EVENTS

Discathon

A race in which players must run and throw discs around a circuitous 1(one) kilometer course. The course uses natural objects to define the mandatory route which the disc must travel. Good race strategy involves accurate throwing which reduces the length of the run. A wide range of throwing skills are required including precise curve control, strong distance and great accuracy. The running component demands speed, endurance and agility. Additionally, a carefully planned race strategy is necessary for attainment of low times.

Disc Golf

One of the most exciting developments in play is the public acceptance of Disc Golf. Many club and municipal courses have been experiencing very heavy usage. Play is analogous to ball golf except that fairways are shorter and much more restricted. Holes are completed by either striking objects on informal courses or hitting Disc Pole Holes on standardized courses.

Distance

More powerful players, better technique and improved discs have pressed the distance barriers well past the length of a football field. Both the backhand and the sidearm are popular deliveries for this power event.

Double Disc Court

A doubles game in which a pair defends a 12 x 12 meter court. The courts are separated by a 15 meter neutral area. Each point begins with one player on each team throwing the disc to the opponent's court. Scoring occurs when a team drops a disc, has a disc land in their court or holds both discs. Good shot variety and placement are the keys to competitive success. The 110G® model is used.

Freestyle

Freestyle is the "hotdog" aspect of Frisbee® disc play. Based on the throw and catch fun of the beach and backyard, freestyle has become an extremely challenging and beautiful aspect of competitive play. Judging is done by other active players and considers difficulty, execution, variety and presentation.

Guts

Two teams of five players face each other across a 14 meter neutral zone. The disc is thrown at great velocity across this zone with points being scored for wild throws or missed catches. All throws must be caught cleanly in one hand. The Professional® model is used for Guts.

Self-Caught Flight

Maximum Time Aloft: MTA is one of the most demanding of all flying disc disciplines. Good performances require strength, control and an extensive knowledge of the nature of disc flight. Players throw a "boomerang" flight into the air and catch the return flight cleanly in one hand. Time is measured from release until first contact in the catching attempt.

Throw, Run & Catch: TR&C holds all the challenges of MTA plus requiring that the player be a swift runner. Players throw a "boomerang" flight into the air and catch the return flight cleanly in one hand. Distance is measured from point of throw to point of first contact in catching attempt.

Self-Caught Flight points are determined by evaluating the player's performance in both MTA and TR&C.

Ultimate

A field game played with seven players on each team, Ultimate has become extremely popular with club, high school and college teams. The disc is moved from player to player by passing and goals are scored by throwing to a team member in the end zone. The 165G® model is used for Ultimate play.

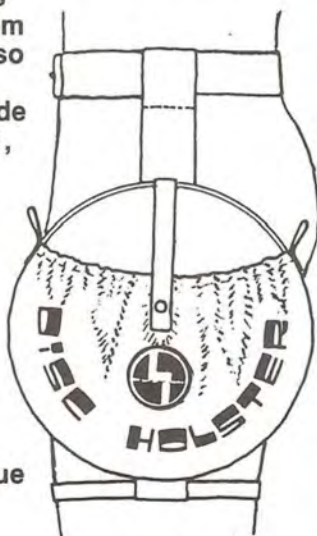

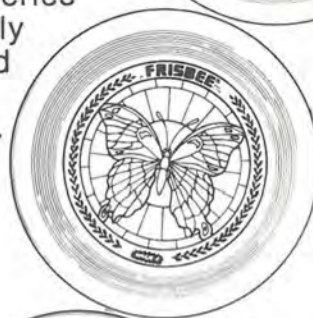

Almost since the very start of the World Frisbee® disc Championships, man's best friend has played an important role in the proceedings.

Starting in 1975, the legendary Ashley Whippet thrilled the assembled thousands in Pasadena's famed Rose Bowl with his speed, leaping ability and enthusiasm. Ashley was the World Champion for three years, from 1975 through 1977.

It's been apparent over the years that the sight of a dog racing down the field, leaping into the air and snaring a plastic disc will delight audiences of all ages . . . and this year's WFC will be enhanced by a personal appearance by Ashley, along with his owner, Alex Stein, as well as some of the dogs which competed in this year's Ashley Whippet Invitational contest, sponsored by the makers of Cycle® brand dog foods.

Over the years the canine performers have evoked many pleasant and sentimental memories during the WFC. There was Gary Smith of Maine who was in tears as he thanked his \$5.00 pound hound Winkie for "bringing me to the Rose Bowl." Another standout performer was Zeke, the Wonder Dog, who was subsequently named official mascot at Michigan State.

And one of the greatest crowd pleasers was the delightful little "Austin-tious Toke" and his equally delightful owner Zeke Linton from Texas. Toke didn't win in Pasadena but he gained thousands of new friends, only to have his life ended the following summer in a tragic accident.

However, Ashley Whippet remains the kingpin among the K-9s, although he is no longer in active competition.

Since he first burst into national prominence in August, 1974, with an unscheduled and uninvited appearance at a nationally televised baseball game between the Los Angeles Dodgers and Cincinnati Reds, Ashley has been delighting people throughout the nation and has appeared at the Super Bowl, the White House and at the prestigious Westminster Dog Show.



While age has somewhat reduced his fabled speed and leaping ability, it has in no way dimmed his enthusiasm and he still evokes cheers and smiles wherever he appears.

As the father of K-9 competition, Ashley has seen the interest among dog owners grow through the years to the point where this year he was honored with a tournament in his name.

Ashley's fame was also a boon to many dogs which might otherwise have been destroyed as unwanted. Two later World Champions...Dink and Kona...both were pound hounds whose owners were looking for a "dog that could beat Ashley Whippet."

All performers who appear at the Smithsonian Frisbee® disc Festival do so without pay, but invitations to the prestigious event are still eagerly sought.

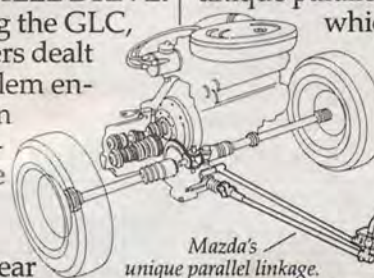

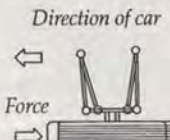
