NO-SMOKING

WUCC 2006 is a smoke free event which means no smoking is permitted in any indoor or outdoor areas for the duration of the tournament including UWA Sports Park playing fields, the players lounge, grandstands and marquees. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

ALCOHOL

WUCC 2006 is a licensed event which means that alcohol will be available only in the Spirit Lounge and must be consumed there. This is required by law. You must not bring alcohol with you to UWA Sports Park (ie no BYO), if you do so it will be confiscated.

Please note that Western Australia's liquor licensing laws are tough - if you are caught outside the licensed area drinking alcohol it will be confiscated and you could be arrested. Worse still, the Spirit Lounge could be closed down! Please co-operate by drinking only in the licensed areas.

In WA it is an offence for bar staff to sell liquor to someone who is intoxicated or disorderly. Alcohol may only be served to people 18 years old or over. If there is any doubt bar staff must request identification.

Please drink safely and if you are driving please don't drink. WA has strict drink driving laws in place. You can be stopped at random and asked to take a random breath test. The drink driving limit in WA is 0.05. As a guide, if you are driving, for men, drink no more than two standard drinks in the first hour and one standard drink for every hour after, for women; drink no more than one standard drink every hour.

SUN SAFETY

Australia has the highest rate of skin cancer in the world, mainly caused by exposure to the sun. Sun exposure also causes premature ageing of the skin and eye damage. Everyone in Australia is at risk because Australia has high UV radiation levels throughout most of the year. And the Perth sun is particularly severe!

You can protect your skin from sun damage and reduce your risk of skin cancer by;

- Wherever possible limit sun exposure between 10am and 3pm when ultraviolet (UV) radiation levels are highest.
- Seek shade wherever possible
- Wear sun-protective clothing that covers as much skin as possible
- Apply an SPF30+ sunscreen - make sure it is broad spectrum and water resistant. Put it on 20 minutes before you go outdoors and every two hours afterwards. Sunscreen should never be used to extend the time you spend in the sun.
- Wear a hat that protects your face, head, neck and ears if possible
- Wear sunglasses

HEAT

The Australian Flying Disc Association (AFDA) has a Hot Weather Policy which will be adhered to during WUCC 2006. Full details on the policy can be found at www.afda.com. We will be measuring the Wet Bulb Globe Temperature and should this reach extreme then games may be postponed.

Players can minimize the risk of injury due to heat exhaustion by following these precautions:

- Hydrate before, during and after games - water is available at all fields
- Increase rest time in hot conditions
- When off the field spend time under shade

LIGHTNING

Thunderstorms are not an unusual event in Perth during November and WUCC 2006 will adhere to the AFDA Lightning Policy. The Policy can be found at www.afda.com. Should a thunder storm be evident within 10kms of the WUCC 2006 fields then games may be postponed.

SAFE SEX

Take care of yourself. Condoms - don't leave home without 'em.

SURF SAFETY

Australians have access to some of the best locations for swimming, surfing, boating and diving in the world. However, every year young adults drown after combining aquatic activity and alcohol. Alcohol is the biggest contributor to drownings of young adults.

Most Perth beaches are patrolled by Surf Lifesavers. Red and yellow flags mark the safest swimming areas, so swim between the flags.

Please be aware that there can be dangerous rips and waves at all Perth beaches. Swim with a friend at all times.

PERSONAL SECURITY

We will endeavour to make WUCC 2006 as safe as possible. Please bear in mind you are responsible for your own belongings and valuables. No cloakroom or locker facilities are provided. Security personnel will provide a range of services throughout WUCC 2006.

LITTER

Put it in a bin! Please take the time to pick up your own litter so it's not left to the WUCC 2006 Volunteers.

PARKING AND ACCESS TO GROUNDS

Please follow the signs and observe the parking restrictions.

Care is required in the parking area adjacent to the playing fields, as this will be used as the bus set down and pick up point as well as for car parking.

