Welcome to New Haven CT, site of the 1991 UPA Eastern Championships. This year's Easterns is the sixteenth championship and returns the event to its original site. As the longest running annual Ultimate tournament in the sport, Easterns started back in 1975 when 8 college teams played in the largest ever multi-team tournament. With the decision to hold a National Championship in 1977, using an East vs. West format, the Easterns became the qualifying event for choosing the contender from the east coast. Despite the acceptance of a five region format for the National Championship Series beginning in 1979, and the subsequent move of that tournament to the fall season, the Easterns has maintained its importance in the annual tournament cycle as the premier tournament of the Spring season for club teams.






EASTERNS BUDGET

Reading the budget below, you will notice that the financial margins of running this event, as with most Ultimate tournaments, are narrow. While the entry fee of \$125 is somewhat high this year, the real per team cost, exclusive of discs and shirts, is about \$150 per team. 
