WELCOME

It's the end of October and the eyes of the Ultimate world turn to Sarasota, Fla. where the top teams from North America will compete for titles at the 2011 USA Ultimate Club Championships. Whittled down from more than 650 teams and 13,000 players, the 60 teams and 1,500 athletes at this tournament represent the best of the sport. For the athletes and fans, this event promises to be an amazing experience and an unforgettable end to the 2011 Ultimate season. So, what should you expect?

The competition is going to be better than ever. Four defending champions are back to try to repeat, with three of them. Surly (Masters), Revolver (Open), and Fury (Women's) starting out as the top seed in their respective divisions. Polar Bears (Mixed) come in as the eighth seed, after a competitive season and Northwest Regionals showed that there is plenty of parity at the top of the Mixed Division this year. All of the teams, including fivetime defending champions Fury, will have their work cut out, and we are sure to see plenty of close games, upsets, and amazing plays along the way to naming our 2011 champions. An added bonus to this year's championship is the ability for teams to qualify for two international events in the summer of 2012 (see pages 4 & 16 for more details about the WFDF World Championships and the inaugural US Open).

For fans at the event and at home, Field 12 will showcase a select game each round of the competition. Fans will get to go online the night before and pick from two game options to decide which game will be on the showcase field. Each game on that field will be live-streamed on the internet, available through the USA Ultimate Facebook page. This showcase game lineup will of course include each division's championship game, so there will be more opportunities than ever to enjoy the action at the fields or at home.

For those at the fields, in addition to the competition there is going to be a lot of other great stuff going on. Come by the USA Ultimate Info tent if you have questions about the event and to learn more about the 2012 US Open. Pick up event discs, apparel, and other souvenirs from our official event merchandiser, VC Ultimate. Browse our other exhibitors to play fun games and see the latest in Ultimate gear. Check out the Likewise Skincare booth to get some protection from that Florida sun, vote for the new Likewise MVP award, and even dunk a teammate in their dunking booth while you're at it. A great selection of food and beer will also be for sale in the vendor area. If you're over 21, with valid I.D., you can buy a beverage and take it back to your favorite game, or just hang out in the VC Ultimate Player Lounge and catch the action on the showcase field. Remember, if you drink, please do so responsibly my friend.

Medical and massage will as always be available for preventative care or in the case of injury or illness. Water and ice will also be available at water stations throughout the complex, as will trash and recycling containers. COMPETITION RULES

- . USA Ultimate Official Rules of Ultimate (11th Edition) will be in effect.
- All games will be played to 15, with a point-cap at 17
- Half-time is 10 minutes.
- . Each team has two timeouts per half.
- Regardless of how many timeouts a team has used before overtime, during overtime each team has one timeout.
- Overtime: A game is in overtime if tied at one point less than original game total (e.g. In a game to 15 goals, overtime occurs when the score reaches 14-14).
- Hard time-cap goes on at end of round time on schedule. Game is over at the end of the point in progress, unless tied. If tied, play one more point.
- Soft time-cap goes on 20 minutes before the hard cap. Add two points to higher score after first score after soft time-cap. Game ends when first team reaches new game total, or when first team reaches 15 or more ahead by at least two points, whichever comes first.
- · Caps do not affect timeouts.

PLACEMENT GAME RULES (5TH-8TH AND 9TH-16TH ON SATURDAY AND ANY THIRD-PLACE GAMES)

For a game to be considered "played", it must be played according to the Competition Rules above. Any variance not listed explicitly below must be pre-approved by the Competition Director.

Strength wildcards will be awarded based on final standings as determined by the set format and the strength wildcard criteria. Because this event is going to be used for qualifying US teams for the 2012 WUGC and US Open, all placement games will be played as scheduled rather than switched to create specific wildcard match-ups.

For games that could affect the strength wildcard:

 If a game will determine a strength wildcard, or leads to a game that might determine a strength wildcard, it must be played. If a team still chooses to forfeit such a game, that team's region/division will not be eligible for any nationals' wildcards the following year (size, strength, growth), unless given a specific exception by the National Division Director.

