

#### **Ultimate Disc**

#### The Game

Ultimate is a fast-moving field sport played with a plastic disc (Whamo's version is called a "Frisbee"). The action of the game combines the passing and scoring of football, the cutting and guarding of basketball and the non-stop field movement of soccer. Because Ultimate is a team sport in which each player must act as a quarterback, receiver and defender, a large number of participants can be actively involved throughout the course of play.

Ultimate is played on a field similar to a football field, with 25-yard endzones at each end of a field that is 70 yards long by 40 yards wide. Two seven-person teams are on the field at once, with substitutions allowed only between goals.

The object of the game is to pass the disc from teammate to teammate until a pass is caught in the opponent's end zone. Running with the disc is not allowed. Upon catching a pass, the player must stop running and establish a pivot foot before attempting the next pass. In the meantime, potential receivers are cutting towards and away from the player with the disc, often running established plays or patterns "on the fly". The disc may be thrown in any direction and there is no offside. One point is awarded per goal. In tournament play, the first team to reach a predetermined number of points wins.

On defense, no overt contact or tackling is allowed. Rather, while the team in possession of the disc is advancing towards an end-zone, the defending team tries to force a turnover by guarding the thrower and potential raceivers, or by playing a zone defense. A turnover results whenever a pass is not completed - when it is caught or knocked down by an opposing player, is caught by a player out-of-bounds, or touches the ground at any time. This results in an immediate change of possession of the disc. The use of a flying disc in Ultimate adds a dimension not seen in ball games and is one of the elements that makes Ultimate a truly unique sport. Unlike a ball, a disc sinks, floats and curves. A skilled thrower can guide a disc over and around defenders and float it ahead of a running receiver. An Ultimate game is filled with leaping one handed catches, short give-and-go passes, field length bombs ("hucks" in Ultimate terms) and diving blocks and catches. Action is intense, exciting and continuous!! A second, and unique, feature of Ultimate is that players on the field are responsible for their own foul and line calls - there are no referees. Players are therefore required by the rules to adhere to the highest standards of sportsmanship and to respect their opponents. This element, the "Spirit of the Game", is greatly valued by all players because it creates an etiquette and camaraderie not typically found in other sports.

#### Spirit of the Game

Demanding athletic competition, such as that found in an Ultimate game, has a positive influence on a person's physical, mental and social development. But, what sets Ultimate apart from all other sports is the emphasis placed on sportsmanship - The game is characterized by its high regard for mutual respect among players and an absence of referees. The introduction to the rules of the game clearly defines this principle which is referred to as the "Spirit of the Game".

Ultimate has traditionally relied upon a spirit of sportsmanship which places the responsibility for fair play on the player himself/herself. Highly competitive play is encouraged but never at



the expense of the bond of mutual respect between players, adherence to agreed-upon rules of the game, or the basic joy of play. Protection of these vital elements serves to eliminate adverse conduct from the Ultimate field. Such actions as taunting of opposing players, dangerous aggression, intentional fouling, or other "win-at-all-cost" behavior are contrary the Spirit of the Game and must be avoided by all players.

## **Poultry Days History**



SAW THE HOMETOWN BLUE MEANIES FACE THE CHALLENGING DIAMOND DAWGS OF DAYTON, OHIO. AFTER MANY ROUNDS OF GAMES WERE PLAYED, THE BLUE MEANIES PROUDLY CARRIED OFF THE FIRST POULTRY DAYS CHAMPIONSHIP TITLE.





EXPANSION WAS THE WORD FOR THE '83 GAMES, TWO POOLS AND SIX TEAMS. PRIMAL URGE INTRODUCED DAY-GLO TO A STUNNED VERSAILLES COMMUNITY. THEIR ORANGE AND PURPLE YARNED CHICKEN RANCH DECOR ELICITED THIS COMMENT FROM ONE LITTLE OLD LADY, "YOU ARE A NICE BUNCH OF FOLKS, BUT YOU SURE DO DRESS FUNNY." ALSO FILLING UP THE GAME SLOTS WERE THE DAWGS, FLYING CIRCUS, MIAMI UNIVERSITY, CINCY, AND THE NEW CHAMPIONS, DISCO VOLANTE, EQUIPPED WITH FRANDOR, DEFEATING URGE IN THE FINALS. FLYING CIRCUS CAME IN THIRD, WITH THE MEANIES.