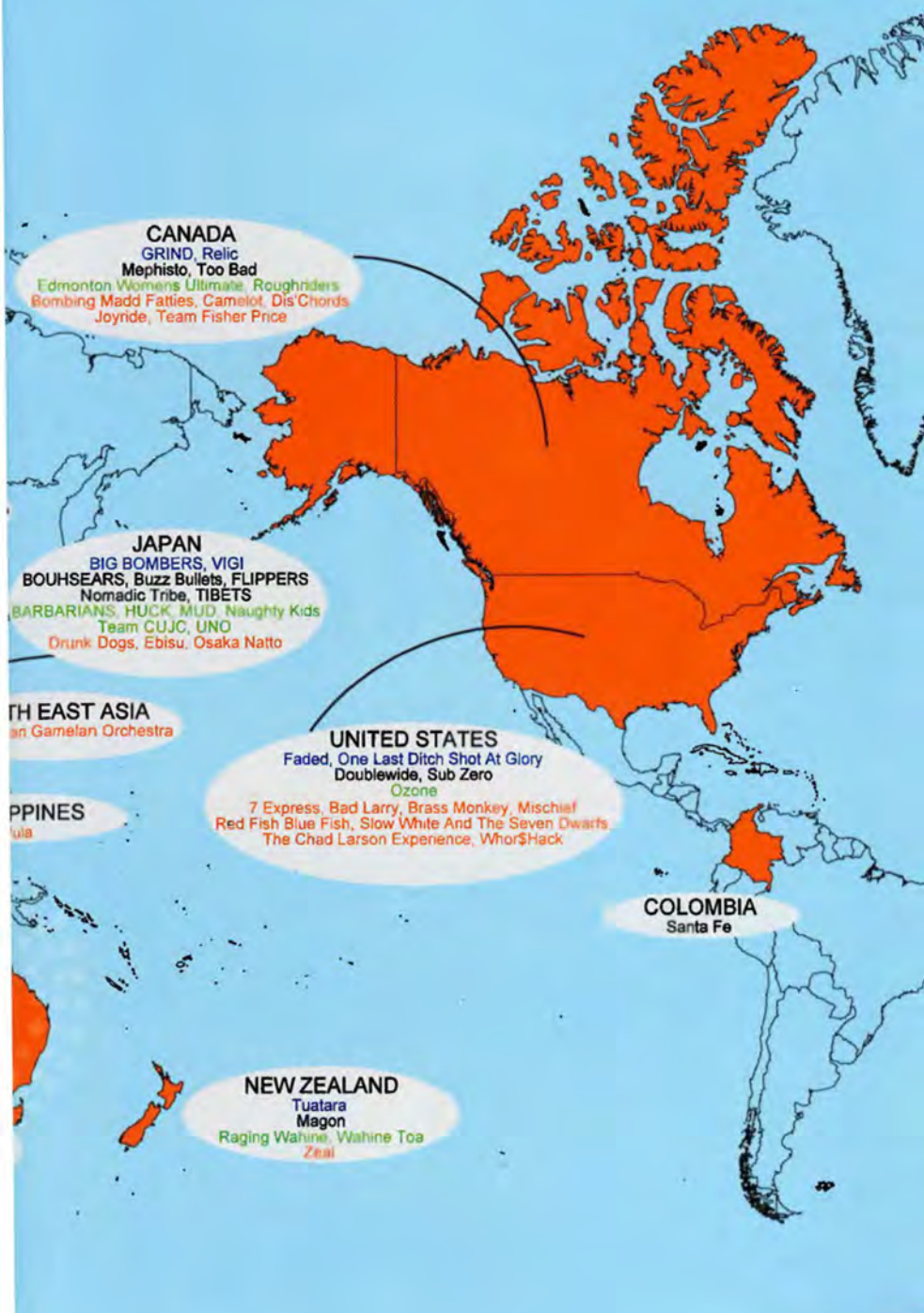

We here at WUCC 2006 want to ensure that your stay is an enjoyable as possible. So you don't look like a complete drongo chatting with Aussies in the Spirit Lounge or at your local pub, here are enough Aussie words to help you get by in Australian society!

a few Kangaroos loose in the top paddock: someone who is being vague or silly

abso-bloody-lutely: absolutely and beyond any doubt

agro: [also aggro], the state of being angry and aggressive over a situation. Also the name of a well known puppet on a children's program

arse over tit: to fall over

arvo: afternoon

beaut: very good or excellent, perhaps even desirable. Pronounced bewd or bewdie.

bee's knees: the absolute best, perfect, the greatest

bite ya bum: exclamation, be quiet

blowie: a blowfly, a large and very noisy fly

bonza: great, excellent

by jingoies: an exclamation of surprise.

cackleberry: an egg

cactus: something has had it, doesn't work anymore, or someone in a lot of trouble.

cark it: to die

carn: a rallying cry at football games to cheer your team on. Short for "Come on!"

chuck a spaz: get angry demonstratively

cods wallop: an exclamation showing disbelief in what has just been said, a polite way of saying "bullshit".

dag: bits of manure that stick to the long wool around a sheep's bottom forming small dangling balls. Also a term for a funny person, nerd, goof, loser. In this respect it can have either an endearing or disparaging meaning, although is usually used for a likable fellow.

dinkum: real, honest or genuine. Can also be used to question validity, e.g. dinkum?

donkey's years: a long time, ages.

duddy: toilet or lavatory, originally an outside toilet or outhouse, now a generic term for the toilet regardless of location.

durrey: a hand rolled cigarette

earbash: to chatter or talk incessantly to the point of boring or nagging

earbasher: someone who earbashes a lot

esky: a portable insulated container for keeping food and drinks cool.

flat out like a lizard drinking: extremely busy and under pressure from work.

fair go: to give someone an equal opportunity or equitable treatment.

galah: an endearing term for a fool or silly person. Also, and from, a particularly noisy parrot coloured Pink and Grey.

g'day: the universal Australian friendly greeting, as in 'hello'. Pronounced "Giddyay".

give it heaps: to not hold back, i.e. to make sure a car would go up the hill, you would "give it heaps", put your foot down on the accelerator. To give someone heaps is to give them a talking to for doing something wrong, or to make fun of them for doing something silly.

have a burl, have a crack, have a go: to attempt to do something considered a little difficult.

home and hosed: used to indicate that something has been completed successfully and easily. The implication is that the horse has run his race and is "home and hosed" before the other runners come in. Also indicates that the result was a foregone conclusion.

hoof it: to walk rather than take transport.

hoon: someone who drives too fast, does burnouts and races on the streets. Hooning around is used to say driving around.

idiot box: television, often abbreviated to "the box".

I'm easy: not worried, not concerned, or has no

preference to the outcome of a choice.

joe blake: a snake

kafufffe: a commotion,

keen as mustard: extremely enthusiastic. From the brand of powdered mustard made by the Keen company. (Get it? Keen's Mustard, keen as mustard..)

knee high to a grasshopper: very short.

larrikin: a rowdy irresponsible and rascally boy or young man.

maggies: magpies, an Australian black and white crow like bird. Beware they swoop in nesting season August to October, wearing a hat and sunglasses is the best form of protection.

mate: a general greeting term and familiar greeting whether a friend or total stranger.

middy: a 285 ml beer glass

never never: a desert region of the Northern Territory of Australia, popularised by the book 'We of the never - never'

nick off: go away. Can be used to explain that someone is leaving, or as an expletive to tell someone rather rudely to go away.

nifty: stylish or clever

no worries: typical Aussie attitude that everything will be OK, there will be no problems.

noggin: your head!

ocker: pronounced ocka, a stereotyped uncultivated or uncultured Aussie who exhibits excessive drinking of alcohol, womanising, chauvinism, and worships the God called Footy!

onya: an expression of encouragement, short for good on you.

out in the sticks: out in the bush, away from civilisation, in remote areas

pavlova: a traditional Australian dessert, a cream and fruit filled meringue case. Named after the Russian ballerina Anna Pavlova.

piker: someone who either does not join in with others, or gives up an activity before it is finished.

rack off: go away, used when very angry with someone

relies: short for relatives.

rice bubbles: the correct name for (Kellogg's) Rice Krispies. Well, after all, they are in the shape of little bubbles.

ridgie didge: genuine, the real thing.

rissole: a meat patty but shaped like a little ball and eaten as part of a meal not eaten in a bread roll like a hamburger.

WUCC 2006 will have comprehensive first aid coverage supplied by Sports Medicine Australia (WA).

First Aid Central is located on the hill overlooking the Showcase Field.

Sports Medicine Australia will provide the following services:

- A triage area run by a sports nurse
- A physiotherapist for consultations and sports trainers for immediate injury management & taping
- Massage therapists

A fully equipped Sports Medicine van is also on site for emergencies. There is no cost if treatment is required on site for an acute injury sustained during the championships. Players should check their own medical cover if treatment is required away from the fields.

All treatment is free to the athletes except for massage and taping.

