WHAT IS ULTIMATE?

For the uninitiated among our spectators, Ultimate Frisbee is a team sport played by seven players on each side, on a field 120 yards long and 40 yards wide (end zones are 25 yds. deep).

The object of the game is to score goals (worth 1 point each) by passing the disc to a teammate in the opponent's end zone. No running with disc in hand is allowed.

Play begins with each team lined up on the goal lines. The defensive team "throws off" to start play. The offensive team passes the disc from player to player to advance the disc toward the goal. A player catching the disc must stop immediately and establish a pivot foot. The defender on the thrower may start a "stall count" by counting seconds aloud, and the thrower must pass the disc before the count reaches 10. The disc changes possession when it hits the ground or is intercepted, or if a stall count is made, and play continues until a goal is scored.

Ultimate is a non-contact sport, and players call their own fouls, out-of-bounds and violations such as traveling (no referees are used, but in some cases observers are used to settle disputes).

Games usually are played to 13 in shorter round-robin games, and up to 21 points in tournament finals.

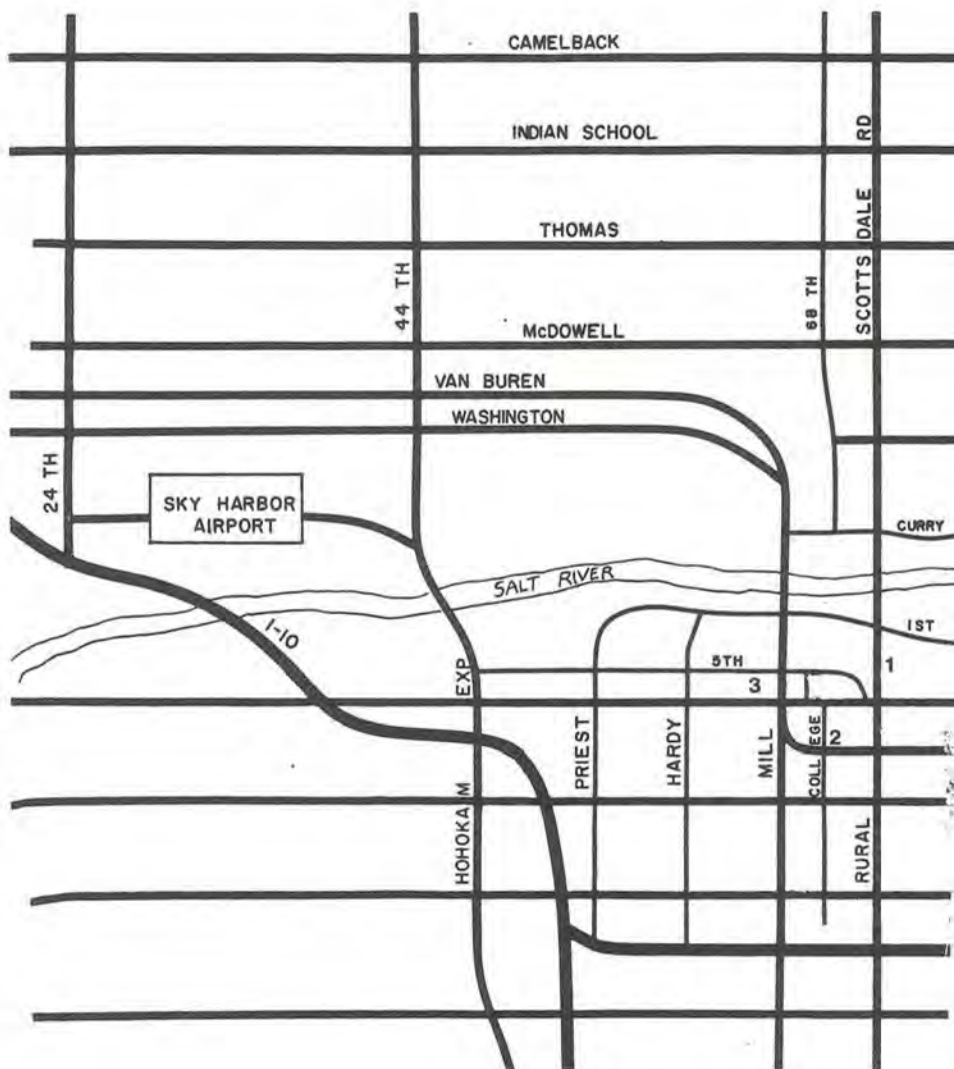

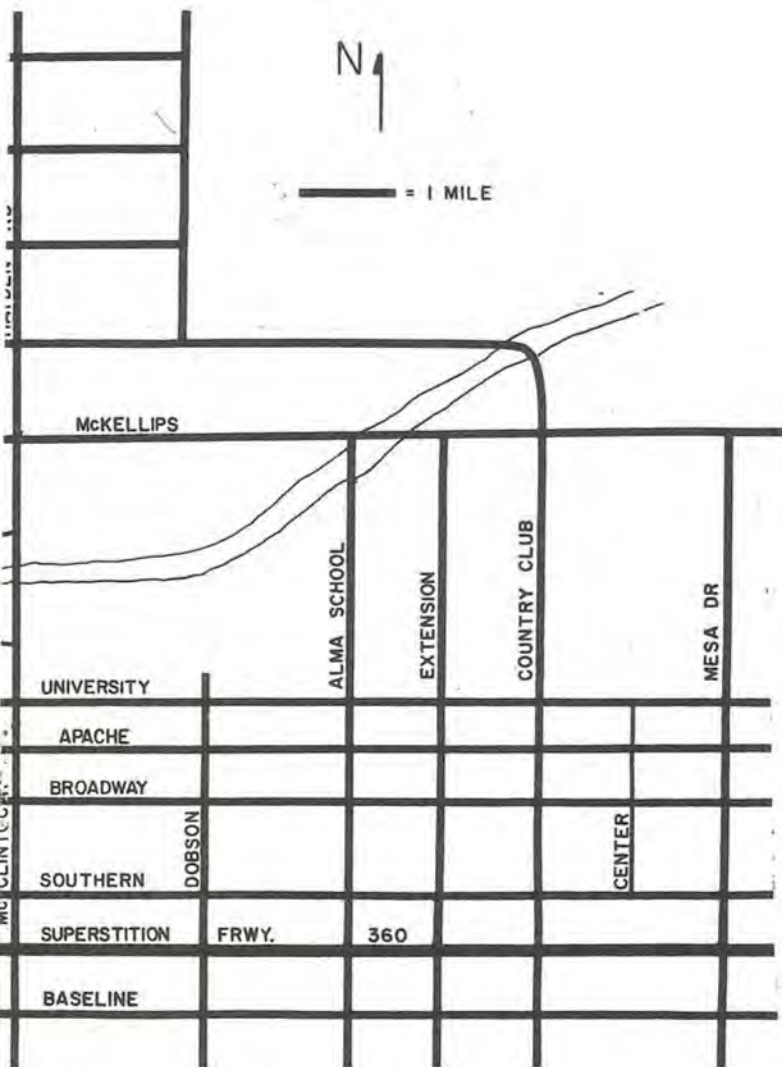
