

After not making it to college Nationals last year, the UNCW squad is amped--most of their hero's don't appear on stamps." **Michigan Alumni** "The UMICH Wolverbees were founded in 1979 and first came to Fools in 1981 with the slogan "Beat 'Boro or Bust." Lo and behold, we defeated the defending National Champs to make the semis that year. After a poor showing in 1982, we were back as Primal Urge in 1983, losing only to then-National champs, the Rude Boys, in the semis. Our reunion team slogan: Bring on Michigan State!"

Throw Me Somethin' Mistah (Good'N'Plenty of D.C.) "Following the festive tradition of Mardi Gras, there was a team. The name was inspired by the crowds begging for people on floats to throw beads and trinkets to them. The chorus of 'Throw me somethin' mistah' echoed through the streets of festive New Orleans. Brought together in a town heavily laden with talented Ultimate players, several D.C. guys coalesced to form a foolish group of merry pranksters, with their sights set on attaining unearthly goals: winning April Fools, Sectionals, Regionals, and Easterns. These dudes just hope to do the best they can and have a lot of fun while they're at it." **Glassboro Reunion** "Boro - Spelled backwards is OROB. Baylock is back--two time world champs. Last college team to win. Second place in first college Nationals." **Purple Haze Reunion** "Burst onto the high school frisbee

scene in the spring of '88 with some snazzy shirts, a motto of "Excuse me while I kiss the sky," and a bunch of eager but inexperienced players--all seniors--from Sidwell Friends in Washington. The initial goal was just to have fun and learn the sport, but with the coaching and encouragement of Sidwell teacher and Yorkama player Dan ("Dano") Bogan, the goal became Mid-Atlantic Regionals and then high school Nationals. Using a swing-and-huck offense and tough defense throughout the season, the team went undefeated among high school clubs until meeting Bronx Science at Nationals. Most players have gone on to play in D.C. Summer League and on their college teams."

Maryland Alumni "Maryversity of Uniland. The center of Md. Ultimate has always been 'the tree'. The alumni team is represented by 2 (soon to be 3) decades of players who've played and partied by the tree. The tree is located on McKeldin Mall and has always been one of the central hangouts for Md. disc players. Besides playing religiously on campus, Md. players have occasionally put together travelling teams. Many players from the later 70's went on to play on Static Disc, D.C.'s first Nationals team. The highlight of the mid-80's was the official recognition of the 'Court Jesters' as the Royal Ultimate Team by King Tom II. I [Buckwheat] have been out of touch recently and hence have no news from the end of the 80's, but I have recently been by the tree for inspiration, and predict it will be in full bloom on April Fools weekend."

Lude Produce "Comprised of surviving graduates from various Va Tech Ultimate teams (Slipped Discs, Larry and the Lude Boys, and Fresh Produce). Team members were selected based on their having a major body part fail in the past year. Members were further evaluated for sportsmanship qualities by Ben Johnson, and personal character by Marion Barry. The team feels this year's reunion is particularly special as we don't have to hide our alcohol."

Michigan State Reunion "The original powerhouse team from the mid-west, started by Columbia High School graduate Eric Simon in 1975. Winners of every Centrals from 1977 through 1981, third place finishers at the UPA Nationals in 1979 and 1980. But now? Bald, fat, out-of-shape, some of us have actually been retired for ten years; some of us haven't even seen each other for longer than that. Our starting lineup has an average age of 33, and over half of us played in that first game, that fateful day in September 1975. When the games are done on Sunday, two things will be for certain; the Michigan State Reunion team will have had the most fun, and will be the most stiff and sore. Note: On Friday and Saturday, A1 denotes the first team in Pool A, etc. On Sunday, A1 denotes the first place team in Pool A after the round-robin. For the women, Sunday's seeding takes into account the round-robin results from pools P, Q, R, and S, counting the previously played game between pool members. So, for example, first place pool E becomes P1 on Saturday. Then we count P1's games against P3 and P3, and the previously played game between P1 and P2. Then the team from Pool P with the best record becomes Sunday's P1.

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





Sunday's Schedule

Women's Divisions





TO TOURNAMENT FROM DULLES OR D.C. - Take I-66 West to Exit 8 (The Plains/Old Tavern). Follow sign to Old Tavern (245 West). Go about 2 miles to Great Meadow Fields Events Center. There is a corner store on the right across from the fields.

TO HOTEL FROM TOURNAMENT - Go left out of fields onto 245 West, and follow about 2 miles to 17 South (left). Follow 17 south to Rte. 29 (see Warrenton Center on left), and turn left. Hampton Inn is on the right (501 Blackwell Rd.) just off Rte. 29.