For games that do not affect the strength wildcard:

- If neither team wants to play a scheduled game that leads to another round (i.e. semis for the 5th, 9th, 13th brackets): Those two teams finish tied for the placement of the lower portion of their bracket and the other game is now for two higher spots. (e.g. In a 9-12 semifinal game, the two forfeiting teams would be tied for 11th and the other semifinal would become the game for 9/10.)
- If neither team wants to play a scheduled game that does not lead to another round: Both teams will finish tied for the higher placement, since they went out at the same time. As an alternative to not playing a game that is the last scheduled for both teams, teams may seek approval from the Competition Director to play a shortened game to 11, point-cap at 13 or to 13, point-cap at 15.
- If only one team wants to play a scheduled game that leads to another round (e.g. semis for the 5th, 9th, 13th brackets): The forfeiting team will finish at the bottom of its respective bracket (i.e. 8th, 12th or 16th).



 If only one team wants to play a scheduled placement game that does not lead to another round: The game will be treated as a loss for the forfeiting team and a win for the other team, with final placement reflecting that outcome. As an alternative to not playing a game that is the last scheduled for both teams, teams may agree to play a shortened game to 11, point-cap at 13 or to 13, point-cap at 15.

STRENGTH WILDCARD ALGORITHM

- i. Using the previous year's Club Championships, final placements of the worst finishing teams from each region are compared. Additionally, if a Region had 4 teams in attendance, then the 3rd-finishing team from that Region also participates in the comparison. This group of teams is called the "Wildcard Comparison."
- The first strength wildcard is awarded to the region with the highest finishing team in the Wildcard Comparison.
- iii. If the team which earned the first strength wildcard is the 3rd-finishing team from a region with exactly three teams and the next highest finishing team in the Final Placement (all teams) is not another region's 3rd-finishing team, then the team that earned the first wildcard also earns the second strength wildcard.
- iv. If not already awarded, the second strength wildcard is awarded to the region with the 2nd-highest-finishing team in the Wildcard Comparison, provided at least one of the following conditions is met:
 - a. they are the 3rd- or 4th-finishing team from their region, OR
 - b. they are more than one place ahead in the Final Placement (all teams) of all other teams in the Wildcard Comparison, OR
 - c. they are the 2nd-finishing team from their region and the team directly below them in the Final Placement (all teams) is not a 3rd- or 4th-finishing team from another region.
- v. If not already awarded, the second strength wildcard is awarded to the region with the 3rd-highest-finishing team in the Wildcard Comparison.

INTERNATIONAL QUALIFICATION

- WFDF World Ultimate Championships The top-finishing* US team in each division (Masters, Mixed, Open, Women's) will qualify to be selected by USA Ultimate to represent the United States in the city of Sakai, Japan, July 7-14, 2012.
- US Open The top four finishing* US teams in the Mixed, Open, and Women's divisions will be eligible for selection by USA Ultimate to participate in the inaugural US Open. The event will be hosted by USA Ultimate and the Colorado Springs Sports Corp on July 4-8, 2012 at the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs CO. The event will be a celebration of the USA Ultimate mission of Character, Community, and Competition. The competition will feature the top four US club teams and the best four international club teams in each division. The competition will be held in conjunction with the USA Ultimate convention, which will provide the best educational and developmental opportunities for organizers, teams, and players from all over the world.
- *Note: Final placement of all US teams in the event will be used to determine wait list bids to these international events. If two non-US teams make it to the final in the Open or Women's Division, a 3rd place game will be necessary to determine the US champion and Worlds gualifying team. If necessary, the game to determine this team will take place on Sunday at the same time as their respective division's final, on an adjacent field.