STOCK, EAGLES, AND THE SQUARE AMERICANS, PLUS THE HOMETOWN MEANIES. RAINS FELL DURING SATURDAY'S PLAY ON THIRD WORLD AS THEY DEFEATED THE MEANIES. HUNTSVILLE DEFEATED TINY LIVESTOCK, AND THE EAGLES OVER TENNESSEE. IN TWO OF THE LONGEST GAMES OF THE TOURNAMENT, THE MISERS OF THE SQUARE AMERICANS OVERCAME HUNTSVILLE, AND



IN A FIERCE MATCH-UP THE EAGLES TRIUMPHED OVER THIRD WORLD. THIS PLACED THE EAGLES AGAINST THE SQUARE AMERICANS IN THE FINALS. BEING A CALM, QUIET, COLLECTED BUNCH THAT THEY ARE, THE SQUARE A'S WON THE FIRST PLACE TROPHY. BY THE WAY DUDES, "WHERE IS IT NOW?"

INVITATION FEATURED A PILE OF DEAD LIVESTOCK SITTING FROZEN TO THE GROUND. THIS LURED SEVERAL NEW TEAMS FROM THE NORTHLANDS TO



ENTER INTO THE POULTRY DAYS FEST. MOLTEN PLASTIC TRUCK DISASTER MADE THEIR FIRST APPEARANCE ALONG WITH THE MILKMEN, WHO DEFEATED NORTH COAST IN THE MASTERS GAME TO DON THE BELT OF THE UDDER CHAMPIONS. THE EAGLES TOOK THE TITLE AWAY FROM THE MILKMEN WITH SHUT UP AND PLAY IN SECOND. COOTER CITY AND NORTH COAST ROUNDED OUT THIRD AND FOURTH.



WAS A YEAR OF DROUGHT AND HEAT AND CONCRETE-LIKE FIELDS. FOR THE FIRST TIME THE ENTIRE TOURNAMENT WAS DEDICATED TO JEFF WARRICK. AT THE TIME HE WAS IN THE HOSPITAL UNDERGOING TREATMENT FOR LEUKEMIA. A VIDEO WAS PRODUCED AND WARM GREETINGS AND WISHES OF LUCK WERE SENT TO JEFF AND HIS FAMILY. OUTSIDE LOOP ROLLED INTO TOWN AND PITTSBURGH CRASHED THE SCENE TO GIVE POULTRY IN MOTION A TOUGH GAME IN THE FINALS. THE NEW VICTOR AND THE SEVENTH POULTRY DAYS CHAMPIONS WERE MICHIGAN'S POULETS.

SUNDAY MORNING TEAMS WERE AWAKENED BY THE CROWING FROM INDY'S CHICKEN LIMO. QUARTER FINALS WERE UNDERWAY WITH POULTRY IN MOTION DOWNING TENNESSEE AND THE EAGLES OVERCOMING THE PONES OF PITTSBURGH. MADISON DEFEATED THE LOOP AND POULTRYGEIST TERRORIZED THE LANDSHARKS. POULTRYGEIST, WHO NEVER FINISHED ABOVE THIRD, MET MADISON IN THE SEMI-FINALS WITH THE CHICAGO TEAM PREVAILING. NEAR THE SHELTER HOUSE, THE EAGLES DEFEATED POULTRY IN MOTION BY TRADING GOALS UNTIL THE END. THE FINAL GAME WAS SET. POULTRYGEIST OF CHICAGO AND THE EAGLES OF INDIANAPOLIS. WITH THE GLIMMER AND SHINE OF THE THREE AND A HALF FOOT FIRST PLACE TROPHY. POULTRYGEIST DEFEATED A WELL DISCIPLINED INDY TEAM. MADISON DOWNED POULTRY IN MOTION FOR THIRD AND FOURTH PLACES. A JUBILANT POULTRYGEIST TEAM THEN BEGAN THEIR CELEBRATION BY ATTEMPTING TO CAPTURE THE FLAG OF TENNESSEE. THEIR METHOD OF HEAD-BUTTING TO OPEN



A WATERMELON PROVED QUITE UNIQUE AND THEIR WATER BALLOON SLING-SHOT SENT VICTIMS SCATTERING. AS DUSK FELL, POULTRYGEIST COULD STILL BE HEARD AS THEY CONTINUED TO ROMP ON THEIR GARDEN-HOSE POWERED WATER-SLIDE.

