We're in the home stretch to the inaugural World Beach Ultimate Club Championships (WBUCC) 2024! On October 14 at 9:30 AM (GMT+1), the Opening Ceremony will mark the beginning of an unforgettable showcase of world-class ultimate frisbee talent. Hosted on the breathtaking shores of Portimão, Portugal, this tournament will bring together the best beach ultimate teams from across the globe.

Format and Divisions

WBUCC 2024 will feature a solid competition format, with matches scheduled daily from 8:30 AM until 6:35 PM (GMT+1). The event will run through October 19, offering fans and players alike, six days of sun, Beach Ultimate, and incredible displays of athleticism and teamwork. Competing in WBUCC will be a total of 118 teams, divided into three divisions:

- Open Division: 39 teams
- Mixed Division: 54 teams
- Women's Division: 25 teams

Teams will compete following a **pool play format** during the initial phase of the competition. Based on their pool play performance, teams will qualify for power pools, quarterfinals, semifinals, and ultimately, the championship final.

The tournament will take place across a staggering 20 fields. October 14th, 2024, marked the first-ever **World Beach Ultimate Club Championships**. 1844 athletes, 706 games to be played, 117 teams from 33 different countries, and 3 exciting divisions (Open, Mixed, Women's), what more could a Beach Ultimate fan ask for?

The first day of competition was what many would describe as a perfect day. A beautiful sunny day with a whisp of clouds sliding through the sky and only a whisper of wind. Festivities kicked off with an energy-inducing Opening Ceremony, setting the tone for a day filled with **97** high-flying, sand-in-your-face

Starting off the day, we witnessed a Mixed division match-up of Portugal's UFA and Poland's, AKS Zły. UFA came out firing on all cylinders, using the space on the field exceptionally well and playing to their experience on the beach. UFA took the lead early and never looked back, leading the match all the way through and by as many as 5 points. While AKS Zły mounted a late surge thanks to their defense, it wasn't enough as UFA took their first win. UFA will certainly be a team to look out for throughout WBUCC 2024.

Disckick Berlin (DE):

In one of the day's most thrilling matchups, the 38th seed, DiscKick Berlin, took down the 12th seed, SunDogs (USA), on a dramatic Universe Point. The game was a nail-biter from start to finish, with neither team able to pull ahead by more than a single point. Both sides exchanged offensive holds and break scores, showcasing patient, high-level disc movement, and fantastic defensive prowess. For Disckick, it was the heroics of #66 Caspar Gross who stole the show, tallying a game-high 7 goals and 1 assist. His partner in crime, #96 Tom Benjamin Sudhaus, quarterbacked the offense beautifully and racked up 6 assists. Despite the relentless efforts of the SunDogs, they couldn't stop the Sudhaus-Gross duo on Universe Point, allowing Disckick to complete the upset and claim victory.



Guayota continued to show why they've been and still are a force on the beach, dominating Mighty Hucks (GB) with a 13-6 victory. Known for their quick, precise tiki-taka style, Guayota took the lead early and ended the match commandingly, scoring 6 goals off turnovers and controlling the game until the end. While Mighty Hucks had flashes of brilliance with strong break-side throws, they couldn't match Guayota's pace of play.

Boracay Ultimate (PH):

Boracay Ultimate is one of the teams that should be on everybody's watch list and their matchup against Italy's AUT BeeFire is the perfect example of why. Boracay led the game all the way through, with lightning-quick cuts and tight defensive pressure. They put up 3 early break scores and to add insult to injury, Boracay's #21, Edgar Sumbi snagged himself a ridiculous Callahan score. They closed the match out with a 13-5 win.

Freezgo (FR):

In a stunning upset, 24th-seeded Freezgo defeated the 3rd seed, Margarita Mix'd (IE), by 4 points in a hard-fought battle.

Torrija turned the defensive dial all the way to 10 straight out of the gate, jumping to an early 2-0 lead with back-to-back break scores. The game remained tight all the way through until the end, but thanks to Torrija's early defensive showing, they were able to

Sweden's E6 is no stranger to Beach Ultimate. Silver medalists at the 2023 European Beach Ultimate Club Championships, E6 continued to show their strength with a fantastic first day at WBUCC. Their leading scorer, #19 Maja Lindroth, was unstoppable in the end zone, racking up 10 goals. In an interview with Ulti.TV's lead commentator, Stefan Rapazzo, Lindroth was asked about managing the team's expectations. She responded, 'We don't really have any expectations. We try to tell ourselves to stay calm... We don't know what people will show up with or what they'll bring, so we just try to stay calm and play our game.' Lindroth's game-by-game approach will be key to her and her team's success throughout the tournament.