The fees for pre & post game massage are:

- \$5 for 10 minutes
- \$15 for 30 minutes

The cost for pre game taping is as follows:

- \$3 per ankle or knee if tape supplied by Sports Medicine.
- To purchase a roll of tape = \$10
- No cost if the athlete provides their own tape.

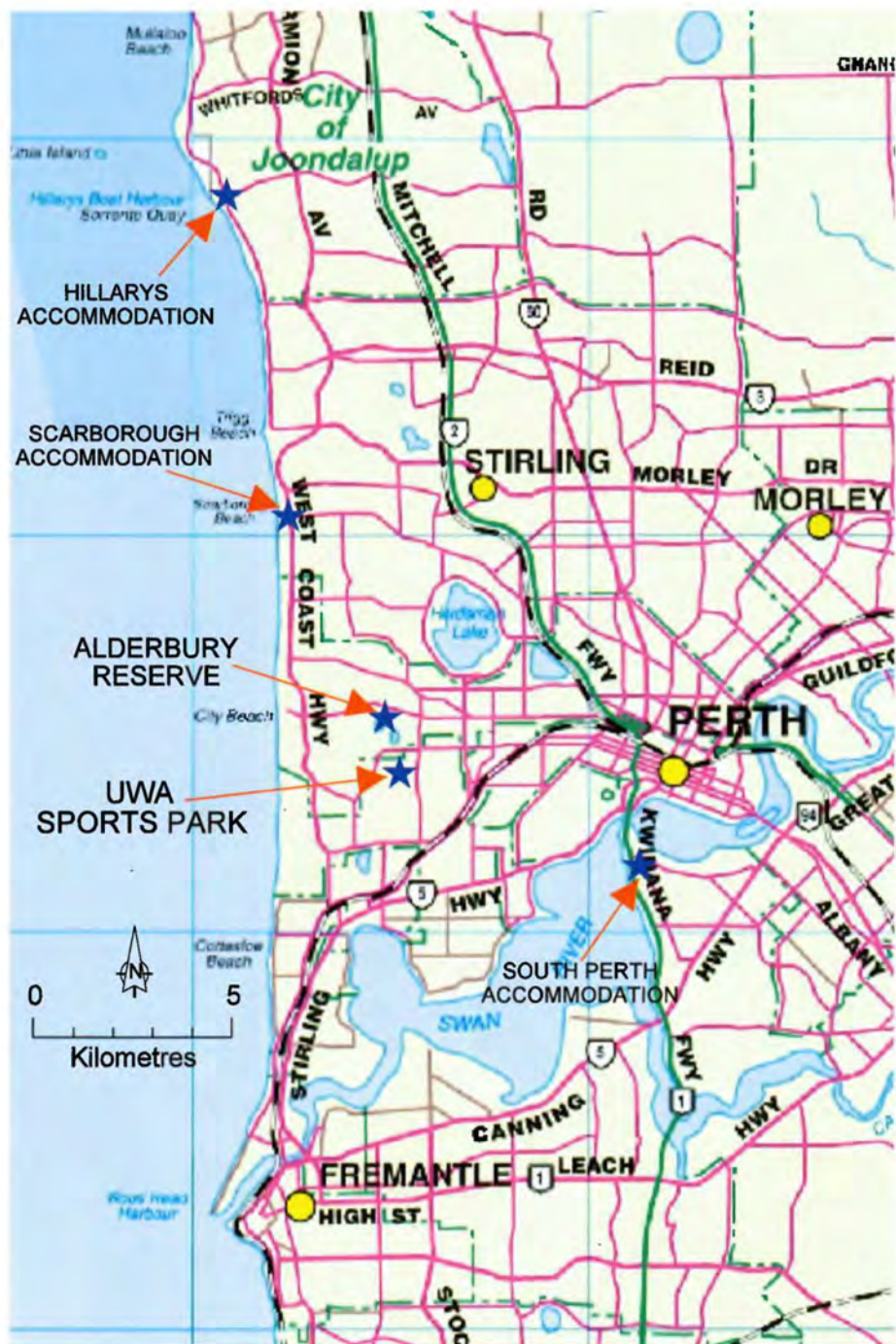

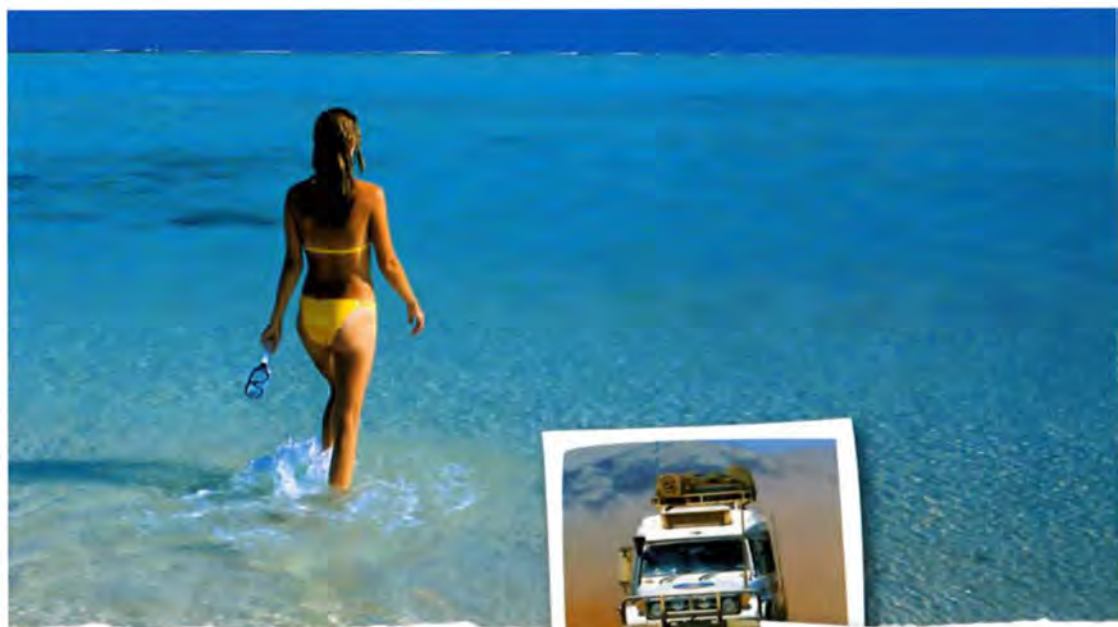

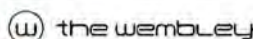

Game Officials – scorer and timekeeper

Game officials will arrive at the appropriate field thirty (30) minutes before the time begins. They will be located in the scorers marquee beside the field. Both Team Captains or Team Representatives shall report to the game officials fifteen (15) minutes before their game is due to start.

