### REMINDER...

Due to the number of teams we are expecting, we will be enforcing the tournament start times. They are: 9:00 AM Saturday morning, Captain's meeting. Games to start at 10:00 sharp. There will be a 15 minute grace period, and those teams who don't begin within that time period will be penalized one point for every two minutes late thereafter. This is an attempt to cure the disease known as "ULTIMATE TIME".

### HOW MUCH DOES IS COST?

If your team is an "A" team, it is: \$100.00 for your entry. If your team is either a women's or a "B" team, the fee is \$75.00. the monies will pay for for the Friday and Saturday night parties; it will cover limited refreshments during the tournament (ie. oranges etc.), and a Saturday Night food bust from 7-9 and dance party from 9-12 pm held in the Ballroom of the Student Center on the SJSU Campus. ## Brief History of Previous Cal State Ultimate Championships

101 AD: Caveman Umph throws first rock shaped like disc to Uhgg for first primitive Ultimate point.

1977-79: Cal State's first three Ultimate tourney's held here in San Jose. Tourney's held in December for unknown reasons.

1981: Tourney held in Irvine for first time in late March, 1981. The Condors of Santa Barbara took home the trophy, which they (rumor has it) picked up on the way to the tourney at a yard sale.

1982: Tournament comes to Santa Cruz for first time. Condors win again. All four quarter finals finished on Saturday. A first!

1983: Condors beat San Diego for title in the slog of a Santa Cruz spring. UCSC Administration severs ties with Ultimate team for completely destroying fields

1984: Condors beat the Flying Circus for the last time at Santa Cruz. Introduction of "Cow State" shirts- a "real big seller".

1985: First out-of-state team competes. Chabot beats the Condors to end their streak of domination, and put Chabot on the map of Cal state Ultimate fame.

1986: King City (where?) beats Chabot for title in the last of successive Cal States held in Santa Cruz

1987: Cal States come back to San Jose on a whopping four weeks' notice. The tradition continues... and not too many states can say that. As the Beach Boys so poetically stated; "I wish they all could be California States".

## ULTIMATE WHO?

To our Ultimate friends; those familiar to the sport and those not. Something new and exciting? Well, Ultimate is not a new sport, but it is exciting. I feel it is so because of a rare combination that exists in the sport. That of the intense, extremely talented and competitive nature in the game. The extremely limited physical contact and stress that is inherent in many other sports contribute to the uniqueness of the sport of Ultimate. We call this the "Spirit of the Game".

Ultimate is a non-contact sport played by two seven player teams. The object of the game is to score goals, worth a point each. Most games this weekend will be to 13 points for women, and 15 for men. Finals will be played to 21. The Disc may only be moved by passing, as the thrower is not allowed to take steps. Anytime a pass is incomplete, intercepted, knocked down, caught out-of-bounds or the defense counts to 10, a turnover occurs. A goal is scored when a player catches the disc in the end zone.

There are no referees in the sport of Ultimate. Players are the judges of their own behavior. We rely upon the spirit of sportsmanship which places the responsibility for fair play on the players. In Ultimate, an intentional foul would be considered cheating, a gross offense against the spirit of sportsmanship. A player is morally bound to abide by the rules. The integrity of Ultimate depends on each player's responsibility to uphold the spirit of the game. This responsibility is not to be taken lightly.

With that in mind I would like to thank the teams who came to participate, some from the far reaches of state, competing in... the 10th California State Ultimate Championships at SJSU. I hope all have a good time, and play to win. Remember the spirit that brought you here. Make sure you take it with you. And always do this: BIFF AND SCORE!!
