning before play, please show up early to avoid long waits in line. The trainers will be at the fields by 7:30AM each day. Directions to the local hospital can be found in the "Directions" section of this program.

CONCUSSIONS

- Concussions are brain injuries that can occur as a result of a blow to the head.
- Symptoms may include headache, nausea, vision problems, confusion, balance problems.
- If you think you or one of your teammates might have a concussion, tell your coach and have the person see a medical professional. Medical staff are on hand at the event at Tournament Central.

HEAT, NUTRITION AND HYDRATION

- Heat-related illness occurs where body cooling by evaporation is limited. Sweating depletes the body's salt and moisture, which leads to dehydration. If a player recognizes any signs or symptoms of heat-related illness, he or she should treat the problem immediately.
- Signs and symptoms of heat illness can include change in level of consciousness, abdominal cramps, nausea/vomiting, fatigue/tingling, chills, inability to spit, dry mucous membranes, decreased output and change in color of urine.
- Prevention and treatment of heat illness:
 - Avoid alcohol, caffeine, and carbonated beverages.
 - Medications such as antihistamines, decongestants, certain asthma medications, and diuretics can increase risk for heat illness. Avoid them if possible.
 - Avoid certain nutritional supplements (such as caffeine and ephedrine) that can dehydrate the body and/or increase metabolism and heat production.
 - Know your body Be honest! Are you fit enough to perform under current conditions?
 - Drink and eat Eat and drink (water AND sports drinks) "optimally" before, during, and after play. Potassium is important (good sources include: sports drinks, yogurt, grapefruit juice, bananas, oranges). Sodium is also important (good sources include: sports drinks, vegetable juices, pretzels, nuts, cheese and crackers). After play, carbohydrates are important: foods such as potatoes, honey, cereal, white bread, corn chips, sports drinks, jelly beans, rice cakes, bagels crackers, gummy candies).
 - Don't drink too much. Over-hydrating can be dangerous if it leads to a fluid and electrolyte imbalance.
 - Monitor your urine Clear/copious = hydrated. Dark = Need water/electrolytes.

- Be sensitive to prior illness If you've been sick, your body may be more susceptible to dehydration.
- Rest and cool down after play Find shade, wet the skin, get in front of a fan or breeze

SIDELINE SAFETY

- Players and spectators should keep objects, including but not limited to bags, strollers, chairs, coolers and tents at least 3 yards from the sideline.
- If a player feels that an object on the sideline is not safe, s/he should inform Event Staff and should refrain from playing until s/he is satisfied that safe conditions have been established.
- The UPA and Event Staff reserve the right to move or remove objects or spectators from on or near the playing field if those conditions are, in the opinion of the UPA or Event Staff, unsafe for players, staff, or spectators.

LIGHTNING GUIDELINES

- Event staff will communicate with players and spectators via PA system and field marshals equipped with radios that there is a lightning danger, play will be stopped, and everyone should seek shelter.
- Safe shelter for players and spectators at the field site includes any fully enclosed building or vehicle with a hard top and closed windows.
- Event staff will use the Flash-to Bang method to determine when to send people to shelter. By the time the Flash-to-Bang count has reached 30 seconds, all individuals should be in a safe shelter location.
- If you can't get to a safe shelter, try to avoid being the tallest object in an open field or on open water. Avoid other tall objects, metal objects, and water. Assume a crouch position with only the balls of your feet touching the ground, your arms wrapped around your knees, and your head lowered. Minimize contact with the ground. Do not lie flat.
- Avoid using telephone land lines. Cell phones are safe provided the person has followed other safety guidelines.
- Event staff will indicate to players when play is going to resume. Team captains should meet at Tournament Central to receive instructions for resuming play and any schedule modifications.

MASSAGE

Massage therapy students from the Sarasota School of Massage will be providing massage for participants free of charge at the medical tent at the following times (Thu/Fri: 1:30-5:00pm; Sat: 9:00am-noon/1:00-4:00pm). Because these are students doing practical hours as part of their training, they cannot accept compensation. Please be sure to thank them for their support of this event (and for their care for your sore muscles).