Team Rosters

The Team Captains or representatives shall register the arrival of their team with the game officials and sign the team roster for that game. The roster will contain the names and jersey numbers of all registered players. Should one or more of those players not participate in the game, they should be removed from the roster by the Captain. Should one or both Captains not report to the field staff at this time, the game officials shall note this, and endeavour to make contact with the team via the WUCC information office.

Teams with less than 10 players on their roster for any one game will not be permitted to play. If this means they are late starting then they will forfeit points.

First possession

Captains of the two teams shall flip discs to determine possession and field position for their teams at the start of the game. If at the scheduled starting time of the game only one of the Captain's is present, then that Captain may choose which end their team will defend and whether they will pull or receive. If neither Captain is present then the first Captain to arrive shall have first choice.

Time Keeping

The game officials will be responsible for starting games on time and capping them when time runs out.

Start of Play

There will be a signal (whistle) from the timekeeper five (5) minutes before the scheduled start of a game in order to prepare all teams to line up ready to play. At this signal, both teams at the field must be ready to play. A second signal will be transmitted by the timekeeper to start the game at the designated time.

Seven on the Line

Teams who do not have seven (7) players on the line and at least three (3) substitutes ready to play when the signal is given to start play shall give one (1) point for each minute they are late to the opposing team. If a team has not arrived after fifteen (15) minutes they shall forfeit their game to zero (0). Should neither team arrive on time then they shall both gain points at the rate of one (1) per minute until a team arrives and lines up, or until both teams arrive and line up or until both teams forfeit their game zero-zero (0-0) after 15 minutes. Should either or both teams fail to turn up and so forfeit their game they shall automatically be referred to the Tournament Rules Group (TRG) by the Tournament Director (TD) for possible disciplinary action.

End of Play – Time Cap

At the end of regular play a further signal (whistle) will be transmitted.

Start of Play – exceptions

Games will start on time, unless a previous game has overrun its time on the same field as the next scheduled game. Teams may have to wait until the previous game is completed before starting their game. They shall still follow the pre-match procedure outlined above and if another field is available teams may be asked to switch at the time they sign their roster, fifteen (15) minutes before the scheduled start of their game. If, however, a game starts late because of another game playing extra time on the scheduled field, and another field being unavailable, then the game officials shall note the beginning time of the game and adjust all subsequent timings so that the game shall run for its allotted time. The game officials shall then enforce this new time schedule irrespective of the time schedule of other games being played in the same round. In the case of a game running long, the field should be cleared immediately after the final point (cheer off the field), and the five (5) minute signal will be given for the next game. Warm up for the game should have been done by both teams at another location.

Time Caps and Point Caps

All games – pool games and finals.

Game Length: Seventeen (17) Points.

Hard Point Cap: Nineteen (19) Points.

Time Cap: One-Hundred (100) Minutes.

Half Time: Ten (10) Minutes in length. Occurs after first team reaches nine (9) points.

Team Time Outs: Two (2) per half per team (Time Cap does not effect the ability of a team to call a time out)

Extra Play: When score is tied 16-16 both teams have one (1) time out no matter how many time outs they may have had prior to this score.



NOTES:

- If time cap is reached between the scoring of a point and the ensuing pull, the point cap will be set after the next point is scored.
- Time Cap - once Time Cap is reached, play will continue uninterrupted until the next point is scored. If the game has not reached its end two (2) points will be added to the highest score and this becomes the hard point cap e.g. If it's 13 to 5, then the game is to 15. HOWEVER, there are no further caps. One team MUST reach 15, so the team with 5 could come all the way back and win, there is no time issue. If the cap occurs when one team has 16 points (e.g. score is 16-8), the hard point cap will be 18, but the game will still end once the first team reaches 17 with a margin of 2 point.
- Hard Point Cap - 19 is the Hard Point Cap. If the score is 16-16, then a team must win by 2 points so the next point (17-16) does not end the game. The score could then be 17-17, 17-18, 18-18. The game will now be over on the next point, when the first team reaches the maximum of 19 (they don't need to win by 2). The win by 2 is not in effect when the time imposes a cap. So if the score is 13-5 and the cap sets the winning point number at 15, a team can win 15-14.

Starting a Point

A point starts once the previous point has been scored (or, if there is a discussion, when the goal is acknowledged by the defending team).

Game Officials – their responsibility, your responsibility.

The game officials will be responsible for scoring and time keeping, including the timing between points and on disputes. They are not available for rule clarification or the settling of any disputes. That is the responsibility of the players. They are, however, responsible for monitoring your time on the field and their decisions will be final. It is the responsibility of all players in all teams to follow all game officials instructions with complete compliance and co-operation. We ask that all players respect this. Any abuse of game officials will be a disciplinary matter and will be referred to the TRG.

Time limits between goals

A point starts once the previous point has been scored or, if there is a discussion, when the goal is acknowledged by the defending team. The time limit between goals (ie the scoring of a goal and the ensuing pull) is sixty (60) seconds for the receiving team, and seventy-five (75) seconds for the throwing team. These limits are enforced by the following procedure:

- The forty-five seconds whistle (one signal): (a) As soon as a goal is scored (in the event of a discussion, as soon as the goal is acknowledged by the defending team), the timekeeper starts a clock. After forty-five (45) seconds, the timekeeper blows a whistle once to warn the receiving team that it has fifteen seconds before the minute runs out.
- The sixty seconds whistle (two signals): (b) After sixty seconds, if the receiving team has acknowledged that it is ready, the timekeeper signals (whistles twice) the throwing team that it has fifteen seconds before the seventy-five seconds run out.

If the receiving team does not acknowledge that it is ready before the sixty-second whistle, this signal means that that team gets a time-out allocated if it has any time-outs remaining. The timekeeper then tells the captains that a time-out has been allocated, and a regular time-out for that team takes place. If the receiving team has no time-outs remaining then a time-out does not occur, there is no pull, and the receiving team takes possession of the disc 15 yards behind their own goal line, midway between the two sidelines. Play is restarted with a check.

