WFDF Forum.

For most of you reading this the work of the **World Flying Disc Federation** may be a mystery. The 11th Congress of WFDF will be held on Monday 24th July at Millfield, right under our noses. But what will happen and how will it effect us as players?

WFDF is a players organisation. It was created to respond to the needs of players world-wide so that they may have a voice in their sport. Constitutionally it is the representatives of your national associations that vote on a range of topics concerning disc sports, from tournament play to development in schools, from disc technology to rules, but historically WFDF has developed through individuals and organisations responding to what players want. The WFDF Forum gives you, the individual player, the opportunity to voice your own ideas about the direction in which the sport is going.

The Forum will be held on **Thursday night at 8.00pm**. It will cover a wide range of topics including many aspects of tournament play at WFDF Championships. For example the question of cost and quality, tournament duration, game length, pre-qualifying tournaments etc. If you have a view please let it be known. Tournament Directors welcome as much guidance as possible on the needs of players both on and off the field. Your views will help form the way tournaments are run in the future.

Spirit of the Game.

When WFDF was formed in the 1980's I was fortunate enough to be elected as its first President. A major part of my job then was to define the Aims of WFDF and try and capture in words the importance of the way we behave as players of disc sports. Reading those Aims again I am struck by their relevance today, even though the sport and WFDF have developed significantly in the past eleven years. The first Aim reads:

"To encourage and protect the spirit of flying disc play where as partners rather than opponents we compete against the limits of our own abilities rather than each other. To foster a climate of peace in which disc play may be appreciated for its ability to bring people together in a communal rejoicing of skill and play. To ultimately learn to live together through playing together."

I hope that these values are shared and that the Aim of WFDF is the aim of us all this week.

Remaining 16 teams play knockout format for places 9-16 and 17-24..

Top 2 teams in Division 2 pools play knockout format for places 25-32. Remaining 8 teams play knockout format for places 33-40.

Women's Division.

16 teams in 2 pools (of 8). Round robin in each pool. Teams 1-4 from each pool advance to Division 1 pool. Teams 5-8 from both pools advance to Division 2 pool. Results of games against opponents coming from the same original pool are brought into Division 1 and 2 play. Games for round 2 are played against all teams coming from the other pool. The four best Division 1 teams play a semi-final, 1 v 4 and 2 v 3. Final will be two winning semi-finalists. No 3rd/4th play-off, this position will be determined by higher placing of two losing semi-finalists at end of Division 1 play.

Masters Division.

All 6 teams in one pool. Double round robin with top 2 teams playing the final.

Tie Breakers:

There is a well developed system for tie-breaks now. If two teams are tied after any phase of pool play then the result of the head-to-head game will determine places. If three or more teams are tied then the following order of criteria will be applied;

1. Points scored in games between those teams will be calculated. The team with the highest points difference in those games will determine the highest ranking for that team. The remaining teams will be decided on the same basis if there are still three teams tied or on a head-to-head basis if two teams are still tied.
2. After calculating the points difference between three or more teams, should the points difference be the same for two or more of those teams then the highest points scored in those matches will determine places. After determining places by this criteria, should two teams remain tied then their ranking will be determined on the head-to-head basis.
3. Should three or more teams still be tied after points difference and points scored are calculated then points difference in *all* games in that pool will be calculated and the team with the highest difference will gain the highest ranking. Further rankings will be determined by the results of head-to-head games.

The **closing ceremony** will take place on the fields after the medals and trophies have been given on Saturday 29th July at approximately 16:30. If it is wet the presentation of medals and trophies and the closing ceremony will take place in the main marquee after the Open Final.

Finals, Medals and Trophies

Medals and Trophies will be given after the Final game in each Division, unless it is raining. There are medals for the top three teams in each Division and trophies for the top three teams in each division. Trophies for the Spirit of the Game in that Division will also be awarded at this time.

If it is raining all medals and trophies will be presented in the Main Marquee at the end of the Open Division Final.

It is therefore very important that third place teams are available to receive their medals and trophy if they are in the Division that is playing that Final. I am sure you will be watching the final game in your Division anyway.....

Medical Facilities.

There are free medical facilities available on the field to all players. The medical tent is next to the players tent on the main field. The medical team are headed by a senior physiotherapist (see Staff Team) and will have a large number of physio's medical staff and sports specialists on duty. The medical tent will open at 08:00 each day in preparation for the first game at 08:30. All taping and equipment is provided free of charge to players. There is access to the main hospitals in the area should you need it!

