#### TEAMS TO WATCH by Jars Blutte

**THE ST. LOUIS TUNAS** - The winners of the 1985 and 1986 Ultimate 4th of July are back in Boulder to win it for an unprecedented 3rd time. The strength of this team lies in their aggressive defensive play. While their large team of 20 to 27 quality players tends to wear down their less numerous opponents, their pressure style defense also can intimidate the most experienced of teams. Don't count this team out of any game and expect them to be right on your tail until the end.

**NEW YORK'S, N.Y. 10012-** The current UPA national champions and the number one seed of this tournament have to be considered the favorite to win this tournament. This team has a wealth of experienced players whose disc skills are tough to compete against. Their systematic offensive play produces quick goals and always puts the pressure of scoring back on the other team.

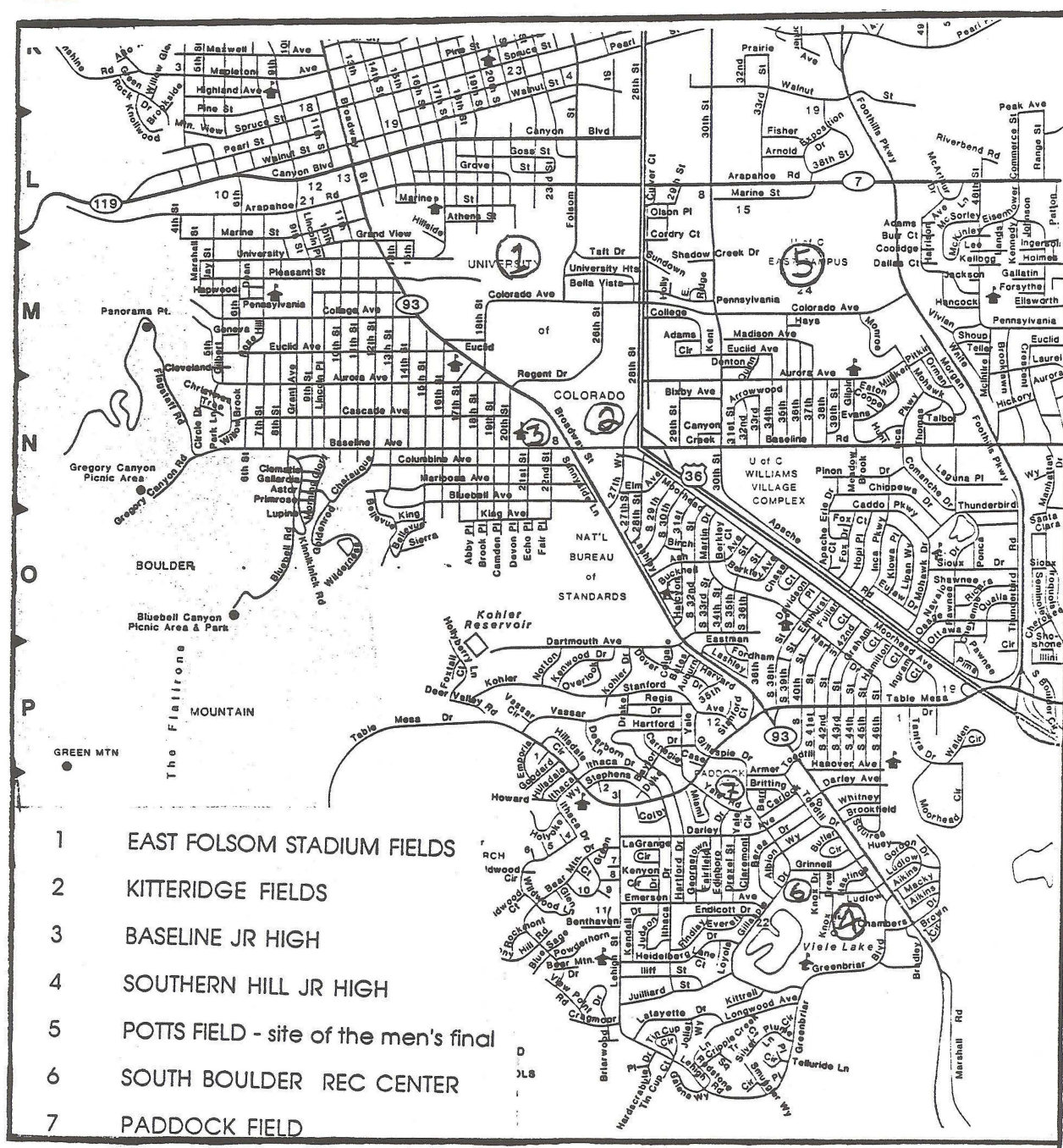
**SOUTH BAY'S SUNAMI-** This top regional team from the west coast can boast some of the most knowledgeable and innovative players in the game. This is another team that relies on a polished offensive attack, known as the Stanford offense, with set plays that can also put some fast goals up on the score. Their zone defense is as effective as any in the game. Look for these guys to be winning the tournament or the party.