- The seventy-five seconds whistle (three signals): If the pulling team does not throw before the seventy-five second whistle, that team gets a time-out allocated if it has any time-outs remaining. The timekeeper then tells the captains that a time-out has been allocated, and a regular time-out for that team takes place. If the throwing team has no time-outs remaining then a time-out does not occur, there is no pull, and the receiving team takes possession of the disc at the brick mark nearest the goal it is attacking. Play is restarted with a check.

Time limits after time-outs

- Time-outs between points: Time outs between points last two (2) minutes. Play is restarted as between ordinary goals. When a time-out between points has occurred, the timekeeper gives an additional warning whistle 30 seconds before the offence must be ready to receive the throw-off. These signals are the same as for time limits after half-time.
- Time-outs during points: The timekeeper signals: once when 1 minute is remaining; once when fifteen (15) seconds are remaining. At the end of 2 minutes all offensive players must have established stationary positions and the thrower must signal readiness. If the offense is not ready at the end of 2 minutes then the timekeeper shall blow the whistle twice to confirm that the time-out has expired.

The marker may then initiate or resume the stall count immediately. If the offense is ready at the end of 2 minutes the defense has an additional fifteen (15) seconds to establish positions, during which time the offense must remain stationary. The timekeeper shall give a final signal (by blowing the whistle three (3) times) when these 15 seconds have elapsed at which time the offense may begin play immediately. If both teams are ready at any time before the final signal is given then play is restarted with a check and no timekeeper signals are required.

- **Time limit after half time:** The same procedures also apply at the beginning of each half of play, except that the timekeeper gives warning signals: at 1 minute (once) before the receiving team must acknowledge readiness, 15 seconds (once) before the receiving team must acknowledge readiness, 15 seconds (twice) before the throwing team must throw and a final signal (three times) when play is to be resumed immediately. These are the same signals as for time-outs between points.

NOTE: if both teams are ready at any time before the final signal is given then play is restarted and all remaining timekeeper signals are dispensed with.

Readiness signal

The signal of readiness is that a player on the team in question raises a hand. Players must establish and hold their positions prior to signalling readiness.

Disputes

After a dispute has gone on for thirty seconds, the game official shall give a warning signal twice with the whistle and call "thirty" to indicate that the thirty seconds are up. The players involved are then expected to resolve the issue immediately or return the disc to the last thrower.

The TRG

At the Captain's meeting, a Tournament Rules Group (TRG) will be formed, which arbitrates in on-field and off-field disputes between players, staff and members of the public. At WUCC 2006, the TRG is chaired by a WFDF representative, and includes the TD, and one player from each division represented. The TRG will address formal requests, complaints or protests about any issue concerning on-field or off-field activities. Requests, complaints or protests may be brought to the attention of TRG by any Team Captain. Requests, complaints or protests may be brought at any time during the event. Upon receipt of a request, complaint or protest the TRG will meet at its earliest convenience and make a decision available to all parties involved within four (4) hours. For any issue brought before the TRG, the TRG shall be comprised of the WFDF representative, the TD and the elected player from the division in which there is an issue. The decision shall be posted in the WUCC info area.

If any member of the TRG has a vested interest in any matter put to the TRG that member shall be withdrawn, to be replaced by their representative, or in the case of an elected player, another elected player from another division. Should two or more members of the TRG have a vested interest in the matter put to the TRG they shall be replaced by unbiased WFDF officials available at the tournament.

If an issue is brought to the TRG that affects the general interest of all or a group of teams participating in the tournament, the TRG may call an advisory Captains' Meeting of all or selected teams. The calling of such a meeting does not in any way reduce the powers of the TRG and the TRG is in no way bound to suggestions or decisions made by such a Captains' Meeting.

DISCIPLINE: The TRG may, at its discretion, disqualify a player or an entire team from any event or from the entire tournament should that player or team have been deemed to have acted in one of the following ways: behaving in a violent or obscene manner; undertaking illegal behaviour; cheating or otherwise attempting to create an unfair advantage for themselves or disadvantage to others through circumvention of the rules; or causing substantial hardship, inconvenience or annoyance to spectators, officials or players.

The TRG may censor an individual player or team verbally or in writing; alter or nullify the result of any game; or order a game to be partially or completely replayed. In the event of an extremely serious conduct violation the TRG may, after disqualifying a player or team from competition, refer the matter for later review and sanctioning actions by the WFDF Board of Directors.

Any player or team disqualified from the tournament shall forfeit all fees paid. If any player or team, or group of teams, chooses to challenge a decision made by the TRG in the course of handling a request, complaint or protest during WUCC 2006, they should file a written protest to the WFDF within 30 days of occurrence.

Spirit of the Game

It is expected that all games at WUCC 2006 will be played under the Spirit of the Game guidelines, taken from the WFDF Rules of Ultimate:

401 SPIRIT OF THE GAME:

Ultimate has traditionally relied upon a spirit of sportsmanship which places the responsibility for fair play on the individual player himself. Highly competitive play is encouraged but never at the expense of mutual respect between players, adherence to the agreed-upon rules of the game or the basic joy of play. The purpose of the rules of ultimate is to provide a guideline which describes the way the game is played. It is assumed that no ultimate player will intentionally violate the rules; there are no harsh penalties for inadvertent infractions but, rather, a method for resuming play in a manner which simulates what would most likely have occurred had there been no infraction.

OBSERVERS WILL NOT BE USED AT WUCC 2006.

If the game officials consider a game to constitute a major problem in relation to Spirit issues, they will call for a WFDF official or the TD or A/TD. This person will have the authority to halt the game at any point, on the grounds of Spirit problems.

The action taken can be a short pause in order for the Captains to calm their teams down or even a decision to play the rest of the game at a later time, should the schedule allow. The official shall bring any misconduct to the attention of the TRG which may decide on sanctions according to the rules above.

Requesting officials to adjudicate on Spirit issues will not be made on the request of the players. Any captain who is of the opinion that the opposing team is not trying to communicate with his/her team is asked to address the opposing captain. Should this not solve the problem, the captain/s may ask for intervention from a WFDF representative or the TD or A/TD. The decision to call or not to call an official lies with the game officials.

Circumstances under which the game officials can/should call for an outside official include:

- Repeated incidents of violent, dangerous or ruthless behaviour
- Repeated incidents of blatant disregard for opponents, spectators, rules or property
- Incidents of disregard for the authority of game officials
- In combination with the assessment on the part of the game officials that the atmosphere of the game is deteriorating.

