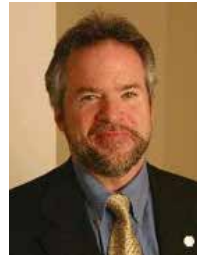

SITE RULES

Facility staff, event staff and security will be checking to make sure people are following the site rules. Those caught in violation of the rules risk being barred from the facility, team/athlete disqualifications, and vehicle towing, in addition to ramifications outside of the event. Thank you for following the site rules!

ATRIUM STADIUM – MASON HIGH SCHOOL

- Only leashed service animals are allowed at Mason High School.
- No smoking.
- No alcohol is allowed on premises and will not be available for purchase. Coolers and other containers are subject to search upon entry.
- No outside food allowed.
- No glass.
- No fires or portable grills.
- No firearms or weapons.
- No abusive language.
- Parking is free at the site.
- Access to the field is limited to only those teams playing at that time.

LEBANON SPORTS COMPLEX

- Pets – well behaved pets on a leash are allowed.
- No smoking.
- No outside alcohol is allowed. Beer/wine will be available for purchase for those 21 & older. Coolers and other containers are subject to search upon entry.
- No glass.
- No fires or portable grills.
- No camping is allowed at the site.
- No firearms or weapons.
- No abusive language.
- Parking is free, but park only in approved locations as noted by signage.
- Spectators/equipment must stay behind designated lines, at least 5 meters back from the fields.

Any color.

CARTONS



Remove caps and straws.

TRASH & RECYCLING

The TOC and suppliers have worked hard to create a sustainable environment and have put a recycling waste management process in place.

Bins will be located around all competition and spectator areas on the venue. Teams are requested to clean up all areas after their games and to leave the fields in a tidy manner. Spectators are responsible for their own rubbish and should use the appropriate bins as provided.

WHAT TO RECYCLE:

- Glass Bottles & Jars (all colors)
- Metal Cans: Aluminum cans, steel cans/lids, empty aerosol cans with the lids and tips removed
- Plastic Bottles (empty, crush, reattach lid): Bottles and jugs that have a small mouth and wider base, such as milk jugs, soda bottles, water bottles
- Plastic Tubs: Containers for butter, sour cream cottage cheese, yogurt, Jello and fruit slices would fall into the tub category. Lids should be reattached prior to recycling
- Plastic Cups (remove/discard straw, reattach lid): Fast food beverage cups
- Paper: newspaper, magazines, cardboard, mixed office paper and envelopes, paperboard (cereal boxes), pizza boxes free of food debris and grease
- Paper Cups (remove/discard lids, straws and stoppers): Fast food beverage cups, coffee cups, Dixie cups
- Cartons: food and beverage cartons, such as milk, juice, & other cartons

WUCC GAME ADVISORS

WUCC will be using Game Advisors, who will work with players during some selected games to help with game management, promote better understanding of the rules and spirit of the game and aid in improving the presentation of the sport to spectators.

Self-officiating is one of the key aspects of Ultimate and is embedded in the WFDF Rules of Ultimate. WFDF wants Ultimate to remain a player-officiated as it defines the sport and its culture, it is an extremely unusual approach and it is undoubtedly part of the sports growing appeal.

Key roles and functions of the Game Advisors are:

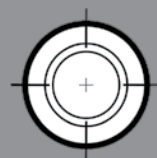
- Presence at games - simply by being present at the game, a GA can reduce the number of calls, types of calls, delays in play and contention between teams.
- Rules expertise - Often disputes come down to players not knowing or disagreeing about the rules, so having someone there to assist helps.
- Call Management - Keeping players aware of the appropriate process for resolving calls can help move things forward.
- Game Management - Being able to talk with Captains, Spirit Captains and Coaches can help resolve any issues that might arise between teams.
- Giving Perspective - Being able to provide an independent perspective can help with call resolution, even if that perspective is that it was "too close to tell" what occurred in the play.

It is important to note, however, that the presence of Game Advisors does not diminish the responsibilities of players to self-officiate the sport of Ultimate. WUCC will have 18 Game Advisors in attendance, all with extensive playing and rules experience. Games with GA's will be selected by the Head Game Advisor and the Tournament Technical Director in consultation with the Tournament Rules Group. Games selected will not primarily be because of SOTG problems, but rather to allow WFDF to give teams from as many countries as possible the chance to play with the Game Advisors. Teams should not feel that they have done something wrong if a GA crew shows up to work one of their games.