Please ensure that you all have **personal medical and accident insurance** to cover injuries that might require long term treatment or a flight home!

To avoid injuries please warm up properly and warm down after a game. Watch your food and drink intake during the day. Read the Fitness Book in the players pack if you want advice on how best to get through the week injury-free.

On-Field Sales.

There will be a range of stalls on the fields throughout the week. They will be selling:

The **Ultimate Store** is the official outlet for all tournament merchandise; discs, shirts, jackets, shorts and the videos of the 1994 WUGC Final, all for sale. All sales on the fields are subject to the School regulations. This means that all sales of goods must be licensed. The Tournament Director holds this license and is responsible for the monitoring of all on-field sales.

Teams who wish to sell goods directly associated with the tournament (shirts, discs or other goods bearing the team's logo specifically for the *95 Worlds) in order to raise funds for their trip may either pay a license fee or have tournament staff retail their goods for them. A License will cost £30 for which you will be provided with tented cover, table and chairs. If you wish tournament staff to sell your goods for you there will be a 10% surcharge for all goods. If you wish to take this option please contact Sally at the Ultimate Store on Sunday and she and her staff will be glad to relieve you of the burden of selling.

Individuals registered at the tournament or teams who wish to sell goods not associated with the tournament may do so subject to a licence fee of £50. All sales will take place in designated areas only.

Further opportunities for sales will take place on Tuesday at the Trading Night.

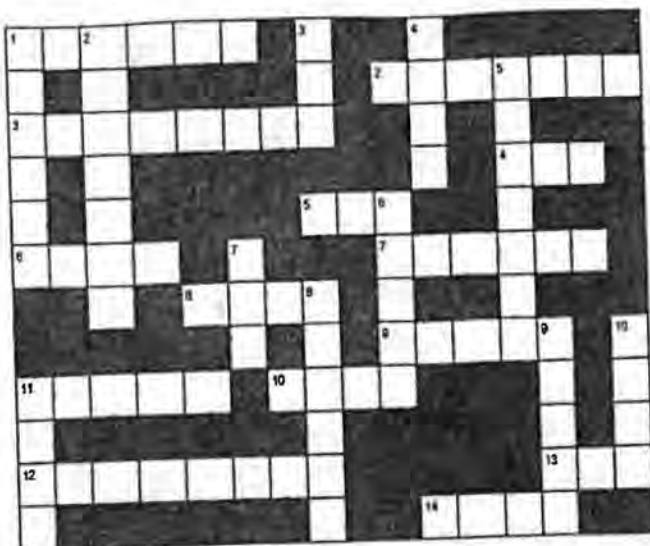

Not only at major competition level but on the club circuit as well.