Ties

If two teams are tied on win-loss ratio after any phase of pool play then the result of their head-to-head game will determine places. If three or more teams are tied on win-loss ratio after any phase of pool play then the following order of criteria will be applied.

1. The teams will be ranked according to the win-loss ratio in the pool play games between the teams in question.
2. Should this ranking still produce a tie between three or more teams, points scored in games between those teams will be calculated. Teams will be ranked according to the points difference in those games. The highest positive difference will determine the highest ranking for that team. The remaining teams will be decided on the same basis.
3. After calculating the points difference between three or more teams, should the points difference be the same then the highest number of points scored in those matches will determine places. After determining places by this criteria, should two teams remain tied then their ranking will be determined on the head-to-head basis.
4. Should three or more teams still be tied after points difference and points scored are calculated then points difference in all games in that pool will be calculated and the team with the highest difference will gain the highest ranking. Further rankings will be determined by the results of head-to-head games.
5. After calculating the points difference between three or more teams in all the games in the pool, should the points difference be the same then the highest number of points scored in all matches in the pool will determine places. Further rankings will be determined by the results of head-to-head games.
6. Finally, should this still produce a tie (now we move to statistical instability) then all teams involved shall nominate one player to throw one disc as far as they can. All players shall throw at the same time, with any prevailing wind at their backs. The furthest throw shall win, other places determined on head-to-head.

Australia first attended a WFDF World Championships in Belgium in 1988 (and four members of that team are playing at this tournament!) and has attended every one since 1990, achieving our best results in 1999 (2nd in Masters for Return of the Redeye) and 2004 (3rd in Open for the Dingoes). Second place at the 2005 International World Games was a breakthrough result for Australian Ultimate (and a lot of fun for the players too!).



The preparations for the 2004 WUGC and 2005 World Games were the most professional we have seen yet in Australia and the benefits of all that work are still flowing through our community. The increased demand for high level Ultimate resulted in the creation of the National Ultimate Frisbee League in 2005, open to a small number of Open and Women's teams, playing regularly at a standard which - they hope - has prepared them well for WUCC 2006.

Australian teams seem (to us) to have established themselves at the top of the world rankings for Spirit of the Game in recent years. It is time for them to be unseated! Do your best friends. Play hard, play safe, play with respect - and you might win the Ultimate prize... (and of course - Party hard, party safe, party with respect...)

WUCC 101 (History of World Ultimate Club Championships)

The first international Ultimate events were established with the European Championship in Paris in 1980. Later, a team from the USA was invited to join the first week-long World Ultimate and Guts Championship (WUGC) in Gothenburg, Sweden in 1983. However, unlike the European national all-star teams, the American UPA decided to send its national champion club team, the 'Rude Boys' of Boston, setting the scene for what was to come. By the late 1980s, participation in Ultimate was expanding rapidly, and the 1988 WUGC in Leuven, Belgium drew 16 Open competitors including teams from Japan, Australia and Canada. There were 14 Women's teams and eight Juniors teams as well.

As head of the UPA, Robert "Nob" Rauch became chair of the WFDF Ultimate Committee in 1987 and sought to increase the representation of Ultimate players in WFDF activities, as WFDF had previously been focused more broadly on individual events. In 1988, Nob proposed the idea of a World Championship for Clubs, to counteract what was seen as the negative impact growth of European Ultimate clubs due to the elite player focus. WUCC as we now know it, was also aimed at giving a greater number of top level club players the opportunity to participate in a high level international environment.

With the Club Championships requiring proof that players were truly permanent members of the Clubs they were playing on, and by banning "ringers," the hope was that the national calibre of elite players would put more of their energy into developing their club teams instead of

focusing primarily on their national squad activities.

Meanwhile, Thomas Griesbaum of the Deutsche Frisbeesport Verband (DFV) had Ultimate included as a demonstration event in the August 1989 World Games in Karlsruhe, Germany. With that event already scheduled, Torsten Görke, one of the founders of the DFV, agreed to become the tournament director for the first WFDF World Ultimate Club Championships (WUCC) to be played in Cologne, Germany, and scheduled it for the week after the World Games. That first WUCC drew 38 teams in the Open and Women's divisions and was agreed by all participants to be a great success!

That first WUCC in Cologne attracted a total of 38 teams across two divisions Open and Women. Both finals were dominated by USA-based clubs, with 'Philmore' (USA) named Open Champions and 'Lady Condors' (USA) winning the Women's. A good showing from the Swedes saw them place three Open teams in the top twelve with the Swedish Women's club 'Stenungsunds FC' taking out third place.

As with other organisations that have supported Clubs attending WUCC 2006 – the organisation's members ability to plan and organise is a crucial factor to the outcomes of the Clubs they support. WAFDA is support by Anna Haynes as President, Rusty Slaughter as VP, Debbie Ng as Treasurer, Brad Saracik as Secretary, Joelle Chalmer & Andrew Hutcheon as active playing General Committee members.

WAFDA has had an active 2006 leading up to WUCC. The Perth Ultimate league (PUL) has run consecutively over 2006 with both social Men's and Women's teams. WAFDA has also supported a number of tournaments in recent past including the WA State Titles – Phoenix has risen in 2005 and in this year, the Winter Solstice UWA, a 'Women's Hat Day' and also 'The Broome Hat' (which is very impressive and shows that Ultimate can start up along way from any capital city), ending the year with the October Witches Hat.

Christian Krogdahl (Croc): "Baseball is the sport I grew up with and at the end of every season, a trip was planned to a country town or city. This weekend trip away usually meant you drank constantly from the time you woke up, to the time you collapsed. On the second day on our trip to Mandurah, the team ended up around two pool tables in one of the local pubs. I was 19 at the time and one of the youngest players. Back then I was very quiet, except, as we discovered, when I had large volumes of beer in me. Anyway, it was my turn to play pool but one of the older players tried to push in. And a different side of me came out - I transformed from quiet beer drinker to an irate/crazy man. It took everyone by surprise, shocked the older guy who would normally have told me to piss off. Instead, he said "settle down, you don't need to snap like a Crocodile". The name stuck, and to this day after playing senior baseball for 13 years, there are guys who don't know my real name."

In my first season for Chevron Action Flash (Top 5 Open team in UK), I went through pre-seasons trainings fine and then three months before the first tournament I burst a bursae in my knee, one week after recovering I tore ankle ligaments and then broke my hand two days before the tournament causing me to miss the first tour of the season and Paganello a week later. That season culminated in playing in a zone defence and a teammate going for a D, sliding on his knees and head butting me (whilst wearing a baseball cap with it a very inflexible peak) in the groin region putting me out for the rest of the day - truly making the nickname stick. Since then I seemed to have managed to do something to remind everyone including breaking my hand 6 weeks ago when a former teammate ran into me putting a spiral fracture in my 4th metacarpal!"

