





Easterns Trivia

Take this Easterns Trivia test - and rate yourself. Are you a "swill puppy", or are you an ultimate "god" or "goddess"? (Here's a helpful hint for the men - don't just assume that the questions apply to the men's division. When no division is mentioned, the question applies to either or both divisions).

1. (5 points) In 1983 the men's finals went on into dusk. It was late in the second half. Lightning flashed across the sky and a severe thunderstorm was about to break. At that point, the captains of the two teams agreed to call the game a tie. Who were the two teams? (extra credit - 5 points: which team was leading by two points at the time?)
2. (10 pts) When was the last time that a college team made it to the men's finals? Hint, in that year, both finalists were college teams. Extra credit (5 pts): who were the teams?
3. (5 pts) Who were the last college teams to make the semi-finals of the men's division, and what year was it? (you must get both parts for credit).
4. (5 pts) In what year did the women's division make its first appearance? Which team won? Extra credit for 10 more points: Which team came in second place?
5. (10 pts) Who was the first team from the Southern Region to make the semi's? Five extra points if you also get the year.
6. (10 pts) Only once in the history of Easterns did a home team make it to the semi's. Who made it and where was Easterns that year? (You can get five points instead of the ten if you can answer with the following big hint: whoops not so fast, try and get the ten points first. OK - here is the hint: In that year, two home teams made it.)
7. (15 pts) In what year did the Easterns and Westerns each use a different model "Frisbee"?
8. (15 pts) When was the last time that no team from the Northeast Region made it to a finals and who were the teams that did make the finals?
9. (15 pts) Who was the first team south of the Mason-Dixon line to make the finals?
10. (10 pts) When and where was Easterns the only other time the site was in the state of Pennsylvania? (Big time extra credit - 10 pts each for naming the finalists that year, 20 points each for naming the two other semi-finalists that year).

Lightning disc Smashes World Distance Record by 64 feet!


On April 11, 1943... in Australia... P-38 Lightnings of the 8th Fighter Group scored their first victories over the Japanese.

44 years later

On April 11, 1987... in Australia... with a wind of 15 knots, an overcast sky and rain on the horizon, 22 year old Michael Canci threw a Lightning disc 612.98 feet breaking the previous World Distance Record by 64 feet!

Easterns Trivia Answers:

1. Rude Boys and the Santa Barbara Condors played to a tie; the Rudies were up by two at the time.
2. In 1981 the defending UPA Champion, Glassboro State College, from New Jersey, beat Michigan State in the men's finals.
3. In 1982 Zoo Disc, from U. Mass., and Glassboro, were the last college teams to make the men's semifinals.
4. The first women's competition at Easterns was in 1981. B.L.U. (Boston Ladies Ultimate) beat the Roses from Cornell in the finals.
5. The first team from the South to make it to the semi's was the women's team from University of Florida, known at the time as the Shakti Nuns.
6. In 1984 the site of Easterns was on the Mall in Washington, D.C. The two home teams that made the semis were Static and Andromeda. By the way, the only time that U. Mass. made the semis, Easterns was in Purchase, N.Y.
7. In 1977 the Easterns disc was a Master-G model, while the Westerns disc was the just released 165-G model. Note the "G-model" referred to the flight ring placement (not "grams"). The G-series had fewer flight rings, leaving a thicker rim, and a more stable disc. By the way, the design on the Easterns and Westerns that year was the famous Boda design of a frisbee player flying through the sky with all sorts of stars in the background. The Easterns disc had the design on a label, while the Westerns disc had the same design as a large hotstamp.
8. In 1983 the Fisheads beat Andromeda in the finals of the women's division. (For the men, the answer is: 1981, when Glassboro State College beat Michigan State in the men's finals.)
9. In 1982 the women's team from University of Virginia became the first team south of the Mason-Dixon line to make the finals of Easterns.
10. The only other time Easterns was in Pennsylvania was in 1980, at Bucknell. The finalists were Glassboro and Boston Aerodisc, the other two semi-finalists were the Cornell Buds and Middlebury Pranksters.