GAME ADVISORS

A brief description of the Game Advisor (GA) role
Refer to Appendix B6.3 for more details



AIM

The aim of GAs is to support the Players to self-officiate as effectively and efficiently as possible. Players remain responsible for making and resolving all game calls.



RULES ADVICE

During stoppages GAs can help to clarify the rules, if asked by the Players.



TIME LIMITS

GAs closely monitor time limits in accordance with the rules, including in between points, time outs, and during discussions, and encourage teams to comply with these rules.



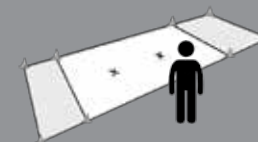
NON BINDING ADVICE

If Players need help resolving any call they may ask the GA for their advice. This advice is non-binding and Players must still make the call.



WHISTLES

GAs give information to Players about time limits by using whistles, but also by providing verbal advice.



SIDELINE ROLE

GAs remain on the sideline during play. They may come on to the field during stoppages, if needed.



SPIRIT OF THE GAME

If GAs have concerns about Spirit they can talk to the Captains, the Players involved, or can even call a SOTG Stoppage to help the Players resolve the issue.



MISCONDUCT

In extreme circumstances GAs can issue warnings in accordance with the WFDF Conduct Policy.

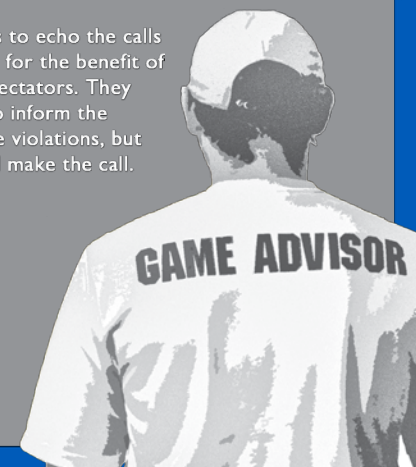

HAND SIGNALS

GAs use hand signals to echo the calls made by the Players, for the benefit of other Players and spectators. They also actively signal to inform the opposition of Offside violations, but the Players must still make the call.

DINNER

ACCREDITATION

All registered players, team members, staff, volunteers, media and guests will receive event accreditation attached to a lanyard. To be eligible to play, utilize event services and access official event areas and social events (including the Player Party), you must keep your accreditation on you at all times.





GET READY FOR OHIO!

The following recommendations will help you prepare for the World Ultimate Club Championships in Ohio.

The weather is typically hot and humid during the summer months. Temperatures can be in the mid 80's to low 90's during June and July. Plan on pre-hydrating, hydrating during the games, and re-hydrating after the games.

- Drink more water than your thirst indicates! It's very hard to catch up once you're dehydrated.
- Bring ice and wet towels to the field with you. Put a cold towel around your neck when you come off the field and at half time.
- During half time, drink water or a sports beverage, such as Gatorade.
- Keep out of the sun when you're not playing. Find shade. Be careful about how long you are in the sun watching games.
- Ice water and shade will be provided at each field.
- Although there will be ice and water available for teams on site, you should bring your own water bottle which you can fill from the water coolers at the fields. Ice and water will be replenished throughout the day as needed.

Athletes who suffer from allergies or asthma can have an increase in symptoms during the time frame of the Ultimate Championships due to pollen, ragweed, and mold counts. You may call the pollen and mold hotline at (513) 946-7753 to hear a recording that will provide a total count or value for the most prevalent allergens for the previous 24-hours. If you have a need for over-the-counter allergy medications, a map of local pharmacies will be available from tournament personnel. Please ensure that any prescription medications for allergies and/or asthma are brought with you, including inhalers and epi-pens.

COVID-19 EVENT PROTOCOL

The WFDF COVID-19 Working Group have been monitoring the situation and have also worked with the LOC to ensure that national and local governmental and health agency advice and criteria for the event are met in full. WFDF also has a social responsibility to each and every participant, to ensure you are able to attend the event and play so that world champions can be crowned in each division and to get you all back home safe and healthy.