SPIRIT AWARDS

Ultimate has traditionally relied upon a spirit of sportsmanship which places the responsibility for fair play on the player. Highly competitive play is encouraged, but never at the expense of mutual respect among competitors, adherence to the agreed-upon rules of the game, or the basic joy of play. - 11th Edition UPA Rules of Ultimate

TEAM AWARDS

Following every game, each team will be asked to rate its opponent on a scale of 1-5, with 5 being the rating for the highest level of sportsmanship. These ratings will be averaged and the team in each division with the highest rating will be awarded the Team Spirit Award after their division's finals.

UPA SPIRIT RATINGS GUIDELINES

The ratings are ordered from 5 (indicating the highest level of spirit) thru 1 (the lowest level of spirit):

- **5**: Highest level of respect shown throughout game towards opponents, officials, and spectators. For the level of play, showed excellent knowledge of the rules and abided by them throughout the game. Any conflicts were resolved amicably and without incident. Opposing team's conduct added to our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team unfailingly played fairly and with an excellent attitude.
- **4**: Respect shown throughout the game towards opponents, officials, and spectators. For the level of play, showed above average knowledge of the rules and abided by them throughout the game. Any conflicts were resolved favorably and without incident. Opposing team's conduct did not detract from our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team played fairly and with a good attitude.
- **3**: Generally exhibited respect towards opponents, officials, and spectators. For the level of play, showed adequate knowledge of the rules and abided by them during the game. Any conflicts were resolved plainly and without incident. Opposing team's conduct generally did not detract from our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team generally played fairly and with a decent attitude.
- 2: Exhibited a lack of respect towards opponents, officials, and/or spectators. For the level of play, showed a lack of knowledge of or disregard for the rules at points during the game. Any conflicts were resolved heatedly or led to contentious incidents. Opposing team's conduct detracted somewhat from our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team played unfairly and/or with a poor attitude.
- 1: Exhibited a major lack of respect towards opponents, officials, and/or spectators. For the level of play, exhibited no knowledge of the rules or blatantly disregarded them during the game. Conflicts were resolved acrimoniously or led directly to contentious incidents. Opposing team's conduct made the game basically unenjoyable. The opposing team played unfairly and their attitude was abysmal.

INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

Teams are asked to nominate a player from their own team who displays the highest level of spirit. The definition of spirit is up to each team, but could include elements of sportsmanship, leadership, perseverance, fire, etc. Teams are asked to choose the person whose attitude they wish other people on their team would emulate and who players from other teams admire. Individual spirit winners will receive a medal, prize disc (courtesy of DISCRAFT), and fuzzy hat (courtesy of FIVE ULTIMATE).

Peter Farricker Spirit of the Game™ Award

The spirit award in the Open Division is called the Farricker Spirit Award, named for Peter Farricker, a player who embodied Spirit of the Game to those who knew him and those who played with or against him. This award is given to a player in the Open Division of the UPA's Championship Series adjudged to have exhibited personal responsibility, integrity, and fairness combined with a high standard of playing ability. Each qualifying Open team nominates one player from their own team as the person who best represents the Spirit of the Game. At the Open Championship, each nominee is honored with a disc and pin or set of Mardi Gras beads. The hope is that the people wearing the Mardi Gras beads will be connected to Pete, each other and the Spirit of the Game, and become role models for their teammates and opponents. A selection committee watches the open semis and selects one of the 4 semifinal nominees as the winner. The award will be presented after the Open Finals. Previous winners include Moses Rifkin, Andy Crews, Damien Scott, Jeff Eastham-Anderson, Allan Cowan and Chase Sparling-Beckley.

Kathy Puſahl Spirit of the Game™ Award

The Kathy Pufahl Cande Spirit of the Game Award (Women's Division) builds upon the foundations of SOTG that are reflected in the Farricker Spirit Award; Ability, Fairness, and Integrity. The Kathy Pufahl Cande Spirit Award builds upon that foundation by also recognizing those individuals who give back to our sport. The Kathy Pufahl Spirit Award is given to the player(s) adjudged to have exhibited personal responsibility, integrity, and selfless contribution to Ultimate, combined with a high standard of playing ability. Each qualifying Women's team nominates one player from their team as the person who best represents the Spirit of the Game and has contributed in a substantial way to their Ultimate community. At the Club Championships, each of the 16 nominees is honored with a memento reflective of Kathy's love of horticulture. A vote of the qualifying teams will determine the recipient of the Pufahl Award, which will be presented after the Women's Finals. Previous winners include Vida Towne, Kati Halmos, Kristine Gill and Deanna Ball.