**THE SANTA BARBARA CONDORS-** The 1987 defending champions are back to defend their title. This team can never be taken lightly and has always had the knack to win when the pressure is on. The L.A. Lakers of Ultimate, the Condors running fastbreak style of play can at any time establish a lead that is hard to fight back from. The defensive prowess rides on their ability to outrun the fastest of teams. Their team speed is probably the fastest of any team around.

**CHICAGO'S WINDY CITY-** This is a team that lost in the finals of the UPA Nationals to New York City this past fall. This perennial participant at the UPA Nationals has never been considered the most physically talented nor disciplined of teams. Any Oakland Raider fan would quickly fall in love with this team for their slightly maladjusted players and their ability to win. Their offense is unconventional and unpredictable in its extensive use of overheads and blades. This wide-open style of play leads to games filled with spectacular catches and coast to coast action.

**THE BOULDER STAINS-** The local favorite every year has made it to at least the semi-finals round of action, but winning their hometown tournament has always eluded them. This year their chances look difficult, but far from improbable. This team is young and has something to prove to itself and others. Look for their defense to rise to the occasion and their offense to be patient and methodical. They have the ability to be the darkhorse favorite with the help of the home crowd around.

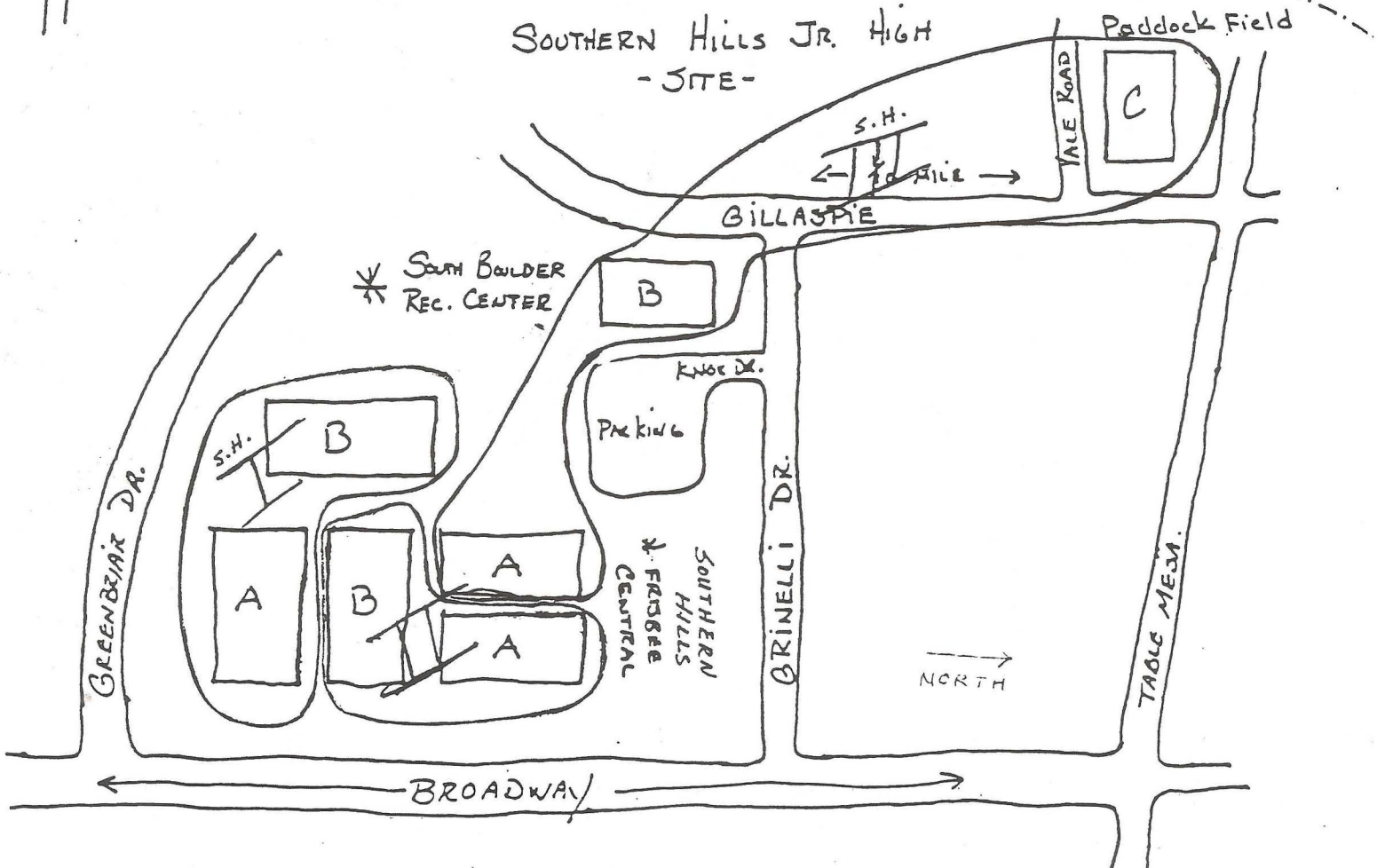
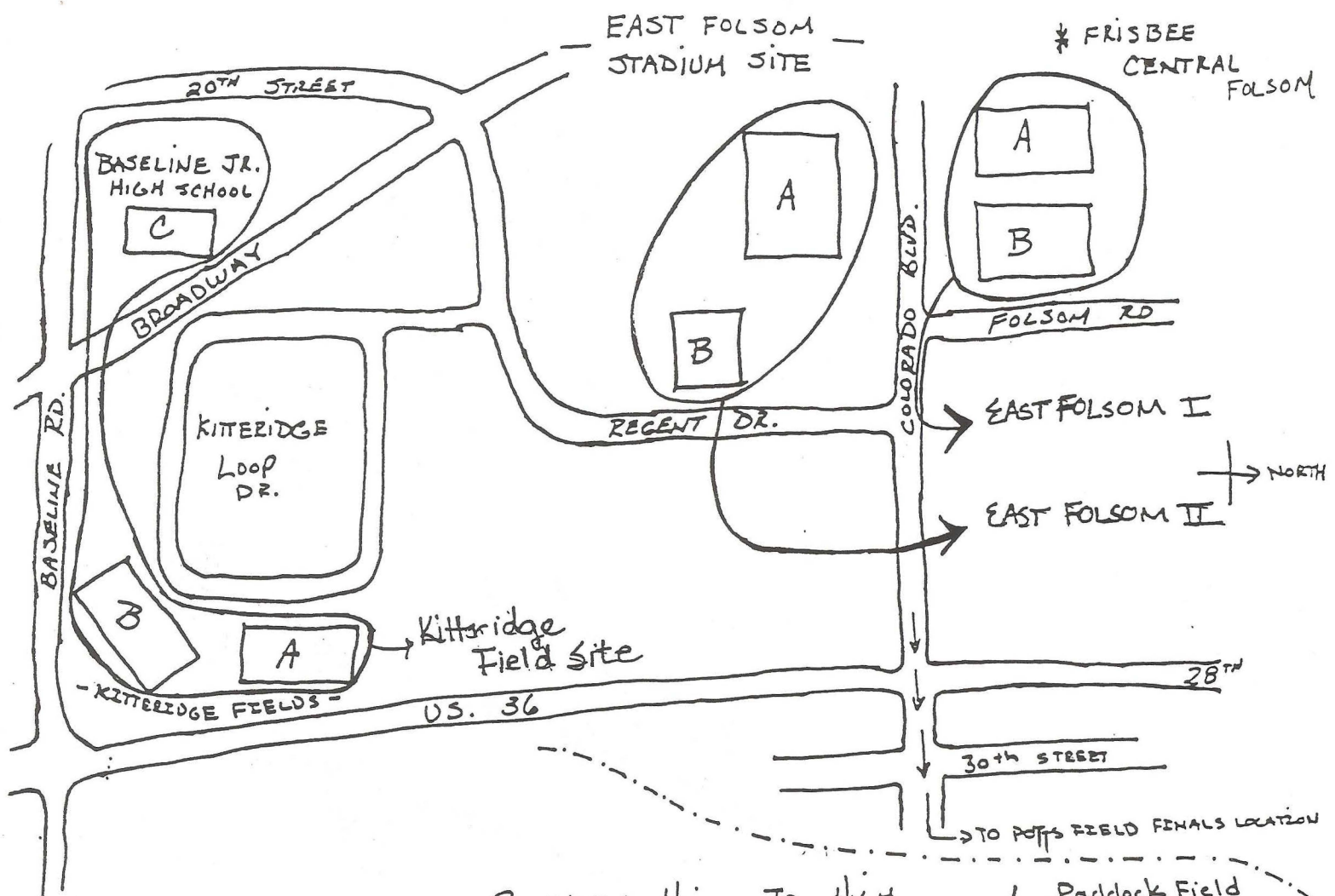