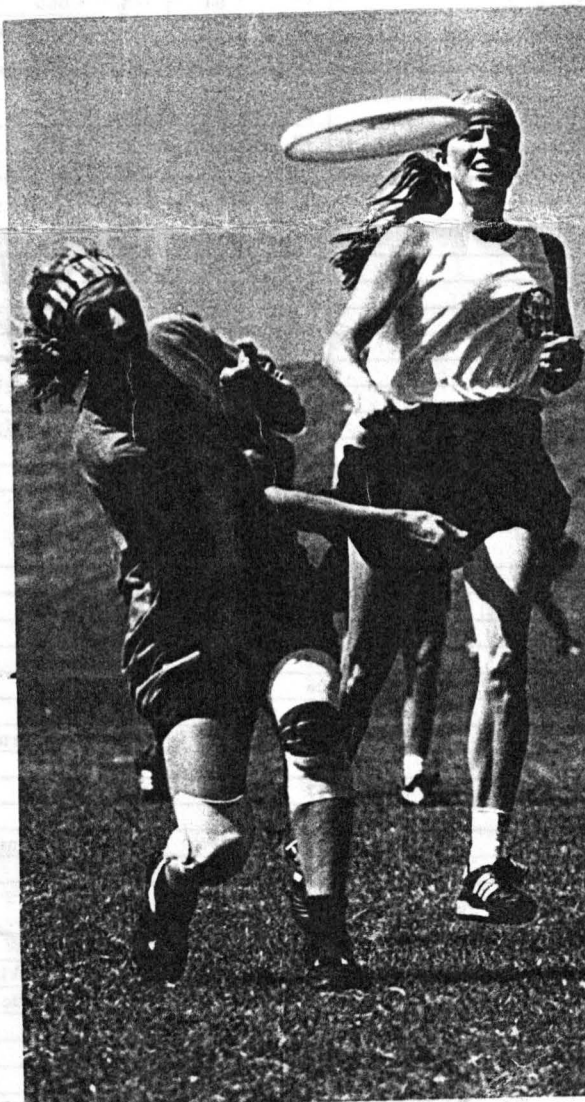

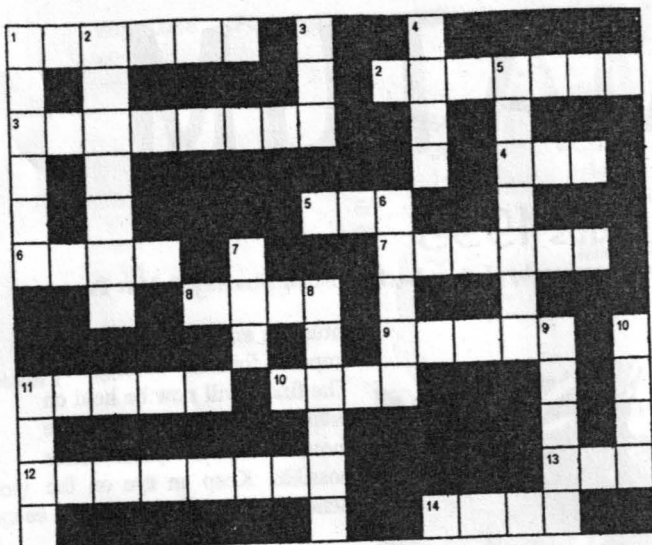

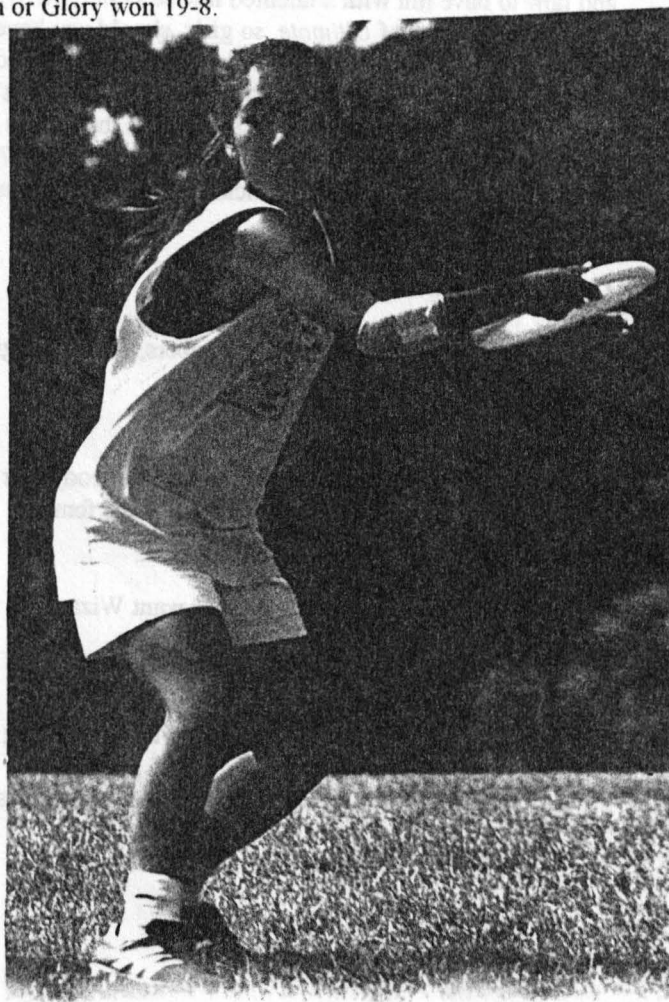

The same lightning bolt temporarily stunned several other players and placed 29 year old Atlanta player Carmen Lipoma into cardiac arrest. After surviving the blast, Carmen remained in a coma for several weeks and was hospitalised for nearly four months. After more than a year of rehabilitation, Carmen continues to slowly recover from the resulting head injury. News about the accident spread quickly via the Internet and other media, and Ultimate players around the world began to reach out with prayers, cards and donations. The family and friends of Carmen would like to extend their warmest gratitude to all of you for your tremendous support! This experience reminds all of us that life is precious and that the world is a better place because of our extended Ultimate family.