Reflections on the Day & Looking Ahead

With such a successful Day 1 of WBUCC 2024 in the books, fans and players alike should have plenty to look forward to. Pool play is set to continue October, 15th, with dreadful showers on the forecast. It will be interesting to see how teams adapt to the severe changes in weather and which teams solidify themselves as top contenders in the tournament.

Day 2 Of WBUCC 2024: Pretenders Or Contenders? Even A Storm Couldn't Stop The Top Teams

Players had the second day of WBUCC marked on their calendars for one reason only: a storm was coming. With strong winds gusting in from the coast, showers dancing over the fields, and the threat of a thunderstorm on the dark purple horizon, all 1844 athletes were put to the ultimate test.

Open Division

Humiliswag (US):

Day 2 Forecast: Wet. All credit to Focus Ultimate.

consistent disc movement in strong winds and suffocating defensive pressure have put them a tier above the competition by beating out the likes of UkrOpen (UA) 13-5, CUS Padova Barbastreji (IT) 12-5, and St. Laurent (CA) 11-6. Being 5-0 in pool play with a 62/31 goals for/against ratio is nothing to scoff at.

Salaspils Wild Things (LV):

The 10th seed from Latvia has been nothing short of impressive. With three more games on their schedule, they continued to showcase their sky-high athleticism. However, their toughest test came against Murciélagos (Spain). Both teams put on a defensive clinic, with huge layouts at key moments. The scoreboard never saw a lead greater than two

quick, short passes. The turning point came late when the Spaniards grabbed a crucial break to make it 10-8 just as time ran out.

With their backs against the wall, Salaspils needed an offensive hold and two consecutive break scores to pull off the comeback of the tournament. In the final minutes, Salaspils clocked in overtime on the defensive side, getting two enormous layouts on errant throws by. Forced into Universe Point, a monstrous pull pinned Murciélagos deep in their end zone. With Salaspils's continued pressure, they were able to force a turnover right on the Spanish end zone line. Securing the win for the Salaspils was none other than #28 Justin Foord to #9 Benjamin Oort.

Salaspils Wild Things heads into Day 3 of WBUCC also undefeated at 5-0.

UFO (NL):

A team that is certainly used to strong winds is UFO, the 15th seed from the Netherlands. The towering Dutch showed their mastery in windy conditions with a convincing 13-5 win over Italy's AUT BeeFree. UFO controlled the game from start to finish, securing an early lead and never letting up. With scoring contributions from 9 of their 17 players, UFO's depth was obvious.

out Ol' Berndad (US) 10-9, and then took down Freespeed Basel (CH) in a winner-take-all 9-8 battle. The Freespeed game, in particular, was a back-and-forth thriller, with no team scoring a break. UFO's resilience in these tight matches has proven they can handle the pressure, leaving them in great shape heading into Day 3.

Mixed Division

If there was a better word than 'dominant' to describe Guayota's performance on the day, it would be applicable here.

allowed in two games. They started by shutting out Singapore's Appendix Ultimate in a flawless 13-0 performance and continuing their momentum with a decisive 13-2 victory over Mexico's Condor Ultimate. Their relentless defensive pressure and faultless execution on offense were overwhelming for their opponents. With back-to-back wins, Guayota has solidified their reputation as one of the top teams to watch at WBUCC 2024.

SoCal (US):

SoCal, the top seed in the Mixed Division, put on a Beach Ultimate clinic in their three games of the day, allowing just seven points across all matchups. They kicked things off with a dominant 13-1 victory over Italy's Ichnos, followed by a perfect 13-0 shutout against Switzerland's Scorillaz. Their mix of sharp offensive execution and stifling defense kept their opponents grounded in the Portimão sand.

Their toughest match came against Austria's Catchup Graz, but SoCal still managed to control the game after a slower 2-2 start, securing themselves a definitive 12-6 win. It seems as if wind, rain, and thunderstorms couldn't slow down the Americans.