#### Rules Modifications:

1. The Austin Rule/Brick Rule: All pulls that are pulled out of bounds of either sideline will be penalized to a point 10 yards in front of the endzone in the middle of the field. For pulls that travel out the back of the endzone, the play will initiate on the goal line in the middle of the field.
2. Marking-A marker must be within 1 meter of the thrower in order to begin the stall count but should avoid physical contact with the thrower. The stall count is 10.
3. Time-outs: Each team will have 3 time-outs per game and a team can sub in up to 2 players on a time-out.
4. Games will be played to 13 points with a half-time of no longer than 5 minutes, in order for both teams to benefit from the pull.



## Ultimate Frisbee **GAMES**

When you think of Frisbee, you probably think of playing catch in the park, not of an all-out physical intercollegiate sport. But at the State of New York College at Purchase, there is an official varsity Frisbee team, with paid coaches and letter-sweater awards.

Ultimate frisbee is the name of the game, and it produces some spectacular play. As a physical workout, Ultimate Frisbee turns out to be one of the most strenuous games ever invented. Telemetering of heart rates during an actual game at Western New Mexico University showed that Ultimate players were actually getting a better cardiovascular workout than soccer players.

The game demands constant running. The only time you get to stand still is when you are holding the disc. Every teammate is a wide receiver trying to break clear, and every opponent is a defensive back trying to cover his man.

There are seven players per side, and the field is 70 yards long by 40 yards wide. After a "throw off," whoever catches the Frisbee must stand still (or at least keep one pivot foot on the ground) and has ten seconds to get off a throw to a teammate. No handoffs are allowed. A defensive player guards him (no closer than one Frisbee diameter) while counting off the seconds.

The object is to complete a pass to a teammate in the opponent's end zone, which extends 25 yards deep behind the goal line. That scores one point. The game is usually to 15 points, but may be to 21 in championships. An average game can last about two hours--longer if the teams are quite evenly matched. The game draws growing numbers of spectators. Like football, it has explosive long passes, diving catches in the end zone for a score, and spectacular leaping one-handed interceptions. Like basketball, it has zone and man-to-man defenses, and like soccer it has non-stop and wide-open field movement. But unlike all those games, it isn't played with a ball. The disc doesn't follow parabolic trajectories. It is an airfoil--it flies. A skilled thrower can make the disc curve around, fly over, or even scoot under a defender. He can send it on an arc that takes it way outside the borderline of the field so long as it curves back for a teammate to catch in-bounds.

### NEXT YEAR: 20 YEARS OLD

Ultimate Frisbee originated in 1968 at Columbia High School in Maplewood, New Jersey, where it got its first rules and its immodest name. Soon there were college teams, and in 1972 came the first intercollegiate game, between Rutgers and Princeton--the same two colleges that played the first intercollegiate *football* game 103 years earlier, and on the same field.