SITE RULES

- NO GLASS! This is important. We're at a world-class polo facility where protection of the horses is a huge priority. If you are found on the fields with a glass container, you will be asked to leave the Polo Club for the duration of the tournament.
- DOGS MUST BE LEASHED! We would prefer that you leave the pooches at home, and certainly do not lock your pets in the car or tie them up in the sun either. So if you must bring your dog, please leash it. They can spook the horses and result in loss of future use of the Polo Club for this event.
- SPECTATORS AND EQUIPMENT MUST STAY AT LEAST 3 YARDS AWAY FROM SIDELINES! Where there are buffer lines, stay behind them. Where there are not buffer lines, stay back at least 3 yards.
- TRASH AND RECYCLING. Place bottles and cans in the recycling receptacles and trash in the trash cans. Please help make the Green Program, sponsored by VC Ultimate, a success.
- ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES. Beer will be available for purchase at the beer vendor tent near the food vendors. You must be 21 to purchase beer (with a legal form of I.D.). There will be a food court/player's lounge area with seating available for food and beverage. Purchased beer may also be taken elsewhere in the facility. Restrictions will be in place to prevent the consumption of alcohol by minors and to limit the impact of trash on the event. No glass is allowed. HEALTH AND SAFETY

Medical staff, including athletic trainers, will be on site at Tournament Central to treat injuries, handle emergencies, and provide some preventative care. The event will provide standard athletic tape, pre-wrap, ice and some bandages. Other supplies, including special tape/bandages and anti-inflammatory drugs, must be provided by teams or may be charged by the training staff. If there is an injury on a field that needs medical attention, inform a field marshal and he/she will radio to the trainers. If you have medical issues that require attention in the morning before play, please show up early to avoid long lines. The trainers will be at the fields by 7:30 a.m. each day. Directions to the local hospital can be found in the "Directions" section of this program.

CONCUSSIONS

- . Concussions are brain injuries that can occur as a result of a blow to the head.
- Symptoms may include headache, nausea, vision problems, confusion, and balance problems.
- If you think you or one of your teammates might have a concussion, tell your coach and have the athlete see a medical professional. Medical staff members are on hand at Tournament Central.

HEAT, NUTRITION AND HYDRATION

- Heat-related illness occurs when body cooling by evaporation is limited. Sweating depletes
 the body's salt and moisture, which leads to dehydration. If a player recognizes any signs
 or symptoms of heat-related illness, he or she should treat the problem immediately.
- Signs and symptoms of heat illness can include changes in level of consciousness, abdominal cramps, nausea/vomiting, fatigue/tingling, chills, inability to spit, dry mucous membranes, decreased output and change in color of urine.
- · Prevention and treatment of heat illness:
 - · Avoid alcohol, caffeine, and carbonated beverages.
 - Medications such as antihistamines, decongestants, certain asthma medications, and diuretics can increase risk for heat illness. Avoid them if possible.
 - Avoid certain nutritional supplements (such as caffeine and ephedrine) that can dehydrate the body and/or increase metabolism and heat production.
 - . Know your body Be honest! Are you fit enough to perform under current conditions?
 - Eat and drink (water AND sports drinks) optimally before, during and after play. Potassium is important (good sources include: sports drinks, yogurt, grapefruit juice, bananas and oranges). Sodium is also important (good sources include: sports drinks, vegetable juices, pretzels, nuts, cheese and crackers). After play, carbohydrates are important: foods such as potatoes, honey, cereal, white bread, corn chips, sports drinks, jelly beans, rice cakes, bagels, crackers and gummy candies).
 - Don't drink too much: Over-hydrating can be dangerous if it leads to a fluid and electrolyte imbalance.
 - Monitor your urine: Clear/copious = hydrated. Dark = Need water/electrolytes.
 - Be sensitive to prior illness: If you've been sick, your body may be more susceptible to dehydration.
 - . Rest and cool down after play. Find shade, wet the skin, get in front of a fan or breeze



SIDELINE SAFETY

- Spectators and equipment must stay at least 3 yards away from the sidelines. Where there
 are buffer lines, respect them. Chairs, coolers, strollers, you, etc., must be at least three
 yards from the sidelines.
- If a player believes that an object on the sideline is not safe, he or she should inform Event Staff and refrain from playing until he or she is satisfied that safe conditions have been established.
- USA Ultimate and Event Staff reserve the right to move or remove objects or spectators from on or near the playing field if those conditions are, in the opinion of USA Ultimate or Event Staff, unsafe for players, staff or spectators.