In 2007, through careful design and testing, navigation to Finals had been attained, only to lose the payload somewhere in flight. It was time to start asking the hard questions.

That payload is dependent on the mission of the spacecraft, and science tells us that with every action,

there is an equal and opposite reaction. The captains pulled together what remained of the crew for 2008 and accepted their new mission. It would carry a superior and more distinct payload, only this time, annihilation was the arrangement made.

New orbits have been mapped and final destinations planned. There is but one question left unanswered and Johnny Bravo will ask: "What does baby want?!"

10 THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT SPIRIT OF THE GAME™

1. THE GOLDEN RULE: TREAT OTHERS AS YOU WOULD WANT TO BE TREATED.

Spirited games result from mutual respect among opponents. Assume the best of your opponent. Give him or her the benefit of a doubt. You would want the same for yourself. But if you are thick-skinned, do not assume that your opponent is. Maybe you should think of this rule as, "treat others as you would have them treat your mother."

2. CONTROL: SOTG TAKES REAL EFFORT.

SOTG is not just some abstract principle that everyone adopts and then games run smoothly without effort. Close calls are made in tight games. Hard fouls are committed. SOTG is about how you handle yourself under pressure: how you contain your emotionality, tame your temper, and modulate your voice. If you initiate or contribute to the unraveling of spirit, the concept falls apart quickly. If you act to mend things (or at least not exacerbate the situation) by following (1) above, the game heals itself.

3. HECKLING AND TAUNTING ARE DIFFERENT.

Ultimate has a long tradition of good-natured heckling. Heckles are friendly barbs, typically from non-playing spectators. Heckling can be fun, but taunting is unspirited and wrong. Harassing remarks after an opponent's foul call or close play are NOT heckling: they are abusive taunts which create unpleasant playing conditions and often escalate to acrimonious disputes.

4. SOTG IS COMPATIBLE WITH CHAMPIONSHIP PLAY.

It is a fallacy to argue that the stakes are so important that some aspect of SOTG can be cast aside. Time and again, great teams and star players have shown that you can bring all your competitive and athletic zeal to a game without sacrificing fair play or respect for your opponent.

5. DON'T "GIVE AS YOU GOT."

There is no "eye for an eye." If you are wronged, you have no right to wrong someone in return. In the extreme case where you were severely mistreated, you may bring the issue up with a captain, tournament director, or even lodge a complaint with the governing body. If you retaliate in kind, however, a complaint may be filed against you. We recall point (1): treat others as you would have them treat you, not as they have treated you. In the end, you are responsible for you.

6. BREATHE.

After a hard foul, close call, or disputed play, take a step back, pause, and take a deep breath. In the heat of competition, emotions run high. By giving yourself just a bit of time and space, you will gain enough perspective to compose yourself and concentrate on the facts involved in the dispute (was she in or out; did you hit his hand or the disc; did that pick affect the play). Your restraint will induce a more restrained response from your opponent. Conflagration averted, you may resume business as usual.

7. WHEN YOU DO THE RIGHT THING, PEOPLE NOTICE.

When you turn the other cheek, you know you've done the right thing. You may not hear praise, there may be no standing ovation, but people do notice. Eventually, their respect for you and their appreciation of the game will grow.

8. BE GENEROUS WITH PRAISE.

Compliment an opponent on her good catch. Remark to a teammate that you admire their honesty in calling themselves out of bounds. Look players in the eye and congratulate them when you shake their hands after a game. These small acts boost spirit greatly, a large payoff for little time and effort.

9. IMPRESSIONS LINGER.

Not only does the realization that your actions will be remembered for a long time serve to curb poor behavior, it can also inspire better conduct. Many old-timers enjoy the experience of meeting an elite player who remembers their first rendezvous on the field and recalls the event in detail. A good first encounter with an impressionable young player can have considerable long term positive impact.

10. HAVE FUN.

All other things being equal, games are far more fun without the antipathy. Go hard. Play fair. Have fun.