WUCC 101 (History of WUCC) Continued from yesterday

Toronto hosted WUCC 1991 with a near doubling of the attendance of both Open and Women's teams, and the Masters division hucking off for the first time. The US clubs were again strong in each of the division, with the top eleven positions in the Open arena taken by US based clubs - won by New York New York. The Aussies were there for the first time in their Dingo-Au-GO-GO t-shirts, fired up to take out 17th position. The Canadian Women's teams - including FLO from Calgary, Alberta (go Flames go!) - fought several hard battles against their neighbours to the south, but only Run Jane Run (CAN) would break the American stranglehold and place in the top ten. The Club Maine-iacs (USA) topped the tables in that division.

Wisconsin was truly invaded by aliens in 1993 with 26 Open, 10 Women's and 2 Masters teams from around the world crossing the frontier to join 45 US clubs (for a total of 83 clubs) in the city of Madison - famous for its grand park acreage and bridges. Canadian club Vertigogh would have felt a certain amount of light-headedness as they climbed to twelfth place in the final standings. New York New York (USA) again took out the Open title, while the Maine-iacs (USA) snatched the Women's. But the North Americans weren't the only ones strutting their stuff on field - a strong South American contingent was offered in the Open division - with Columbia, Mexico and Venezuela in attendance and Yanomami Norte and Yamomani Sur (VEN) sharing Spirit prize with Columbia's own Sirusiciuayursi. Japan sent five Women's teams to compete that year with the top standing for CUJC in fifteenth position.

There were 14 Master's teams and it looks as though they started a trend in naming with acronyms with G.O.U.T. and P.U.L.P. both US based clubs leading the way.

Hyponatremia — what is it?

Hyponatremia means a low concentration of sodium in the blood. The longer the sport event, the greater the risk of hyponatremia.

What causes it?

The exact mechanisms are not fully understood. The simplest answer is that lost sweat (salt and water) is replaced by ingested water (no salt). This dilutes the sodium in the bloodstream, and hyponatremia results. Your body can tolerate a degree of imbalance for a short period of time, but it may decompensate if this continues for too long.

Drinking water or a "low sodium" sports drink actually compounds the problem by further diluting the blood and thus lowering even further the already too low plasma sodium content. Most of the cramping experienced by athletes that is mistakenly attributed to dehydration is actually the result of hyponatremia. Sodium losses can become quite extreme in certain cases.

What are the symptoms of hyponatremia?

The spectrum of symptoms can range from mild to severe and can include nausea, muscle cramps, disorientation, slurred speech, confusion, and inappropriate behavior. As it progresses, victims may experience seizures or coma, and death can occur. Severe hyponatremia is a true medical emergency.

Treatment

Minor symptoms, such as nausea and mild muscle cramps, can be treated by eating salty foods and hydrating with a sodium containing sports drink. More severe symptoms require treatment by qualified medical personnel. If you think you are suffering from hyponatremia or are unsure, seek medical attention immediately.

A green paddock out yonder is where players gathered for the 1995 WUCC at Millfield UK. The open Swedish Club Disciples knew their way around and milked the 40 strong division for sixth place, their highest standing since 1989. But it was Double Happiness (USA) in a dual to the end with Death or Glory (USA) for the top spot and Double Happiness was the best on the day.

The British Women were well organised and sent three clubs of which Bliss made it to the top 10. Other good results included German Club Milder Norden in tenth spot and Ozone (USA) second.

Masters number's were far reduced

with only 6 Clubs attending the event. Old Growth (CAN) placed at the back of the pack and Seven Sages (USA) secured their place at the front making it their third victory in a row.

Furious George from Vancouver Canada shook the US-based teams' stranglehold on the top five and cut in to take third position at the 1997 Championships held in their home town. 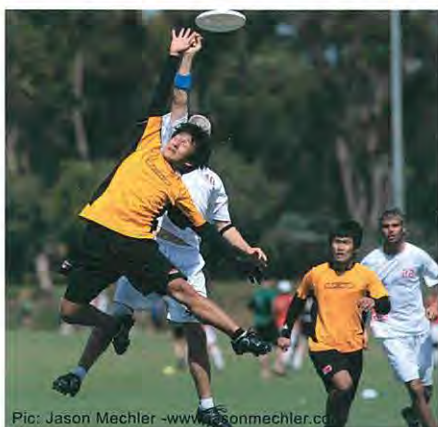

#1 ranked Ozone and #2 MUD squared off in women's semi-final action at 10:30 am yesterday. Already suffering losses to UNO and HUCK, Ozone faced another battle with a Japanese women's team. MUD's zone defense was the deciding factor in a game which went nearly thirty minutes past time cap and boasted several 5-10 minute points.

Ozone opened with a 3-1 point streak over MUD. However, MUD adjusted their zone and quickly came back to tie the game up three all. Ozone's Katherine Wooten, 12, punched the disc through the MUD zone to bring the game to 4-3. MUD then went on a four point streak with great play from Nami Naya, 77, Hiroko Abe, 5, Yuki Mori, 15, and Natsuki Hyakkai, 3.

Ozone's handlers, Wooten, Martha Keltner, 88, and Cara Crouch, 15, practiced great patience throughout the game as they dump-swung the disc back and forth. Kate Wilson, 5, played a flawless and effective game popping the cup, while Shanye Crawford, 83, and Jennifer Smith, 34, also contributed. MUD's zone, however, prevented much upfield movement and caused numerous turnovers. Ozone scored again after Maggie Jackson, 64, received a huck from Crouch and called time out. After many, many dump-swings Wilson threw to Jackson for a 7-5 score. To credit Ozone's person-to-person defense, MUD turned the disc over an equal number of times. Ozone's Angela Ahlquist, 23, squared off well with MUD handler and high-scorer Abe for an epic battle. An 8 minute 16 second point saw nine turnovers between the teams before MUD's Aki Nakaza, 2, threw to Ai Fukano, 12, for the half, 9-5.