Players & participants are responsible for taking necessary health and safety precautions to minimize the spread of the virus by following these recommendations:

- Avoid transmission of COVID-19 by reducing your physical contact to an absolute minimum.
- Practice cleanliness, handwashing, and sanitizing in busy areas.
- Consider wearing a mask in indoor areas like buses, hotel lobbies, bathrooms, etc.
- Players are encouraged to keep their distance off the field and to avoid high fives.
- Spirit Circles should be conducted with a distance of at least 2 metres between players.
- Anyone displaying symptoms of active COVID-19 must self isolate immediately and get yourself tested.
- Anyone with a positive test result must self isolate immediately and not return to the venue until you are officially cleared with a negative test result.
- Anyone living with a person who is displaying symptoms or has been diagnosed with a positive test must self test for the next 3 days. Living with is regarded as a close contact and encompasses sharing a hotel or dorm room, or sharing a full house if booked at an AirBnB or private home.

Ultimate relies upon a Spirit of the Game that places the responsibility for fair play on every player.

Spirit of the Game (SOTG) is the mindful behavior practiced by players worldwide prior to, during and after a game. It encompasses attitudes and skills such as good knowledge and application of the rules, fair-mindedness, safe play and spatial awareness, clear and calm communication, and a positive and respectful attitude towards teammates, fans, and opponents, in a mutual effort to protect the basic joy of play.

We strongly believe that Spirit of the Game helps people to improve their skills in polite, calm and respectful communication even in difficult situations and to make friends all over the world despite ethnic, national or religious differences. Spirit promotes understanding and peace in our sport, and we hope that through you players, that influence can even spread beyond and make real changes in the outside world.

At the WFDF 2022 World Ultimate Club Championships, every team in every division has chosen a Spirit Captain. It is this player's responsibility to work with their team and all opposition teams to ensure that the highest standard of the Spirit of the Game is maintained throughout the competition (both on and off the field).

A spirit scoring system has been developed to evaluate the other team immediately after each game. With all players involved and led by the spirit captain, each team fills in a spirit scoresheet. Using guidelines found in the spirit scoring examples document, each team can provide a more consistent score for the other team. The spirit scoring system therefore serves as an educational tool where teams can learn how to improve based on standardised feedback.

To celebrate Spirit of the Game, an award will be presented to the team with the highest total spirit score in each division. Winning this award is held in the highest regard and all teams strive to achieve this.

Good luck to all at WUCC. Athletes, your ability represents the pinnacle of our sport in your age group and you have the opportunity to demonstrate the highest values of our sport through the Spirit of the Game. Fans and spectators, you can look forward to some incredible action and even more incredible displays of spirit throughout the Championships.

ANTI-DOPING MESSAGE

The World Flying Disc Federation (WFDF) requires ALL athletes and coaches/medical staff competing in the WFDF 2022 World Ultimate Club Championships in Ohio to complete the ADEL anti-doping education course prior to the event.

ADEL is an internet-based tool which WFDF has used for the past several years. This is an educational exercise and test to enhance your knowledge of Anti-Doping matters for elite athletes and their support personnel concerning subjects such as doping control procedures, the WADA Prohibited List, athletes' whereabouts reporting and Therapeutic Use Exemptions (TUE).

We kindly ask you to ensure that ALL team members review the following information carefully.

