

GAME ADVISORS

A brief description of the Game Advisor (GA) role Refer to Appendix B6.3 for more details

AIM

The aim of GAs is to support the and efficiently as possible. Players remain responsible for making and resolving all game calls.



RULES ADVICE During stoppages GAs can help to clarify the rules, if asked by the Players.



TIME LIMITS

GAs closely monitor time limits in accordance with the rules, including in between points, time outs, and during discussions, and encourage teams to comply with these

WHISTLES

GAs give information to Players about time limits by using whistles, but also by providing verbal advice.

SPIRIT OF THE GAME

If GAs have concerns about Spirit they can talk to the Captains, the Players involved, or can even call a SOTG Stoppage to help the Players resolve the issue.



NON BINDING ADVICE

If Players need help resolving any call they may ask the GA for their advice. This advice is non-binding and Players must still make the call.

SIDELINE ROLE during play. They may come on to the field during stoppages, if needed.

MISCONDUCT

In extreme circumstances GAs can issue warnings and/or enforce sanctions in accordance with the WFDF Conduct Policy







HAND SIGNALS

GAs use hand signals to echo the calls made by the Players, for the benefit of other Players and spectators. They also actively signal to inform the

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Waterloo Organization of Disc Sports are annual guests at the Manulife Sportsplex and RIM Park and enjoy the privilege of hosting ultimate tournaments on these amazing fields. There will be clearly marked

"NO ACCESS" areas throughout the venue and all event patrons must not trespass on any of these areas – this includes buildings that are locked and staff only areas.

VENUE RULES

NO SMOKING – There is a general no-smoking policy that applies to ALL the City of Waterloo venues, buildings, fields, seating and parking areas. NOISE CONTROL – We aim to greatly reduce any noise on site from 10pm. While games are done at this point, please be aware of your noise levels for local residents while you're boarding shuttles or finishing up at the venue.

LOST & FOUND

The lost and found service is provided in the Information Centre at the Manulife Sportsplex or at the event's disc central tent. Any lost or found items should be reported to a volunteer or delivered to the disc central tent.

USEFUL INFORMATION

Cars drive on the right here; look both directions when crossing the road. Please use designated crossings at the event venue.

TRASH AND RECYCLING

The TOC and event contractors & suppliers have worked hard on creating a sustainable environment and have put a recycling waste management process in place. Please use the black bins for general waste and the blue bins for recyclable materials. The field food tent will have some green bins for food waste. Should you have food waste at the fields, please collect it and bring it to the green bins in the main food area.

Bins will be located around all competition and spectator areas on the venue. Teams are requested to clean up all areas after their games and to leave the fields in a tidy manner. Spectators are responsible for their own trash and should use the bins as provided.



MEDICAL AND FIRST AID SERVICES

Wishbone Athletic will provide on-site medical services from a variety of stations around the event grounds. Medical staff will be on-site from 08:00 to end of games each day and offer medical services as well as taping. If you wish to have preventative taping, you must supply your own tape or buy it from Wishbone. If you require taping due to an injury, this will be covered by the medical services.

There is also a branch of Waterloo Sports Medicine located in the Manulife Sportsplex at RIM Park. This branch of Waterloo Sports Medicine is typically staffed with an orthopaedic surgeon and multiple physiotherapists.

Lunch is not included. During the day it will be possible to buy lunch and other snacks onsite at the RIM Park Main Fields. All food and beverage sales will be **CASH ONLY.**

There are also a few restaurants adjacent to the fields and inside the Manulife Sportsplex. Hours will vary by location.

LUNCH - STAFF / VOLUNTEER:

You will get your daily lunch voucher from the Volunteer Director. Present this to any of the concession stands for your meal.

Dinner is provided by the accommodation providers or are the responsibility of the individual. Both accommodations are in close proximity to a variety of restaurants meeting all tastes.

WLU: 17:30 - 19:00 HRS DAILY*

August 18: 20:00 - 21:30 hrs to allow for a meal after the opening game

INN OF WATERLOO: 17:00 - 21:00 HRS.

Water - The tap water in the Canada is drinkable - Athletes are advised to refill their water bottles from the stations around the venue. Water will also be provided at each field during competition.



The WJUC organizing committee has partnered with the local public transit agency, Grand River Transit (GRT) to offer free rides all week on all GRT routes when you show your event accreditation. GRT offers express bus routes from both accommodation providers to RIM Park. Shuttles buses will be used to supplement GRT service during special events throughout the week (ie. Showcase games, social night)

BUS ROUTES

THE INN OF WATERLOO TO RIM PARK

The route 201 iXpress to Conestoga Mall will run between the Inn of Waterloo and RIM Park. Board the bus at the stop on King St., 80m from the Inn of Waterloo. This bus will stop briefly at Conestoga Mall where it will change to the 202 iXpress. The same bus will carry on to the fields, so please do not exit the bus at Conestoga Mall.

RIM PARK TO THE INN OF WATERLOO

Board route 202 iXpress to Conestoga Mall at RIM Park. This will take you to Conestoga Mall, where it will stop briefly and change to the route 201 iXpress. The same bus will carry on to the Inn of Waterloo, so please do not exit the bus at Conestoga Mall.