Pie Wagon (AU):

undefeated run on Day 2. Their most challenging matchup came from Belgium's Flying Rabbits. In a tight game, no team could really find their footing in the wet and windy conditions. Both teams exchanged blows with offensive holds and back-toback breaks. However, late in the game, the Aussies finally broke the game open in the 44th minute of play with a pair of crucial break scores from #1 Luke Prosser and #74 Kristen Murray. Despite their rough start to WBUCC 2024, Pie Wagon has proven to be a real threat in the standings through their resilience.

Women's Division:

LAMP (US):

Through Day 2, LAMP remains undefeated. After solid wins against top competition in Jetset LUV (BE) 9-6 and a 10-5 triumph over Yaka (FR), LAMP has shown their ability to brilliantly move the disc along the sands of Portugal. #24 Danielle Walsh continues to be the center of the American offense, distributing a total of 8 assists on the day. Her patient decision-making and pinpoint throws make her a problem for any competitors. Teams heading into Day 3 need to keep LAMP —and Walsh—firmly on their scouting radar.

After E6's (SE) dominant performance on Day 2, the 5th-

Cassalletes (ES):

The ladies from Valencia, Spain had themselves two 12-round boxing matches. In a thrilling matchup against the 8thseeded Salaspils FK (LV), the Latvians displayed meditative patience in their end zone play, finding good resets constantly. They utilized a huck-and-d strategy that kept the Spaniards on their heels when moving upwind. Their defense was tenacious, featuring tight marks and several impressive handblocks, as well as effective high-release backhands that opened up the field.

With the score tied at 6-6 and a gruesome turnover after turnover point, the Cassalletes found a loophole and made a statement with a massive huck from #7 Valentina Betancor Boerr, leading to a spectacular momentum-shifting layout from #15 Jenny Lee. An errant deep shot from Salaspils then gave Cassalletes an advantageous field position, allowing them to pull ahead with an 8-6 lead. The Cassalletes held their ground and went on to secure the win, 9-7.

The Cassealletes faced a tough loss on Universe Point against Poland's team, Troubles, 8-9. They continue onwards to Day 3 with 3 wins and 1 loss.

Day 3 Of WBUCC 2024: Tight Games And Shifting Sands **Reveal The Tournament's**

The third day of WBUCC was littered with huge upsets and tight-knit games. In a complete 180° turn from yesterday's weather, the skies were calm and the sun was shining. The only thunderous rumble to be heard were the growls and cheers from a slate of unbelievable games.

Open Division

The Quijotes are THEM. Throughout WBUCC 2024, they've been quietly dominating the competition, streaking through the bumpy sands with ease and playing with red-hot intensity. Leading up to their final match of the day against tournament favorite Humiliswag (US), Quijotes had been undefeated throughout the tournament, beating out the likes of St. Laurent (CA), CUS Padova Barbastreji (IT), and FT Würzburg (DE).

Quijotes's game against the Americans lived up to the hype, with Humiliswag starting the match with an easy break score. However, spirits for the Spaniards remained high as they responded in appropriate fashion with an offensive hold and a pair of break scores to show the Americans they were there to play. The game was nothing short of intense as physical play and defensive stops kept tensions at a tournament high. With the score tied 4-4 after an exchange of break scores, Quijotes continued to pressure Humiliswag with their pinpoint disc movement. In a thrilling finish, Quijotes completed the upset with a 10-7 victory, empowered by #1 Claudio Gagliardi Valbuena, who stood out as one of the keys to their offense with 2 assists and 3 goals.

Quijotes head into Day 4 of WBUCC 2024 undefeated and leave Humiliswag 6-1.

Salaspils Wild Things (LV):

Open. The wind was nearly non-existent and that meant one thing for both teams: send the big man deep and give him that disc. It was an incredible sight as both teams glided the disc so effortlessly across the pitch. Each throw, whether short or long, was precise and perfectly caught in the bread basket. While Jetset gave the Salaspils a run for their money, it wasn't until a break score after halftime that gave the Latvians the breathing room needed to take home the victory, 13-11. Standout performances came from #99 Arvīds Žanis Kārkliņš, who effortlessly tallied 5 assists and 1 goal, alongside his running mate #9 Benjamin Oort, who put in 1 assist and 4 goals.

In their second game of the day against Sweden's Viksjöfors, Salaspils's patience in the end zone was key as they meticulously worked the disc through Vijkjöfors's defense. The Latvian's force-middle defense strategy kept Vijkjöfors' offense in check, securing them their 7th well-earned victory, 13-8.