Now there are some 150 college teams and another 600 men's teams and 50 women's teams that play each other in regional contests. Team names may reflect the lighthearted nature of the sport: the San Diego Spinoffs, the Boulder Stains, the Miami Refugees, New York's Kaboom, Crimes of Passion, Life B4 Plastic, and Boston's Rude Boys.

The sport is international. There are teams in 17 countries, including Holland, Finland, Sweden, Austria, West Germany, and Japan. The last three international championships have all been played in Europe and won by American teams. In 1983 Boston beat Finland in Sweden. In the '84 contest in Switzerland, the Windy City team beat Sweden. Last year the championships were in England, and in the finals the Swedish team again lost to an American team--this time San Francisco's Flying Circus. The next international championship will be held in '88 in Belgium.

One of the most unusual features of Ultimate is the so-called spirit of the game, an attitude even written into the official rules, which value sportsmanship above victory. The game is played without referees. The players are expected to call their own fouls. If a catch was good or not, whether both feet were in bounds, whether a defenseman crowded a thrower too much, or whether the throw was released before or after the ten-second count, players are expected to admit any rule infractions, and at that point the disc goes over to the other team. Part of the philosophy is that when there are referees, players try to get away with as much as they can, short of having a foul called.

It is hard to believe, but almost 20 years after the idealistic rules of Ultimate were first written, intercollegiate matches and world-championship games are still played without referees. The rules now allow for four to six "observers" on the sidelines, but they don't call fouls. They give judgments only when the players themselves call a foul and can't quickly settle it.

Ultimate players are a bit smug about all this--they consider their game a cut above other games, and in many ways it is. Can you think of another team sport in which players routinely applaud when their opponents make an extraordinary play? It's all in the spirit of the game.

Hello Team Captains and Correspondants,

It is time once again to start planning your summer tournament schedules and vacations. Boulder, Colorado is the place to combine them both. With the mountain backdrop and some of the best fields, the fifth annual Ultimate 4th of July tournament will assemble the best teams from every region - Chicago, St. Louis, Santa Barbara, Boston, New York, Atlanta, Los Angeles. The dates for the tournament will be July 2nd, 3rd, and 4th, Saturday, Sunday, and Monday. All participants are encouraged to make plans to stick around for the festive Monday night party! The past parties have provided some memorable moments, and I'm sure that this year's bash will add a few more.

The men's format of this year's tournament is identical to last year's. The top 12 teams will be divided into two pools of six teams. The winners and second place teams of these pools will get automatic berths into the quarter final round. The 3rd and 4th place of these pools will have to play the second place and winners of the pool play in bottom 12 team division in a wildcard game to determine the four remaining quarterfinalist spots. Prize money will be awarded, along with 200 Discraft Ultrastars with your own single color hot stamp for the 1988 4th of July Champions. The pools for the upper division have been selected and tentatively pooled as follows:

The rules governing the sport of Ultimate will again be experimented with in Boulder. Discraft is sponsoring this fine event for the third straight year and the Ultrastar is the official disc of the tournament. Some of the rule changes from last year will again be in place- up to 2 players can be substituted on a time-out, 3 time-outs per game, no half times, a 15 yard penalty for pulls that go out of bounds on either of the sidelines, traveling calls can only be called by the defensive player who is marking the thrower, and only if the marker is within 3 meters of thrower. New this year is the requirement of team roster that have no fewer than 14 players attending this event. The insurance waiver that is enclosed in this mailing will serve as the team roster. All members of your team must sign this document and return it to me with your \$200.00 entry fee to assure your place in the tournament!!!! For next year I plan to have an upper limit 22 players per team Correspondence can be sent to :

Now for the rules modifications:

The Brick Rule- All pulls that are pulled out of bounds of either sideline will be penalized to a point 15 yards in front of the endzone in the middle of the field. For pulls that travel out the back of the endzone , the play will initiate on the goal line in the middle of the field.

Marking- A marker must be within 1 meter of the thrower in order to begin the stall count , but should avoid physical contact with the thrower.

Traveling- Only the marker can call a travel <sup>(3ft)</sup>. The marker must be within the 1 meter distance with the exception of a thrower running away from the marker.

Time-outs- Each team will have 3 time-outs per game and a team can sub in up to 2 players on a time-out.

Games will be played to 17 with no half-times. The Pool D games will be played to 12 since they have more games to complete.