WILFRID LAURIER UNIVERSITY TO RIM PARK

Board the route 202 iXpress to Conestoga Mall at the stop on University Ave. (beside Clara Conrad Residence) and ride directly to RIM Park.

RIM PARK TO WILFRID LAURIER UNIVERSITY

Board the route 202 iXpress to The Boardwalk at RIM Park and ride directly to Wilfrid Laurier University.

USING THE SHUTTLE BUSES.

Your player pass is also your bus ticket. You must show this to the volunteers at the bus stop. Guests will also be able to access the shuttles by showing their guest pass. Shuttles will pick up at the public transport stops at the accommodations and RIM Park.

Those who have not purchased a guest ticket and do not have a player pass, will not be able to use the shuttle buses. We have planned capacity based on player numbers and a small number of guests in attendance and do not have capacity to carry those without a pass. A number of public transport options are available for getting to the site; and taxis can also be booked if desired.


For transport to any other sites, you will need to use local taxis or bus services.

CAR PARKING

Parking at Wilfrid Laurier University is by permit only. A permit can be arranged upon check in. Parking at the Inn of Waterloo is included in the cost of accommodations. There is ample free parking at RIM Park. NOTE – Please do not park in the small horseshoe driveway near the turf fields as they are for staff and deliveries only.

ACCOMMODATION

Wilfrid Laurier University (WLU) offers dorm style accommodation in double rooms. A central dining hall provides a great opportunity to catch up with teammates or meet new friends. WLU is located near a number of restaurants, businesses and Waterloo Park. Laundry machines are available in the WLU residences but vary from building to building. Please ask for details when you check in to your rooms.



The Inn of Waterloo is a full-service hotel offering comfortable rooms, swimming pool, workout area, relaxing garden and on-site restaurant. The Inn of Waterloo is just a few hundred metres from Conestoga Mall, where you can find a number of restaurants and all the shopping you desire.





MAIN FIELDS



EASTBRIDGE FIELDS



The playing fields at RIM Park are in two clusters. The main field cluster has 6 fields (2 artificial turf and 4 natural grass) and will be home to the hot food station. main medical tent, disc central, VC Ultimate tent and the Showcase Field. The Eastbridge field cluster has 4 natural arass fields and will have a medical tent and field food station. The field clusters are located at each end of the Manulife Sportsplex, which will house the players' lounge, vendor outlets, media offices and tournament staff offices. The Manulife Sportsplex also has free wifi, water fountains. changerooms, washrooms, a variety of food outlets and seating to get out of the sun and cool down in the air conditioning.



Waterloo is a small city with a number of restaurants, shopping and other items of interest within walking distance or a short bus ride.

INN OF WATERLOO:

For those staying at the Inn of Waterloo, Conestoga Mall is a 5-minute walk along King St., or a single stop on bus route 201 iXpress. Conestoga Mall offers a wide variety of shopping, a grocery store, food court, movie theatre and a museum. Directly across King St. there are a few stores (National Sports, Chapters Books) and an East Side Mario's restaurant. East Side Mario's is a good option for teams as it is quite large and can host a number of teams at once while offering good food at a good price.

WILFRID LAURIER UNIVERSITY (WLU)

WLU has a variety of restaurants within a 5-minute walk of campus. Many offer limited seating but have good food at good prices. If you walk to the corner of King St. at University Ave., you will be able to see many of your choices! Conestoga Mall is the nearest large shopping

option and can be accessed via bus route 7C from the stop at King St. at University Ave. (in front of the Royal Bank).

Some nearby dining recommendations from the Tournament Director are:

1. Frat Burger/Metro on King: 247 King St. North, Waterloo. This restaurant is beside WLU and offers great burgers that you can built to your tastes. It also offers a variety of Czech style schnitzel if you're looking for a traditional local flavour. There is seating for about 40 people.



Dining recommendations cont'd:

2. Morty's Wings: 272 King St. North, Waterloo. This pub is located 100m from WLU and offers the best chicken wings in Canadal Do I need to say more?

3. Shawarma Royal: 258 King St., North, Waterloo. This new restaurant is home to 2 Syrian refugees who came to Canada a year ago and are now producing some amazing traditional middle eastern foods. This is a take-out restaurant with very limited seating.

LOCAL NAVIGATION:

Public Transport – Maps will be available at Disc Central to help you use the local bus network. You can also plan your trips by visiting www.grt.ca.

Taxi – There are a few local taxi options to help you get out and explore the city. Waterloo Taxi – 519-888-7777; City Cabs – 519-747-7777. Taxi rates are regulated in Canada and include the taxes. You can tip the driver if you wish, but it is not mandatory.

OPENING CEREMONY



- 1. WFDF Rules of Ultimate 2017 are in use
- 2. All games to 15
- 3. Each team has two 75-second time-outs per half
- 4. Halftime is 7 minutes in duration

5. Halftime cap (+1) occurs after 55 minutes of game time if neither team has reached 8 goals

6. Time cap (+1) occurs after 100 minutes of game time if neither team has reached 15 goals

7. Teams should clear fields and sideline areas to allow next teams to move in and prepare in a timely manner. Spirit circles, team huddles, and the like should be done off of the field