Salaspils Wild Things continue their undefeated streak on Day 4 of WBUCC 2024, 7-0.

CUS Padova Barbastreji (IT):

In Padova's square-off against St. Laurent (CA), the Italians were faced with a torrent of blows from the Canadians. St. Laurent's physical and ice-cold defense disrupted all of Padova's rhythm, giving them a huge 5-2 early lead. However, a

flip was switched and Padova began playing their game, discarding the errant deep throws for a more controlled short game. Their resilience paid off as they quickly snagged halftime and ultimately finished with an impressive 11-7 comeback victory.

CUS Padova Barbastreji closed out their third day and are 4-3 for the tournament.

Mixed Division

Guayota (ES):

The Spanish team hailing from Tenerife in the Canary Islands remains unstoppable. In their three games of the day, they handled RFO (FR), CUS Padova Rangers (IT), and Margarita Mix'd (IE). In all three games, they were in the driver's seat, never relinquishing the lead and providing no room for errors for their opponents. Their exceptional disc movement in the short to midfield has been their calling card.

Let's see if the Canarians can continue their dominance as they face the top competition heading into Day 4 of WBUCC 2024.

The American powerhouse SoCal finishes their Day 3 with an astonishing 51-point differential. In their three games of the day, they never trailed on the scoreboard. Their larger-than-life defensive intensity paired with a calm disc movement has been a sight to behold. The way they utilized the field's deep space

Women's Division:

Torrijas (BE):

The 22nd seed from Belgium has been silently moving through the tournament while handing out Ls to top tournament contenders. In an upset victory against the 12th-seeded team from Czechia, the ladies from Torrijas handled 3SB in convincing fashion, 11-7. Belgium's #91, Pita D'Hespeel was dealing assists on a platter to her teammates with 5 assists.

In similar fashion, Torrijas continued their trend of upsetting the apple cart by taking down Spain's Cassalletes, 10-6. After a tense 4-4 tie, the Belgians went on a break score spree with D'Hespeel putting up another 5 assists, bringing her assist total to 10 for the day.

If competitors want to stop Torrijas, they need to look no further than slowing down D'Hespeel's pinpoint passes and beautiful movement.

Cassalletes (ES):

matchup was a tale of two halves with the two teams exchanging breaks. But, after an incredible defensive effort from Cassalletes and the use of great switch defense, LAMP was left scrambling and unable to get easy inside cuts. While the Americans fought back amicably with consecutive break scores, Cassalletes had a firm grasp on the win condition and completed the upset victory.

Cassalletes finished Day 3 of WBUCC 2024 2-1, defeating MUC Munich (DE), 10-5, and dropping their game against Torrijas, 6-10.

Valkyria (SE):

After taking an early loss from Torrijas on Day 1, the Swedish women have been sensational. They put on a clinic against the familiar faces on Yaka (FR), leading the matchup early and refusing to trail at any point. #14 Oda Homlong caught fire during the match, emphatically scoring 5 goals and dishing 1 assist, bringing her total to 7 points on the day. Through sharp execution and high-energy defense, the Valkyries are without a doubt, top contenders heading into Day 4.

Looking Ahead

As we head into Day 4, the tournament's powerhouses are firmly establishing themselves, but the road to WBUCC 2024 champion is far from certain. With only three days left, every game will be pivotal as teams push for the top. As the winds continue to keep the sand shifting in Portugal, more and more will be revealed.

The WBUCC 2024 crown is close. Day 4 has come and gone as quickly as the showering rain and the gusting wind. With pool play now in the rearview, we're finally seeing the cream rise to the top. Teams have found their footing and the sand is heating up as the top contenders vie for glory. Let's dive in and find out what happened on Day 4 of WBUCC 2024.

Open Division

SunDogs (US):

The 11th-seeded SunDogs have clawed their way through the

the SunDogs struggled to find chemistry in their lineups and faced challenging windy conditions. However, they finally hit their stride when it mattered most, taking difficult victories against Vorai (LT), 12-10, and Solaris (PL), 11-9. Their hard work paid off and earned them a performance against the undefeated Quijotes (ES) in a quarterfinal match for the ages.