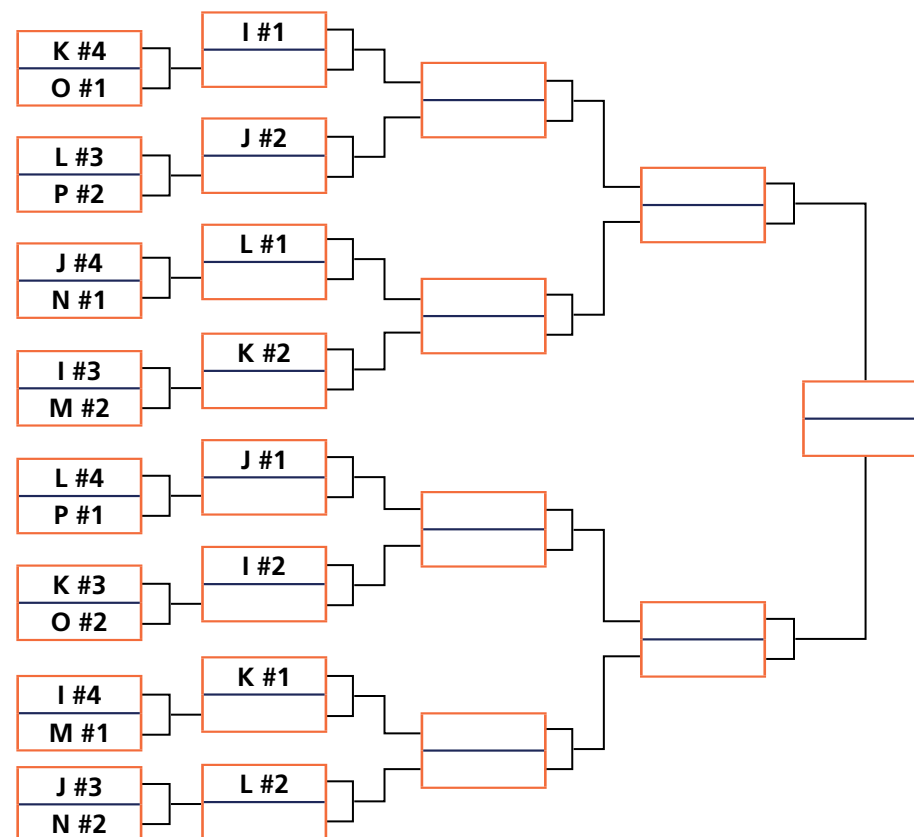

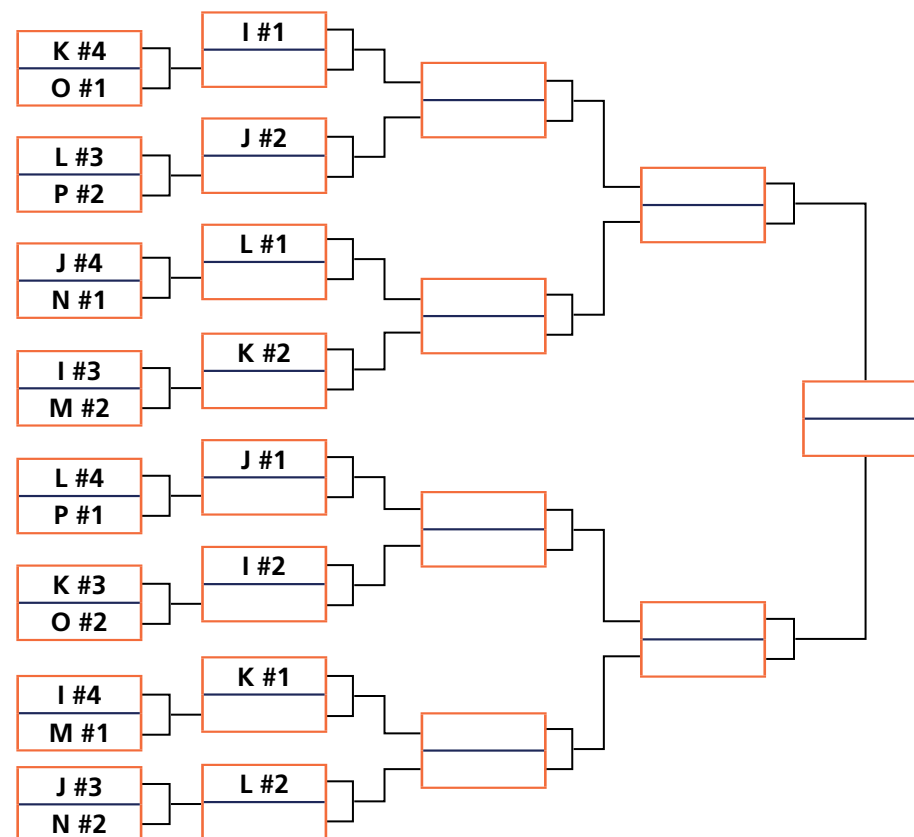