LIGHTNING GUIDELINES

- Event staff will communicate with players and spectators via PA system, and through field marshals equipped with radios, if there is a lightning danger. Play then will be stopped, and everyone should seek shelter.
- Safe shelter for players and spectators at the field site includes any fully enclosed building
 or vehicle with a hard top and closed windows.
- Event staff will use the "flash-to-bang" method to determine when to send people to shelter. By the time the flash-to-bang count has reached 30 seconds, all individuals should be in a safe shelter location.
- If you can't get to a safe shelter, try to avoid being the tallest object in an open field or on open water. Avoid other tall objects, metal objects and water. Assume a crouched position with only the balls of your feet touching the ground, your arms wrapped around your knees, and your head lowered. Minimize contact with the ground. Do not lie flat.
- Avoid using telephone land lines. Cell phones are safe, provided the person has followed other safety guidelines.
- Event staff will indicate to players when play is going to resume. Team captains should meet at Tournament Central to receive instructions for resuming play and any schedule modifications.

USA ULTIMATE SPIRIT RATINGS GUIDELINES

The ratings are ordered from 5 (indicating the highest level of spirit) through 1 (the lowest level of spirit):

5: Highest level of respect shown throughout the game towards opponents, officials, and spectators. For the level of play, showed excellent knowledge of the rules and abided by them throughout the game. Any conflicts were resolved amicably and without incident. Dpposing team's conduct added to our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team unfailingly played fairly and with an excellent attitude.

4: Respect shown throughout the game towards opponents, officials, and spectators. For the level of play, showed above average knowledge of the rules and abided by them throughout the game. Any conflicts were resolved favorably and without incident. Opposing team's conduct did not detract from our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team played fairly and with a good attitude.

3: Generally exhibited respect towards opponents, officials, and spectators. For the level of play, showed adequate knowledge of the rules and abided by them during the game. Any conflicts were resolved plainly and without incident. Opposing team's conduct generally did not detract from our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team generally played fairly and with a decent attitude.

2: Exhibited a lack of respect towards opponents, officials, and/or spectators. For the level of play, showed a lack of knowledge of, or disregard for the rules at points during the game. Any conflicts were resolved heatedly or led to contentious incidents. Opposing team's conduct detracted somewhat from our enjoyment of the game. The opposing team played unfairly and/ or with a poor attitude.

1: Exhibited a major lack of respect towards opponents, officials, and/or spectators. For the level of play, exhibited no knowledge of the rules or blatantly disregarded them during the game. Conflicts were resolved acrimoniously or led directly to contentious incidents. Opposing team's conduct made the game basically unenjoyable. The opposing team played unfairly and their attitude was abysmal.

INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

Teams are asked to nominate a player from their own team who displays the highest level of spirit. The definition of spirit is up to each team, but should include elements of respect, sportsmanship, leadership, perseverance, intensity, etc. Teams are asked to choose the player whose attitude should be emulated by teammates and admired by opponents. Individual spirit winners will receive a medal, prize disc (courtesy of DISCRAFT).