From the outset, the SunDogs set the tone, catching Quijotes off guard with their intense defensive pressure and precise execution in the deep space. #0 Jesse Johnson led the charge, helping the SunDogs jump out to an early three-point lead. Quijotes, known for their calm and efficient short-field play, were forced into uncharacteristically long throws, struggling to adapt to the SunDogs' suffocating defense. However, the Spaniards fought back in brilliant fashion. Using the infectious crowd energy, they found their way back to their familiar playstyle and took advantage of back-to-back errant throws from the SunDogs to send the game to Universe Point. With everything on the line and in a moment of absolute cinema, a dramatic layout defensive grab by #43 Kai Durvasula followed by his perfectly executed cut sealed the match for the SunDogs, 10-9.

The SunDogs find themselves in the semi-finals against their fellow Americans, the top-seeded Humiliswag.

Salaspils Wild Things (LV):

the Open Division after Day 4 of WBUCC 2024. Their quality of players and near-perfect disc movement make them nearimpossible to stop. In their two games of the day, Salaspils faced off against 33 Tours Stade Bordelais (FR) and Freezzz Beezzz (BE) for their quarterfinal match.

To put it lightly, the men were dominant in every way, never trailing in any of their matches and asserting unwavering control from the opening pull. Their balanced roster saw significant contributions from all of their players on both offense and defense.

As Salaspils head into Day 5 of WBUCC, they prepare for a much-anticipated rematch against Jetset Open (BE).

Jetset Open (BE):

After suffering a loss to Salaspils Wild Things (LV) on Day 3, the Belgian lads have been marching forward confidently as a tournament powerhouse. With a 3-game slate on Day 4 of WBUCC, they found themselves in several tight matchups against the likes of Gentle (BE), FT Würzburg (DE), and UFO (NL).

Their greatest test came from their quarterfinal match against the 15th-seeded UFO, who pushed the Belgians to the brink for 40 minutes. What really set Jetset apart from the Dutch was their willingness to put their bodies on the line stealing

Jetset Open finished their Day 4 with three victories and will enter the semi-final round for a fated rematch against Salaspils Wild Things. All eyes will be on their strategic adjustments as they seek redemption and on their path to WBUCC glory.

Whether you're a fan, player, or someone just passing by watching athletes run around chasing plastic, this final was everything and more anyone could ever ask for. It was a testament to the spirit of the game, dedication to the craft, and enthusiasm for the sport found in Beach Ultimate. All three divisions delivered on the hype and somehow, exceeded any and all expectations. Three World Champions were crowned on Saturday and here's how it went down.

Open Division

This game had it all—a roaring crowd, huge layouts, an emphatic Callahan, a jaw-dropping Greatest, and a hands-onyour-head Universe Point finish. Scriptwriters couldn't write a better Open final even if they tried.

Humiliswag and Jetset both came into the final with 11-1 records and it was the Americans that came out in full stride with a highly-contested offensive hold and an easy break score. Undeterred in the slightest, the Belgians held and scored with a fantastic sky-high grab by #23 Sofiène Bontemps. Then, just as quickly as Humiliswag took an early lead, Jetset's #9 Luca Tognetti cleared the lanes for take-off and flew through the runway at a ridiculous pace and grabbed himself a monstrous, momentum-shifting, layout Callahan, igniting his teammates and the crowd.

Regardless of the momentum gained from Tognetti's heroics, Humiliswag weathered the storm like experts, playing pictureperfect Beach Ultimate and stifling Jetset's offense for a break score of their own. With disc in hand, Humiliswag sent a huck deep for their striking player and in another flash of brilliance, #89 Alexander Spahlholz put on his cape and went horizontal for an electric shoulder-high layout.

In stride and perfectly executed, Heymans grabbed the disc midair and launched it back in bounds to #24 Robin Wouters who also flew across the field with his one-handed layout catch to secure the disc. The grandstand erupted as Ulti.TV Lead Commentator, Stefan Rappazo, summed up the moment: "My brains are melting out of my ears!"

If all that excitement wasn't enough, Humiliswag answered the call with an offensive hold of their own, and fans and players were treated to an unbelievable climax: Universe Point at the

Arthur Moyersoen for the championship-winning score, 11-10. Jetset's triumph over Humiliswag capped off an unforgettable Open Division final, securing their place in Beach Ultimate history.

That was a challenge, but it was a mental game... and today, we were a little bit stronger." The win not only solidified Valkyria's dominance on the world stage but also marked the beginning of what could be an enduring rivalry between two of Sweden's best.