#### Jeff Warrick Poultry Days Ultimate Classic XV Itinerary

- Captains' Meeting: Will be held at 9 a.m. on Saturday, June 15th. Teams who show up late will forfeit their \$25.00 deposit and possibly get bumped from the tournament. Please, only one or two appointed team representatives at the meeting.
- Entry Fee: \$25.00 will be given back after the first game on Sunday if
  a representative of your team is there at the start of both morning's Captains' Meetings.
  You must also start both day's first game on time.
- Parking: New this year. NO PARKING ON GRASS <u>ANYWHERE</u> IN VERSAILLES THIS
  YEAR!!!!! Park only in designated parking places. If the Heritage Park parking lot is full,
  park across the street in the swimming pool parking lot. A new parking lot has been built
  off of Klipstine Road (see map). Parking is available on the sub division streets adjacent
  to the park. Please do NOT walk through residential yards next to the park.
- Camping: The Heritage Park fields are available for camping Friday night through Sunday night. Please, stay away from fenced areas and residential houses and please keep the noise level down after dusk. Problems with noise will end the tournament this year. Police the individuals and groups near you so we don't have any of these situations. Remember, if one of us is trouble, we all are trouble to the locals. Please, no fireworks or loud music at night and late night drummers will be executed at sunrise!!!! No exceptions!
- Shower: Will be opened Saturday morning and Saturday night until 9 p.m. and Sunday
  morning and afternoon. They are located in the Versailles High School locker rooms (in
  the back of the school, next to the gym). Refreshingly COLD outdoor temporary showers
  will be available throughout the day at Heritage Park!
- Game Time: Announced at the Captains' Meetings. The first games will start both days 15 minutes after the conclusion of the Captains' Meetings. This means the first games will start at approximately 9:30 a.m. Saturday's first game will be capped at a predetermined time set at the Captains' Meeting. Tournament Directors will be present to make sure the first games of the day are started and ended on time. Points will be assessed. It is in your best interest to not disgruntle the Tournament Directors and especially their wives!!!
- Sunday's Games: Captains' Meeting at 9 a.m. on June 16th. Game times and points will be determined at the Captains' Meeting. The first games will start 15 minutes after the conclusion of the Captains' Meeting. This means the first games will start at approximately 9:30 a.m. Be ready to play or points will be assessed. Don't anger the Ultimate Gods (the tournament directors in this case!!!).
- Trophies: Awarded by Miss Chick to the top two teams in the "A" Division and to the winner of the Women's tournament.
- Masseuses: Two (2) masseuses will be available for a limited time during the tournament.
   Please make appointments and requests at the Big Green Tent.

THE '90 CLASSIC WAS DIFFERENT. THE TOURNAMENT DIRECTORS AND THE POULTRY DAYS COMMITTEE DEDICATED THE TOURNAMENT TO TWO VERY WELL KNOWN, FINE YOUNG ULTIMATE PLAYERS, JEFF WARRICK AND DAN GOUBEAUX. WHO DIED OF LEUKEMIA. THEY WERE AND WILL ALWAYS BE SORELY MISSED, 27 TEAMS ARRIVED IN 1990 TO SOGGY FIELDS AND HUMID WEATHER. HOWEVER, POULTRYGEIST OF CHICAGO WON DIVISION 1, POOL A AND ROCKFORD TOOK POOL B. POOL C WENT TO THE COMBINATION OF NORTH COAST AND BURNING RIVER, WHILE BREAST & THIGHS EARNED THE HONORS OF POOL D. QUARTER FINALS GOT UNDERWAY SUNDAY MORNING WITH CHICAGO DOWNING COOLER BY THE LAKE AND NORTH COAST/BURNING RIVER TAKING BEDROCK. THE FINAL BATTLE WAS BETWEEN BREAST & THIGHS AND NORTH COAST/BURNING RIVER WITH NORTH COAST/BURNING RIVER PREVAILING. #### ULTIMATE Past, Present and Future

#### PAST. . .

Ultimate originated in 1968 at Columbia High School in Maplewood, New Jersey. Here the first set of rules were drafted and the name "ULTIMATE" created.

The first intercollegiate game was held between two local universities, Rutgers and Princeton. These same two teams originated the first intercollegiate game of football 103 years earlier on the same playing field.

In 1979, the Ultimate Players Association, was formed as a national membership organization for the sport. With it came the first sectional and regional garnes with the goal of achieving a berth in the national playoffs. The first men's national playoffs were held in 1979, with women joining the competition in 1981.

#### PRESENT . . .

Today, the UPA is approximately 6,000 members strong, playing in college and open division competitions which are UPA sanctioned. In all, there are over 25,000 men and women playing Ultimate nationally. In the United States, the organization boasts 150 college teams and more than 650 "club" or "city" teams. More than 21 foreign countries are represented, including Holland, Finland, Sweden, Austria, West Germany and Japan.

Efforts at promoting the sport have been focused primarily on educational environments, particularly among young people. Boy Scouts can now earn an Ultimate "Physical Fitness" badge by accumulating a minimum of 12 hours of instructional playing time.

An Ultimate package has been developed which will enable physical education teachers and camp counselors alike to teach students the game of Ultimate.

#### Future . . .

Ultimate continues to gain more players and wider public exposure. It's development as a sport appeals to both sports enthusiasts and spectators. The future of the sport is very exciting and promising.

Successful summer intramural leagues have enjoyed fine receptions in such cities as Boston, New York, Chicago, and Washington D.C.

With eyes toward the future, many participants have organized a committee to promote Ultimate through participation in the World Olympic Games.