PETER FARRICKER SPIRIT OF THE GAME AWARD – The spirit award in the Open Division is named for Peter Farricker, a player who embodied Spirit of the Game to those who played with or against him. This award is given to a player in the Open Division of the USA Ultimate Championship Series deemed to have exhibited personal responsibility, integrity and fairness combined with a high standard of playing ability. Each qualifying Open team nominates one player from its roster who best represents the Spirit of the Game. At the Open Championship, each nominee is honored with a disc and a pin or set of Mardi Gras beads. The goal is that those wearing the Mardi Gras beads will be connected to Pete, each other and the Spirit of the Game, and become role models for their teammates and opponents. A selection committee watches the Open semifinal round and selects one of the four semifinal nominees as the winner. The award will be presented after the Open Finals. Previous winners include Moses Rifkin, Andy Crews, Damien Scott, Jeff Eastham-Anderson, Allan Cowan, Chase Sparling-Beckley, Josh McCarthy, Robbie Cahill, and Bart Watson.

KATHY PUFAHL SPIRIT OF THE GAME AWARD – The Women's Division spirit award builds upon the foundations of SOTG that are reflected in the Farricker Spirit Award: ability, fairness and integrity. The Kathy Pufahl Spirit Award also recognizes those individuals who give back to our sport and is presented to the player deemed to have exhibited personal responsibility, integrity and selfless contribution to Ultimate, combined with a high standard of playing ability. Each qualifying Women's team nominates one player from its roster as the person who best represents the Spirit of the Game and has contributed in a substantial way to their Ultimate community. At the Club Championships, each of the 16 nominees is honored with a memento reflective of Kathy's love of horticulture. A vote of the qualifying teams will determine the recipient of the Pufahl Award, which will be presented during halftime of the Women's Finals. Previous winners include Vida Towne, Kati Halmos, Kristine Gill, Deanna Ball, Allison Boyd, Jody Dozono, and Michelle Ng.

MARTY BAKKO SPIRIT OF THE GAME AWARD – In 2010, USA Ultimate added a new individual spirit award in the Masters Division to recognize one player in that division who stands out for their commitment and love of the game. The Masters Division spirit award honors players that embody the best attributes of Ultimate. Like Marty Bakko, these individuals: have an infectious sense of humor; possess a long-term passion for the sport of Ultimate; display a commitment to fair play, integrity and respect for their opponent; are shrewd, tactical innovators on the field; show an intense, competitive Spirit; and are leaders who inspire others to act. Each qualifying Masters team nominates one player from its roster as the person who best represents the Spirit of the Game and the qualities listed above. At the Club Championships, a vote of the qualifying teams will determine the recipient of the Marty Bakko Award, which will be presented during half-time of the Masters Finals. The award's inaugural winner in 2010 was Blayne Ferguson.

WOLVERINES

McMinnville, OR

The wolverine or Gulo gulo (Gulo is Latin for "glutton"), also referred to as glutton, carcajou, skunk bear, quickhatch, or possibly gulon, is the largest land-dwelling species of the family Mustelidae (weasels). It is a stocky and muscular carnivore, more closely resembling a small bear than other mustelids. The wolverine has a reputation for ferocity and strength out of proportion to its size, with the documented ability to kill prey many times its size.

The wolverine can be found primarily in remote reaches of the Northern boreal forests and subarctic and alpine tundra of the Northern hemisphere, with the greatest numbers in the U.S. state of Alaska, northern Canada, the Nordic countries of Europe, and throughout western Russia and Siberia. Their populations have experienced a steady decline since the 19th century in the face of trapping, range reduction and habitat fragmentation, such that they are essentially absent in the southern end of their European

range. It is, however, estimated that large populations remain in North America and northern Asia. These Wolverines are primarily from Oregon, though.

Johnny Bravo was founded in 1996 by Dan Ackerstein, Wes Williams and Dan "Jello" Revelle. (Note-Johnny Bravo was not named after the popular animated television series which first aired in 1997.) The team was founded on vengeance by castoffs from the top Boulder-area team. Secret Squirrel Johnny Bravo quickly overtook their rivals and began their reign as the top elite team in Colorado, qualifying for Nationals in 1997. Bravo split into two teams (Bravo and Gun Club) in 1998 and failed to qualify for Nationals after falling to the Santa Barbara Condors in the final and Los Guapos from San Diego in the backdoor game. Bravo and Gun Club reunited in 1999 and took the name of the old Boulder team, Secret Squirrel. After a disappointing 15th-place finish at Nationals in 1999, the team reclaimed its Johnny Bravo identity in 2000. Bravo has qualilied for Nationals every year since 2000, a feat matched by Se-

attle Sockeye and surpassed only by Raleigh's Ring of Fire (1997). Bravo broke into the quarterrinals in 2001 and has remained a top-tier team ever since. In the past few years, Bravo made three semifinals appearances and a finals appearance in 2007.