MUD opened the half with a downwind point from Abe to Yuki More, 15. In another 10 minute point, Ozone's Erin Coker, 9, came down with a great grab between two MUD defenders and called time out. The score looked like it would go to Ozone with a quick pass, but MUD's Emiri Minegishi, 17, came up with a big layout D. MUD finished the point with a beautiful forehand down the line from Mingishi to Naya.

Cap was called at 12-8 with a game to 14. MUD finished the match with a pass from Noriko Nakamura, 19, to Mori, to end 14-9.

Ozone's captain Angela Lin, 71, said, "Their zone is strong. They forced us to make a lot of throws until we turned it over, which happened often. We were able to send it long after the swing, but they adjusted quickly. They have great inside-out passes, and we tried our best to stop them."

"Ozone has been a good team for a long time. We've been looking forward to playing U.S. teams because they are strong, and we are pleased to be doing so well. Ozone is very tall, and they have great throws and hucks. We struggled a lot with the hucks. Our zone is the only way we can win with the tall players. We had to stop their quick, long throws," commented Nami Naya.

The Rob Hancock Memorial Award is the highest honour available in Australian disc sports.

Rob Hancock was involved in flying disc sports from the early days of 1979 and was instrumental in the development of both the Western Australian and National bodies. His organisational skills were outstanding, shoring up the National body during its early autonomous period. He also excelled on the field, taking out both State and National Titles.

Rob passed away in 1984, his untimely death being a great loss to his family, friends and the flying disc community. The Award was instigated in 1986 to commemorate his life of dedication to our sport.

Each year any number of awards (including no award) may be given, depending on the quality of the nominations. Rob Hancock Award Winners are granted life membership of the AFDA. To date there have been 23 winners of the Rob Hancock Award.

Criteria for the Award are based around Rob's own fine attributes, and is based upon the nominee's life work as a whole. Winners have a primary interest in the growth and improvement of flying disc sports in Australia, are a model of athletic endeavour and leadership, teach a love for flying disc sports and help new or younger players develop, show dedication and excellence in administration, and by their initiative and personal actions have achieved a significant milestone in the growth and development of the sport. Winners are recognised as true ambassadors for the game and upholders of its spirit.

WUCC 101 (History of WUCC) Continued from Wednesday

Boston's Death or Glory (USA) defeated Finnish squad Liquidisc to take the Open Championship in 1999 at **St. Andrews, Scotland**. Denmark's Fenris made the top ten and Great Britain's UTI must have chugged antibiotics with their pints as they made an impressive top 20.

The Women's division top 10 saw an impressive mix of Clubs from Finland's Espoo, Carnegie (SWE) and Bliss (GB). Both Australia and New Zealand sent Clubs. With the Australian Seven Green Bottles taking out tenth position and Raging Wahine from New Zealand making a convincing 19th.

Adding to the excitement as if pant-less Scotsman running around the fields at St. Andrews wasn't enough – WUCC 1999 featured a super competitive mixed division that added

spice and plenty of game action to the event. The mixed division attracted 16 teams of which American Club Red Fish Blue Fish swam to victory and Japan's Osaka Natto came second. Canada's own Throws of Passion got into the theme and came in at ninth spot, with the local Scots Club Gael Force blowing lightly at 16th.

Cigar (USA) won the Masters division, while Australia found its way on to the dais for the very first time with a Silver in the Masters division with Return of the Redeye. The Wizards from Switzerland took out the spirit prize for the Masters division.

WUCC 2002 was nestled between the palm trees and great blue pacific in **Hawaii**, but this didn't seem to deter or stop the USA based clubs placing first in all divisions. It did have something to do with the great showing by Clubs from the Asia-Pacific region, with the Buzz Bullets from Japan making it to the top ten in the Open division, and the down and under 'Feral' Australians coming in fourteenth. The Mixed division saw plenty of Eurasian plate action from the Blue Lotus

Sect from China, Freak Show from Singapore and Russia's own Glasnost playing hard.

Twenty four Women's teams duked it out in their division. Significant showings included MUD from Japan in eighth place, Bliss from Great Britain placing twelfth and Espoo from Finland placing twentieth. The Masters division had their second biggest ever showing of Master's team of which the Canadian's appropriately named Club the 'Relics' placing seventh.

For members of Japan's Buzz Bullets, accompanying spouses handled childcare duties so the men could concentrate on their games.

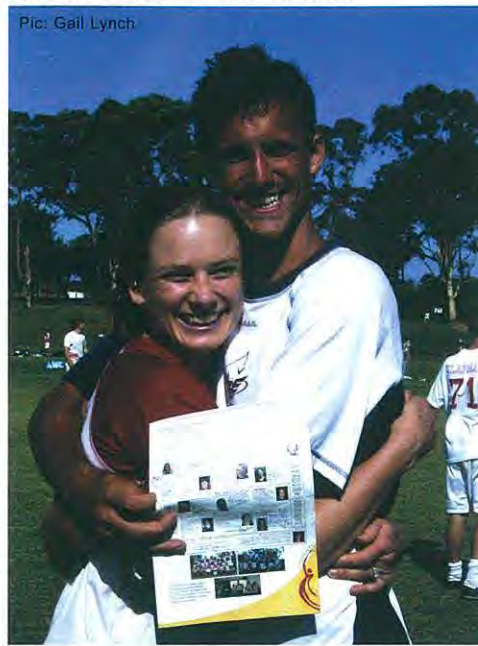

Cygnus Atratus

The Black Swan has a special status in Western Australia, firstly it is the official state emblem of WA and is also displayed on the Australian coat of arms. The area where Perth is situated today was once referred to by



Europeans as the 'Swan River Colony' (named by the Dutch explorer Willem de Vlamingh in 1697). The 'Swan' River

separates Perth's downtown area from its southern suburbs starting in the Darling Range and flowing through appropriately named Swan Valley. But lastly and mostly the Black Swan is the logo for WAFDA!

Our feathered friends (*Cygnus atratus*) is a large nonmigratory bird which breeds mainly in the southeast and southwest of Australia.



The Black Swan is 130 cm long and weighs up to 9kg (20lbs). It has (not surprisingly) an all black plumage, except for the red bill, dark grey legs and white tips of the wing feathers. The neck is long and curved in an “S”. On its red bill, there is a white bar near the tip. Both sexes are similar, with the female slightly smaller and lighter than the male. The cygnets have light grey plumage. As with other swans, the Black Swan is largely monogamous, pairing for life. Male and female swans share the care of the nest and cygnets. The Black Swan is protected under the Australian National Parks and Wildlife Act, 1974. All info referenced from wikipedia.com
