GAME DETAILS - OPEN DIVISION - WUCC 1997

Rules

All games at WUCC '97 will be played according to WFDF Rules. Please be aware of these rules. It is your responsibility to know them.

Time-slots

First Game: 08:30 to 10:30 Second Game: 10:35 to 12:35 Third Game: 12:40 to 14:40 16:45 Fourth Game: 14:45 to Fifth Game: 16:50 18:50

Game Conditions In the OPEN division the games will be played to 19, with a hard cap at 22.

There will be a 5 minute half time at 10 points. The MAXIMUM game length will be 2 hours.

Each team will get 3 time-outs per half with an extra time-out for overtime.

For the finals the game will be to 21 with a cap at 25, the half time will be 10

minutes long and will be at 11 points.

Each team will get 3 time-outs per half with an extra time-out for overtime.

Time-outs

The length of each time-out is 2 minutes only.

Final

The OPEN Division final will start at 15:30 on Saturday 2nd August at T-Bird Stadium.

Tournament Discipline

Team representative must deliver the roster for their next game to field staff responsible for timing and scoring the match at the correct field 15 Minutes BEFORE they are scheduled to play.

Teams with less than ten (10) players on their roster for any one game will not

be permitted to play.

All teams MUST be ready to play 5 minutes before they are scheduled to play.

Start

The games MUST start and finish ON REAL TIME, unless a previous game has overrun its scheduled time. If another field is available, teams may be asked to switch fields when they hand in their roster.

Late Start

Teams who deliver their roster late will not be permitted to play until the roster has been checked. If this means they are late starting, then they will forfeit points.

Teams that are not on the line ready to start when the signal is given will forfeit 1 point per minute to a maximum of 15 to the opposing team. After 15 minutes, the game will be forfeit 15-0 to the opposing team.

Game End

At the end of regular time, play will continue until the next point is scored. If the game has not reached its end then two points will be added to the highest score. The first team to reach that score will win.

However, if a team reaches the target with a lead of two (2), then they shall have won.

E.g.: Open Division: if the score is 18-12 at the end of regular time and the leading team scores the next point, they shall have won.

Tied Procedure

In pool play ties shall be broken in this order:

- In ties with two teams Head-to-Head result
- In ties with three or more teams Point difference in games between those teams, until two teams are left, then it is Head-to-Head.
- In ties with three or more teams where the point difference is the same between two teams, then Head-to-Head will be the deciding factor.
- In ties with three or more teams where the point difference is the same between three or more teams, then point difference in the whole pool shall determine places until two teams are left then Head-to-Head will be the deciding factor.
- In the statistical certainty that this may still leave the possibility of a threeway tie which is equal on points difference throughout pool play, the points scored will count.
- Finally, should this still produce a tie (moving towards statistical
 improbability) then all three teams shall nominate one player to throw one
 disc as far as they can. All players shall throw at the same time with any
 prevailing wind at their backs. The furthest throw shall win, with other
 places determined on Head-to-Head.

Tournament Rules Committee

This is the group that decides on all matters that affect the tournament including player discipline, tournament format and playing conditions.

The committee is the group that arbitrates and decides on all matters brought before it.

In the past three WFDF Ultimate Championships the committee has been involved in settling a number of issues concerning player formats and player discipline, both on and off the field.

The group has the responsibility to ensure that the game of Ultimate is seen in a positive way by all who come into contact with the sport. As such, the committee has the power to exclude any players or teams who are judged to have acted in a way that discredits the game.

The Tournament Rules Committee (TRC) is comprised of: Chair of the Ultimate Committee or representative - Charlie Mead Tournament Director or representative - Joel Duckham Players Representative - one from each division. The players representatives shall be elected at the Captain's Meeting.

Should any member of the TRC be involved in any way with incidents that require the attention of the group, then that person shall step down for discussion of that incident.

Team Discipline

Uniforms

All teams must wear uniforms that conform to the guidelines laid out by the Tournament Organizing Committee.

- Shirts shall be all the same, with unique numbers that are clearly visible.
- · Shorts shall be the same.
- Socks shall be the same for any Finals.

Time

All teams must make a determined effort to keep game flowing. Time wasting will be seen as against the spirit of the game. Please change ends quickly; take only 2 minutes for time outs; and 5 minutes for half time. You will lose time from your 2 hours and it will affect your score in the event

of a tie in pool play.

Teams observed as being slow will be asked to speed up by the Field Director. Please respect and respond to this encouragement.

Fouls

There is no need for any prolonged discussion about a foul or a call. Either you agree or disagree. If you agree the disc stays where it is, if not it goes back. There will be some very tight calls at times that seem crucial to individuals, but that does not alter the procedure. There is no need for arguments that slow the game and reflect badly on the sport. Settling disputes quickly is a very positive way of showing the spectators that there is an advantage to our system of self-officiating over the concept of referees.

Observers

TRC or representative is to responsible for appointing observers if it is felt necessary, or if it is requested by both captains the day before.

TOURNAMENT PLAY - the Format Details

The Open division consists of 50 teams, divided into 10 pools, each pool consisting of 5 teams. In the first round the pools are named A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, J, K. In the second round the pools are split into A division, consisting of 10 pools of 3, and B division, consisting of 5 pools of 4. The 10 pools of 3 are named 2A, 2B, 2D, 2E, 2F, 2G, 2H, 2J, and 2K and the 5 pools of 4 are named 2L, 2M, 2N, 2O, and 2P. In the third round there are three divisions, A division, B division and C division. A division consists of 4 pools of 5 called 3A, 3B, 3C, and 3D. B division consists of 3 pools of 5 called 3H, 3J, and 3K.