10 THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT SPIRIT OF THE GAME^{TT}

1. THE GOLDEN RULE: TREAT OTHERS AS YOU WOULD WANT TO BE TREATED.

Spirited games result from mutual respect among opponents. Assume the best of your opponent. Give him or her the benefit of a doubt. You would want the same for yourself. But if you are thick-skinned, do not assume that your opponent is. Maybe you should think of this rule as, "treat others as you would have them treat your mother."

2. CONTROL: SOTG TAKES REAL EFFORT.

SOTG is not just some abstract principle that everyone adopts and then games run smoothly without effort. Close calls are made in tight games. Hard fouls are committed. SOTG is about how you handle yourself under pressure: how you contain your emotionality, tame your temper, and modulate your voice. If you initiate or contribute to the unraveling of spirit, the concept falls apart quickly. If you act to mend things (or at least not exacerbate the situation) by following (1) above, the game heals itself.

3. HECKLING AND TAUNTING ARE DIFFERENT.

Ultimate has a long tradition of good-natured heckling. Heckles are friendly barbs, typically from non-playing spectators. Heckling can be fun, but taunting is unspirited and wrong. Harassing remarks after an opponent's foul call or close play are NOT heckling: they are abusive taunts which create unpleasant playing conditions and often escalate to acrimonious disputes.

4. SOTG IS COMPATIBLE WITH CHAMPIONSHIP PLAY.

It is a fallacy to argue that the stakes are so important that some aspect of SOTG can be cast aside. Time and again, great teams and star players have shown that you can bring all your competitive and athletic zeal to a game without sacrificing fair play or respect for your opponent.

5. DON'T "GIVE AS YOU GOT."

There is no "eye for an eye." If you are wronged, you have no right to wrong someone in return. In the extreme case where you were severely mistreated, you may bring the issue up with a captain, tournament director, or even lodge a complaint with the governing body. If you retaliate in kind, however, a complaint may be filed against you. We recall point (1): treat others as you would have them treat you, not as they have treated you. In the end, you are responsible for you.

6. BREATHE.

After a hard foul, close call, or disputed play, take a step back, pause, and take a deep breath. In the heat of competition, emotions run high. By giving yourself just a bit of time and space, you will gain enough perspective to compose yourself and concentrate on the facts involved in the dispute (was she in or out; did you hit his hand or the disc; did that pick affect the play). Your restraint will induce a more restrained response from your opponent. Conflagration averted, you may resume business as usual.

7. WHEN YOU DO THE RIGHT THING, PEOPLE NOTICE.

When you turn the other cheek, you know you've done the right thing. You may not hear praise, there may be no standing ovation, but people do notice. Eventually, their respect for you and their appreciation of the game will grow.

8. BE GENEROUS WITH PRAISE.

Compliment an opponent on his/her good catch. Remark to a teammate that you admire their honesty in calling themselves out of bounds. Look players in the eye and congratulate them when you shake their hands after a game. These small acts boost spirit greatly, a large payoff for little time and effort.

9. IMPRESSIONS LINGER.

Not only does the realization that your actions will be remembered for a long time serve to curb poor behavior, it can also inspire better conduct. Many old-timers enjoy the experience of meeting an elite player who remembers their first rendezvous on the field and recalls the event in detail. A good first encounter with an impressionable young player can have considerable long term positive impact.

10. HAVE FUN.

All other things being equal, games are far more fun without the antipathy. Go hard. Play fair. Have fun.