I witnessed the best throwing demonstration ever yesterday. All the discs thrown were flat and powerful, with plenty of spin and were totally accurate. The Demonstrator was Alex Thorne, the only unusual thing about him was that he probably does not even come up to my knee, you see Alex is only five years old. But already he has the ability to draw a crowd, with remarks such as "that's better than mine!!".

Today also sees the kids showing their parents how it's done, at 2:30 on Pitch 1 Seven Sages and Where's Bob? are playing a parent and children game, our own Charlie Mead will be strutting his stuff, with his sons Oliver and Daniel.

WFDF STUFF

Last night's WFDF Forum provided an opportunity for interested parties to bat about some topical subjects, and was attended by representatives from many of the countries attending WUCC '95. Topics discussed: i) **Women's Masters** It was noted that older women players are easily lost from the sport whereas some of the guys seem to go on forever (naming no names!) Some solutions discussed included the creation of a separate Women's Masters division or alternatively making the Masters division "co-ed" (though concerns were raised that some countries would have difficulty finding enough eligible women players) ii) **Four-year term** Charlie Mead suggested the possibility of a four-year term for WUCC and WUGC (i.e. holding the tournaments half as frequently as at present - WUCC, then a year off, then WUGC, followed by a year off, and so on.) The idea is to assist players that find attending world tournaments every year difficult due to money/time off/etc. and so achieve a broader representation of Ultimate-playing countries at these events. Charlie's view is that there are simply too many tournaments - hence the absence of French and Italian teams at WUCC '95 since these countries are concentrating their efforts on the upcoming European Championships. The idea was countered by the notion that halving the frequency of World tournaments might hinder the continued development of the sport as new players have longer to wait (perhaps as much as four years) before gaining experience of play at this level. iii)

Presentation WUCC and WUGC have the potential to attract the best possible media coverage. Hence the presentation of the sport is of utmost concern at these tournaments. The specific questions raised were how to enforce team strip requirements, and minimise delays between points in matches. Suggestions included the possibility that teams arriving without appropriate strip be required to wear strip provided by the organisers. Forfeiting timeouts as a penalty for time-wasting was generally thought to be a little heavy-handed; a gentle reminder from the tournament organisers and a little SOTG were deemed preferable.

SWEDEN GETS TO THE BOTTOM OF THE PROBLEM

A quite remarkable injury has happened. The assistant coach to the Swedish national squad has injured his bottom through a hard week's video filming where he's had to sit on ladders, chairs and tables and probably one or two other strange things too. He has been in the medical tent, but has been refused treatment, since he is not actually playing.

As you can imagine, it was quite a shock when they lost their semi final to Double Happiness, but it could not have been a more exciting, intense or entertaining game (the final today has a lot to live up to!!).

After the Semi NYC had to delay any disappointment that they might have felt to play a game against Ring Of Fire, to decide 3rd/4th places. I had the privilege to be allowed to score that game and whilst doing this I was able to speak to Blair O'Connor of NYC and ask him one or two questions.

I asked him what he had thought of the game in general, and he replied that it had been a good running game, (the best sort to watch) but aggressive, but this is what you have to expect at such a high level - unfortunately or fortunately it is a by product of top level competition. For NYC the momentum they showed in the first quarter of the game waned in the second half, and this effected their game throughout.

You may notice that crowd participation is an essential part of any game, however for NYC a crowd cheering for them is not always the best thing. In America NYC are seen as the bad boys of Ultimate and because of this the crowd tends to boo them rather than cheer. But as a team they feed on this aggression, using it to build their momentum. It is strange, whilst the crowd hated them, they won every tourney. But what Blair believes to be far more important is the commitment and encouragement from the team members on the side lines, he noted that in Europe we tend not to encourage the players on pitch as much, whereas in America they rely on these other players as their ears and eyes.

But what now for NYC? Well, hard training and practice in structure and offensive play for the American Nationals in early November. The NYC belief is that "Life gives you experiences, if you learn from them it is time well spent, if not, it is time wasted."
