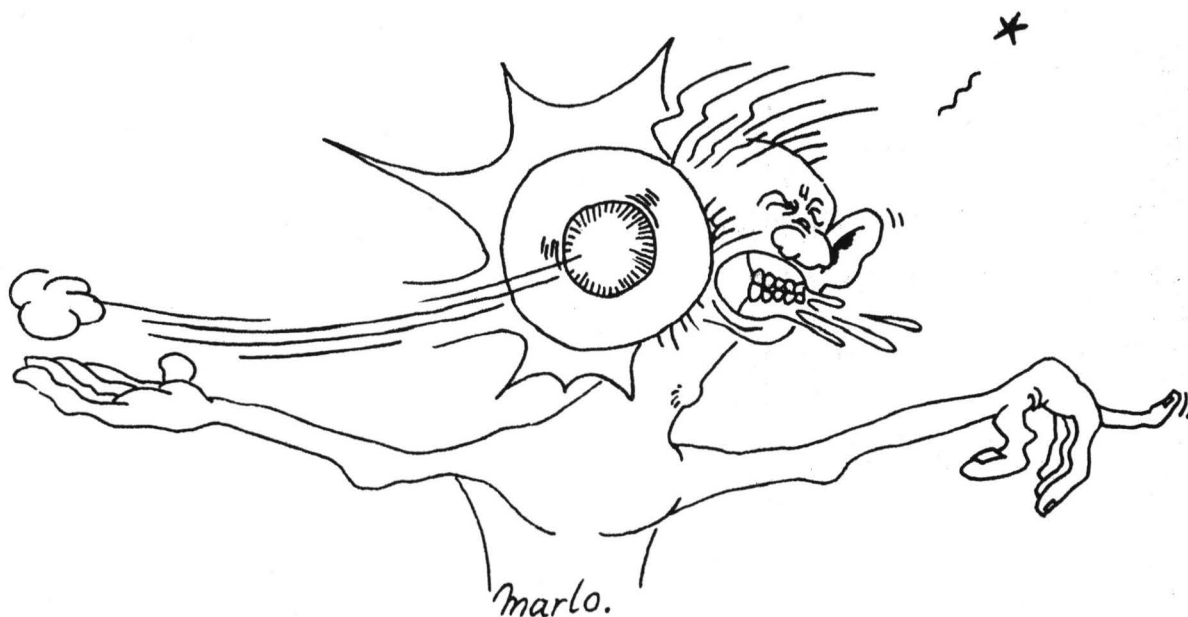

## The Finish\_Sisu vs\_American Spirit!

Wednesday is the day when United States and Finland play each other twice. At 13:00 the women get on the field and one hour later the boys follow.

- Our chances are as big as the americans, says the Finish coach Klaus Arpia, 27. In tactics and technics wer'e as good as Rude Boys. The SISU will determine the victors.

Sisu is finish for fighting spirit, goo, will to win, everything and a famous word especially in meetings between Finland and Sweden in all kinds of sports.

Ultimate in Finland has more or less exploded in a few years. The finish association was formed in 77/78 and three years later Finland won the European championships. 16-15 against England.

- Of course it was a little surprise even to us, but we had been playing Ultimate several years and quite much, says Klaus Arpia. Our team was made up of players from just two team while Sweden had players from 10-20 teams. I think Ultimate is very dependant upon the players knowing each other well in order to play well.

Since 1980 Finland's been in the top in Europe with a third place 1981 and a second place 1982.

The Finish women has come even faster. They took up organised Ultimate just one year ago and even so could manage to win the european championship 1982.

Finland has about 600 organised players in 10 teams. They play Guts but mostly Ultimate and the six individual events. Frisbee in Finland faces the same problem as the Swedish. Its hard to get Frisbee accetped as a sport and to get any media coverage.

The players in the Finish national team has lots of experience of other sports. There are several Finish champions in other sports in the Ultimate team.

- They have all found the excitement of Ultimate Frisbee and changed sport, says Klaus Arpia.

& Physically they seem to be much better equipt than the other countries.

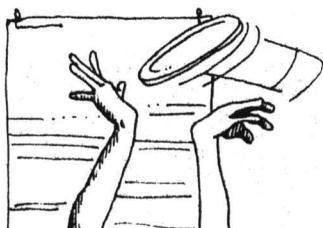
& They have been playing demanding torunaments in USA against teams that are much better than the teams the europeans everhave played and thereby have accumulated lots of experience.

## THE HISTORY OF ULTIMATE FRISBEE

Greetings and best wishes to the World Ultimate Frisbee Championship from the Columbia High School varsity Frisbee Team, New Jersey, originators of Ultimate Frisbee.

The Columbia students Joel Silver and Buzzy Hellring invented Ultimate in the fall of 1968 and winter of 1969. The first games were played in march 1969.

The skill level and field shape were very different, but the rules are still much the same. The field consisted of two goal lines approximately 50 yards (45m) apart. There were no side boundaries and unlimited end zones. The field was confined in reality by any natural boundaries. In the fall of 1969, the CHSVFT began playing on a lighted asphalt parking lot. The field was forty-eight yards long and forty-five yards wide at one goal line and fourteen yards wide at the other goal line. The sidelines were six inch concrete curbs with a ten foot drop into a river on one side and a fifteen foot high railway embankment on the other.

This field is still in use for the Annual Varsity Alumni Ultimate Game, first played on thanksgiving night, 1970 and continue to the present. The alumni lead the series 10 games to 3.

### The skills were very primitive

Masters and moonlighters were used. Virtually all of the players had only one throw. The sidearm was not used effectively until 1972, the overhand was not used until 1971. A one hand catch was considered difficult and a fifty yard throw was an exceptional effort. The backhand and underhand were the usual throws.

The rule differences were: no stalling count, any amount of contact was permitted between defender and receiver as long as the action was directed at the disc, the thrower could push a defender away and then throw and if a defender tried to intercept a throw and missed, the offense retained possession.

The first game between two schools was played in November 1970, the first game between two colleagues in November 1972. The first Ultimate tournament took place in April 1975, and was won by Rutgers University. (Perhaps someone here can tell me the date and the teams in the first European Ultimate Game)?

### Women and Ultimate

Women played Ultimate from the very beginning, but the first all Women's Ultimate game I remember seeing was in August 1978 in Santa Barbara, California.

Now Ultimate is played on at least five continents. Joel Silver is a Hollywood film producer (48 hours and Xanadu). Buzzy Hellring died in an automobile accident in 1971. They wanted to invent an alternative sport with universal appeal in which friendship and "spirit of the game" were more important than competition.

Every Ultimate player here must decide for himself/herself whether they succeeded.