In round 1 the pools were filled by taking the first 10 seeded teams and putting them in pools with seed 1 in A, seed 2 in B, seed 3 in C, etc. with seed 10 in pool K. For the second group of 10 we filled the pools from the opposite direction, so that seed 11 is in pool K, seed 12 in pool J, etc. with seed 20 in pool A. This change of direction for filling the pools continues for the last 3 groups of 10 so that when it is all done A pool consists of teams seeded 1, 20, 21, 40, and 41.

Tournament Play

Round 1

Each team will play all the others in its pool for a total of 4 games. The first 3 teams in each pool will move on to the A division in round 2 and the bottom 2 teams will move on to the B division.

Round 2

A Division

In round 2 the A division will consist of 10 pools of 3 with each pool consisting of one first place team from the round 1 pools, one second place team, and one third place team. Instead of taking the first 3 teams from A pool in the first round and creating pool 2A we shifted all the second place teams in each pool 2 pools to the right and all the third place teams 3 pools to the left. What this means is that pool 2A now consists of teams that finished as A1, J2, and D3 in the first round. This compensates for strong/weak pools in round 1 and avoids repeat games. Each team plays the teams in its pool for a total of 2 games. The first 2 teams in each pool move on to round 3 A division, the bottom teams to round 3 B division.

B Division

In round 2 the B division will consist of 5 pools of 4 teams each. The pools will be filled with the fourth and fifth place teams from the first round pools. The first positions in the second round pools will consist of the fourth place teams from pools K through F. Second position will be will consist of the fourth place teams from pools A through E, such that K4 and A4 will now be in the 1 and 2 spots in the new 2L pool. The fifth place teams from round 1 will fill the third and fourth spots in each pool. In order to avoid duplicate games, the third spots in each pool are filled in an unusual way. First round teams E5, C5, and A5 will go into pools 2L, 2M, and 2N respectively. First round teams B5 and D5 will go into pools 2O and 2P respectively. The fourth spots will be filled by first round teams F5 through K5, shifted one pool to the left so that pool 2L will get team G5 from the first round and pool 2P will get team F5. Pool 2L should then consist of first round teams K4, A4, E5, and G5. Go back and read it again, it does make sense. These pools will play

a playoff format, ie. 1vs4 and 2vs3. The winner of 1vs4 will then play the winner of 2vs3 and the loser of 1vs4 will play the loser of 2vs3 in each pool for a total of 2 games each. The first place teams in each pool will move on to round 3 B division. The second, third and fourth place teams will move on to round 3 C division.

Round 3

A Division

Round 3 A division will consist of four pools 3A, 3B, 3C, and 3D of 5 teams each. The pools will be filled from the first 2 teams in round 2 A division. Teams finishing first in pools 2A through 2D will fill the first spots in pools 3A through 3D respectively. Teams finishing first in pools 2H through 2E (in that order) will fill the second spots in pools 3A through 3D. The third spots in pools 3A through 3D will be filled by teams finishing first in pools 2J and 2K, then by teams finishing second in pools 2B and 2A, in that order. The fourth spots in pools 3A through 3D will be filled by teams finishing second in pools 2G through 2K. The final spots will be filled, from 3A through 3D, by teams finishing second in pools 2F through 2C, again, in that order. Teams will play each team in their pool once for a total of four games.

B Division

Round 3 B division will consist of 3 pools, 3E, 3F, and 3G of 5 teams each. The pools will be filled by the third place teams in round 2 A division and the first teams in round 2 B division. The first spots will be filled by the third place teams from pools 2H through 2K. The second spots will be filled by the third place teams from pools 2C through 2A. The third spots will be filled by the third place teams from pools 2D through 2F. The fourth spots will be filled by the first place teams from pools 2L and 2M and the third place team from pool 2G. The final positions will be filled by the first place teams from pools 2N through 2P. The teams will play each team in their pool for a total of 4 games.

C Division

Round 3 C division will consist of 3 pools 3H, 3J, and 3K consisting of 5 teams each. The pools will be filled from the bottom three teams in round 2 B pool. The first positions in pools 3H through 3K will be filled by filled by the second place teams in pools 2P through 2N, in that order. The second spots will be filled by the third place team in pool 2N, then the second place teams in pools 2L and 2M. The third spots will be filled by the third place teams from pools 2O, 2M, and 2P. The fourth place spots will be filled by the fourth place teams from pools 2L, 2P and the third place team from pool 2L. The fifth spots will be filled by fourth place teams from pools 2M through 2O.

Playoff Round

A Division

The playoff round will consist of the corresponding teams in pools 3A and 3D playing each other (ie. first place team in pool 3A plays first place team in pool 3D, second place team in pool 3A plays second place team in pool 3D, etc.) and the corresponding teams in pools 3B and 3C playing each other. The winners will then play the winners and the losers will play the losers for final rankings (1 through 20).

B Division

The playoff round will consist of the first place teams in pools 3E, 3F, and 3G playing each other (2 games) and their records in these final 2 games used to rank them from 21st through 23 rd. The same method will be used for all the other teams in the pools, ie. second place teams in pools 3E, 3F, and 3G will play for rankings 24th through 26th, third place teams in pools 3E, 3F, and 3G will play for rankings 27th through 29th and so on for all the teams in each pool to complete rankings 21st through 35th.

C Division

The playoff format for round 3 C division follows exactly the playoff format of round 3 B division, but for pools 3H, 3J and 3K. This will determine the rankings from 36th through 50th.


Up-to-date Field map

If you see any of the organizers, staff, and volunteers today, give them a hug, shake their hands, and give a big thank you for an excellent tournament and so on...




