



ULTIMATE. WHAT IT IS, STRAIGHT FROM THE NINTH EDITION RULES.

- 1. Description. Ultimate is a non-contact sport played by two seven player teams. The object of the game is to score goals. The disc may only be moved by passing, as the thrower is not allowed to take any steps. Any time a pass is incomplete, intercepted, knocked down, or contacts an out-of-bounds area, a tumover occurs, resulting in an immediate change of possession of the disc. A goal is scored when a player successfully passes the disc to a teammate in the endzone which that team is attacking.
- 2. Spirit of the Game. Ultimate has traditionally refied upon a spirit of sportsmanship which places the responsibility for fair play on the player himself. Highly competitive play is encouraged, but never at the expense of the bond of mutual respect between players, adherance to the agreed-upon rules of the game, or the basic joy of play. Protection of these vital elements serves to eliminate adverse conduct from the Ultimate field. Such actions as taunting of opposing players, dangerous aggression, intentional fooling, or other "win at all-costs" behavior are contrary to the spirit of the game and must be avoided by all players.







WHY THE "KAIMANA" KLASSIK?

The Kaimana Klassik has grown from an activity stuggling to find a playing field into a tournament with a record number of visiting players and the best fields available—those here at Honolulu Polo Club. Historically, the finals and most of the preliminary games of previous Klassiks were held in Kapiolani Park, where local players of the game have been gathering for years. Just across the street from the park is Kaimana Beach, hence the name.

Originally just a dream in the minds of a few players, this event has materialized as a central focus in the direction of H.U.L.A. and Ultimate in Hawaii.

The evolution of the Klassik has been much the same as larger tournaments on the Mainland. In the first year, there were some co-ed teams. The second year saw an exhibition women's game in addition to match-ups of eight co-ed teams. Last year, seven men's teams were complemented by three women's teams. Every year gets bigger and better and we're stoked.

The home team prevailed in the first two Klassiks, but last year saw L.A.'s Gang of Haoles taking the top men's honors. Like a gang, they return this year to defend their title. And Stanford, who would have faced Gang in last year's final but had to leave early to make a flight home, is also back to challenge.

Last year, the local ladies, properly known as "Ultimate

Wahines, " took the women's division in what amounted to a rematch with the previously victorious Stanford Women.

In our effort to continually improve the Klassik, we have moved the event to this truly special place on the island of Oahu. We hope you'll agree that we're getting closer to "the Ultimate Hawaii experience."

We welcome all of our returning friends, and the new ones too. Thanks for being here to celebrate the game with us. Get HO and always remember, "Ultimate is more than a sport... it's a lifestyle."


