V. TOURNAMENT FORMAT:

I. Preliminary Round - (Saturday, March 28th)

Four pools of 4 teams each will be established at the opening captains' meeting as follows:

- <u>STEP 1</u>: The pre-determined, top 4 teams of the Northern section (N) will be arbitrarily placed in each pool by way of their respective captains drawing from a hat position numbers 1, 5, 9 or 13.
- STEP 2: The pre-determined, top 4 teams of the Southern section (S) will be arbitrarily placed in each pool by way of their respective captains drawing from a hat position numbers 2, 6, 10 or 14.
- STEP 3: The remaining 8 teams (X) will also be arbitrarily placed in position numbers 3, 4, 7, 8, 11, 12, 15 or 16 by way of their respective captains drawing from a hat.

Once the four pools have been established, each team will play the other three teams in their pool to determine the winner of each pool. The order of rounds in the preliminaries will be as follows:

*NOTE: The full details as to time scheduling of games and field lay-outs will be clearly defined in the opening captains' meeting. Each game in the preliminary round will consist of a point game to 15 points, win by 2, with a ceiling at 17 points, and half-time at 8 points. II. Semi-Final Round (Sunday, March 29th)

Upon conclusion of the preliminary round, the winning team from each of the 4 pools will advance to the semi-finals. In order to determine the match-ups, one of the four team captains will draw from the hat one of the three remaining teams.

This round will be played to 17 points, win by 2 with a ceiling at 19 points, and half-time at 9 points.

III. Final Round (Sunday, March 29th)

The two winning teams of the semi-final round will advance to the final game to determine the California State Champion.

The game will be played to 21 points, win by 2 with a ceiling at 23 points, and half-time at 10 points.

THE SANTA BARBARA CONDORS

Situated on the coast of California, Santa Barbara with its unique climate provides a perfect setting for frisbee players to practice their skills. The Condors have utilized this situation to blossom into one of the premier ultimate teams in the country.

Over the years the Condors have amassed a few tournament victories, including two World Championships, four consecutive Western titles and a California State Ultimate Title, which they won in 1978 with only 11 players.

Their achievements as ultimate players have won them international recognition. Through the last five years, ultimate has grown greatly, the Condors, being at the front of that growth, have enlarged their initial group of 15 players to include a wide spectrum of frisbee energy in Santa Barbara that numbers close to 100 active members.

For this year's California State Ultimate Championships, the Condors are sending a young, quick team to Irvine to challenge for the title. Though veterans Cliff Marhoefer, and Mike Minnini remain stalworths on the team, it is the inspirational play of the newer players that keep the Condors giving and going.

From wildboys like Dan TB to schoolboys like Brian O'Donnell, the Condors new look is young. But don't be fooled, these boys know how to play ultimate. The Condors have always been known for their defense and this year it will once again assume a primary role in the Condor game plan. Now more than ever, the passing game of the team is becoming more refined. With their quick bursts of speed, this year's team could do real well.
